SUBJECT: Interview with Mormile, Prefect of Benevento

DATE : 11 October 1944

1. The Prefect, MORMILE, came to see Col. Spicer because he had received a cable from the Prime Minister, Boromi, stating that as of the 11th October he was to be at the disposal of ACC, and that he was to be substituted in his position at Benevento by Rosso.

2. He had been told that we could throw some light on the situation. I ascertained from my file that he was to be made available for an assignment in a northern province, and that in the meantime he was to be in Rome, subject to call. The Prefect explained that he did not want to give the impression that he was unwilling to take assignment north; that as a matter of fact he was quite disposed to do anything in the service of his country.

3. He merely wanted to point out that he had been ill for two months with some stomach trouble and that within thirty or forty days he would be able to get proper medical care, so that his health would be sufficiently restored to enable him to withstand the rigors of any difficult assignment.

4. I informed him that there was no immediate assignment for him and that he would have some opportunity while awaiting assignment to take care of himself. That seemed to satisfy him sufficiently.

5. He now lives in Rome, having already left Benevento. His address is Via Saura 22, Piazza Tuscolo, Interno 13, Rome. He has no telephone but he gave me the telephone number of a friend who lives in the same floor; namely, 760466. Incidentally, he indicated that there was no current in the building, as a consequence of which water is not pumped up in the apartment and he wondered if we could be of any help. I told him that the distribution of current is in the hands of the Italian authorities, and that he should take the matter up with them.

6. Mormile stated that if it were at all possible he would like to be Prefect of Padua. He knows Padua only as a tourist, however. The reason he asked was a personal one again; namely, he would like to be near a place where his wife, who suffers from rheumatic fever, could get medical aid. His family consists of a wife and one child.

1. The Prefect, MORMILE, came to see Col. Spicer because he had received a cable from the Prime Minister, Bonomi, stating that as of the 11th October he was to be at the disposal of ACC, and that he was to be substituted in his position at Benevento by Rosso.

2. He had been told that we could throw some light on the situation. I ascertained from my file that he was to be made available for an assignment in a northern province, and that in the meantime he was to be in Rome, subject to call. The Prefect explained that he did not want to give the impression that he was unwilling to take assignment north; that as a matter of fact he was quite disposed to do anything in the service of his country.

3. He merely wanted to point out that he had been ill for two months with some stomach trouble and that within thirty or forty days he would be able to get proper medical care, so that his health would be sufficiently restored to enable him to withstand the rigors of any difficult assignment.

4. I informed him that there was no immediate assignment for him and that he would have some opportunity while awaiting assignment to take care of himself. That seemed to satisfy him sufficiently.

In reference to the situation pointed out in the letter indicated above, we wish to inform you that the vicarious functions in the Prefecture of Benevento and those of Inspector in the Prefecture of Avellino, are carried out respectively by Vice-prefect Inspector Dr. Eduardo PAPPACENA, acting as vice-prefect vicar and by Vice-prefect Inspector Domenico MARINO.

In the Prefecture of Salerno the vicarious duties are carried out by Vice-prefect Inspector Dr. MANCINI and those of Inspector by the Counsellor of 1st class Dr. SANTORO.

At present this Ministry is not able to assign a ~~Deputy~~ Vice-prefect to the Offices of Benevento and Salerno.

However, it is not unusual for the higher grade functions to be carried out by officials who belong to the grade immediately inferior.

Moreover, considering that the official holding the office of Inspector in the Prefecture of Avellino, is in very poor conditions of health and for this reason on regular leave of absence, this Ministry will not fail to revise at the earliest possible moment, the situation of this Office, in order to have the duties of inspection thoroughly fulfilled.
