1. Dr. Celso Accatino who held office in the Prefecture of Apulia up to liberation, is still there at disposal.
2. The Prefect of Apulia on a recent visit to the Ministry brought with him a petition of Dr. Accatino asking that he should be re-employed elsewhere. This petition and the accompanying letter of the Prefect constitutes the "previous correspondence" referred to in the Ministry's letter dated 4 July 45 addressed to the Prefect of Apulia, which has been withheld by us.
3. Dr. Micalì believes Dr. Accatino is a good official and is in favor of utilizing him in some other prefecture of the North as soon as a request for such an official will be submitted to the Ministry through us. The purpose of the Ministry's letter under consideration was to clear the way for such nomination.

SUBJECT: Venice Prefecture.-Dott. INGRASSIA Domenico.

TO : AO Venetia Region (with copy to PO Venice)

1. Reference is made to your letter RM/1G of 20 August and to this Sub Commission's letter to you (reference as above) of 25 September.
2. The Ministry of the Interior advises that Dott. INGRASSIA should leave Venice and enter upon his new duties in Apulia as soon as possible. In this connection, please refer to the first sentence of para 2 of this Sub Commission's letter of 1 August.
3. If Dott. INGRASSIA has not already left, please instruct the Prefect to give him a peremptory order to obey the directions transferring him. The Italian expression for this is "diffidare" which is untranslatable, but imports a final opportunity to obey orders and that failing compliance sanctions will be imposed. The Prefect and Dott. INGRASSIA will know what it means.
4. This appears to be a case where Dott. INGRASSIA should be removed from Venice without delay. Please keep this Sub Commission informed on the position.

A few days ago we learned, to our great satisfaction, that first secretary Dr. Domenico Ingrassia had been assigned to another Prefecture. It was as if a blow of pure air had dispersed the stink of

and ourselves, a man who was transferred from a Prefecture to another because of his dirty conduct; we are highly surprised and we cannot find any excuse for Your action.

Nor we can admit your ignorance about the personality of Dr. Ingrassia because every time one of us had the opportunity to mention the wonderful Dr. Ingrassia you openly declared you were aware of his dishonesty and other bad qualities and that you disapproved them; many of us can confirm it.

Dr. Ingrassia, a physically and morally repulsing individual, has all the characteristic qualities of the fascist corruption: incapability, inefficiency, idleness, dishonesty and so forth; when we knew that he was going to be transferred to another prefecture we thought this arrangement was made by you, as it was your precise duty as a chief of the personnel and of the administrative services. We thought that in a regime of liberty that kind of individuals ought to be wiped out of the picture altogether so that they would not continue to dishonour the administration with their disgusting behaviour; however, it was a great thing for us and for our Prefecture that he was transferred.

Everyone of us was delighted, from the highest official down to the last usher; now we learn that you are the only one who is not satisfied.

We are told that Dr. Ingrassia has the merit of not having taken the oath for the republican Government when the famous Cagetti had forced us to do so; he would have certainly been the first to take it if, by mere chance, as he was going to be kicked out of the Prefecture of Trieste, he had not avoided that trouble, and now makes it a merit of it.

We now request You as the Chief of the Personnel to be honest enough to stop defending such a dirty person as Dr. Ingrassia.

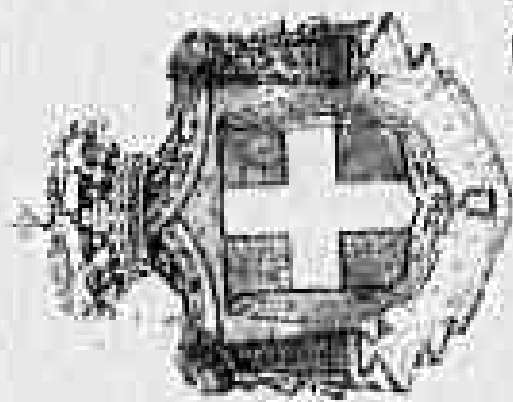

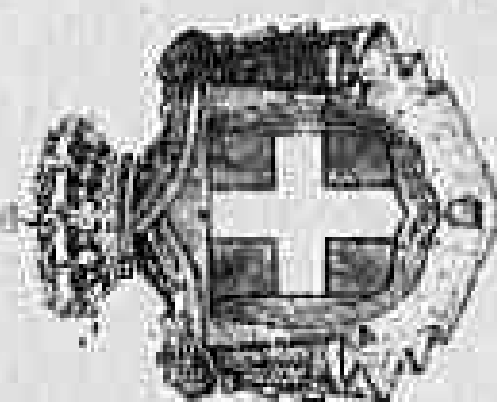
re al Suo contegno né una giustificazione né una spiegazione.
