(one specification)

CHARGE III - VIOLATION OF A LAWFUL REGULATION ISSUED BY THE SECRETARY
OF THE NAVY (one specification).

2. The findings of the court:

CHARGE I - Guilty, the specification proved by plea.
CHARGE II - Guilty, the specification proved by plea.
CHARGE III - Guilty, the specification proved by plea.

3. The sentence of the court:

To be reduced to the rating of apprentice seaman, to be confined for a period of six (6) months, to be discharged from the United States naval service with a bad conduct discharge, and to suffer all the other accessories of said sentence as prescribed by section 622, Naval Courts and Boards.

4. The convening authority on 3 January 1947 approved the proceedings, findings, and sentence of the general court martial in the foregoing case. However, in view of the previous good record of the accused, and the unanimous recommendation to clemency by the court, the execution of the sentence is held in abeyance with a view to withholding the execution entirely upon the successful completion of a probationary period of nine (9) months. During this period the commanding officer may order the execution of the sentence.

Aide to American High Commissioner to Turkey, Rear Admiral Mark L. Bristoll, now deceased - two years.

Chief of Staff to Commander Squadron 40-T, May 1939 - December 1940. Throughout period cruises were made to Southern France, Northern France, Holland including an official visit to Berlin in July 1939, St. Nazaire France, Lisbon, and Spain. This squadron was based at Lisbon, Portugal for a period of thirteen months. Throughout stay in Lisbon Naval Intelligence was organized in co-operation with the Naval Attaches in Spain, Portugal, and Italy. Their reports were co-ordinated and transmitted by Squadron 40-T.

ROYAL NAVY ADMINISTRATION AND FUNCTIONS IN ITALY.

A drastic programme of reduction in the number of Royal Navy Establishments and personnel in Italy is being effected and, although there may be certain delays in the closure of larger establishments, it has been planned to withdraw Royal Navy personnel from all ports except:

(a) Trieste, Venice and Pola;

and (b) Naples, where the Naval Officer in Charge, Naples Area, who is the Chairman of the Port Committee, will continue to remain in overall control of port operations undertaken by the Italian Royal Navy.

The period for which Royal Navy personnel will be required to remain for winding up naval affairs, disposing of stores and equipment, etc., cannot be accurately forecast, but it is almost certain that all Royal Navy personnel will have been withdrawn from Leghorn and Taranto by 15th March, 1946, thus leaving Naples and the Northern Adriatic ports as the only ports under Royal Navy control in Italy.

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2. As a direct consequence of this large scale withdrawal and with a view to cutting down the number of personnel on my staff in Rome, it is intended on 1st March, 1946,

(a) To transfer my responsibilities for administering all remaining British Naval Establishments in Italy to the Vice Admiral, Malta and Central Mediterranean, who will thus become the administrative authority for all British Naval affairs in both Italy and Sicily;

and (b) To transfer my responsibilities as regards Allied Force

3. Concurrently, I shall cease to carry out the
functions referred to in paragraph 2 above, and shall adopt the
title of Flag Officer, Liaison, Italy, (short title F.O.L.I.)
for the purpose of my duties in accordance with the Cunningham -
De Courten Agreement in relation to the operation of the Italian
Fleet and for dealings in connection with the Italian Mercantile
Marine. In addition I shall be responsible for the administration
of the small Royal Navy unit forming my staff in Rome.

4. This reorganisation of Royal Navy commands will
in no way affect the functions of the Navy Sub-Commission,
Allied Commission, which remain as heretofore and relate to
the supervision of administrative matters concerning the
Italian Royal Navy.

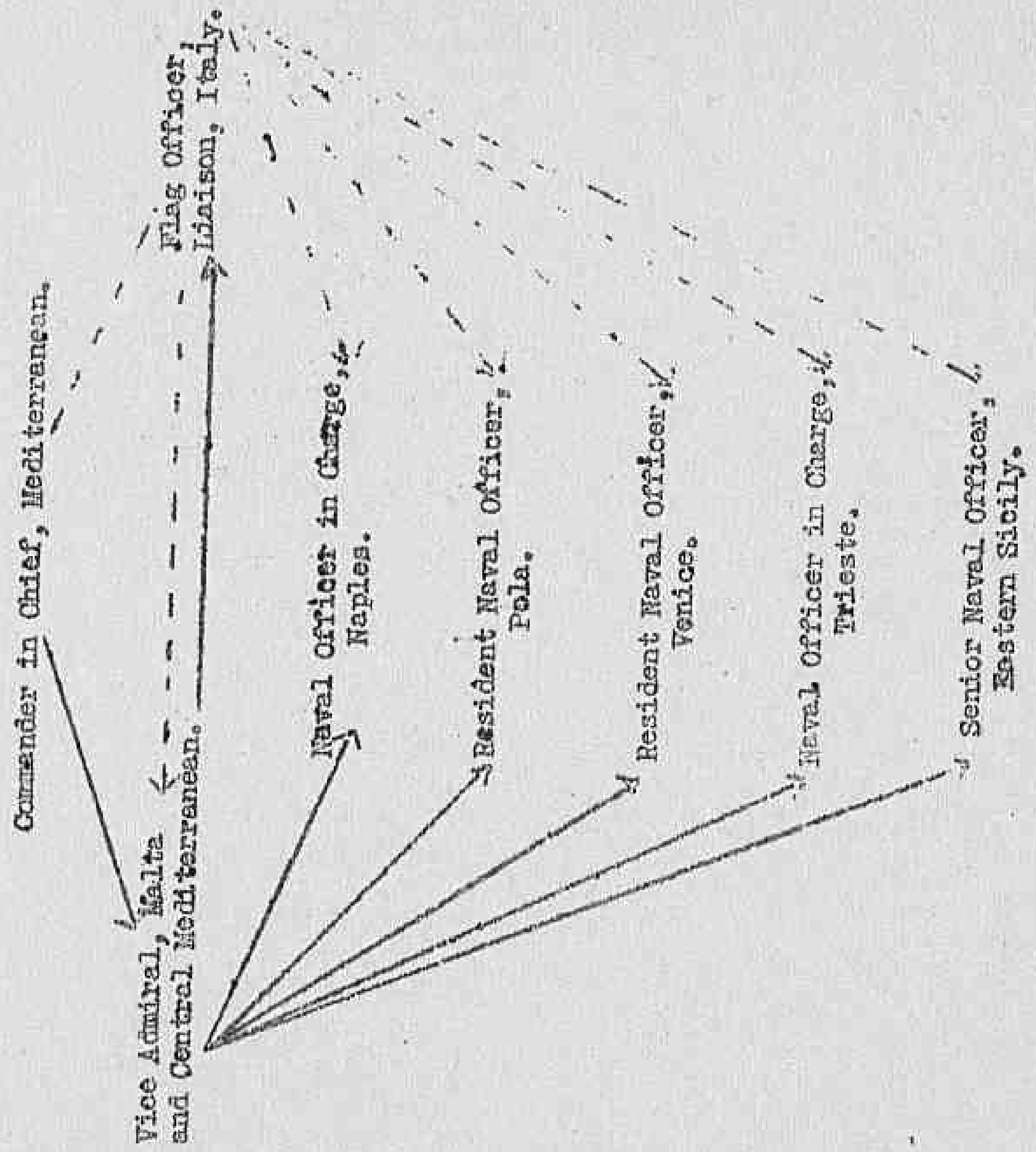

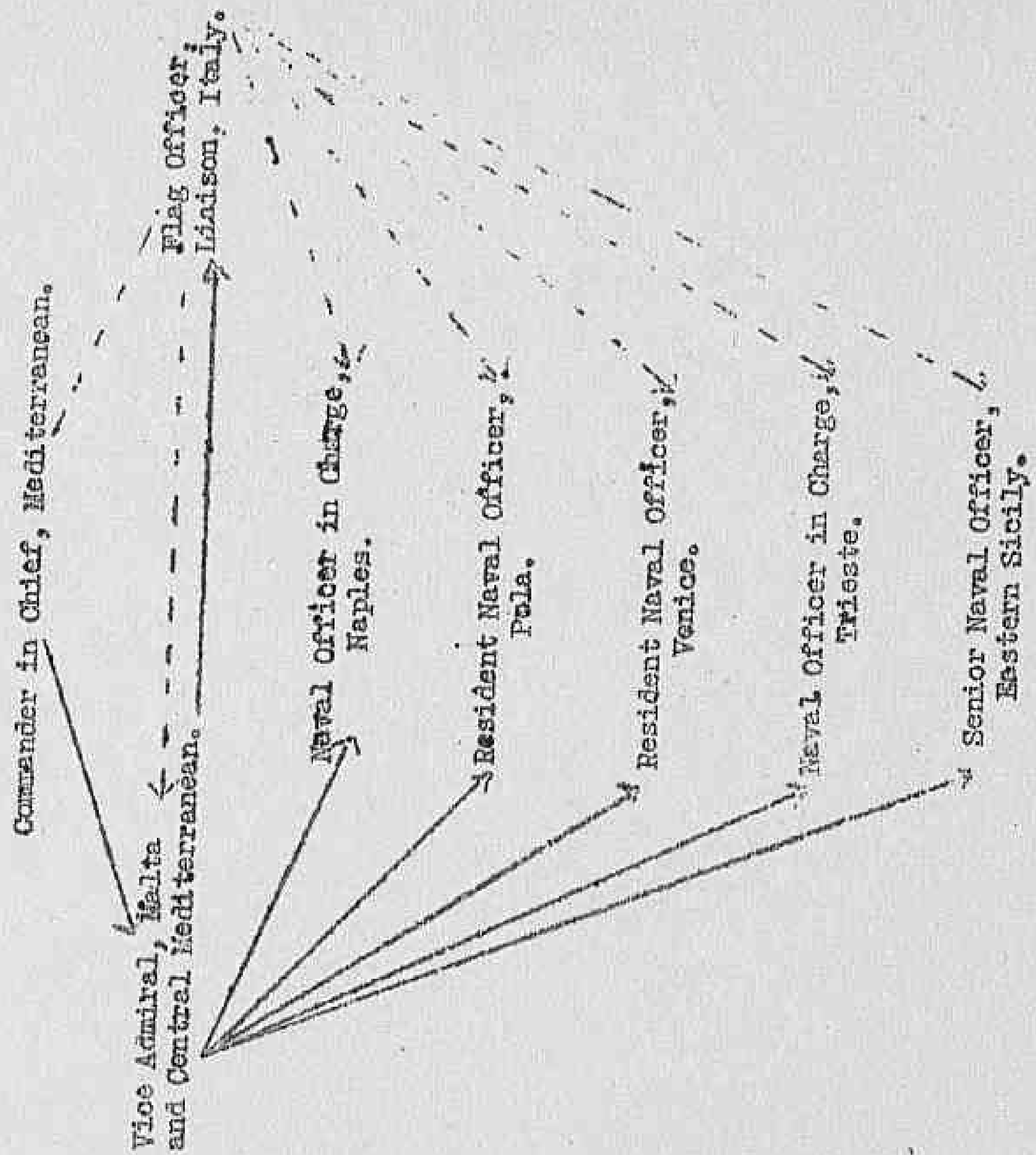
