1. PREFECT : Is sick at present. A special report has been forwarded. I consider he is not suitable for this Province. He seems very unpopular with the Communists, who threaten him in public. He is naturally weak and shirks ~~his~~ responsibility.
2. VICE-PREFECT : A hard working career man, not suitable for advancement.
3. VICE-PREFECT VICARIO : Same as above. (*same man*)

Short statement by the P.C. as to general state and condition of the local Government Organisations mentioned on p. 1 and any views he may wish to express thereon.

On the whole satisfactory. A large communist element throughout, which tends to create one-sided administration.

SUBJECT: Treatment of Comitati di Liberazione.

TO : RC, Toscana Region.

1. I refer to your letter of 27 October XVIII/72/24.
2. In the present temporary absence of Col. Spioer, nothing is known of the Unione Nazionale.
3. The provisions and policy of the Directive to which you refer are applicable to this newly formed body in the same way as they are to the CLN, which, it is observed, has already been dissolved.
4. If, therefore, the Unione Nazionale is exercising executive functions and usurping the authority of the Prefect properly established under the provincial Commissioner, the latter is clearly entitled to deal with the situation under and in accordance with para 6 of the Directive and to dissolve the organization if circumstances justify this step.

SUBJECT: - Treatment of Comitato di Liberazione

TO: -(See Distribution below).

1. Recent events have made it desirable to clarify the position and standing of local *Comitati di Liberazione*, and to lay down the policy to be adopted by AMG officers in their dealings with these bodies.

2. In Allied Military Government territory the Provincial Commissioner who is the local representative of the Military Governor is supreme in his province and he is responsible for the conduct of affairs there.

3. In carrying out his functions the Provincial Commissioner uses the local civil administration; where a Prefect has been appointed he is head of and represents the local civilian administration and is the person to whom the Provincial Commissioner gives his orders. The Prefect on his part is responsible to the Provincial Commissioner for seeing that the orders given by the latter are fully and properly carried out.

4. It follows therefore, that the Provincial Commissioner must on his part give his full support and weight of authority to the Prefect in the discharge of his duties. If the Provincial Commissioner no longer has confidence in the Prefect, it is his duty to ask his Regional Commissioner or the SCAG, AMG, to have him removed, in consultation with HQ ACC, but while the Prefect continues to enjoy such confidence the Provincial Commissioner must as stated above give him his full support and authority.

5. The local *Comitato di Liberazione* has no official standing in the conduct of affairs within the Province. Its members must not be permitted to assume any executive functions, to appoint *Comissari* or *Managers*, or to set up any Commissions of Enquiry, or to do any executive acts within the Province. If it becomes desirable to appoint *Comissari* or Commissions of Enquiry into any matter, it is the duty of the Provincial Commissioner to give the proper instructions to the Prefect.

6. At the same time the *Comitato di Liberazione* must be treated with courtesy and their advice and views may be sought by the Provincial Commissioner or the Prefect. It is entirely a matter for the Provincial Commissioner, after consultation with the Prefect, to consider whether in any particular case the advice of the *Comitato* is to be followed or rejected. If the *Comitato* attempt to exercise executive functions and to usurp the authority of the Prefect they must be stopped at once. If instructions to that effect are not followed by the *Comitato* then the Provincial Commissioner will take steps to ensure that his orders are carried out, and as a last

It is entirely a matter for the Provincial Commissioner, after consultation with the Prefect, to consider whether in any particular case the advice of the Comitato is to be followed or rejected. If the Comitato attempt to exercise executive functions and to usurp the authority of the Prefect they must be stopped at once. If instructions to that effect are not followed by the Comitato then the Provincial Commissioner will take steps to ensure that his orders are carried out, and as a last resort, dissolve the Comitato. If necessary the Provincial Commissioner, subject to the concurrence of the Regional Commissioner or SCAO Army concerned will ask the local Military Commander to assist him for this purpose.

SUBJECT: Treatment of Comitati di Liberazione,
TO : HQ, ACC (Attention C.A.Section).

1. Reference your letter 9/5B/CA dated 21 Oct 44.
2. I submit the following case for your consideration and advice.
3. SIENA Province has reported that during the time this Province was under the control of Fifth Army the Committee di Liberazione caused a great deal of trouble. The P.C. consulted with G/Capt. BERSON, SCAO, Eighth Army when SIENA Province was under Army control, and Col. Spicer. They decided the Committee should be dissolved and a new advisory committee called Unione Nazionale should be formed.
4. It was made clear that they were to act purely in an advisory capacity and although they produced a letter heading "Unione Nazionale" they continued and are continuing to use their name and up to the present time they are giving orders, disobeying orders issued by the P.C., and using their name for communist propoganda.
5. The Prefect would like them disbanded. The P.C. endorses this view and so do I. In the meantime the Prefect has been notified to ignore all orders issued by them.
6. In view of the fact that the Comitato di Liberazione, as such, has already been disbanded, I propose to authorise the P.C. to dissolve this newly formed "entente" in ten days time.
7. May I please have your comments on this question in due course. I would like to feel that I am considering all aspects of it.
