My Dear General,

My Dear General:

With the creation of new Ministries the Italian Government is experiencing considerable difficulty in securing suitable additional office space. The Commission is, of course, concerned to facilitate the smooth working of the Government in every possible way and it is for this reason I bring to your attention the Government's request that consideration be given to returning to it the Air Ministry Building, at present under requisition by the Allies. In this building it is intended to house the new Ministry for Post War Assistance and also the Air Ministry itself, now a greatly reduced body, could be accommodated there.

I would appreciate your consideration of this matter and if the Air Ministry Building is not immediately available you might perhaps be able to suggest an alternative which could be released in the near future.

To: The Residency of the Council of Ministers

1. Further to the Prime Minister's letter of 3 October 1944 and to the Acting Chief Commissioner's reply of 9 October 1944 on the subject of procuring the Air Ministry Building for the Central Institute of Statistics.

2. Written authorization releasing certain portions of the Air Ministry Building is contained in a letter from the Commanding General Rome Allied Area Command of 12 October 1944.

3. The following conditions are set forth by the Zone Allied Area Command respecting the use of this property:

"The Air Ministry building in Via Libro e Moschettio is hereby released to you for use by the Italian Government engaged on the preparation of the Census for the National Reconstruction until the 15th November 1944, after which date it is assumed that you will make the necessary arrangements to hand it back to this Headquarters." 726

"Arrangements are being made for the withdrawal of guards forthwith, but it will be necessary for the Italian Government to allow those sub-units now in occupation by authority of this Headquarters to remain and to avoid interference with their activities. These sub-units are -

- (a) Meteorological Section (R. A.)
- (b) No. 1 Canadian Base Signal Section.

"It is pointed out that it is not possible to release the Air Force Barracks, as suggested by you, because this building is in course of urgent conversion to a Military Hospital under orders from Allied Forces Headquarters.

"Headquarters Allied Armies in Italy obtained clearance certificate on the Air Ministry building to the effect that it was left in good condition and that the furniture contained therein was complete at the date of their departure.

"It is obvious that the Allied Military Authorities can no longer be responsible for the condition of the building or for the custody of the furniture contained therein, once it is handed over to the Italian Government, though naturally none of the furnishings or fittings should be removed.

"It is suggested that suitable arrangements in connection with this latter matter should be made with the Italian Air Force."

4. May I suggest that you bring this information to the attention of the officials in your Government who will be concerned in these arrangements.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister

I have carefully examined the proposal made in your letter, number 16645/10026.10.8/1.1.16 of 16 October, on the subject of the Air Ministry building.

As you know, this building is held under a requisition by the allied military authorities, who have temporarily rescinded the requisition so that the Census Staff may be housed in the building.

Now, even if at the request of this Commission the requisition were permanently to be lifted, this would take several days, and meanwhile authority has been given to the Census Staff to move into the building. Moreover the census documents are already flowing in, and compilation of these cannot be delayed.

I therefore submit that in order to avoid confusion the matter should be allowed to proceed as arranged, and that the statisticians move in for their temporary occupation.

Your anxiety to have the Regia Aeronautica housed in its own building is well appreciated, and I hope that by the time the work of the census is finished it may have been found possible to lift the requisition permanently from the Air Ministry Building, and I shall continue to work to this end.

1. It is noted that the ITALIAN Air ministry has presented a formal request that they be allowed to re-take possession of the Italian Air Ministry Building in Rome.
2. This building is at present occupied by Italian civil servants who are occupied in taking a census of the population in Rome. The building has only loaned to the Italian Government for this purpose.
3. It is improbable that this building can be surrendered finally to the Italian Government as it is likely that it will be required sometime in the nearfuture by British and American forces.

Dear Comodoro,

I want to draw your attention on a fact which is particularly important, not only in itself, but also because it has political consequences and diminishes the prestige of the Government.

As you well know, when Rome was liberated, the building of the Air Department was occupied by the Allied Authorities which requisitioned it.

Therefore, when the Italian Government came back to Rome, the Air Department couldn't reintegrate its own building, and had to install its offices in two or three buildings scattered through Rome.

Recently, the Central Institute of Statistics, which has been entrusted with the works relative to the census, requested and obtained the help of the Allied Authorities, which, as you have told me, put at its disposal the building of the Air Department for the duration of the census.

I don't need to explain why I should like you to take this opportunity for giving back its seat to the Air Department. This would put an end to the serious difficulties caused by the material separation and the distance between the buildings in which it is temporarily installed. On the other hand, the fact that this Ministry is still kept out of its seat puts it in a condition of inferiority towards the other Administrations; it gives a political aspect to the question and reacts unfavourably on public opinion, just when the Allies are showing their appreciation of the contribution of this arm to the common war, by mentioning the help it has given, and by hinting at greater possibility of employment in the future.

The Central Institute of Statistics let me know that it would be quite satisfied if the three buildings now occupied by the Air Department were put at its disposal. From this point of view, there would be nothing to oppose the requested restitution.

Therefore, I beg you, my dear Comodoro, to see whether you can possibly agree to my proposal. The Government attaches great importance to this restitution for political motives and also for reasons of prestige, and I know I can rely on your help.

General Maccagnini informs me that an attempt is being made by the Italian Bureau of Statistics to obtain, at any rate, a part of the Italian Air Ministry building. He has seen Bonomi about this and Bonomi agrees with him that if anyone at all other than the Allies goes into the Air Ministry building, it should be the Air Ministry.

I must say I agree with this entirely. The present situation in which the Air Ministry is split up among a number of buildings is most wasteful in efficiency, time and transport, and I do regard it as of the utmost importance that we should get back again into the building as soon as possible.

3. I have, in fact, made application twice within the last ten days to A.E.Q. for the return of the building.

4. If you are approached in any way, I should be very grateful if you could give us your support.

Following our ref 6734/S of August 28th (Cabinet) and ref.

I shall be obliged if the Sub-Commission could re-examine  
the possibility of restoring the Air Ministry building to the I.A.F.  
as the present accommodation is provisory and inconvenient, its  
offices at a distance from each other, necessitating duplication  
of services, and a waste of organisation which could be better and  
more profitably used otherwise. In short a slowing up of every  
activity, operational, administrative and logistical.

Furthermore there is an aspect of morale involved which I  
think should be considered, and which prompts me to raise the  
question. The situation has, in fact, provided an unfavourable  
impression both with regard to public opinion and on I.A.F.  
personnel, for, as you know, of the three Forces' ministries only  
the Air Force has been deprived of its site.

In view of the above and the active participation by the Air  
Force during a year of co-belligerency plus the recent declarations  
by the heads of the United Nations concerning a wider undertaking by  
every branch of activity, I pray the Sub-Commission will use its  
good offices to impress upon Allied H.Q. in Italy the need for  
restoration, at least in part, of the Air Ministry as suggested in  
our letter ref 6734.

It is understood that the building is at present unoccupied, and the Air Minister has pointed out that the handing back of the building would be in accordance with the recent policy as expressed by Mr. Winston Churchill and President Roosevelt. Its return would have a very beneficial effect on the morale of the Italian Air Force, which is at present actively engaged in assisting Balkan Air Forces, and would have a happy effect on public sentiment.

Dear Admiral,

As you well know, the Italian Government, in agreement with the Allied Commission, has entrusted the Central Institution of Statistics with important investigations (demographical, agricultural, industrial, economical, and social) to obtain a full knowledge of the state of the nation in the various sectors, and to know the needs.

It is necessary that this researches should be made without delay, so that the work of national reconstruction could be started soon. Therefore, and because of the obvious complexity of the researches, especially during the selection and classification of the informations, the Institution needs 8000 employees to be put in big rooms, each of which ought to hold 20 persons at least, with their respective tables.

The works of selection are impending and the Institute is worried about the arrangements which will have to be made for such a numerous personnel, a small part of which only can be put in the premises of the Institute. For the census Services, for a period of about two months, it means ~~1522~~ use a part of the seat of the Air Ministry.

As this Ministry is at the disposal of the Allied Military Government, I ask you to see whether it would be possible to agree to the proposal of the Central Institute of Statistics.

1. In the building of the Air Ministry, all the offices of the Ministry itself and all the Directorates General depending therefrom can be accommodated, leaving at the disposal of your Sub-Commission 200 rooms.
2. The sub-division of the premises of the Ministry to be allocated to the I.A.F. and those to be used by the Allies could be made by floors or else by wings as desired and can be agreed upon.
3. The I.A.F. would furthermore vacate the following premises:

100 rooms in the Palazzo Caprara.  
70 " in the War Ministry.  
40 " in No.2 Via Urbina L.N.A. building.  
50 " in the Collegio Pontificio Latino.

260 rooms in all.

4. Accommodation for troops and motorparks.

At present the I.A.F. holds the Casermetta N.A.C.A.O. accommodating 350 bodies and a pavilion serving as garage. These premises too could be retained if 2 floors of the Romagnoli barracks and some garage space in the ~~top floor~~ school of the Ministry were at the disposal of the I.A.F. the latter for some 30/50 vehicles.
