1. Capt. BOZZI

called here at 1600 hours today. He said Dr. Camera has told him to come to see us about his case. He stated that he had earned no money since his appointment at Frosinone was terminated and was selling his personal effects to buy food, and urged that we should find some employment for him.

2. I told him that as the Italian Government had terminated his employment it really was up to them to find him something to do but that we had a good opinion of his work and had recommended him for a position in the North. There were no vacancies at present and while the front remained static vacancies were not likely to occur. We would keep his name before us and if a suitable position was vacant would strongly recommend him for it.

3. He said he had spent 25,000 lire in moving his wife and family.

4. I enquired if it was possible for him to rejoin the Italian Army but he did not seem to think this would be possible without specifying any reason.

5. Having said good bye and departed he returned to state he was qualified as a lawyer.



1. The above-named is an Italian Artillery officer (Captain) with some administrative experience who was nominated last June by the Italian Government at the request of the then RC, Region IV, to take charge of the badly devastated area on the left bank of the river Liri from Cassino to Roccasecca.
2. He has done excellent work in this capacity, co-ordinating the efforts of the Sindaci; but now, owing chiefly to the limitations imposed by the supply position, the necessity for a special appointment of this nature is coming to an end.
3. In agreeing to the Italian Government's proposal to terminate Capt. BOZZI's appointment in the near future, this HQ has drawn attention to his merits and requested that the appropriate Italian Department of State will consider his continued employment in such work as he may be suited. A copy of the Ministry's reply to this is enclosed.
4. Would you be good enough to bear Capt. BOZZI in mind for any office for which he might be suitable in your Region.

1. I refer to the conversation Captain Temple of this Sub Commission had with M.R. BETTINI on 15 November regarding your Ministry's proposal to discontinue the position held by the above named.

2. I am informed that the necessity for the position no longer exists and in these circumstances, the Allied Commission have no objection to the termination of Sig. BOZZI's appointment.

3. It will be recalled that this AC appointment which was in the nature of an experiment was made in collaboration with the Ministry to deal with the particularly difficult conditions in the Cassino area.

4. In conveying the above decision to you, I desire to place on record that Sig. BOZZI has cooperated well and energetically with AC and has performed much useful work.

5. In these circumstances, I am to express the hope that the appropriate department will consider his continued employment in such work for which he may be suited.

6. With regard to Sig. DUMANO, I find that his appointment was made by the Prefect after restoration of the territory to your Government and the matter is therefore entirely one for your Ministry to deal with.

Reference your AC/1/4/2/LG dated 15 Nov. a letter from Provincial Commissioner Frosinone is enclosed.

At this HQ it is agreed that there is, probably, no necessity for the continuation of the Office. On the other hand it does not seem to be a good moment to remove it.

The main reason for the position being unnecessary is that the Economics and Supply position has made possible action very limited. This has restricted the scope of the job considerably. Should the new Repairs to Houses Decree genuinely become effective or should this winter bring some of the difficulties which are possible (including the withdrawal of personnel) we may be very glad to have a Commissario to help out the unpaid Sinduci.

3. I refer to the copy of Inter-Form 31 (Enclosure) dated 9 November as to the writing (and seal) of the two documents above named, a copy of which was handed (Clark, Justice - Post, 11376) to me on 15 November.

3. You will see that the Ministry are postponing the dismissal until the P.C. can be consulted. They will take no further action till the views of this U. are made known to them.

4. The necessary facts seem now to be established except in two respects :-

(a) the exact nature of the instructions received by the prefect from the Ministry. The prefect says he was ordered to terminate the appointments by 15 November; the Ministry say they have merely advised the prefect that it is a matter for him to decide. Could the U. please ascertain the truth of this?

(b) whether DELL'ALDO was appointed by A.M.C., ROMA clearly yes; but we do not know whether TULLIO was appointed before the date of the transfer of the provinces to Italian control. Could this be ascertained please?

5. There appears to be nothing against DELL'ALDO or TULLIO personally. The reasons for terminating their appointments seem to be :-

(a) that the office of Commissario Speciale is unknown to Italian law.
(b) that it is unnecessary, now that the normal organs of Local Government have been set up in all the colonies affected.

We should be glad to have your views and those of the U. upon the necessity or otherwise of continuing to have Commissari Speciali in these devastated areas.

PRESENT: H. E. Giovarbattista ZANFRANUNDO, Prefect of Frosinone.
Capt. C. G. R. Williams
Signorina P. CASTANI, interpreting.

1. I told the Prefect we had heard that the Ministry had proposed the dismissal of the two Commissari for devastated areas. The Prefect replied yes, the Ministry had directed him to terminate their appointments on 15 November.

2. He said they were not Commissari prefettizi because each town had its own Sindaco and Giunte but they were Commissari Speciali appointed to exercise "vigilarza", i.e. to supervise closely the operations of local authorities under their charge and to report to the Prefect.

3. The areas each one controlled were as follows:

4. The Prefect stated that when CANEVARI visited him in Frosinone he stated that the two Commissari were to be dismissed. He said he told CANEVARI he did not agree, but if it was the view of the Ministry he would do so. He said he pointed out that at least one of them--BOZZI--was an AMG appointment and the Allies should be consulted. He did not know if that had been done. But at the same time ZANFRANUNDO did say in the course of conversation that he did consider the appointments superfluous, as all the 170 towns had their Sindaci, etc.


4a. Dumano was formerly Sindaco of Portecorvo: the Prefect thought he had been appointed before the province passed to the Italian Government but he was not sure.

5. I asked him how he proposed to supervise the restoration of these devastated areas. He said he, the Prefect, would have to go there more frequently; transport was difficult but he would have to manage as best he could. I asked him if he had a good VPI. He said he had none: a Consigliere FABIANI was acting as such, but as there was only one other Consigliere, the Prefect could not let the Acting Inspector go out very much. He said he has asked the Ministry frequently for another VPI, but so far without success.

6. I advised the Prefect to continue to press the Ministry for a VPI and said we would refer the matter to them as well.

1. Capt. Temple referred to the information received (as at No. 24 on the file) that the Ministry proposed to dismiss BOZZI and DURANO, the two Commissari for the devastated areas in Frosinone Province.

2. BERRUTI said the Prefect ZANFRANEDO was at the Ministry about 20 days ago and he himself had said there was no more need for these Commissari as all the communes under their supervision were now properly organized with Sindaci and Giunte. The Ministry told the Prefect (a) that there was no provision in Italian law for posts such as these Commissari; (b) that the Ministry could neither dismiss nor confirm the appointments--that was for the Prefect.

3. BERRUTI stated he did not know that the two Commissari had in fact been dismissed. He did not think so. He thought the Ministry had gone no further than the advice given to the Prefect as stated above.

4. He said that, however, the Under Secretary CANEVARI was in Frosinone some time ago and spoke to the Prefect about this. It was possible, BERRUTI thought, that CANEVARI's words might have been taken by the Prefect as an instruction to dismiss.

5. Capt. Temple pointed out that at least one of the Commissari--BOZZI--was an AG appointment and the Allied Commission had not been consulted as to his dismissal. BERRUTI immediately suggested that any question of dismissal should be postponed until the IC had been consulted. Capt. Temple agreed.

6. BERRUTI stated that the Prefect was in Rome today and was calling on Local Government S/C this morning. Capt. Temple thereupon telephoned Capt. Williams, who said he had the Prefect with him at the moment and that he had obtained a full statement from him on the subject (see No. 27 on this file). *Elm*

(NOTE: In the normal Italian system, a Commissario Prefettizio is an official appointed by the Prefect to take the place of the usual local government organ, i.e. Sindaco and Giurato, etc., when the commune cannot function. If BOTTEI and DUMINO were Commissario Prefettizi, the method of appointment would be by decree of the Prefect with the "visto" of the RC at the foot to signify R.C. approval.)
3. Just what measures were each of them responsible for.
4. Has notice of dismissal been actually given or is it merely intended? Is the Prefect doing it himself at the instruction of the Ministry or of his own accord.
5. Have any reasons been given for the dismissal.

SUBJECT : Tour of Provinces

TO : Col. R.G.B. Spicer

1. I submit my reports of the interviews I had during my recent visit to Littoria and Frosinone.

2. The following points emerge from the information obtained :

(I) - Local Government Reorganization - It appears that no clear-out policy has been expressed or definite orders given Region HQ. on this subject. As far as Littoria is concerned it may well and truly be said that it is difficult having regard to the appalling war conditions which exist and the consequent necessity of other and more immediate needs having priority. Whatever may be the explanation the position either of the immediate or later introduction or lengthy postponement should be clearly decided upon and that appropriate steps be taken accordingly.

In Frosinone the scheme is in hand through the attitude of the PC and the experienced Prefect and not on account of any direct lead or instruction from the top.

(II) - Direct contact with the Ministry - The Prefects of both Provinces have with the PC's approval have been writing and dealing directly with the Ministry of the Interior. As long as territory is under AMG the proper channel is from RC to ACC. This point is made not for mere "Channel's sake" but because this Sub-Commission has daily contact with the Ministry and as far as personnel matters are concerned can doubtless get better results than a letter from a Prefect. It is suggested that this point should be made clear to RCs via RC & MG Section. Draft memorandum herewith.

(III) - Officials and Staffing - This Sub-Commission is primarily concerned with assisting the Italian Administration generally. As far as bodies are concerned its interest is confined to Prefects and Vice-Prefects. It is no part of the Sub-Commission's function to conduct detailed surveys of staffing problems in Prefectures. It is suggested that the question whether or not a Prefettura is adequately staffed by the right officials is essentially one for a Provincial Commissioner to settle. If they do not exist and cannot be obtained locally the PC should contact this Sub-Commission. Further where small teams of officials have been provided these should be considered only as a nucleus. Others may or may not exist. If they do not the small skeleton staff which is provided as an emergency measure must be built up. Particularly do these remarks apply to devastated Provinces which should be "priority" for supply and built-up of staff.

I consider this point should be made to and impressed upon the Ministry. It is also of prime interest to AMG whose policy is to get the Italian Administration AMG to work. Whether it be AMG or the Government.

SUBJECT: Local Government - Littoria and Provinces

TO : HQ, Region IV

1. Shortly before the change of provincial arrangements an officer of my staff visited Littoria and Province Provinces in connection with the state of local government arrangements.

2. I append a précis of the interviews with the Provincial Commissioners, and Prefects, and I make the suggestions appearing therein which I hope may prove of some assistance to you.

(1) LITTORIA

a. Local Government - Apparently it had not yet been practicable to introduce the plan of local government reorganization as contained in R.R. 111. There was some doubt as to the effect and intention of Regional Order 4 dealing with the subject and the RU had requested clarification of the position. The matter will now be covered by the R.R. which, as you know, has been made applicable to ACG territory.

b. Prefectural staff. It will be recalled that the Prefect Leggero (Viscovo), was appointed together with a small train of officials who were sent forward at the request of 5th Army owing to the disappearance and lack of officials when the province was taken.

The Prefect Leggero has no Vice-Prefect Vicario or Inspettore. On a basis of the normal requirements of the prefecture he said he was short of the following, viz: -

- 11 Vice prefetto vicario
- 11 Vice prefette inspettore
- 1 Consigliere
- 3 Segretari
- 11 Notizio provinciale
- 4 Magistrati
- 1 Archivista
- 3 Applicati

In view of his increasing needs he asked that at least the following should be sent:

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Il Vice Prefetto viario
2 Interpreti
3 Legionieri
1 Archivista
2 Applicanti

By arrangements with AMI the Prefect had written the Ministry direct urging them to provide the minimum list above.

Regarding communications with the Government in AMO areas, it is advisable that the normal procedure of contact by Legion through AMI should be used. I make this point not for mere insistence on "channels for their own sake" but because that arrangement ensures the best and certainly quietest result.

As you know this Sub-Commission have what is now a well established arrangement and procedure with the Ministry on this subject of personnel. Actually I have since contacted the Ministry in support of the Prefect's requirements.

(ii) PERSONNEL:

a. Local Government - No formal order on the subject has been received. However, the Prefect ~~and~~ ^{is} in close collaboration with the SO, is going ahead with the arrangements which are well in hand. Ambramo has had previous experience of the subject at Avellino (under Lt Col Irish) and knows it well.

b. ~~Correctional~~ staff. The prefect had no difficulties in this respect but is in need of an additional engineer and 2 commissari which we undertake to pass on to the proper quarter. I have conveyed his request. He did mention that he wants to change his Vice-Prefect Isopitore and had written to the Ministry thereon. My remarks above also apply here.

3. The comments made above are intended in no critical sense. AMI's difficulties are appreciated and Interior's function is to help and not hinder.

4. Lt Col Thorshill asked for a copy of our completed pro-form containing data of Frosinone Province. I enclose it herewith for forwarding.

5. Please convey to both PCs my thanks for the help and hospitality they extended to Lieut. Lewis.

1. Reference your ACC/1/4/2/Int of 24 July, the question of the amalgamation of Roma and Frosinone Provinces, appears to the writer, to be part of a long term planning, which mainly must be the responsibility of the Italian Government.
2. As you are aware, the entire present territorial subdivision of Lazio, only dates from 1927. Most of the territory now generically known as Lazio, was then contained in one large province of Rome. On the other hand, the south eastern portions of Littoria and Frosinone were in the now suppressed Province of Caserta, and most of Rieti was in Aquila.
3. It is submitted that an ^{ephemeral} merging of Roma and Frosinone Provinces would only be a half way solution in any programme of re-organisation. The resultant Province of Rome-Frosinone stretching, as it would, from Cassino to Civitavecchia, would be exceedingly difficult to administer; moreover it would become in population, wealth and industrial importance, unduly large in comparison with the other provinces.
4. The Province of Littoria is, in population, one of the smallest, and is, as a political and geographical entity, of comparatively recent growth. The writer's suggestions are clearly those of an outside observer, but in response to your request for comments, the counterproposal is submitted that the two provinces of Frosinone and Littoria might be combined, with the HQ of the combined provinces at Frosinone. These two provinces have alike suffered considerably from the war, and there is much similarity

between their two problems. While it is true that the mountain range of the Lepini lies between the Via Casilina and Via Appia, there are a number of quite good cross-country routes, and the distance from Frosinone to Gaeta, Terracina or Littoria is much less than, for example, the distance from Civitavecchia to Frosinone.

SUBJECT: Italian Officials - FROSINONE Province.

TO : Colonel R.G.B. Spicer, Director.

FROM : Captain C.G.R. Williams, Assistant Executive Officer.

1. I refer to my report of 27th June (Nos.16 and 16A in file) as to the delivery, under my conduct, to the PC FROSINONE of BOZZI, Capitano Renzo, the Italian Officer selected for appointment as Commissario Prefettizio of the devastated Cassino - Roccaapice area.

2. The incident described in this present report has already been reported verbally to you and it is now submitted in writing in accordance with your orders.

3. Provincial HQ are in the town of PIEMONTE. We arrived there at about 18.15 hours. The only officers available were Major - PING (A) and 1st Lieut. - O'DONNELL (A). The PC - Lt.Col. John S. Thorwhill (A) was in Naples but he was expected back that evening.

4. I explained our presence to the two officers above-mentioned and asked as to quarters and meals for Capt. BOZZI and myself. Major PING and Lt. O'DONNELL said the PC had requisitioned two rooms in a hotel next his office and we could have those. As to meals, they agreed that I should dine in the mess and that Captain BOZZI would have to do so as well.

5. We accordingly went to our rooms and returned to the mess at 19.00 hours. I asked Captain BOZZI to follow me in but he did not understand me and remained waiting outside.

6. Several officers were present, including Major PING and Lt. O'Donnell. The PC had not arrived. A moment after I had entered, Lt.Col. R. HOWARD (B) came in. As he was the senior officer present, I introduced myself, explained why I was there, mentioned the arrangement for Captain BOZZI to dine in the mess and asked permission to bring him in.

7. Lt.Col. Howard then said "Oh, damn that - there's too many Italians coming into our mess and eating our rations" - or words to that effect. After some more observations of the same character, he told Lt. O'Donnell to give Capt. BOZZI a K Ration and tell him he could not take his meals in the mess. Lt. O'Donnell did so.

8. Lt.Col. Howard's language was both abusive and indecent.

9. Capt. BOZZI showed no resentment at, or even awareness of his treatment in my contacts with him next morning. The incident was however, most embarrassing to me and I believe, to the other Provincial Officers present.

The Prefect is rather hanging back on this, not, I gather, out of any unwillingness to do as he is told, but because energetic action of this kind is rather unfamiliar to him. Lt Col Thornhill hoped to make use of the car licensing and petrol rationing system for the purpose of discovering civilian vehicles which could be requisitioned.

13. Region IV have warned the PC that some of his officers will be withdrawn shortly for provinces further north.

TO : Colonel R. G. H. Bishop, Director

FROM : Captain G. G. Williams, Assistant Executive Officer.

1. According to your orders, I travelled to Tessinone via Bellinzona on Saturday, 10 June, picking up the Prefect designated for Tessinone, and returning at Bellinzona on the way.

2. The Prefect had a quantity of trunks, boxes, and suitcases - far more than would go in my Bianchi car. Moreover, he had arranged - without any word to this sub-commissioner - to take with him a local Agent of Fabbioli, whom he is his personal attendant, and Lt Col Litchfield reported a letter from this Mr Fabbioli, it was hoped, will serve as some sort of a pass. Unfortunately, it was arranged that the Prefect, the Agent, and part of his luggage should come back in a local AGO car which was used to take the Prefect about the province, I taking the rest of the luggage in my Bianchi.

1. I refer to your letter of 3 June 157/49/CA and enclosure.
2. I have been in touch with the Ministry of Interior who have arranged for two of the persons in the pool of Sindaci to be summoned to Salerno from Lecco and Tari, respectively. They are expected on the 11th or 12th June.
3. Both are Army officers and after interview the Ministry will recommend the man best suited for this particular appointment. He will remain here and be available on short notice. (The second man will also stay in Salerno for use elsewhere if and when required by A.C.)

1. It appears that an area of some ten communes in the east portion of Frosinone Province contained in the general quadrilateral:- Roccasecca - Cassino - R. Rapido - R. Gari - R. Liri - R. Melfa, will present a problem that may be unique in the Italian Campaign. This area has been under heavy shell fire for some three months and has been the scene of heavy fighting; it constitutes a real devastated area.

2. For the present this area has been declared a closed zone by AMG Eighth Army in their OA/67 of 25 May.

3. In order that as much as possible be saved of the crops and that the maximum work may be done in the dry, summer weather; it will be necessary to make a plan for the rehabilitation of this area, to be put in effect as soon as the area passes to Region IV and military conditions permit.

4. It appears desirable that the group of ten or more communes be treated as one unit. It is therefore suggested that the Italian Government be requested to appoint, in due time, a Commissario who could work with the AMG/ACC Officer concerned, and would act for the Prefect of the Province in respect of these special areas.

5. Region IV will study the possibility of setting up a special HQ for this area, possibly under canvas alongside Route 6, South of Piedimonte.

6. This project has been discussed with Brig. Moseley, Cdg: 55 Area. He will, at a later date, be Area Commander for the above-mentioned territory. He is in complete agreement. 11.31
