The possibility of requisitioning the building is dependent on the curtailment of the British and American occupation and commitments in Foggia, and whilst I cannot say with authority what date we shall be sufficiently reduced to enable us to remove to smaller premises - I anticipate the earliest would be September.

3. The Prefect of Foggia has already approached me on the subject of accommodation - and the U.S. authorities - whose sphere of influence it is, and he would be content with any large building, and it has been promised that the first to fall vacant shall be placed at his disposal. It is anticipated that the ex-Fascist HQ, now the American Red Cross will be vacated before this building and the Prefect has informed me that it would be suitable. However, you can be assured that his need is appreciated and every assistance and consideration will be given.

SUBJECT: Note of interview - Dott. Giovanni PALAMARA, Prefect of Foggia.

DATE : 27 March 1945.

PRESENT: Dott. PALAMARA
Major Ralph R. Temple
Sig. Arrigo NICH, interpreting.

1. The new Prefect, Dott. Giovanni PALAMARA, visited the office today. He is to replace Gen. COIRONI. He asked whether we had any instructions for him, and I explained that under the new arrangement, the Allied Commission will not take an active affirmative interest in the province, but will be available for any advice that he may seek.

2. He asked whether we had any objection to his changing the location of the seat of the capital of the province, which he understood is now Lucera, back to Foggia. He said the Italian Ministry had no objection. I said we had none, but suggested that he stop in to see Brig. Durlop at Naples, before he formally reported to his station at Foggia. I said I was sure that the brigadier, in his capacity of Regional Commissioner, would have some interesting observations to pass on to him. He said he would do so, and I gave him a card of introduction to Brig. Durlop.

3. Dott. PALAMARA impressed me as being an energetic, wide-aware official, quite interested in his job.

SUBJECT: Movement of Prefects.

24 February 1945

TO : His Excellency the Minister of the Interior.

Your Excellency:

1. I refer to your letter No. 6243 Gabinetto, dated 22 February 1945, and delivered to this office by Gov. CAMERA this afternoon.

2. Chieti: The Allied Commission approves of your proposal to remove the present prefect at Chieti, Avv. MIRIELLA Castano, and approves also the proposal to appoint Dott. VOLPI, Goffredo, to be Prefect of that province in his place.

3. Foggia: The Allied Commission also agrees to the proposal to recall Gen. GÖTTSCHE Etters from Foggia and to appoint to be Prefect of that province Dott. PALAMARA Giovanni, at present prefect of Nuoro.

4. Pescara: Your proposal to recall the present Prefetto Reggente of this province, the Vice Prefect Dott. PAGG Cesare, and to employ him in the Ministry with inspective functions until the judgment of the War Crimes Commission upon him is known, is likewise approved. The proposal to appoint in his place as Prefect of Pescara Dott. RIZZA Giulio Cesare will require some inquiries on my part and I will write you again about this as soon as possible. In the meantime, I shall be glad to know the address of Dott. RIZZA. I understand from Gov. CAMERA that he may be living either in Rome or Rieti.

5. Nuoro: The proposal to appoint Avv. VILLAVANTE Carlo to be Prefect of this province in place of Dott. PALAMARA is likewise agreed.

6. Matera: I am not yet in a position to give you an answer as to the position of the present Prefetto Reggente, Dott. TAMBURINO Guido

1. Berruti said the Ministry would propose to remove General Ettore COIRONI, the present Prefect Regent of Foggia. He had been retired from the army on grounds of incompetency, and while a bad General might still be a good Prefect, yet this retirement was bound to affect General COIRONI's prestige and authority in Foggia.

2. To substitute him, Berruti proposed PALAMARA the present Prefect of Nuoro in Sardinia. Colonel Spicer said he formed a high opinion of this Prefect which was shared by the Regional Commissioner and he wanted to use him in North. It would however be a useful move to bring him back to the mainland and therefore he could agree to the proposal. *4307*

3. Berruti said they would now submit it formally in writing.

SUBJECT: Prefect for Foggia Province

TO : RG, Southern Region.

1. Reference letter sent by Col. Temperley to this Sub Commission dated 26 October, file R/1164, I have discussed this matter with the Deputy Chief of Staff, Brigadier Upjohn, who agrees with me that you be given an opportunity to review the situation regarding the retention of General COTRONI as Prefect of Foggia Province after a few weeks.

2. I should like to point out a fact that you are very likely aware of; namely, the difficulty in getting efficient Prefects with sufficient energy and drive which COTRONI is alleged by the Zone Commissioner to be lacking now. As a consequence, there is no guarantee *4384* that a replacement of the Prefect would be any more efficient than the present one. In any event, will you please advise as to the position in a few weeks.

1. Attached hereto is copy of Foggia Zone letter FP/1130 of 23 October. In the opinion of the Regional Commissioner this excellent letter paints a very fair picture of General COTRONEI. In AMG days the General proved a useful vehicle for the transmission of AMG orders. Provided AMG clearly took the responsibility, he was always prepared to do what he was told. On his own under the Italian Government, he has obviously proved a failure. In the interest of everyone he should be dismissed.

2. It is possible that General COTRONEI could still be of service to his country and to the Allies in a position where less initiative and drive is required, but where his past association with the Allies, his clean record and his loyalty to Italy would be of value. Because of the long and pleasant association with him, the Regional Commissioner would be happy if some such post could be found.

3. In short, General COTRONEI does not deserve to be sacked with ignominy, but whether or not another post can be found an early change is desirable.

1. In accordance with the request of the Regional Commissor on 10th Oct 4, I am forwarding a more comprehensive report on the report of FOGLIA.

STORY TELLER.

2. General COMBONI was appointed prefect of FOGLIA under A.G. in January, 1944.

3. Until July, 1944, when the Province was handed back to the King of ITALY, he was, I understand, most cooperative in carrying out all orders and instructions issued by the Provincial Commissioner.

4. The responsibility for government under A.G. and the initiative and drive required for its application rested solely with the Provincial Commissioner.

5. Now, however, the Prefect must assume these responsibilities and provide the initiative, energy, & determination which, with our co-operation, are essential for the Government of the Province.

6. It is the lack of these qualities which in my opinion, renders him unsuitable for his present appointment.

7. He is generally weak and vacillating when called upon to take decisions.

8. He is, in most respects, a plodder rather than a leader, and invariably takes the line of least resistance when called on to decide any issue.

9. He appears to know what is going on throughout the Province in a general way, but has no counsel worth the name in law, planning, financial management, & political issues.

4. The responsibility for government under S.S. and the initiative
are reserved for its application rester solely with the Provincial
Commissioner.

5. Now, however, the project must assume these responsibilities and provide the initiative, energy, and supervision which, with our cooperation, are essential for the Government of the Province.
6. It is the lack of these qualities which in my opinion, renders him unsuitable for his present appointment.
7. We have carefully evaluated whom we will turn to give general res.
8. In my view, a "Platzherr" rather than a "Leader", and invariably takes the line of least resistance when called on to discuss an issue.
9. He appears to know what is going on throughout the Province in a general way, but when like counsel ought be of most value it is lacking.
10. His speeches are long and wearisome to listen to and never vary.
11. He repeats his self continually, both in public speeches and conversation, and on several occasions I have seen a genuine look of bewilderment on the faces of his audience.
12. His speech to the Communist meeting on the occasion of the Soviet Delegation visit, was much too long for the occasion and was punctuated by shouts of "Be practical!"
13. General COMONEN is a distinguished soldier and has a great deal of manner. He is, however, over 50 years of age, and in my opinion, has lost the vitality, vision or adaptability of mind to grapple with the many social and economic problems facing the Province today.
14. I believe these opinions to be shared by the literary commentaries in power and by most responsible people in the Province.
