SUBJECT: Future Policy in North Italy.

25th April, 1945.

TO : Civil Affairs Section.

Reference your memorandum of 24th April 14/33/CA, the following are the comments and suggestions of the Local Government Sub-Commission on the local government phase of the proposed answers:

PART I - POLITICAL

Q.4. The question of the part to be played by the Italian Government in connection with the appointments has been raised again in a conversation between the Chief Commissioner and the Prime Minister. However, the position to-date may be expressed as follows:-

Wherever possible, agreement between AMG and the CIN will be obtained. The Italian Government will not be consulted but may be asked to furnish officials who may thereafter be required by AMG.

Q.5. The old directive on the CIN provided for the dissolution of the CIN by the PC if the CIN persisted in attempting to act in an executive capacity after being warned to desist. If necessary, the assistance of the local Military Commander could be secured for this purpose. Reference will have to be made to the directive which is shortly to be issued in order to ascertain whether that provision is still retained. If it is, the answer to the question should read as follows:-

It is not intended to disband the CINAI or the CIN. They will be allowed to remain in existence to give any advice that AMG authorities may desire to seek from them. Should they fail to cooperate or insist on being executive, they will be ignored. As a last resort, to be adopted in cases of absolute necessity, the PC may dissolve the CIN. If necessary the PC may, subject to the concurrence of the SOAO or EO ask the local Military Commander to assist him for this purpose.

1. Attached is copy of C-3 20/5 of 21 April under the above heading.
2. The following answers to questions have been drafted by this Section :

PART I - POLITICAL

- Q.1 The Italian Government, which includes the Minister for Occupied Territory, will be allowed no official position in Northern Italy until such time as the territory is handed over to its control. This does not preclude the Government from expressing its views through the Allied Commission, nor from making contacts with the North under the control of the Commission.
- Q.2 No political recognition will be given to the Patriot Movement. GIN, when co-operative, will be accepted in an advisory capacity.
- Q.3 AMG Officers are being instructed to accept the advice of GIN whenever possible.
- Q.4 The Italian Government will not be consulted. Wherever possible agreement between AMG and GIN will be obtained.
- Q.5 It is not intended to disband GINAI or GIN. Should they fail to co-operate or insist on being executive, they will be ignored. Attempts to disband are considered as unlikely to be successful, and also most undesirable.
- Q.6 Such police will be regarded as any other Patriots. They may, if necessary, be employed as AMG police.
- Q.7 In all cases Carabinieri will be screened and, subject to ceiling restrictions, re-engaged if found acceptable. If not acceptable, no further action against them will be taken on the mere score of service.
- Q.8 Yes.
- Q.9 Expiration will be carried out by AMG Officers (AS EXECUTIVE MEMORANDUM 77) and the posting of General Orders 35 and 35a. Ultimately, D.L. 159 will be implemented.

Q.10 Persons found under arrest will, if charged with collaboration, be brought before Special Courts to be established for that purpose. These Courts are set up by a Decree which will be implemented at once, and will consist of a Judge with four laymen chosen from a list submitted by GIN.

Q.11 Yes, under strict control of Allied Commission, advised by AFHQ.

PART II - ADMINISTRATIVE.

Q.3 Initially AMG will carry in medical supplies. When practicable the Italian Distributing Agency, ENDESEA, will take over this task. Medical services will be established in the normal way, working through the Medico Provinciale.

Q.4 Patriots will be given the chance of enlisting in the Italian Army. The Allied Armies have undertaken to give Patriots priority in the matter of work. These matters will be arranged at Patriot Centres.

3. Sub-Commissions are requested to submit to this Section, by 1000 hrs. Wednesday 25 April, 1945, their comments and suggestions on the above proposed answers.

4. Will Patriots Branch please draft replies to questions under PART III - MILITARY.

1. In accordance with instructions from the Chief of Staff, a short paper is to be prepared summarizing decisions which have been taken regarding our future policy and action in North ITALY.
2. The attached list, which is intended to be illustrative rather than comprehensive, sets out various matters on which policy has either been decided already, or will be required. General and Special Staff Sections are requested to examine this list, and to forward the appropriate information or their comments, as under:

On Part I - POLITICAL - to G-5
On Part II - ADMINISTRATIVE - to Log Plans, copy to G-4 Plans
On Part III - MILITARY - to G-3 Plans

In all cases, consideration must be given to two possible eventualities:

- a. A slow continuance of military operations gradually driving the Germans out of Northern Italy either into the Alps or eastwards to the ALGER position and from there to a final battle.
- b. The total surrender of the German control forces in Northern Italy as the result of the military operations now proceeding or as a result of a general German collapse in all theatres of war.
3. a. G-5, Log Plans in conjunction with G-4 Plans, and G-3 Plans will coordinate the action taken under paragraph 2 and will ensure that it is as comprehensive as possible. G-5 and Log Plans will then forward their papers to G-3 Plans for coordination in the final paper.
b. If necessary, a meeting will be called by G-3 Plans to settle outstanding points before the final paper is prepared.

SUBJECT: Conveyance of officials for North West Italy. 21 April 1945

TO: RC Emilia Region.

1. I would welcome your assistance upon a point in connection with the arrangements for conveying officials to North West Italy.
2. As you are aware, in the event of an RO being unable to find a suitable local person to fill vacancies in the office of Prefect, etc., a career official will be sent from Rome from a "pool" of Prefects and Vice Prefects which has been established for the purpose in collaboration with the Italian Government.
3. It is intended that any official so sent forward will be conveyed by AC HQ transport to the Regional HQ or Rear HQ. From that point, Region will assume responsibility for sending the official to the actual place at which he is needed.
4. The first staging point on such a journey North will be Florence and arrangements have been completed between AMG and the Prefect thereof for the provision of suitable accommodation at which officials can stay the night. They will carry their own rations.
5. It is improbable that after leaving Florence the official will be able to reach the required Regional HQ on the second day of the journey and will accordingly have to stay the night at a second staging point.
6. I appreciate that it is impossible at present definitely to fix such second point, as it depends upon a number of factors as yet unknown, e.g. condition of roads, bridges, traffic arrangements, position of Regional HQ, etc.
7. Subject to these factors, however, it is suggested that the most convenient place would be Piacenza, and I should be glad to have any views you may desire to express on this proposal.
8. I suggest that this place, or any agreed alternative, should be tentatively ear-marked between us for the purpose, and if this is done, I would communicate with you again after the occupation with a request for the arrangements to be put in hand by one of your representatives.

Transportation Sub-Commission Officers - Northern Italy

1. When AC/AMG take over in N.W. Italy, it is proposed to establish an Advanced Echelon of the Transportation Sub-Commission. Its duties will be as follows:

a. To coordinate, on behalf of the Director of the Transportation Sub-Commission, movements and transportation work in the regions of Piemonte, Liguria, Lombardia, and such other provinces as may be considered as "N.W. Italy" from time to time.

b. To coordinate movements and transportation work with the military authorities.

c. To control the general distribution of AC and civilian transport in N.W. Italy.

d. To see that movements programs are carried out in accordance with established priorities, particularly programs affecting more than one region.

2. a. Regional Transportation Officers will arrange all local movement within N.W. Italy as far as possible from their own local resources; they will contact each other as necessary; and they will also work closely with military movement officers.

b. Demands for local movement within the N.W. area that cannot be met as outlined in (a) above and movement to or from places outside N.W. Italy will be referred to the Advanced Echelon of the Transportation Sub-Commission, who will try to meet such demands (1) by adjustment of AC controlled capacity, (2) by further contact with military movement headquarters in N.W. Italy, and (3) by reference to Transportation Sub-Commission, Rome.

3. The following officers are nominated for the Advanced Echelon of Transportation Sub-Commission:

4. The Advanced Echelon of the Transportation Sub-Commission will be located near HQ, 2 District.

5. All railway engineering work will continue as at present to be dealt with by Transportation Sub-Commission at HQ, and not by Regional Transportation Officers; the following HQ officers are nominated for detachment to Northern Italy:

The position of such additional staging posts has not yet been fixed and will not be settled until requirements, conditions, etc. are known or can be anticipated.

- (d) After arrival at regional HQ, the HQ will assume responsibility for the conveyance of the official to the province concerned in AIR transport.

6. Arrangements have been made for an officer of the Sub Commission to be detached from HQ for temporary service in forward areas, where he will be available for advice and assistance of local government matters. It is at present intended that he will be located as follows:

Phase 1 with 5 Army
Phase 2 with DCAO

He may be detached from Army or DCAO to regions as and when required. He will observe control channels from and under whatever authority he may from time to time be working. One of the purposes of this arrangement is to enable HQ and also the Ministry of the Interior to be kept fully informed of and in touch with conditions affecting the administration in forward areas. He will thus be required to maintain regular liaison with HQ by personal attendance as and when required.

It is not intended that the HQ officer so temporarily attached as above will necessarily be the same person for the whole of the required period. The plan is to be kept elastic, and after a period of e.g. 2-3 weeks service, it will be followed by attendance at HQ. Another member of HQ staff or the same one will be sent up immediately thereafter. The periods, division of work, areas involved, etc. will be determined by the Sub Commission in the light of prevailing conditions and circumstances.

Thank you for your letter of 4 Feb 45 re the attachment of a Local Government representative to your staff.

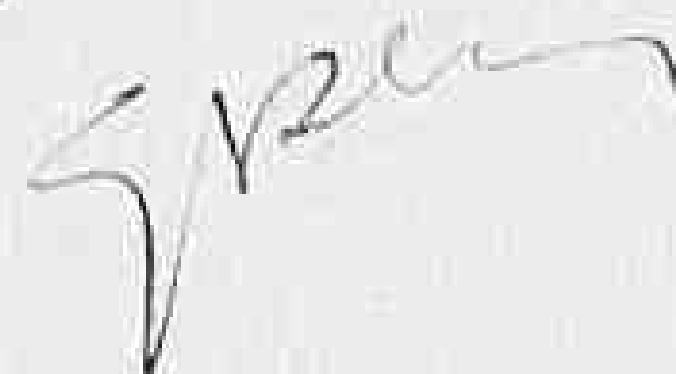

1. As requested I have interviewed Major Birch.
2. The procedure to be followed will be :
 - (a) So soon as it is known that officials are to go forward, the NCO i/c Transport will be asked when transport will be available, and date fixed.

NOTE:- Major Birch stated that he did not think he could now provide transport on 24 hours' notice, but he could do so on 48 hours' notice.

The question of North West Italy is very much in our minds these days. One of the features of the occupation which we expect to be of prime importance is the quick establishment of sound Italian Provincial Government. If the advances goes quickly this will entail a great deal of work during Phase 1 in which the Provinces will successively be the responsibility of this Headquarters.

I should therefore like to put up to you for consideration the suggestion that a representative of the Local Government Sub-Commission should be sent up to work in the forward area when operations start again. It is fully realised that the Sub-Commission is very short in personnel and that hitherto it has not been found necessary or desirable for them to have any officers permanently assigned out in the field: however if things go quickly in the North West there will be a full time job for one officer at this Headquarters to supervise Local Government problems. It would be of great help to us if we could have temporarily on this staff an expert in Local Government who could act as a trouble-shooter for Provincial Commissioners, an adviser to this Headquarters, and a Liaison Officer with the Sub-Commission and the Italian Government in Rome.

The suggestion therefore is that such an officer should be attached here as soon as active operations start and there are prospects that a rapid occupation of North West Italy is imminent : during Phase 1 of the occupation he would work out of this Headquarters and under our control. If you agree to this there is obviously the further possibility that you might continue the arrangement during the early part of Phase 2, during which the officer concerned might work out of the Western DCCO's office or such other place as you think fit - that however is not for us to decide.

I would stress that the foregoing is only a suggestion, but it is an arrangement which would help this Headquarters a great deal during Phase 1.

SUBJECT: Planning for Northwest Italy.

19 January 1945

TO : Civil Affairs Section.

1. As directed in TB/18/11/CA of 17 January, the following particulars are submitted.

2. Apart from what may hereafter be decided as to administrative elections, the functions of this Sub Commission as regards Northwest Italy will not differ from those it has exercised hitherto. Such functions may be divided under two heads:

(a) the establishment of a temporary system of democratic local government;

(b) ensuring the efficient working of the Prefectures and controlling the movement of Prefectural staff to and from them.

3. As regards the establishment of a temporary system of democratic local government, the plan which has hitherto been operating in Central and Southern Italy requires no adjustment or amplification except on one point. RC's and FC's are already in possession of full instructions on the subject, as contained in existing directives.

4. Executive Memorandum No. 30, para 1(d) states that "appointments and removals of Prefects and other administrative officers of like rank will be subject to prior approval by AC HQ." It is recommended that RC's LOMBARDIA, PIEMONTE and LIGURIA be authorized to appoint and remove Prefects without such prior approval, provided they report any such action to AC HQ immediately afterwards.

5. As regards the Prefectures and their staffs, arrangements are being made to have available for this purpose a number of Prefects, Vice Prefects, Consiglieri and Segretari and Ragionieri. At this stage, the numbers that may be available cannot be given: this must depend upon the specific proposals of the Italian Government and the results of screening. It is intended, if possible, that about half the officials so available should be kept here in Rome (employed at the Ministry) available to go to the North-West on, say 24 hours' notice; the other half should be distributed about the Prefectures in Italian Government Territory, from whence they can be called up to Rome to take the place of those sent forward.

6. The planning for this purpose has been fully discussed with officials of the Ministry of the Interior and their concrete proposals are being submitted.

7. The Ministry have indicated that among their formal proposals will be a suggestion that only the key positions be filled from the "pool" here; i.e. the posts of Prefect, Vice Prefect, Consiglieri, Vice Prefect Inspector, and two or three

elections, the functions of this Sub Commission as regards Northwest Italy will not differ from those it has exercised hitherto. Such functions may be divided under two heads:

(a) the establishment of a temporary system of democratic local government;

(b) ensuring the efficient working of the Prefectures and controlling the movement of Prefectural staff to and from them.

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6. The planning for this purpose has been fully discussed with officials of the Ministry of the Interior and their concrete proposals are being submitted.

7. The Ministry have indicated that among their formal proposals will be a suggestion that only the key positions be filled from the "pool" here; i.e. the posts of Prefect, Vice Prefect Vicario, Vice Prefect Inspector, and two or three Consiglieri according to the size of the Province: and for the purpose of filling gaps among the officials of lower rank, they suggest that temporary employees be recruited on the spot.

8. They also submit formal representations that officials dismissed from North-Western Prefectures by AMG for local reasons only be made available to the Italian Government for use in provinces in Italian Government territory. This proposal will require most careful examination.

9. The actual movement of Italian personnel into the North-West raises problems of transport and accommodation. The journey by road will take two and in many cases three days. The provision of quarters and rations at FLORENCE and MILAN or ALESSANDRIA needs consideration. Moreover, adequate transport should be at the disposal of RC's to convey officials from Regional HQ to their destinations. It is submitted that these considerations be brought to the notice of the appropriate Sub Commission.

APPRECIATION CIVIL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE
NORTH WEST ITALY

OBJECT:

1. To plan for the civil administration of North West Italy excluding the economic field.

INFORMATION:2. Enemy

- (a) May be forced to withdraw from N.W. Italy (i) as a result of current operations; (ii) at a later date as the combined result of operations in this theatre and elsewhere.
- (b) He may hold either the line PO-TICINO-SWISS FRONTIER covering MILAN, or the line ANICOT-VERONA-SWISS FRONTIER. It is not improbable that he will attempt to hold GENOVA as a fortress.
- (c) Some ardent Fascists may attempt to prolong resistance as guerrillas but Italian Fascist Divisions are unlikely to remain intact and many desertions may be expected.
- (d) Extensive demolitions and destruction of public utilities are to be anticipated.

Conclusion:

Plans must be flexible.

We may anticipate an earlier occupation of N.W. Italy than of N.E. Italy and in view of para (d) above a heavy mine clearance responsibility. Day and order problems are likely to be of greater magnitude than hitherto.

3. Our Troops:

- (a) The intention of AFHQ is to destroy such enemy forces as may remain in N.W. Italy and establish Allied Military Government.
- (b) The operation will be conducted in two phases:

3. Our Troops:

- (a) The intention of AFHQ is to destroy such enemy forces as may remain in N.W. Italy and establish Allied Military Government.

- (b) The operation will be conducted in two phases:

Phase I: Military occupation and the elimination of remaining enemy formations, re-establishment of law and order among civilian population, terminating in Allied Military Government.

Phase II: The assumption of responsibility for military administration by No.2 District and for Allied Military Government by A.C.

- (c) Command and responsibility during the two phases will be:-

Phase I: 15 Army Group will be responsible, with R.C.s LIGURIA, PISTOIA and LOMBARDY under command AIG Fifth Army.

Phase II: No. 2 District will take over the Compartimenti of PIEDMONT, LIGURIA, and the Provinces of VARESE, COMO, MILANO, and PAVIA of LOMBARDY. The Province of PLACENZA of EMILIA will be included in No. 2 District at a later date. (See Sketch Map at Appx. "A"). No. 2 District H.Q. to be situated at ALESSANDRIA.

(d) Internal Security will be maintained by the following troops which will pass under command of No. 2 District at Phase II.

- (i) One British or Dominion Division, one Armoured Car Regt.
- (ii) One Italian Combat Group, three Italian Garrison Bns.

(e) Communications: Assistance to AIG will be provided by AFHQ in the form of assuming the responsibility for:

- (i) Opening the port of Genoa.

- (iii) Provision of pipe line to ALESSANDRIA and bulk storage at GENOA.

It is therefore necessary to find and to have ready competent and strong personalities to fill such appointments as Prefects and Sindaci of the large cities and towns.

TOPOGRAPHICAL FACTORS:

5. (a) North West Italy, i.e. that part of the country described in para 2 (c) above, is the most highly industrialized of all Italy and more densely populated with a more vigorous and energetic people than have hitherto been encountered. It contains at least three centres of population of over 1,000,000 persons, i.e.:

TORINO	1,250,000
MILANO	2,500,000

(b) It is cut off from Rome by the north-westerly sweep of the Apennine mountains, which in turn divide the Compartimento of LIGURIA from that of PIEMONTE and confine the exits from the port of GENOA.

All Compartimenti have frontier provinces with Switzerland or Southern France.

(c) This area includes the upper valley of the River PO which is rich agriculturally and will, with the re-establishment of communications, go far in feeding the population.

Conclusion:

Much will depend on the quick re-establishment of communications. That until such time as this is completed, distribution of food in the large centres of population may be difficult and if not up to minimum requirements may lead to the spread of unrest and disease, especially after a period of hard winter, if not a complete season. In view of the binger populations a larger number of displaced persons may be expected to be encountered.

PATRIOT ACTIVITIES:

6. (a) A large body of the population has been employed on these activities, encouraged and supplied direct by Allied Command operating and organised in particular by C.L.M.A.I.. There are, however, other bodies pursuing similar activities for political motives, some of them not officially recognised by Allied authority.

(b) Weather conditions latterly have interrupted supply operations, and made open air living hard and beyond endurance in some instances. Added to which, anti-patriot operations by the enemy have been more rigorous especially in PIEMONTE region.

Conclusion:

That a very much larger number of patriots will have to be dealt with, and their claims may well be strongly pressed by the C.L.M.A.I. who have, in fact, been in command. If their opinion and claims are not met they may well become dissatisfied and unruly with resort to the violence in which they have been schooled. This stresses the importance of the Public Safety organisation.

SUMMARY:

7. (a) In general, A.C. will have, in the occupation of N.W. Italy, the biggest task it has yet been set: the population being more dense and having lived under the strain of war and active operations for a longer period than those in the south.

(b) The normal functions of Civil Affairs Section's Sub-Commissions will suffice to meet the situation, but will require energetic action and hard work by all concerned: the undermentioned responsibilities appear to require special attention in planning:-

 - (v) Formation of Mine Clearance Service. (C.A. Section).
 - (vi) Rapid emigration. (C.A. Section).
 - (vii) Distribution of medical supplies. (Public Health)

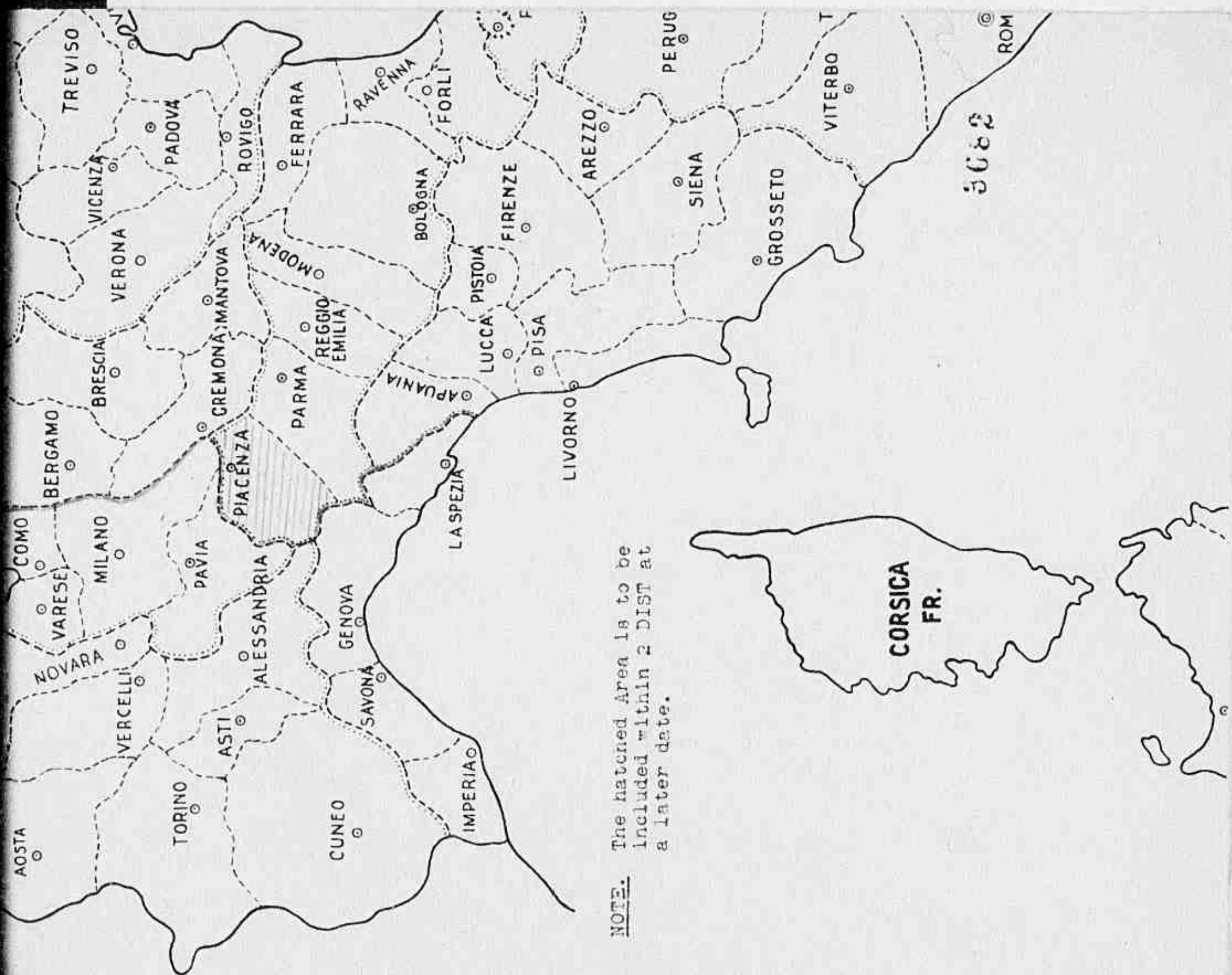
