Colonel JOHNSTON, February 20th at Monte Catini.

Col. JOHNSTON stated that there were no outstanding problems in Tuscania Region that he was aware of with the following exceptions that:

- (1) he was worried about administrative personnel for Arezzo Province;
- (2) that Epuration Commissions were not formed or functioning in any Province except Grosseto. As far as he could understand the delay was in Rome and would be go into the matter and let him have a note about it.

Major Temple will please write a dem official letter to

Col. Johnston when he has ascertained the position, and let him know.

Col. WEBER and Major DREYFUS both brought up a point as to the use of the words "to dismiss" in G.O.67, whereas all subsequent orders have used the words "to suspend". These latter orders have obviously been drafted and passed by the Vice President and the Legal Sub Commission, and I think that this point which apparently is worrying to professional lawyers, should be cleared. Major DREYFUS is the Legal Officer of Siena Province.

In Gazzetta Ufficiale No. 4 of 9 January 1945, the endorsement was modified to provide that the Decree No. 328 of 18 November 1944 would have force and effect in each province when the Provincial Commissioner arranged for this in his own province by pertinent order.

5. Apparently the failure to make the Italian Decree effective in Toscana is not the fault of HQ AC (Finance and Labor Sub Commissions) but the Regional Commissioner of Toscana Region and the Provincial Commissioners under him. The foregoing remark, however, may be subject to change if previous consultation has been had between the Finance and Labor Sub Commissions and the Regional Commissioner.
