We are now receiving fortnightly reports through Italian Government and AMG channels as to progress in regard to the preparation of the Electoral lists. If, as the result of these reports, any matters affecting AMG arise, they are sent to the Regions, while points affecting the Italian Government are taken up with the Italian Government.

As soon as AMG is withdrawn the matter becomes entirely one for the Italian Government but we have arranged with them for the continuance of fortnightly reports to this Headquarters. All points arising out of these reports will have to be taken up with the Italian Government so that they can direct and advise the local authorities. No purpose would be served by referring any matters to Liaison Officers because they are precluded from giving advice to Prefects and local government authorities.

Any reports sent in by Liaison Officers could not be as complete as and would only duplicate those received through the Italian Government. Moreover there has been so much delay in the handover of territory that the preparation of the lists will be in the closing stages by the time Liaison Officers get into action.

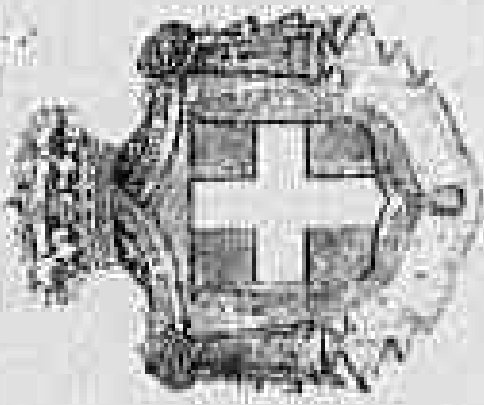

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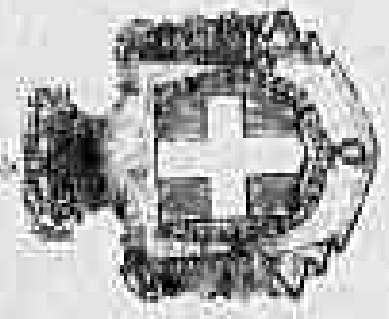

TO : A. C. Chief Liaison Officer, Bolzano

Reference the Directive for A.C. Liaison Officer forwarded under cover of 7002/EC, dated 29 September 1945.

Due to the exceptional situation in Bolzano Province the following addition to Para 2 of the Directive is forwarded for information and necessary action:

"(a) A special responsibility will devolve upon the Liaison Officer in BOLZANO Province by virtue of the existence, in that Province, of two ethnic groups with different viewpoints.

(b) In the normal course of his duties he will visit and talk with representatives of all parties; but it will not be desirable for him to receive formally either petitions, letters or delegations. Such communications should be referred either to local or Central Italian Governmental Authorities. He will explain to applicants that he is an observer only, and will invariably maintain an attitude of strict impartiality in his own speech and approach to the problem.

(c) He will on no account commit himself to any expression of opinion on behalf of the Commission or of the Allied Powers. He will endeavour, by example and demeanour, to encourage mutual understanding and tolerance between the two groups.

(d) It will be his duty to give early information to Headquarters, Allied Commission, of any circumstances which appear likely to cause a worsening of local feeling. In such cases, it would be proper for him to recommend to Headquarters, Allied Commission, the steps necessary in his judgement to prevent such a deterioration of the local position.

(e) The intervention of Italian troops in any ethnic dispute would obviously be an event likely to have serious repercussions. Liaison Officers will be scrupulously careful not to commit themselves to any action which might imply either acquiescence or disapproval of such intervention. They will however immediately report such matters to Headquarters, Allied Commission.

(f) They will at all times keep an Allied Commander informed of the

1. As you are aware, on 1 January 1946 that part of Italy which has been under Allied Military Government, with the exception of Venezia Giulia and the province of Udine, was handed back to the control of the Italian Government.

2. Attached for your information is a directive which is being sent to all Allied Commission Liaison Officers to act as a guide for them in their work.

3. I suggest that you might consider the possibility of bringing this directive to the notice of all Prefects, in order that they may be aware of the functions and powers of the Liaison Officers in their Provinces. At the same time the Prefects could be told of their reciprocal obligations to help the Liaison Officers to accomplish their missions in accordance with the general agreement between the Allied Commission and the Italian Government. They should also be reminded that the Liaison Officers are not channels between Italian officials and the Italian Government.

FUNCTIONS OF ALLIED COMMISSION LIAISON OFFICERS.

1. The first duty of Allied Commission Liaison Officers will be to keep themselves at all times informed of the situation in the area with which they are concerned. This will involve the use of all available means of information: Press, Intelligence, Summaries, etc. They will inform HQ Allied Commission direct of any circumstances arising which may in their opinion adversely affect Allied interests or influence the general policy of the Commission. They will submit a monthly report to HQ which will include comment in the political situation.

2. Liaison Officers will, by study of previous Regional monthly reports and other records, inform themselves of the present position of various Commission functions now being handed over to Italian Agencies. They will specially watch those cases where previous difficulties have been encountered.

Liaison Officers will bear in mind that HQ Allied Commission and ANHQ are interested in activities in all parts of the area with which Liaison Officers are concerned and not merely with the situation in the leading cities. Consequently Liaison Officers should make frequent trips to the smaller towns and country districts and acquaint themselves with the political and economic conditions in such districts. They must endeavor to be on the spot where trouble is expected and observe any incidents, strikes, demonstrations and the like in their areas. All Liaison Officers will remember, however, that their role is solely that of observers and reporters and they will not interfere in any way in such incidents, nor will they give any advice ~~to~~ to the Italian authorities in the handling thereof. Liaison Officers have no authority to pledge the use of Allied troops in quelling any disturbance; this is a matter for the local Allied Commander. They should, however, keep Allied Commanders informed of the course of events. In cases where they consider safety of Allied property or nationals likely to become endangered, they must inform the Allied Commanders concerned, advising HQ AC of such actions.

3. Liaison Officers will keep close touch with the senior military formation, American and British, in their areas. They will endeavour at all times to assist military formations in their relations with Italian Government departments and agencies. They must, however, remember that they are Liaison Officers and not Executive Officers and will not be able to carry out in any sense the former functions of Provincial Commissioners.

Points which require special attention are:-

- a) Disease and unrest
- b) Law cases affecting Allied personnel and property
- c) Requisitioning and derequisitioning
- d) Relations between Allied ~~forces~~ and Italian police forces.

Liaison Officers will also keep in touch with British and U.S. Consular Officers, as well as any U.S. Information Service and British Press Officials in their areas.

4. They will at all times avoid being involved in questions of Italian Local Government and, even if asked, they will NOT give official advice on behalf of the Allied Commission to Prefects or other State employees. They will, in all cases, refer the Italian local official to his Ministry in Rome. The Allied Governments are most anxious to promote free and secret elections and an essential preliminary is the preparation of a proper electoral list. Any points which affect these matters coming to the notice of Liaison Officers should be included in their monthly reports.

5. The Officer in charge Liaison Group will be responsible for discipline and administration of all Allied Commission officers in his area.

Said Circular also contained information regarding the Liaison Officers of the Allied Commission in the territory that had been handed back to the Italian Government.

In compliance with the communication contained in the memorandum of the President of the Allied Commission, as from 1st March, in the territories under the Italian Government's jurisdiction Allied Commission will limit its mission to the tasks of consultation and advice with the competent Ministries of the Italian Government. Consequently the approval of the Allied Commission is no longer required for the appointments either for offices of the Government or for local offices in the territories under the jurisdiction of the Italian Government, except for duties of a military nature.

The Italian Government is also entitled to modify nominations formerly made by the authorities of the Allied Military Government.

Beginning 1st April 1945 regional offices of the Allied Commission for Sicily, Sardinia, southern Region and Region Lazio Umbria and the officials of the Allied Commission displaced in the above mentioned territories will be withdrawn.

Representatives of Allied Commission will be sent, when necessary, in the territories under the jurisdiction of the Italian Government and, for a limited period some specialized officials with economic duties will also remain in such territories.

Allied Commission has also informed us that in some place liaison officers between the Allied Forces and the authorities will be left. These officers will have only the duty of regulating the relations between the Allied Forces located in the various provinces and the local Italian authorities, and will not have any interference in what is concerned with the Italian administration.

Said officers will be posted at: Cagliari for the provinces of Cagliari, Sassari and Nuoro; Palermo for the provinces of Palermo, Agrigento, Caltanissetta and Trapani; Bari for the Provinces of Bari, Brindisi, Foggia, Lecce, Matera, Potenza and Taranto; Naples for the provinces of Naples, Avellino, Benevento, Campobasso, Catanzaro, Cosenza, Reggio Calabria. For the city of Naples which remains under the control of the Allied Military Government, the duties of the liaison officers will be carried out by the local Commissioner at the city of Naples, while for the provinces of Abruzzi the duties will be carried out by the Regional Commissioner of Umbria Marche Region with HQ at Perugia.

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It is obvious that the reduction of the Allied control in Italy would be inefficient and inoperative if from the Italian authorities side the most complete sense of responsibility and initiative and the most conscious freedom of movement and action were not forthcoming.

The Government therefore trusts upon the most efficient cooperation from every governmental and local authorities in order that the advantages which originate from the initiative in the field both of public administration and of economics do not remain sterile and useless.

They must endeavour to be on the spot where trouble is expected and observe any incidents, strikes, demonstrations and the like in their areas. All Liaison Officers will remember, however, that their role is solely that of observers and reporters and they will not interfere in any way in such incidents, nor will they give any advice to the Italian authorities in the handling thereof. Liaison Officers have no authority to pledge the use of Allied troops in quelling any disturbance; this is a matter for the local Allied Commander. They should, however, keep Allied Commanders informed of the course of events. In cases where they consider safety of Allied property or nationals likely to become endangered, they must inform the Allied Commanders concerned, advising HQ AC of such action.

4. Liaison Officers will keep close touch with the senior military formation, American and British, in their areas. They will endeavour at all times to assist military formations in their relations with Italian Government departments and agencies. They must, however, remember that they are Liaison Officers and not Executive Officers and will not be able to carry out in any sense the former functions of Provincial Commissioners.

Points which require special attention are :-

- a) Disease and unrest.
- b) Law cases affecting Allied personnel and property.
- c) Requisitioning and derequisitioning.
- d) Relations between Allied forces and Italian police forces.

Liaison Officers will also keep in touch with British and U.S. Consular Officers, as well as any U.S. Information Service and British Press Officials in their areas.

4. They will at all times avoid being involved in questions of Italian local Government and, even if asked, they will not give official advice on behalf of the Allied Commission to Prefects or other State employees. They will, in all cases, refer to the Italian local official to his Ministry in Rome. The Allied Governments are most anxious to promote free and secret elections and an essential preliminary is the preparation of a proper electoral list. Any points which affect these matters coming to the notice of Liaison Officers should be included in their monthly reports.

5. The officer in charge Liaison Group will be responsible for discipline and administration of all Allied Commission officers in his area.

The Mayor has referred the matter to the Prefect.

FUNCTIONS OF ALLIED COMMISSION LIAISON OFFICERS

1. The first duty of Allied Commission Liaison Officers will be to keep themselves, at all times, informed of the situation in the areas with which they are concerned. This will involve the use of all available means of information: Press, Intelligence, Summaries, etc. They will inform HQ Allied Commission direct of any circumstances arising which may in their opinion adversely affect Allied interests or influence the general policy of the Commission. The comprehensive expenditure for the personnel of the new province and of those whose territory has been cut down or however modified by the present decree cannot, as a rule, be above the one, that, on the date on which the present decree shall become in force, of the provinces with the territories of which the new province has been formed save of course for what regards the allowance of economic improvements, and the put in practice of general provisions.

ART. 4

All jurisdictional and administrative affairs which, on the date on which this decree shall become in force, will still be in course at the prefectures competent for territories, shall be brought to an end by the same organs within a maximum of the six months starting on the said date.

ART. 5

By lieutenantcy decrees, on proposal of the competent Ministers, upon the opinion of the State Council in General Assembly, the agreements between the provincial administrations shall be approved or in case of contest the official plans for the restitution of the properties of the former Province of Caserta, for the patrimonial distribution and the distribution of activities and passivities also continuative and anything else necessary for the execution of the present decree, taking into account the criteria followed when the suppression took place by R. decree 20th January 1930, n.39.

ART. 6

The Government is authorized to proceed, in accordance with the provisions of the law of 20th January 1930, n.39, to the provincial circoscription.

1. The Chief Commissioner has had a conference with the Prime Minister and Under-Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs with a view to exploring the question as to what functions of Allied Commission might be discontinued in Italian Government territory, and also with regard to withdrawal of Allied Commission personnel.

2. The following tentative proposals were made and I should be glad if you will let me have your comments on them by Friday Saturday, November 18.

a) With regard to suspension of functions, it was agreed that the only functions which might be terminated were those of Education, and the Prime Minister suggested that we should discontinue supervision of Education in Italian Government territory forthwith. Education to comment please; I think Southern Region's report for October shows a definite need for continued supervision.

b) Withdrawal of personnel. The Prime Minister suggested that all personnel south of Salerno might be withdrawn as from January 1, 1945. All Sub-Commissions to comment please. Note: This does not apply to Sicily.

c) Supervision of appointments in Italian Government territory. The Prime Minister suggested that we should continue to approve the following appointments only (so far as affects Civil Affairs Section):- High Commissioners for Sicily and Sardinia, Ministers and Under-Secretaries of State, High Commissioners for operation, Deputy High Commissioners of Education, Director of Public Security, Chief of the Carabinieri. All Sub-Commissions to comment please.

SUBJECT: Allied Commission Control in Italian Territory

TO : Vice President, Civil Affairs Section

1. Insofar as the Local Government Sub-Commission is concerned, I have gone into this matter and have taken the opportunity to consult His Excellency Berruti, Chief of the Interior Cabinet, in this connection.

2. As a result, I recommend the following:

(1) That we regard what have been generally termed the "Badoglio-Mason MacFarlane letters" as in fact cancelled, and that in regard to restored Italy, we should concern ourselves no longer with appointments, transfers, promotions, or removals from office, with the exception of such removals from office which are AMG appointments and from which the incumbents cannot be removed except with Allied Control Commission consent, in accordance with the Armistice terms.

3. I suggest, however, and with this His Excellency Berruti agrees, that the Italian Government would notify us of all such appointments, transfers, promotions, and removals of Prefects or Vice-Prefects for the purposes of record.

4. In regard to non-restored Italy, I advise that the status quo should remain and that all appointments of and above the rank of Prefect and Vice-Prefect should be made with the cooperation and agreement of the Italian Government.
