NOTE ON INTERVIEW WITH H. S. BARRUTI AND DETT. CAMERA.

Subject: Provision of Italian Officials.

INTERVIEWED BY: Major R. B. Temple, Chief Executive Officer, Local Government Sub Commission and Captain W. I. Cunningham.

DATE: 27 March, 1965.

INTERVIEWER: Signature and go HERE.

1. Major Temple said he was raising again the old question of delays in filling positions in Prefectures. The Local Government Sub Commission was continually getting complaints from Regional Council members on this subject. He gave H. S. a list of names of the outstanding cases and noted the case of Saverio where a Reglemento Capo had been asked for on 25th October 1964 and the position had not been filled yet. Other cases such as Saverio and others were also mentioned.

2. H. S. Barruti said he would examine the list carefully. He could only repeat what had been said before. A lot of delay was due to people going sick. When people went sick the Ministry could not discharge them and indeed they were so short of personnel that they didn't know what to do.

3. Major Temple said he didn't know what could be done to instil a sense of discipline into some of these officials. The Regional Council members only looked for results and for one reason or another the results were not good.

4. Barruti said it was a very difficult situation. The Ministry were encouraging these officials to move in every way possible. They were given special allowances and other considerations if they moved.

5. Major Temple then mentioned the case of MONTANALI. He had visited the P.A. of Grosseto and personally pressed him to accept Montanali as V.P.V. who was supposed to be attending by ready to move in Rome. He had promised the P.A. that Montanali would be sent to Grosseto as soon as he (Maj. Temple) got back to Rome. The Ministry was asked for him on 24th March and so far he hadn't reported to this day.

6. Both Barruti and Camera said Montanali would report tomorrow (28th March).

7. Major Temple explained that he did not want H. S. Barruti or Dett. Camera to think that they were being blamed in any way for these delays. It was the officials themselves who were to blame.

8. Barruti said he appreciated this.

9. Major Temple then mentioned the new plan for provision of officials for the North. Under this plan a minimum of correspondence should be required but if officials continued to cause delays the penalty would become impossible when the front border and the North opened up. The Vice President had asked Major Temple to get his knowledge here to fear as in him the importance and urgency of the 2003.

1. Major Pample said he was raising again the old question of delays in filling positions in Prefectures. The Local Government Sub Commission were continually getting complaints from Cardinal O on delays on this subject. He gave H.B. a list of names of the outstanding cases and quoted the case of AMOTMA where a Magistrate Dago had been asked for on 25th October 1942 and the position had not been filled yet. Other cases such as AMBAGO and TANGAL were also mentioned.

4. Dornbusch said it was a very difficult situation. The Ministry were monitoring these officials to make in every way possible. They were given special allowances and other considerations if they moved.

5. Mayor Temple then mentioned the case of ANTONELLI. He had visited the P.C. of Grosseto and personally pressed him to accept Antonelli as V.P.V. who was supposed to be standing by ready to move in Rome. He had promised the P.C. that Antonelli would be sent to Grosseto as soon as he (Maj. Temple) got back to Rome. The Ministry was asked for him on 25th March and so far he hasn't reverted to this P.C.

7. Major Temple explained that he did not want E. A. Bernetti or Dettl, Canada to think that they were being blamed in any way for these delays. It was the officials themselves who were to blame.

18. Dott. Casanova said that if these proposals for feeding and paying officials was put in operation the Ministry of Interior would, with a clear conscience, enforce strict discipline on the officials who failed to move when ordered. At present they were not happy about taking to strict measures as conditions were so bad.

19. Major Temple asked H.V. to send a brief memo on the financial proposals and he would present it to the proper authorities. In the meantime would H.V. look over the list of outstanding cases and see if some of them could not be cleared by the end of the week.

SUBJECT : Italian Officials.

4 - MAR 1945

TO : All PC's.

1. The practice of Prefects writing direct to the Ministry of the Interior upon questions relating to the appointment, dismissal or release of, or the granting of leave to Italian Officials is becoming increasingly prevalent.

2. A further practice which has developed recently is that of Italian Officials ordered by HQ, AC to take up appointments in A.M.G. territory suddenly being overcome by acute illnesses either before or soon after they have taken up their appointments.

3. There is a great shortage of Italian Officials and both the Ministry of the Interior and Local Government Sub-Commission, HQ, AC are experiencing the greatest of difficulty in meeting the demands made upon them.

4. You will, therefore, instruct the Prefect of your Province that under no circumstances whatsoever will they write direct to the Ministry of the Interior upon questions relating to the appointment, dismissal or release of, or granting of leave to Italian Officials. Such communications will be submitted to your HQ, and, if after examination you concur in the contents, they will be transmitted to this HQ, with your recommendations. After further scrutiny by this HQ, such communications may, if it is considered desirable, be represented to HQ, AC.

5. In regard to para 2 above. All officials sent by HQ, AC to appointments in A.M.G. territory are sent with the knowledge that they are capable of working satisfactorily. In the event, therefore, of any official sent to you by HQ, AC complaining of being unable, owing to ill health, to carry out his duties, you will insist on a medical examination by an Army Doctor at the nearest Italian Military Hospital. No request for relief of such officials will be considered at this HQ unless it is supported by a medical certificate signed by an Italian Army Doctor.

SUBJECT: Note of Interview. (Local Government S/C offices)

DATE : 9 February 1945 - 11:30 hours.

PRESENT: Marchese PARENTI, Consigliere, Dir. Gen. Personale, Ministry of the Interior.

Major C. G. R. Williams, Local Government S/C
Signorina E. CARTA, interpreting.

1. The Marchese PARENTI had one or two suggestions to make with a view to securing better discipline among the officials. He drew attention to the telegraphic circular, copy of which had been sent us today, and made the point that the Ministry were no longer accepting the medical certificate of the official's private doctor, or even the Medico Provinciale, either of whom and particularly the private doctor might give the official the kind of certificate he wanted out of friendship. They were now insisting on a medical certificate of the nearest Army doctor, who was more likely to take an objective view of the case.
 2. He suggested also that after any officer of this S/C has interviewed an official, he should get in touch with the Ministry by telephone and discuss the case, as the Ministry could often tell us whether an official's excuses of illness or family difficulties, etc. had any real substance.
 3. He also suggested, if we decided to grant the official a period in which e.g. to go and fetch his luggage, we should immediately telephone the Ministry and inform them of our decision. Some officials to whom we have granted say ten days have been coming back to the Ministry and saying we granted them 30.
 4. Would we also inquire as to whether the official had reported himself to the Ministry as well as to us, and if not direct him to do so.
 5. I said these were excellent suggestions and we would certainly adopt them. In my turn, I suggested that when an official called at the Ministry first, the Ministry on their part should telephone us and let us know what he said and their opinion of any excuses he might have made to them. PARENTI readily agreed.
-
6. I recommend the above be brought to the notice of all the officers of this S/C who interview Italian officials, for them to initial as seen. We ought strictly to observe these suggestions in the future.
 7. I formed quite a good impression of PARENTI. He seems to have a better idea of the need for prompt action, decision and strict discipline than anyone else I have met in the Ministry except PARENTI.

Following the telegraphic circular concerning the transferred personnel alleging ill health as reasons to avoid or at least delay their arrival to the new office, we wish to instruct that they must be submitted by Your Excellency to a strict examination of the collegial doctor attached to the nearest military hospital. Your Excellencies must see to it that the request or proposal must be accompanied by the report of the afore-mentioned examination. However for the purpose of reconciling administrative requirements with the aspirations of the individual employees, Your Excellencies are asked to communicate the names of the officials in group A or B with a grade higher than the 10th who wish to be transferred eventually with functions belonging to a higher grade to Provinces under AMG Administration or that will be liberated in the near future, indicating in order of preference the officers to which they wish to be assigned. Kindly answer by wire

405 - A.G.P. - To provide, on the request of the Allied Commission, the necessary personnel for the services in the Prefectures of the recently liberated provinces and of those which will be liberated shortly, in substitution of the personnel which has been transferred to the North or has been compromised with the past regime, the Ministry will have to make the necessary movements.

In regards to the actual difficult moment the Ministry will make only the strictly indispensable movements and will examine closely beforehand the situation of each dependant and the needs of the service in each Prefecture, and will also give every possible economical accommodation so as to relieve the discomfort of the change of residence. To enforce these movements which have an urgent character, the Ministry trusts in the sense of discipline and comprehension of its dependants, but warns them that any eventual resistance or delaying attitude on the officials part will not be tolerated and that the provisions on the juridical status of the civilian employees and the law of the 21st of May 1940, n. 435 on the civilian mobilization will be severely enforced.
