Dear General Mac Farlane:

As you know, the R. Italian Government, to determine the position of its civil servants, who have not been able to rejoin their original offices, because of the state of war, and to provide for the needs of public offices, has issued the provisions contained in the R. Decree-Law of 3 January 1944, No. 3, which I attach herewith in copy.

From the enclosed list, transmitted by Major Rastol, chief of the office of civil affairs at Campobasso, it appears that in said province there are at present several functionaries and employees who, although not having resumed their service, continue, nevertheless, to receive their salaries.

It is not to be excluded that numerous others find themselves in identical circumstances in localities still administered by the Allied Military Government.

To be able to proceed with the return of this personnel and normalize its position in all respects, I am pleased to call to your attention the necessity that provisions similar to those issued by the Italian Government be adopted also by the Allied Authorities within the territory under its jurisdiction.

In such case the return to service and assignment to offices could be effected through the Regional Offices or the R. Prefecture.

I shall be pleased, my dear General, to know the decisions of the Allied Military Government in the matter.

1. The following communication dated 17 Jan' 44 has been received from the Head of the Prime Minister's Office:

" To meet the demands of the Civil Administration, the Italian Government has ordered all civil servants in liberated Italy who are not at their posts owing to conditions resulting from the war to resume their duties immediately.

To this end a decree R.D.3/1/1944, N3 has been published in the official Gazzetta of 3 Jan 1944, No. 1, copy attached, which also lays down the penalties for evasion.

It is requested that the possibilities of applying this decree to the territories under AMG be examined, so that the services of all civil servants of which the Government has need may be called upon, and in order to provide uniformity of treatment with personnel in the territory under control of the Italian Government".

2. The Italian Government are finding it difficult to lay their hands upon a sufficient number of reliable Officials within the 4 Provinces of Apulia. They believe that if all Italian Civil Servants in liberated Italy return to their last post of duty, it will be found that there are officials to spare.

3. I shall be glad to know what reply I am to communicate to the Italian Government.

SUBJECT: Official Gazette, 3 January 1944 (Italian Civil Servants)

TO : Vice Chief of Staff
 (through Vice President, Administrative Section)

1. In the absence of 2nd Lt. Wedleigh (A), transferred, I cannot translate this decree with accuracy, nor have I been able to trace anybody in this HQ who can do so with legal accuracy, but my opinion is that "to resume their duties immediately" in the Chief Liaison Officer's letter is not a correct rendering of "re fatto obbligo di presentarsi". It would appear to me to be better interpreted by "to report".
2. The term "all civil servants" is a wide category and might well include individuals of such strong Fascist tendencies that their employment in Governmental offices may be highly undesirable.
3. It is essential that any civil servants who report for duty should be screened before they are allowed to resume office by responsible AMG/AGC authority, viz: Security Intelligence. A recent flagrant example of "resuming office" was the appointment to the Ministerial Office by the Royal Italian Government of an officer whose services had been terminated by MOACO, Region II. Such cases, after screening, should be referred to this sub-Commission for communication of their views to the Italian Government.
4. Paragraph 9(3) of the Memorandum of 23 January 1944, dealing with AGC reorganization, however, reads: "Care should be taken, however, not to interfere directly or to give the appearance of interfering directly in or with the local administration except in real emergency."
5. My conclusion is that there is nothing to apprehend in the order provided the civil servants so reporting are fully screened before they are allowed to resume office, and that the order could, with such conditions, be equally applied in territories under AMG.
6. I consider, however, that this is a matter affecting many sub-commissions, and is one that might well be discussed at the Vice President's conference before a reply is sent.

It is requested that the possibilities of applying this decree to the territories under ACO be examined, so that the services of all civil servants of whom the Government has need may be called upon, and in order to provide uniformity of treatment with personnel in the territory under control of the Italian Government."

2. The Italian Government are finding it difficult to lay their hands upon a sufficient number of reliable officials within the 4 provinces of Apulia. They believe that if all Italian Civil Servants in liberated Italy return to their last post of duty, it will be found that there are officials to spare.
