F. A. Y. I. S. O. REPORT

1. Persons interviewed : -- Lt. Col. A. ROMAN, PHILIP -- Lt. Col. (A) -- PO
Viguer E. M. M. M. -- Prefect Regent
V. V. V. V. V. -- V. Castellario Politico

2. Date -- 7 July 1945

3. AMERICA are in office in all 28 Departments. Most have been confirmed by the 10 and he would have the remainder confirmed before 15 July.

4. Every Comarca has a Regentario to make, all other men in possession of the "petate". This is most unusual -- and fortunate.

5. The Regentarios Provinciales held its first meeting a few days before my visit; it then appointed the executive members of the 10 which was to hold its first meeting the next week. The Regentarios consist of 1 member from each of the 8 departments.

NOTE -- Information from HIO indicates 7 Regentarios only.

6. The population registers are in order in all comarcas except Canellas and one or two others. The Prefect has had a talk with the Regentario Comarcal of Canellas as to how he should proceed.

7. The distribution of electoral material to comarcas was completed by 4 July. Yesterday the Prefect held a meeting with the majority of his officials; the whole process was discussed and instructions given.

8. 15 documents at Torrance. The Castellario is in order. All Prefect in office.

9. The organization of the Prefecture is unusual. The following table illustrates it : --

10. The 10 seemed to regard the Regentarios and Regentarios as Vice Prefects; I advised him that if he wished them to act as such he had better formally appoint them to the post. The 10 is compromised and will have to go eventually under 60.55; the 10 thinks he can be substituted with a local man. ROMAN was promoted VII by the Republican Government; this being null and void, he has been reduced to the rank of Comandante.

4. Every Comune has a Regretario Comunale, all of whom are in possession of the "patente". This is most unusual -- and fortunate.

5. The Regretabile Provinciale held its first meeting a few days before my visit: it then appointed the active members of the C.C. which was to hold its first meeting the next week. The Regretabile consists of 1 member from each of the 6 Municipalities.

NOTE -- Information from RHO indicates 7 Municipalities only.

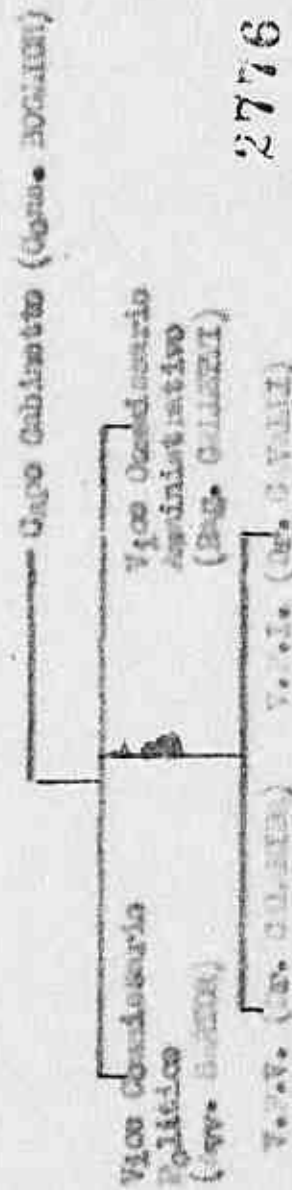
6. The population registers are in order in all communes except Orselle and one or two others. The Prefect has had a talk with the Regretabile Comunale of Orselle as to how he should proceed.

7. The distribution of electoral material to communes was completed by 4 July. Yesterday the Prefect held a meeting with the majority of his kindred: the whole process was discussed and instructions given.

8. 1 Tribunal at Torino. The Cassario is in order. All Prefetti in office.

9. The organization of the Prefecture is unusual. The following table illustrates it: --

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10. The P.D. seemed to regard the Prefect and Consigliere as Vice Prefects: I advised him that if he wished them to act as such he had better formally appoint them to the post. V.P.I. is compromised and will have to go eventually under C.C. 35: the P.D. thinks he can be substituted with a local man. MULLIN was presented V.P.I. by the Republican Government: this being null and void, he has been reduced to the rank of Consigliere.

11. As compared with the Prefect (active party), V.P.P. (Comm. Bologna) is the live wire. The P.D. has considerable confidence in him and I received a good impression. The Prefect is also a man of personality with his own view.

12. The organization is not "according to the book" but if it works (as it seems to do) and the P.D. is satisfied, I was not prepared to advise any alteration. I shall see better when our provincial report form comes in. Since the Italian Government take over however, they will I think, require a return to the normal constitution.

13. The electoral office is in charge of a Consigliere di Torino, who

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will also do the inspections as to the electoral lists.

13. The PU. thinks elections would strengthen the authority not only of the local government agencies but also on AMG; and the sooner they are held the better. The Prefect thought that the administrative elections would be held in October/November and these for the Constituent in December. I think he is most sanguine; but he is of course, only considering Treviso, the other 90 off provinces being none of his business.

14. The Prefect who said the great problem is public order: he fears the elections won't be free and said that the Communists specifically were still armed. "Give me 1000 GJ.RR. and an efficient and equipped questura and I can hold the elections". This was avv. BARNOR's view as well.

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
