SUBJECT: Control of Production of Armaments in Italy.

TO : Chief of Staff, AFHQ, ARV 512, U.S. ARMY.

1. Paragraph 2 of PA 711 authorizes the establishment of IMAS, to be charged with the control functions of supervision and direction of the Italian Armed Forces heretofore exercised by the Land, Naval and Air Force sub-commissions of the Allied Commission and the control of the production of armaments.

2. Paragraph 4 of Acting Chief of Staff's letter, G-3 AFHQ/131/1 of 26 January states that "IMAS and its Sub-Sections will continue to operate in accordance with existing directives for, and practices of, the Service Sub-Commissions."

3. Since AFHQ Staff Memorandum No. 3 dated 31 January 1947 excludes from the responsibilities of the Chief Civil Affairs Officer, Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, AFHQ, control of the production of armaments in Italy, and since existing directives and practices of the former service sub-commissions of the Allied Commission did not include responsibility for Italian armament production control, instructions are requested as to whether this function should be assumed by IMAS. If so, it is recommended that this function be added to those of the Land Forces Sub-Section, with authority to co-opt services of the Naval and Air Forces Sub-Sections when necessary. **32-5**

4. In this connection, it is the view of Director, Land Forces Sub-Section, with which I concur, that if the responsibilities of his Sub-Section are to include supervision and inspection of factories and arsenals, it may become necessary to augment the staff of his Sub-Section with personnel having technical qualifications beyond those at present available.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister:

With reference to your letter dated 22 January 1947 requesting the use of an Allied hospital ship for the evacuation of hospital patients from Pola, I am directed by the Supreme Allied Commander to inform you that there is no Allied hospital ship at present in this area and that none is expected in the near future. Should your Government nevertheless wish to obtain the use of a British or American hospital ship, there appears to be no alternative but for your Government to approach the governments concerned through diplomatic channels with a view to chartering such a vessel.

In view of the expense and time which would be involved in obtaining a ship by the above means, however, your Government may wish to consider the practicability of using the "VULCANIA" on her return from her present mission for the evacuation of hospital patients from Pola.
