EXTRACT FROM LOMBARDA REGION REPORT
FOR JUNE 1945

MILAN: Between 12 and 26 June there were 24 disturbances in the Province. The disturbances usually took the form of sit-down strikes, but there were also demonstrations at the Municipio. The reasons given were to demand: Increase in pay to meet rising cost of living; payment of Premio di Liberazione; changes in Municipal Administration; increases in rations. Considerable concern is expressed by employers as to their ability to continue the financing of the unproductive wages of the work-people whom they may not discharge. Many enquiries are made concerning the arrival of coal and raw materials so that manufacturers may plan production and determine prices.

MILAN CITY: Public Safety: Carabinieri, Guardia di Finanza, Guardia Municipale all functioning well and every thing under control. The biggest difficulty is with the Agenti di P.S. where the question of inadequate pay is still open. Satisfactory results obtained in collection of firearms from civilians and patriots. Crime is low in the city. R.A.C.I. now licensing vehicles. Italian welfare agencies functioning well, but are now faced with a feeling of unrest in the community due to low wages and high living costs. Food: Food demonstrations in city against SEPRAL. Increasing quantities of local resource products arrived and were distributed. Rationed items were distributed: bread 150 gr. daily for normal and supplementary rations. Monthly ration: rice 1 kg; cornflour 1 kg; butter 100 gr.; lard 80 gr.; cheese 100 gr.; sausages 100 gr. Salt for breadmaking and sugar for children and sick. Public Works: Many projects getting under way and programs have been approved although insufficient transportation has delayed progress. Transportation: Lack of POL makes transportation problem acute. Allocation used for food transport and none available for public works, industry and commerce. Over 33,000 tons of goods transported, and 7400 trucks registered of which about 6000 are efficient. Finance: Stock Exchange opened.

I conferred with the Provincial Commissioner first on the compilation of electoral lists and other local government matters, and then later we both went to the Prefect's office where we covered the same and additional ground. The Provincial Commissioner pointed out that the city of Milano is under another Allied officer (Lt. Col. Herkinson) and that his jurisdiction is that of the rest of the province excluding the city.

2. It was his opinion that the Prefect, who is a member of the Party of Action, was still under the influence of the CLN to too much of an extent. In fact he showed me some documents which contain the "visto" of AMG and the seal of the Prefecture. In the center of the seal of the Prefecture, the Royal Arms have been removed and replaced with a star and the initials "CLN". I obtained a copy of one of these documents in which a Sindaco was appointed in this Comune in the Province. The PO said that he has not taken this point up because he does not think it means too much and it is just a continuation of a longer series of similar incidents. So far as the administration of the Prefect was concerned, the PO thought he was an able man. My own impression was that he was a capable person who had a broad point of view and realized his shortcomings. In fact, shortly after we began talking and he realized what the nature of our conversation would be, he asked whether he could call in his legal adviser who was familiar with the administrative law and apparently was the person upon whom he leaned in connection with the administration. The Prefect is a young man, and impresses one with his sense of responsibility and power.

3. The PO stated that the province is divided into 7 districts with a CAO in each.

4. I discussed the problem of distributing electoral material and compiling the electoral lists. The PO thought I might distribute the material to each of the 7 zones and then have the CAOs distribute from these points to the Communes under their jurisdiction.

5. There is no problem regarding the lack of Communal Secretaries. Practically of the old ones were retained in office by the Prefect in spite of their background, and he is now making substitutions. The Association of Communal Secretaries is submitting names of possible candidates. There is a school for communal secretaries located at Milano.

6. Sindaci have been appointed in all of the Communes. They are now being formally confirmed in office. The PO was under the impression that all the Sindaci were under the thumb of the CLN. All of the old ones had been

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6. Sindaci have been appointed in all of the Comune. They are now being formally confirmed in office. The IC was under the impression that all the Sindaci were under the thumb of the GIM. All of the old ones had been thrown out of office and replaced when ANI moved in. The Prefect mentioned the fact that the rates of pay of temporary employees made it difficult for him to put on such personnel since they were unwilling to wait at the rates fixed as of 3rd April. He thought that this difficulty might prevent their recruiting staff for the task of compiling electoral lists. I informed him and the IC that I would bring this matter to the attention of the proper authority at this HQ, and suggested that Labor Sub Commission be sounded on this matter.

7. Giunte have been established in every comune, but in most cases they are larger than the size provided by law. The Prefect is now reducing them in size and hopes that this task will be completed in two weeks for receipt of the formal approval by the Provincial Commissioner.

8. A Deputazione Provinciale of 10 members and 4 substitutes have been appointed by the Prefect and approved by the IG. The 4 citizen members of the CPA have not been appointed. Names for candidates will be submitted to the Deputazione Provinciale in a day or two, so the Prefect informed me. The Prefect said there was no shortage of expert and technical personnel in the Prefettura. The following are his top personnel:

VEN - Dott. FROMMERL He is a career Vice Prefect who was on leave when the Allies entered the province. He did not take the Oath to the Fascist Republican Government. He is a career official

VPI - AVV. VANDAPORTI Non-career special

Capo di Gabinetto DE IENNE A career official with VPI functions

Vice Capo di Gabinetto DE FILLIZIO A career official with special VPI functions

Consigliere BACCHANELLI A career official with special VPI functions

" HUNNO functions

9. After further discussion of general problems of administration and the compilation of electoral lists, I left a form of local government report to be filled out and sent to the IG's office for further forwarding on to this Sub Commission.

10. In conclusion, the province is apparently adequately staffed for proper civil administration.
