PREFECTURE OF BARI

BARI, 6 August 1944

Vice prefect Comm. Giuseppe NICOLI, an excellent official in every respect, has been working most satisfactorily for eight years in the Prefecture of Bari to the great advantage of the Administration and arousing wide public esteem.

As your Ministry is certainly aware, he well deserves to end his career in a manner befitting his many years of honest, appreciable work, which received no acknowledgement during the past regime owing to his open disapproval of fascist political tendencies. He is advanced in years; has seen 44 years of service, seven of which he passed in another Administration.

His health however is weak from daily work, as revealed by the enclosed doctor's certificate, and he has need of the assistance of his sisters living with him.

"He would not yet be able to undertake a voyage to Rome in the ordinary way, nor could he overcome the difficulties of such poor boarding conditions for him and his relatives, who cannot leave him unassisted. I therefore suggest, in the interest of the Administration, that he be allowed to remain a little longer at Bari, where he will be just as useful to the State."
