Dott. VICARI referred to the plan, now being executed, of a general movement of Prefects throughout Italy and said that the elaboration of this plan had taken up most of his time and energy in trying to conciliate the different aspirations of the officials concerned and their natural resistance at being transferred from their present position. It was necessary, however, to muster all personnel with the rank of Prefect in order to strengthen the position of the Prefectures in view of the forthcoming elections.

Dott. VICARI said then that the object of his visit was to ask whether Allied Commission had any objection if, in the course of the above movement, the Ministry might find it necessary to transfer Prefect MASTROBUONO. The Minister felt that all officials holding the rank of Prefect should have actual experience in one of the Prefectures.

I replied that there was no objection at all on the part of my Sub Commission. I recalled that there had been a verbal agreement between my predecessor, Col. Spicer and the Ministry with regard to putting Mastrobuono at the service of the Allied Commission, but I added that I saw no reason why with the turnover of the administration of Italy to the Italian Government, the latter should not avail themselves of the service of Mastrobuono as they saw best fit. I stated that I understood perfectly well the point of view of the Ministry.

Dott. VICARI asked that the matter concerning Mastrobuono should be treated as confidential, since Mastrobuono himself did not know of his visit and has not been apprized of the possibility of his transfer.

I then asked Dott. Vicari whether there was still a division of opinion in the Ministry as to the policy to be adopted towards the replacement of non-career prefects. Dott. VICARI said that there were no longer differences of opinion and that the policy agreed upon by the Ministry was to put, whenever possible, a career man at the head of the Prefectures and in certain cases to retain non-career Prefects and moved them to be capable officials. Prefect of Modena

1. Dott. CAMERA said he had called to tell us that TACCOLI, the present Prefect Regent of Modena, had called to see the Under-Secretary of State SPATARO recently and told him he wished to resign from his office. The Under-Secretary wanted to know if in his place we would accept Avv. GERLO, the present Prefect Regent of Terni. GERLO had been appointed by AMG. Moreover, he was a Christian-Democrat as was TACCOLI, so that the balance of the "equilibrium of the parties" would be preserved.

2. I asked if TACCOLI had communicated his wish to resign to the PC. CAMERA said he did not know: TACCOLI did not say so when he was at the Ministry.

3. I said we could give no answer until we knew the views of the RC and PC. As to GERLO, RC and PC might desire to have a career Prefect or some other person. I promised to communicate with RC as soon as possible.

Prefects of provinces with AMG enclaves

4. CAMERA referred to the provinces of Naples, Pisa and Livorno, the capital cities of which were still under AMG. He inquired whether we considered it necessary for AG to give approval to new appointments of Prefects to these provinces on the grounds that parts of them were still under Military Government.

5. I said no. I thought the question had been considered some time ago within the S/C and resolved ~~in the affirmative~~. CAMERA said the Ministry would, of course, inform us of any changes so that the local Commissioners could be kept in touch. I told CAMERA he had anticipated a suggestion I was about to make myself.

1. Attention is drawn to the Decree of the Italian Ministry of Agriculture, of which copies in English and Italian are at fo. 15. By this Decree, the Minister purports to confirm the appointment of an official in Military Government Territory.

2. It is believed the Decree has been made with the knowledge and consent of Agriculture S/C which is understood to consider that the Italian Minister should be responsible for advising and guaranteeing to them the suitability of senior agricultural officials such as this, and that the getting of the Minister to make this Decree serves to fix this responsibility upon him.

3. The S/C primarily concerned with this particular Decree is, of course, Agriculture, and Local Government S/C is only concerned with this case insofar as (a) The Decree purports to confirm the action of our Prefect and (b) in the usual Memorandum of Legal S/C on this number of the Official Gazette, Local Government as well as Agriculture is noted as being concerned. The question of implementation is, of course, one for the S/C primarily concerned; and as the Decree is understood to have been made at the instance of Agriculture S/C, we do not feel that any initiative should be taken (in spite of our doubts as to the procedure) to exclude it from implementation, at least not at the instance of Local Government S/C.

4. This practice is the reverse of that adopted by this S/C as to its own Italian officials. The S/C agrees entirely with the policy of making the appropriate Italian Ministers responsible for advising on the suitability of official appointees. But as regards the actual appointment of such officials, however, it has always been our practice never to permit the Minister of the Interior to take such executive action in Military Government Territory.

5. There would seem to be objection to permit Italian Ministers to purport to take executive action in Military Government Territory, even in agreement with AG. For instance, such action tends to obscure the principle that Italian officials in such territory are responsible to AG alone. It may encourage our Minister of the Interior as well as other Ministers to take

6. On this last point, our records show that in December last, the same Prefect had occasion to dismiss the Director and Vice Director of the Florence S.E.P.R.A.L. for maladministration. Thereupon, these two gentlemen went to Rome and obtained from the same Minister of Agriculture a Decree confirming them in their new appointments. This Decree was, of course, disregarded by AMG 5 Army who requested Economic Section to "take up most strongly with the Italian Minister concerned this infringement on the authority of AMG." Copies of AMG 5 Army's letter to Economic Section and the enclosure to it are at fos. 13 and 14. 23

7. It is realized that these Decrees are of no effect unless implemented; but this does not detract from the consideration that a standard procedure is desirable for all S/Cs, so as to avoid AMG officers in the field having to remember different procedures for different officials.

1 From time to time, questions arise as to the correct status and rights of individual members of the Italian civil service at present employed in Military Government Territory, e.g. questions as to an individual official's correct rank or grade or correct rates of pay or allowances. At present, such questions have of necessity to be referred to the appropriate Italian Ministry for advice, as the Ministry is the only body in possession of the knowledge requisite for a decision. It has been decided that in future all such questions may be dealt with by direct correspondence between the appropriate Ministry and the dependent Provincial State office.

2 This decision is subject to the following limitations:-

- a) It is limited to matters involving application to an individual only: it does not authorize direct correspondence with the appropriate Ministry upon matters involving a general application to a class or group of officials; it is limited to the ascertainment of the true facts and of the Italian regulations applicable thereto in an individual case: it does not authorize Italian Ministers in any way to alter the existing situation of the individual (e.g. to promote, demote or transfer him) without the consent of HQ.

3 All such communications from the Province to the Ministry must, however, be sent through HQ channels. The necessity for strictly observing these channels must be firmly impressed on the Provincial and command taken to see that he adheres to them.

4 HQ/20.05 and HQs will place on all such communications a stamp or other indication containing the words "forwarded" or "seen" to indicate that the proper channels have been observed. HQs/SACOs and HQs are not required to examine in detail the Province's proposals or to express any opinion on them, unless they have some special reason for doing so.

5 In AMG Territory no instructions or directions of general application must be issued to any category of officials may be issued without prior consent of the Allied Commission. Hence the grant of any general increase in pay or allowances, or of any bonus or indemnity to a group or section of employees must be approved by the HQ Allied Commission.

6 Where such wages or pension changes of general application have been notified by the Italian Government Territory, other than by decree, and it is considered

  - c) Letters and PCs will place on all such communications a stamp or other indication containing the words "garantito" or "scatto" to indicate that the proper channels have been observed. Letters and PCs are not required to contain in their text any words or signs or to express any opinion on them, unless they have some special reason for doing so.
  - d) All letters or instructions or directions of general application without limitation of time or category of officials may be issued without prior consent of the Ministry or of any other authority. Hence, the grant of any general increase in pay or allowances, or of any bonus or indemnity to a group or section of employees must be approved by the HQ Allied Commission.
  - e) Where there is a change or pension changes of general application have been authorized in Italian Government territory, other than by decree, and it is considered advisable that the same should be applied to this territory, the proper Italian Ministry will furnish copies of the relative circular or instructions to the Allied Commission. If a decision to this territory is approved the same instructions will be sent through the channels to Regional Commissioners and PCs for delivery to the Executive Provincial State offices. By this arrangement financial officers will know that the salary or pension changes are authorized in this territory, and the instructions will be delivered without postal delay.
  - f) These arrangements do not hinder in the Italian Government any authority to transfer provincial State offices or to issue credit or direct payment orders in this territory; except as already provided for expenditures chargeable to the budgets of the Ministries of War, Marine and Air, the State Railways, the Posts and Telegraphs and to capitolo 202 in the budget of the Ministry of the Treasury.
  - g) Nothing in this letter shall compel the Regional Commissioners or PCs to permit direct correspondence between a Ministry and Provincial State Offices in this territory should he not desire it.

1. Having performed most unsatisfactorily for some time, it has been decided to change the directorate of the Sezione Provinciale Alimentazione of the Province of Florence.
2. This change has been brought about by a Prefect's decree dismissing the existing directorate and putting in their place another director, Dr. Palazzo, who has the full authority to choose his own subordinates.
3. Amongst those dismissed are Rag. Barbieri and Sig. Dall'Oppio, who were commissario and director respectively in the old organisation.
4. It appears that the two persons mentioned in the previous paragraph, having gained the impression that a change was being made, proceeded to Rome without reference to this HQ or to the Prefect and, apparently, interviewed the Italian Minister of Agriculture, who proceeded to issue a decree, also without consulting the A.M.G. or the Prefect, appointing Rag. Barbieri and Sig. Dall'Oppio as director and vice director of SEPRAI.
5. The decree of the Minister is obviously not valid in this Province, but it has however created, quite unnecessarily, a considerable amount of bad feeling, and I should be glad if the Italian Government could be requested not to make such decrees without prior reference to the Allied authorities.

NOTES OF INTERVIEW with H.E. BERRUTI and Dott. CAMERA.

Subject :

Provision of Italian Officials.

1. Major Temple said he was raising again the old question of delays in filling positions in Prefectures. The Local Government Sub Commission were continually getting complaints from Regional C on misassignments on this subject. He gave H.E. a list of some of the outstanding cases and quoted the case of ANCONA where a Ragioniere Capo had been asked for on 25th October 1944 and the position had not been filled yet. Other cases such as ARNUNO and LIGNA were also mentioned.
2. H.E. Berruti said he would examine the list carefully. He could only repeat what had been said before. A lot of delay was due to people going sick. When people went sick the Ministry could not discharge them and indeed they were so short of personnel that they didn't know what to do.
3. Major Temple said he didn't know what could be done to instil a sense of discipline into some of these officials. The Regional C misassignments only looked for results and for one reason or another the results were not good.
4. Berruti said it was a very difficult situation. The Ministry were encouraging these officials to move in every way possible. They were given special allowances and other considerations if they moved.
5. Major Temple then mentioned the case of PONTANELLI. He had visited the P.C. of Grosseto and personally pressed him to accept Pontanelli as V.P.V. who was supposed to be standing by ready to move in Rome. He had promised the P.C. that Pontanelli would be sent to Grosseto as soon as he (Major Temple) got back to Rome. The Ministry was asked for him on 24th March and so far he hadn't reported to this S/C.
6. Both Berruti and Camera said Pontanelli would report tomorrow (28th March).
7. Major Temple explained that he did not want H.E. Berruti or Dott. Camera to think that they were being blamed in any way for these delays. It was the officials themselves who were to blame.
8. Berruti said he appreciated this.

9. Major Temple then mentioned the new plan for provision of officials for the North. Under this plan a minimum of correspondence should be required but if officials continued to cause delays the position would become impossible when the front broke and the North opened up. The Vice President had asked Major Temple to get his Excellency here to impress on him the importance and urgency of the position.
10. Berruti asked if the Sub Commission had any proposals to make for improving the situation.

11. Major Temple suggested a time limit after which sanctions would be imposed on an official who failed to move.
12. Dott. Camera replied that if they had enough officials for the posts there would be no trouble but the great shortage of officials had made it very difficult to get any action. Officials were prepared to risk being sacked sooner than go to the North where conditions are very hard as they can't find lodgings or food and have to leave their families behind thus adding to their heavy expenses. He suggested that the financial conditions of Italian Government officials in A.M.C. territory should be improved in order to make the jobs more attractive. He suggested that the Finance S/C should double the present allowance given to officials in A.M.C. territory.

13. Major Temple said he would present any such proposition the Ministry wished to make to the proper authorities. This Sub Commission was worried about a possible breakdown in administration when the North was liberated and would help in every way possible. That was the reason for asking H.E. SUBJECT : Appointments and promotions of Prefects.

Some Prefects of Italian liberated provinces, but not yet turned over to the Administration of the Italian Government, are sending to this Ministry requests of ratification of appointments or promotions of officials attached to the Prefecture.

In order to avoid useless and premature correspondence, this Ministry has to point out that so far it is unable to take into consideration such requests, without unduly interfering in AMG territories in which the AMG is the only authority who can take any measures, and also without eventually prejudicing the disposition of general character which might be taken, in agreement with the Allied authorities, at the moment of the turning back of other liberated provinces to the Italian administration.

Moreover it is pointed out that, according to the rules in force, the position of the single state official, with regards to appointments and promotions, must be estimated together with the others who find themselves having the same requisites and also, according to general agreements between the Italian government and the Allied authorities, the appointments and nominations, if made by the AMG, must not be definitive, but temporary. This Ministry will be very grateful to the Local Government S/C if the Prefects of the Provinces under AMG are notified accordingly.

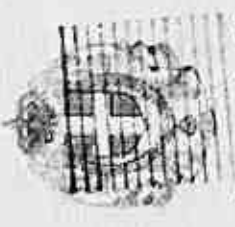

2. Prefects will address correspondence to the provincial commissioner who will forward it to this headquarters with his recommendation. This H.Q. will in turn forward it to U.S. Allied Commission with our recommendations and from Allied Commission it will be sent to the appropriate Italian Ministry with the comments of Allied Commission. The same procedure will apply for correspondence in the reverse direction.

3. Unless the method outlined in paragraph 2 is used the Italian Government will delay their answer until they have been satisfied that all the Army/AFB agencies concerned approve the recommendations or requests made by the Prefect.
