NOTES ON INTERVIEW

PLACE: Ministry of Interior, Municipio, Salerno

DATE & TIME: 15th June, 1944. 1000 hours.

PRESENTER: H.E., Dr. Aldo, Minister of Interior

1. Captain Temple referred to the message sent to him over the telephone yesterday from the Ministry, through the Italian Liaison Section, from which he understood that the Ministry did not think they could complete the preparation of the list of Prefects.

He said that he was rather concerned and hoped that this did not mean that the Minister had abandoned his original suggestion that such a list should be prepared.

2. The Minister said that he was in a particular difficulty at the moment because he was about to go out of office and another Minister to come in.

3. He had consulted with Boroni, who entirely agreed with the idea of having such a list. The understanding with Colonel Spicer that the Ministry would prepare the list, therefore, still holds.

4. The Minister said, however, that he now found it impossible to go on completing the list from government resources in south Italy. There were not enough career Prefects or Vice-Prefects available for the purpose.

5. The government knew, however, that there were many Prefects in Rome who had either escaped from their Provinces or had been working at the Ministry there. If the preparation of the list could be delayed for a few days until these Rome officials could be obtained, the position would be clearer.

6. The Minister said he would certainly go on nominating a candidate for this or that Province, as they become liberated, and these would have to be non-career men, but he could not prepare a list that would be of any use without drawing on Rome officials.

7. Captain Temple said the Sub-Commission is now empowered to authorize the entry of Italian government officials from Salerno to Rome and he would set the Minister said he was very grateful indeed

7. Captain Temple said the Sub-Commission is now empowered to authorize the entry of Italian government officials from Salerno to Rome and he would set the machinery in motion immediately. The Minister said he was very grateful indeed to hear this. He himself could probably not go to Rome at this time. He promised to telephone the names of those who would constitute the advance party, as soon as possible.
8. The Minister said he would certainly consult the new government about the names to go on the list. In fact, he would propose to include in it some persons nominated by Boromi.
9. Captain Temple told the Minister that the formal approval of AOC to his proposal that future AMG appointments should be called "Prefetti Reggenti" had just been received and instructions had been set out accordingly to all regions.
10. H.E. said he was very glad to hear this and greatly appreciated the help Colonel Spicer had given. He promised to inform Boromi of this.
11. The Minister asked to be informed when Col Spicer comes back, as he would like an opportunity to take leave of him.

NOTE: Both Captain Temple and myself feel that what finally cleared the air was the AOC approval to the use of the title "Reggente". It was evident to us that Ajdisio, not knowing whether or not AOC had formally agreed to this, was intending

to construct his list out of career people only - that he had practically exhausted the career officials he has in the south of Italy, and as to non-career people, his difficulty is that he must choose some one whom the new Italian government would accept.

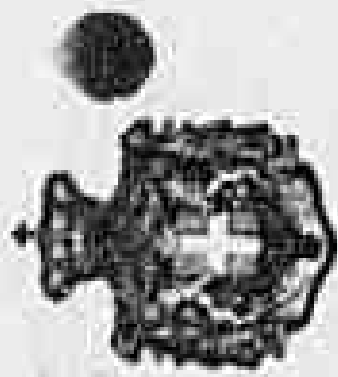

1. In reply to your communication of 17th May, I am to inform you that your proposal to send a limited number of your Ministry's officials into Rome at an early date after its liberation has the approval of the Allied Control Commission.

2. Will you please nominate and list in short particulars of the officials who will be sent under this arrangement who should be limited to a total of six.

3. The party will be sent to the City at a time to be determined by the appropriate authorities who will notify this Sub-Commission. On receipt of this notification I will immediately communicate with you. The party should be prepared if necessary to move on short notice.

4. To enable transport arrangements to be prepared will you please state if you can supply the vehicles for the purpose or if you desire any help from me.

5. To prevent any doubt between us I make it clear that the above relates only to the particular party of Ministerial Officials for which you applied and is separate from the other arrangements we have been discussing for the provision if required, of officials in the Rome administration.
