SUBJECT: Vice Prefect DEGLI ALBERTI.

10 August 1945

TO : The Minister of the Interior.

1. Reference is made to the Ministry's letter No. 5000 (Dir. Gen. Pers.) dated 11 July 1945, in which it was suggested that the above-mentioned Vice Prefect be appointed to the Prefecture either of Modena or of Bologna as might be thought best by Allied Military Government. The Regional Commissioner for Emilia decided to appoint Dott. DEGLI ALBERTI to be Vice Prefect of Modena, retaining in the Prefecture of Bologna the existing Vice Prefect Dott. DE VITA. On 27 July, Dott. DEGLI ALBERTI was directed to proceed to Modena, accordingly.

2. A letter has just reached this HQ from the former Regional Commissioner of Emilia in which it is stated that Dott. DEGLI ALBERTI at first promised to leave for Modena, stating however that he would ask the Prefect of Modena for permission to allow him to return immediately to Bologna to continue a course of medical treatment. On 3 August, however, it was learned that in spite of his promise, he had not in fact left Bologna.

3. The Provincial Commissioner of Bologna was not satisfied with the genuineness of the excuse offered by this Vice Prefect and accordingly on the 4th of August suspended him from office and directed that he should cease to receive any salary.

4. The Province of Modena accordingly remains without a Vice Prefect Inspector.

5. The foregoing facts are communicated for the information of the Ministry and for any action the Ministry may think fit to take.

1. Following your instructions I gave orders on 27th July to Vice-Prefetto Degli Alberti to report at once to the Prefect of Modena. He promised to do so, stating however that he would ask the Prefect of Modena to allow him to return immediately to Bologna to continue a course of treatment he was having for his health. He also complained generally of his state of health.

2. On August 3rd I learnt that Degli Alberti had still not left for Modena. Interviewed by me to-day he produced the enclosed copy letter (not addressed to me) to justify his failure to report to Modena.

3. I reminded him he had promised me on 27th July that he would leave at once for Modena. I have written the enclosed letter to the Prefect and recommend that Degli Alberti be dismissed from the service of the state as summarily as possible. I am convinced that even if he were persuaded to go to Modena he would be useless there.

1. Major Temple informed Dott. CATRUCCI that the Ministry's nominee for the position of Prefect of Cremona--Dott. CIANCHETTI--was not acceptable to the S/C and added that a letter had been addressed to the Ministry on 1 August requesting a further nomination. Major Temple pointed out that local Government conditions in the northern provinces were somewhat delicate at present and it was our policy to send to the North only those Prefects who were known to be good and to have irreproachable records. Major Temple asked Dott. CATRUCCI to let the S/C have the names of the new nominees as soon as possible. Dott. CATRUCCI said that he regretted that the S/C was unable to accept CIANCHETTI, since the Government knew of no objection to him. However, he fully appreciated the need for the best officials in the North and he would submit a new name as soon as possible.

2. Dott. CALERA said that owing to the great shortage of officials, President PARRI had said that those officials already at the disposal of the Ministry in Rome should be used first. Dott. CALERA said that Major William had already agreed to have included in the pool those Prefects who might have some minor charges of disfavor against them. However, President PARRI was anxious to send to the North Prefects against whom no objection could possibly be made, particularly as far as expatriation was concerned.

3. Major Temple raised the question of the Ministry's nomination of DE ROSA for the position of Prefect of Isona, and said that no biographical details had been received.

4. Dott. CATRUCCI handed a letter containing these details to Major Temple and said that DE ROSA was not subject to expatriation proceedings.

5. Major Temple stated that he believed the details to be incorrect insofar as they stated DE ROSA had been Prefect of Isona during the period 1943-1944. Our records indicated that ROSA had been Prefect in that Province during the same period.

1. Major Temple informed Dott. CATENACCI that the Ministry's nominee for the position of Prefect of Cremona--Dott. GIANNINELLI--was not acceptable to the S/C and added that a letter had been addressed to the Ministry on 1 August requesting a further nomination. 6. Major Temple said that from the man's record he seemed to be experienced and he would probably be acceptable. Major Temple asked that DE ROSA be sent to the S/C for an interview as soon as possible. Dott. CATENACCI said he would do this.

7. Major Temple then spoke of Rovigo. A request had been made in the middle of July for a VP for Rovigo and we had suggested that a consigliere fit may be suitable. Major Williams had asked the Prefect of Rovigo to write direct to the Ministry on this matter and we had no information as to whether this had been done. In any event we had promised, and had written to the Ministry yesterday, that he had written. Our reports show that a VP is needed in Rovigo, particularly as someone with training was essential for the compilation of electoral lists. Dott. GAZZUCCI said he would take up the matter.

8. Major Temple then spoke of Ravenna, stating that there was urgent need for both a VP and a VPL. Major Temple gave a resume' of the correspondence which had already taken place with the Ministry on this subject and asked Dott. GAZZUCCI to give this matter his urgent attention. Dott. GAZZUCCI promised to take the matter up.

9. Major Temple said that the Ministry had been asked to nominate a Prefect for Modena. Dott. GAZZUCCI said that the Ministry were proposing General ZANETTI, who is in the pool, for Modena. General ZANETTI would be promoted Prefetto del Regno if and when he was appointed Prefect of Modena.

10. Major Temple stated that he thought General ZANETTI would probably be acceptable and asked Dott. GAZZUCCI to make arrangements to have General ZANETTI report to Rome as soon as possible.

SUBJECT: Note of interview - AC HQ

DATE : 4th August 1945 - 11:00 hours

PRESENT: Gen. Dima ZANETTI
 Captain W.I. Cunningham - Local Government Sub Commission
 Sig. Arrigo NICE, interpreting

1. Gen. ZANETTI called here this morning. He said he had come from the Ministry and had been told he was the Prefect for MODENA. We had a talk on conditions there and Gen. ZANETTI impressed me very favourably.
2. I asked if he was ready to go and he said that as an old soldier he was always ready to move anywhere he was ordered. It would not be fair to MACERATA if he ~~would~~ without going back for a few days. He explained that he had not been warned of the move but had only received a telegram which told him to come to the Ministry at Rome to receive an "urgent communication". Therefore he had come immediately. He would require a few days to ~~hand~~ over to his VPV. He would go to MODENA on Thursday or Friday next at the latest. He had his own car and would go direct from MACERATA.
3. I pointed out that as Emilia Region had now been handed back to the Italian Government it was now a matter to arrange with them but I knew that the need for a Prefect at MODENA was urgent.
4. Gen. ZANETTI asked of I could tell him anything about the previous Prefect and officials at MODENA. I did so. He recognised TACOLI's name and said he knew him slightly. He thought that TACOLI probably wanted to get back to his private practice.
5. Gen. ZANETTI expressed confidence that he would be able to handle the Political parties all right. He was a native of Emilia and knew the people.
6. Gen. ZANETTI said he would go back to the Ministry and tell them when he could move to MODENA. He hoped he would see some Allied Officers when he got to MODENA. When AMG was at MACERATA he had had an easy time. It was more difficult when the Province went back to the Italian Government but there was nothing he had not been able to handle.
7. I thanked Gen. ZANETTI for his call and wished him ~~back~~ in his new Province. The General asked that he should be remembered to Major Temple whom he had met at Macerata.

1. Dett. CAMERA said he had called to tell us that TACCOLI, the present Prefect Regent of Modena, had called to see the Under-Secretary of State SPATARO recently and told him he wished to resign from his office. The Under-Secretary wanted to know if in his place we would accept Avv. GERLO, the present Prefect Regent of Terri. GERLO had been appointed by AMG. Moreover, he was a Christian-Democrat as was TACCOLI, so that the balance of the "equilibrium of the parties" would be preserved.

2. I asked if TACCOLI had communicated his wish to resign to the FC. CAMERA said he did not know: TACCOLI did not say so when he was at the Ministry.

3. I said we could give no answer until we knew the views of the RC and FC. As to GERLO, RC and FC might desire to have a career Prefect or some other person. I promised to communicate with RC as soon as possible.

Prefects of provinces with AMG enclaves

4. CAMERA referred to the provinces of Naples, Pisa and Livorno, the capital cities of which were still under AMG. He inquired whether we considered it necessary for AG to give approval to new appointments of Prefects to these provinces on the grounds that parts of them were still under Military Government.

5. I said no. I thought the question had been considered some time ago within the S/C and resolved ~~in the negative~~. CAMERA said the Ministry would, of course, inform us of any changes so that the local Commissioners could be kept in touch. I told CAMERA he had anticipated a suggestion I was about to make myself.

2. The Under-Secretary of State also desires to know whether, in the event of TACOLI resigning, AMC would accept in place of him Avv. GERLO, present Prefect Regent of Terni. Avv. GERLO was appointed to his present position by AMC: he is, moreover, a Christian-Democrat as is TACOLI, which the Ministry say would preserve the "equilibrium of the parties". 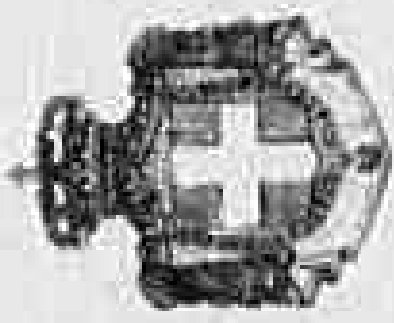

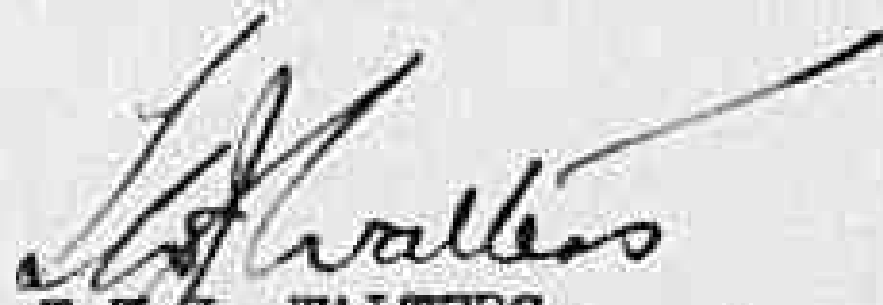

1. I told H. E. MICALI that I had come to talk to him about the case of the VPI for Modena, PIZZARI, who had been sent back by the PC as unsuitable because of his fascist background. We were disturbed at this as PIZZARI had been nominated by the Ministry in accordance with our agreed policy and accepted by this S/C. However, I had a long interview with both the PC and the Prefect of Modena and they were both quite definite that PIZZARI could not be used as the people of the Province would not work with him and his life would be in danger. We would, of course, have to be guided by the opinion of the PC who knew the local circumstances.
2. MICALI said he had a feeling that PIZZARI had made his case as black as possible when talking to the PC and the Prefect, as he had not wanted to go to Modena. He then asked did we wish to change the policy regarding the supply of officials.
3. I said that a change of policy had not yet been considered but that the PC and the Prefect of Modena were both very anxious to get a good efficient VPI whose background would permit him to be used in that Province.
4. MICALI said that he would give a new nomination for Modena as soon as possible. In future also they would try to pick men with reference to the political state of the Province concerned and would try to avoid nominating "censured" officials except for quiet and settled Provinces.
5. We then discussed the position of officials for Bologna, Ferrara and Reggio. The results are noted on the minute sheets of the respective files.

PIZZARI was selected for the position in accordance with the policy settled between Allied Commission and the Ministry of Interior that Appointment should provide the standard of suitability for service, and if an official has received no greater punishment than "censure", he could be used. It is pointed out that there is a great shortage of career officials and that 40 per cent of those remaining in Italian government territory had sufficient fascist qualifications to require them to be submitted to Appointment. A system of screening proposed officials at this RE. and clearing them with the REs before they moved would result in endless delays as three out of every four officials would go sick or find some other reason for not moving at the last moment after all the arrangements had been made. Experience has shown that very rarely does the first official proposed by the Ministry of Interior and accepted by this Sub Commission reach his destination. Sometimes as many as five different officials are nominated and approved before one can be made to move.

FROM : Captain W.I. CUMMINGS

1. I talked with the PC. both before and after seeing the Prefect and passed on some of the Prefect's views to the PC.
2. Prefetto Reggente Avv. Alfonso TACOLI is an extremely good man. Hard-working and cooperative. He is a lawyer and has always been antifascist. He founded the Comitato Liberazione Nazionale in Modena 3 years ago. He was the obvious choice as Prefect. Even when Col. Whineray was in Florence months before Modena was liberated he met people who had come through the lines. These were of many political creeds but they were unanimous in naming TACOLI as the outstanding man for Prefect. He is facing a very difficult situation as there is a lot of underground activity going on which it is impossible to pin down to any one party. There are probably several of these underground parties working separately. The Prefect has to go carefully. He feels he and his wife and children are not safe now at his house in the country and will soon move into the town where there is more protection available. The son of the President of the Tribunale Court had been kidnapped recently and no one knew whether he was dead or not. There were other similar cases and political murders some of which might be attributed to fascists and others to partisan bands all of which made the Prefect's position difficult. The Prefect is a Christian Democrat.
3. V.P.V. Giuseppe PIZZARI. He is a political appointee nominated by CLM. and is a Socialist. He works hard and well with the Prefect but, of course, neither have any experience of Provincial Administration.

I pointed out that the agreed policy in Rome was to accept officials who had been exonerated and had not had any greater punishment than "censured". The Ministry of Interior had certified that PIZZARRI had been tried and had only been "censured" and was in Rome had to accept that but of course the PC was the only one who could judge the conditions in his own Province and in view of what he had said it was obvious that PIZZARRI was not suitable for Modena. I explained the great difficulty in finding officials even "censured" ones and getting them to go North. The PC said he realised the position but thought we should screen officials and before they were sent North, notify the PC of their history and character. It was just a waste of time sending PIZZARRI to Modena. It was urgent that a really good V.P.I. should be found who would be acceptable to the people in Modena. If the PC tried to keep PIZZARRI the latter's life would be in danger. I said we would do our best to get another official from the Government, but that I could not hold out much hope that such an official as the PC required could be found and cleared without considerable delay.

5. Other officials. - There are two career Consiglieri and three Segretari. The I' Consigliere SAMPANO is one of the few good officials. Unfortunately he is compromised and may have to go. PC will try to prevent this and in the meantime has asked for two Consiglieri. I told the PC I would talk to the Prefect

and explain to him how to apply for these officials. I said that a I' Consigliere was on his way from Rome at present and I hoped that it would be possible to use him as I did not know his background. He had simply come to the Sub Commission for transportation with a certificate from the Ministry of Interior that he was not subject to any greater punishment than "censure".

6. *Deputazioni Provinciali*. Could not be formed yet as the nominees kept resigning for various causes. There is a lot of terrorism going on and it is difficult to get people to take positions. He is now giving a letter to the Prefect (see Report n.8 para 5) which may cause the parties to reach agreement on their nominations.

7. *Giunta Provinciale Amministrativa* - There are *Giunte Comunali* in most Communes. Some are not much good. The PC is short of officers but they are getting round and regularising the position as quickly as possible. There are only 2 CAOs for 46 Communes and the Police Officer, Legal Officer etc., were helping as well.

9. *Sindaci* are functioning in all communes. They are a mixed lot and several will have to be changed.

We talked about it again and I told him the main machinery necessary was that Sindaci and Segretari Comunale should be organized in all Comunes and the other Local Government agencies established as soon as possible.

14. The PC was very much against the Decree authorizing the collecting of subscriptions by Partisan organizations as he considered it an encouragement to their collecting by force of "voluntary" subscriptions which was already too well organized.

15. He did not consider the Province could be handed over to the Italian Government for a long time. Conditions were too unsettled and it was largely a matter of Public Safety.

He impressed me as a very liberal minded gentleman who is very worried about conditions in his Province and especially at the way in which the Communists are recruiting people to their party by every means possible including threats and violence. He stated that he "had not fought Fascism for twenty-five years just to see it come back again under a different name and colour and in a worse form". He said there was a reign of terror going on and those who could were moving out of the Province and going to Switzerland or to Southern Italy. It was only comparatively few who could do this. It was very difficult to get good men for Local Government positions as most of them were afraid to act owing to threats and oppression. It was mostly a question of Public Security and until a strong organization was built up he as Prefect couldn't do much as there was no use giving orders unless there was sufficient power to enforce them. He was also worried about the Partisans. He was a Partisan himself but the good partisans had only fought for their country and gone back to their homes without trouble when the fighting was over. The present bands were dangerous. I promised to do what I could, but explained the difficulties.

4. I' Consigliere SANTORO Nicola. In Capo Gabinetto and is a very good official. It would be hard to get a better. He is compromised having sworn allegiance to the Fascist Republic Party as each member of the Prefettura was compelled to do, but he had not joined the republican Party nor was he mixed up in a personal manner with the many dishonesties of the late Prefect. SANTORO is a man who obeys his superior officers whoever he is, Fascist or otherwise, and the Prefect will try to keep him. The other Consigliere is DE VITTORIS 2' grado "a mediocre man without praise and without blame". There are two career Segretari. All these officials are compromised but will be kept if possible. I explained to the Prefect the manner in which to ask for reinforcements or replacements from the Ministry of Interior if and when necessary.

5. The Deputazione Provinciale was not yet established because they could

not reach agreement on the President who was to be a Socialist nominee. The Socialists only good nominee was 90 years old and now refused to act and their second string was so mediocre that nominees of other parties did not wish to act with him. The Vice President was a liberal and an excellent man. He had in fact been President of the Deputazioni in the days before Fascism but he could not be a President now as that position was promised to the Socialists. He refused to act with the present Socialist nominee and had now resigned. He had agreed to act with the former Socialist nominee. As soon as a President was agreed on the other members would be quickly found. It was a very difficult political situation. The Prefect wondered if the P.C. would strengthen his hand by giving him an order that Deputazioni should be in operation before a certain period elapsed otherwise the P.C. would appoint a Commissario Prefettorio for the Province. H.E. thought this would go a long way to stop the Political Parties bickering and make them come to an agreement. I said I would convey this suggestion to the P.C.

(NOTE: The Prefect saw the P.C. later and they arranged between them a form of a letter to be sent by the P.C. to the Prefect which he can use as a lever to settle the problem).

6. Giunta Provinciale Amministrativa. None at present. Will be formed as soon as Deputazioni meet.

10. Jurisdiction. The Commission has been set up and was at present examining cases. No trials had been held yet however - again for political reasons. The members of the Court were afraid of trouble if they gave light sentences but they wished to follow the law and would probably not satisfy public opinion.

11. Preparation of electoral lists. H.N. was of the opinion that this is not an appropriate time for the preparation of electoral lists. He is afraid that many people "now in the grave will appear on the lists and many living people will be in the grave so far as the list is concerned". I told him that the "graveyard vote" was not unknown in other countries and that the Agents of the candidates checked this practice at the polling booths. He replied that in pre-fascist Italy it had been known too but not the complete graveyard coming to vote! If the preparation of the lists had to go on it could be done. I told him he could employ such extra assistance as was necessary.

12. In closing the Prefect said that he would like very much to come to Rome and talk with the Government officials there on many subjects regarding his administration. I said that it was possible that this might be arranged in the future but it would be better to wait until the new Government got settled in office.

13. Attached is a pro-forma completed in the Prefettura showing the position at the date of my visit.

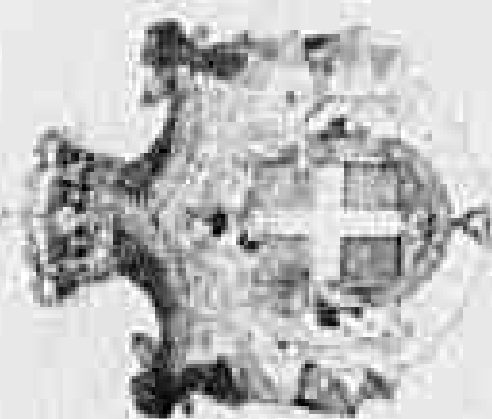

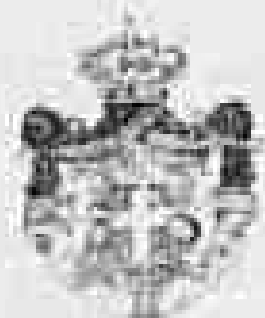

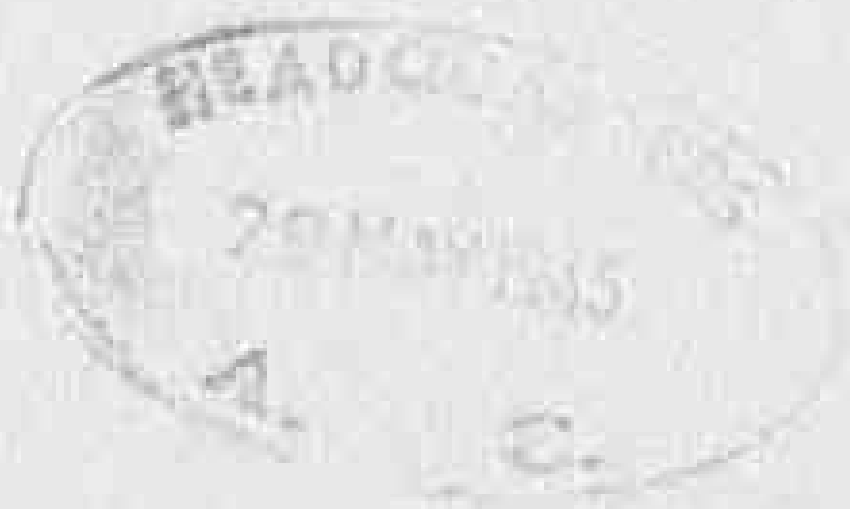

The Minister of the Interior has forwarded to me the attached biographical notes upon certain officials who appear, from his information, to have been in service at Modena Prefecture on 1 March 1944. They may or may not be in office now, of course; but the notes are forwarded (in English and Italian) in case they may be of use.

2. I would not advise attaching too much weight to the opinions expressed at the foot of each note as to the capacity and quality of the officials. These appear to be extracted from the officials' personal records in the Ministry and the somewhat stilted language which Italian Government departments use for this purpose does not always, we find, correspond to the opinions formed by AG/AMC officers, after personal experience with the Italian official in question.
