TO : See Distribution

It relates not only to current orders etc but also to orders previously and whenever issued.
- 2 50 copies of all Proclamations and General Orders, Regulations and Rules, for the drafting of which this Headquarters was responsible, will be sent forthwith to the Information Division by the Sub-Commission which sponsored the same together with schedules showing areas and dates of enforcement.
- 3 20 copies of all Proclamations, Orders, regulations and judicial or administrative rules (other than those mentioned above) which have been issued in a Region or any Province thereof, showing where and when they have been brought into force, will be forwarded at once by the Region concerned to the Information Division of the Public Relations Branch of this Headquarters.
- 4 All documents sent to the Information Division in accordance with this instruction will be accompanied by descriptive lists showing the quantity of each item forwarded.
- 5 Regions and Sub-Commissions respectively will in future supply the Information Division with the said number of copies of all the above described Documents which may be issued hereafter as the same are issued.
- 6 Archives will so far as they can, supply from the records of closed Regions such copies of orders etc issued in such Regions as may be spare up to the above mentioned maxima.

3. Each Province has a President and a Provincial Deputation.
4. The President is the head of the Provincial Administration and President of the Provincial Delegation.
5. The President is appointed by the Prefect subject to the approval of the Allied Military Government. **614**
6. The members of the Provincial Delegation are appointed by the Prefect subject to approval by the Allied Military Government.
7. Until such time as the Town and Provincial Councils are constituted the Town Council will be substituted by the Council of Aldermen and the Provincial Council by the Provincial Delegation who will retain all the other powers attributed to them by the aforementioned Unified Text of Municipal, and Provincial laws of 1915.
8. To the grounds for ineligibility established by the Unified Text of 1915 are added the following: No one is eligible to the office of Mayor, Alderman, President of the provincial administration and delegation, or Provincial Delegate, if they have held an office in the Fascist Party.

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9. All other regulations of the Unified Text of the Provincial and Communal laws approved by Royal decree of February 3, 1915, n. 148, remain in force provided they are not in contrast with the present order or with special rulings issued or to be issued by the Allied Military Government.

10. In the application of the dispositions contained in the above articles, and for doubtful cases of a general character rulings will be issued by the Allied Military Government.

The Vice Mayor assists the Mayor, and takes his place in the case of absence.

The appointment of the Vice Mayor, must be approved by the Prefect.

Art. 4) Each Provincial Administration is governed by a President and a Provincial Deputation.

Art. 5) The President is the head of the Provincial Administration and President of the Provincial Deputation.

Art. 6) The President and the Members of the Provincial Deputation are appointed by the Prefect, subject to the approval of the Allied Military Government. The ruling cited in second section of art. 2) applies also to the President and Members of the Provincial Deputation.

The President presides and presides over the Provincial Deputation, arranging for the matters to be discussed at each meeting, and puts into effect the decisions taken by the Deputation.

Art. 7) The President will appoint a Vice-President from among the Members of the Provincial Deputation and he may entrust them with special duties in connection with the Provincial Administration.

Art. 8) Until such time as the Town and Provincial Councils are constituted, the Town Council will be substituted by the Council of Aldermen, and the Provincial Council by the Provincial Deputation which will retain all the other normal powers attributed to them by the aforementioned Unified Text of Municipal and Provincial Law of 1915.

Art. 9) To the grounds for ineligibility established by the Unified Text of 1915 are added the following: He who is eligible to assume the office of Mayor, Alderman, President of the Provincial Administration and Deputier, or Provincial Deputy, if he has held such office, or offices, in the Fascist Party, or those specified in the Regional Order dealing with Ineligibility and Renewal of Fascists.

Art. 10) All other regulations of the Unified Text of the Provincial and Communal Laws approved by Royal Decree of February 5, 1915, No. 146, remain in force, provided they are not in at variance with the present order or with special rulings issued, or to be issued by the Allied Military Government.

The regulations of the Unified Text dated March 27th, 1934, No. 165 which are at variance with this Order, are hereby cancelled.

Art. 11) The Prefect, when making appointments of members of the above-mentioned agencies, will bear in mind the various political tendencies of the community. Also, labor and agriculture as well as industry and the professions must be adequately represented.

Art. 12) The Prefects will appoint the Sindaco, the Members of the Council of Aldermen, and the Members of the Provincial Deputation (by 30 April 1944).

In the meantime, pending the appointments to be made under this order, the present Municipal and Provincial Administrative Officials will continue to exercise their positions, with the title of "Mayor" and "President".

1. Reference is made to Office Memorandum dated 1 March 1944 published in "Instructions for the Guidance of Officers of the Commission", Part III, Pages 3 and 4.

2. From time to time General Orders have been issued by the Executive Commissioner upon recommendation of Sections and Sub-Commissions. Some of these remain current, others are now obsolete and the remainder have either been incorporated in General Orders 1 and 2 (renumbered) or will be included in General Orders now in preparation.

3. The attached list shows all the Orders now considered necessary to cover the full requirements of Military Government both in newly occupied territory and in territory still to be occupied. General Order No. 27 is with the printers and No. 28 is ready for signature.

4. With regard to publication in newly occupied areas, SCAO's with AMG 5th and 8th Armies, will publish Proclamations Nos. 1, 2 and 3, General Order No. 1 (renumbered) and Notices 1 and 2. Proclamation No. 4 and General Order No. 2 (renumbered), will be published only upon order of the R.C. & M.G. Section at the request of the Finance Sub-Commission. The foregoing Proclamations, General Orders and Notices, will be issued in accordance with demands received by R.C. & M.G. Section.

5. The publication of the remaining General Orders and any to be issued in the future will be the subject of further instructions based on the opinions, comments and requests of Regional Commissioners and Sub-Commissions after consultation with the Legal Sub-Commission. There are at present in course of preparation, an Order dealing with the Declaration of Essential Supplies and prohibition against removal and transfer of certain commodities, certain further General Orders dealing with agriculture, and a revised order covering the reorganization of the Bar Association.

6. Proclamations and General Orders can be amended or varied only by order of the Chief Commissioner in the case of Proclamations and by the Executive Commissioner in the case of General Orders. It follows that Sections and Sub-Commissions will take no action in conflict with the above.

1. Reference is made to Office Memorandum dated 1 March 1944 published in "Instructions for the Guidance of Officers of the Commission", Part III, Pages 3 and 4.

2. From time to time General Orders have been issued by the Executive Commission upon recommendation of Sections and Sub-Commissions. Some of these remain current, others are now obsolete and the remainder have either been incorporated in General Orders 1 and 2 (renumbered) or will be included in General Orders now in preparation.

3. The attached list shows all the Orders now considered necessary to cover the full requirements of Military Government both in newly occupied territory and in territory still to be occupied. General Order No. 27 is with the printers and No. 28 is ready for signature.

4. With regard to publication in newly occupied areas, SCAO's with AMG 5th and 8th Armies, will publish Proclamations Nos. 1, 2 and 3, General Order No. 1 (renumbered) and Notices 1 and 2. Proclamation No. 4 and General Order No. 2 (renumbered), will be published only upon order of the R.C. & M.G. Section at the request of the Finance Sub-Commission. The foregoing Proclamations, General Orders and Notices, will be issued in accordance with demands received by R.C. & M.G. Section.

5. The publication of the remaining General Orders and any to be issued in the future will be the subject of further instructions based on the opinions, comments and requests of Regional Commissioners and Sub-Commissions after consultation with the Legal Sub-Commission. There are at present in course of preparation, an Order dealing with the Declaration of Essential Supplies and prohibition against removal and transfer of certain commodities, certain further General Orders dealing with agriculture, and a revised order covering the reorganization of the Bar Association.

6. Proclamations and General Orders can be amended or varied only by order of the Chief Commissioner in the case of Proclamations and by the Executive Commissioner in the case of General Orders. It follows that Sections and Sub-Commissions will take no action in conflict with the above.

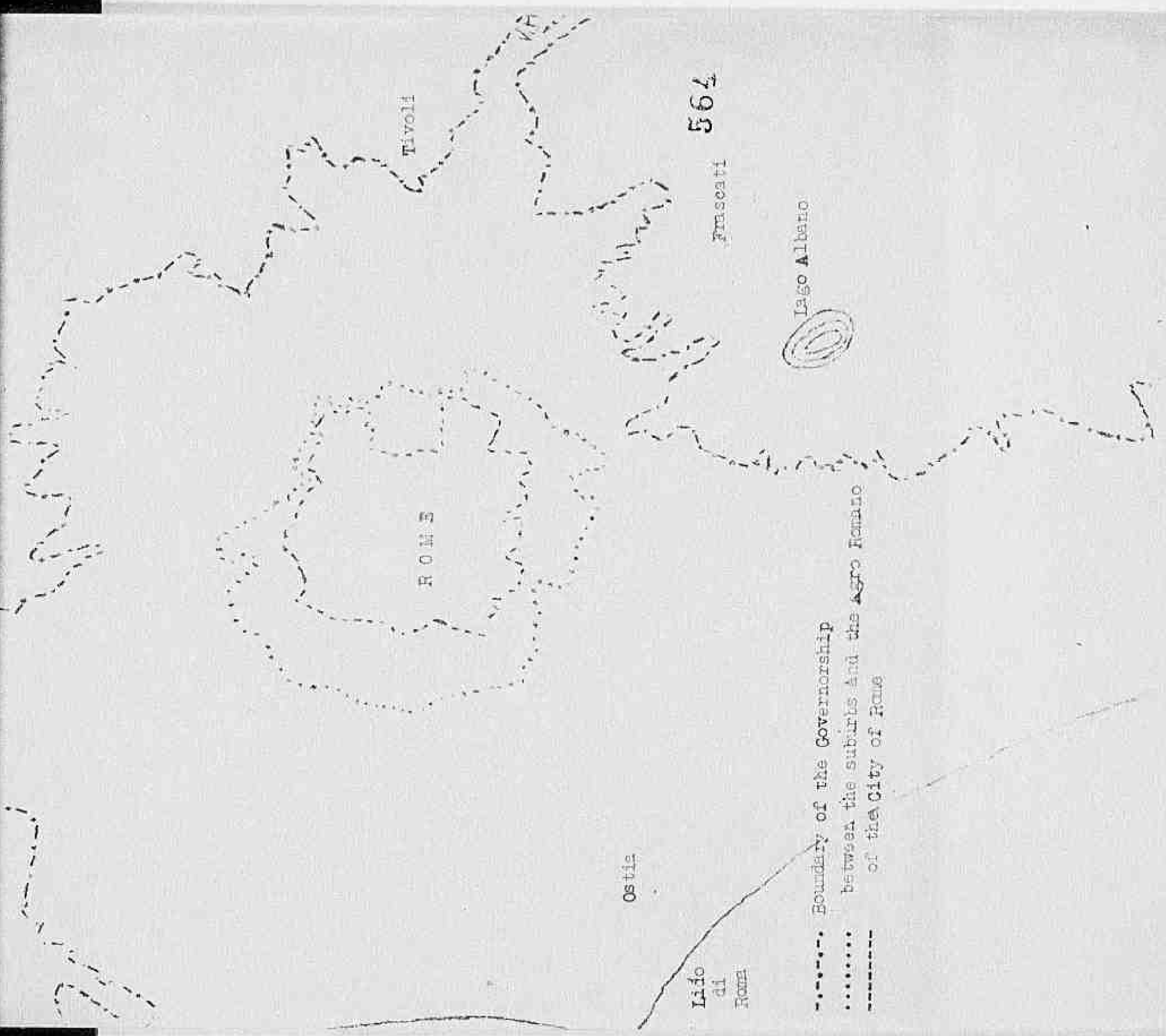

GENERAL ORDER NO. 14

TEMPORARY WAGE ADJUSTMENT

Whereas by Proclamation No. 3 of the General Officer Commanding the Allied Forces in the Occupied Territory of Sicily, a general limitation on wages was declared, and the Allied Military Government was given power in Article II thereof to alter rates of wages.

Now, therefore, I FRANK J. McSHERN, Brigadier General, Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, hereby order as follows:-

ARTICLE I

(a) Employees of permanent and temporary status of the State, Provinces, Communes, Enti Para-Statali, and Public Institutions and Agencies (Aziende) which are administered by any of the foregoing governmental units shall receive a "temporary wage adjustment" which shall be calculated on the base of present total salaries (base plus ordinary and extraordinary indemnities, which normally represent an integral part of their total salary) as described in Article I, below.

(b) Increases in Article I, subdivision (a) above shall become effective as of 1 November 1943.

ARTICLE II

(a) Private employees are permitted to grant increases in both salaries and wages, effective through 31, which shall not exceed the percentages described in Article I, below. Increases shall be applied to salaries and wages fixed by Collective Labor Contracts effective as of 1 September 1942. However, in the case of the cities of Palermo, Catania and Messina, the percentage increases shall be based upon the contract wage so fixed plus the index of Messina. These increases shall in no way affect or be affected by the Assegni Familiari.

(1) Increases in salaries and wages received by employees since 1 September 1942 shall be deducted from any increase granted as a result of this proposal.

(2) Increases in salaries and wages received by employees since 1 September 1942 which exceed the amount of increase granted by this proposal shall not be affected thereby.

TEMPORARY WAGE ADJUSTMENT

Increases by Proclamation No. 8 of the General Officer Commanding the Allied Forces in the Occupied Territory of Sicily, a general limitation on wages was declared, and the Allied Military Government was given power in Article II thereof to alter rates of wages.

Now, therefore, I FRANK I. McSHERRY, Brigadier General, Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, hereby order as follows:--

## ARTICLE I

- (a) Employees of permanent and temporary status of the State, Province, Communes, Enti Para-Statali, and Public Institutions and Agencies (Aziende) which are administered by any of the foregoing governmental units shall receive a "Temporary Wage Adjustment" which shall be calculated on the base of present total salaries (base plus ordinary and extraordinary indemnities which normally represent an integral part of their total salary) as described in Article IV below.
- (b) Increases in Article I, subdivision (a) above shall become effective as of 1 November 1943.

## ARTICLE II

- (a) Private employees are permitted to grant increases in both salaries and wages, effective through 1942, which shall not exceed the percentages described in Article IV below. Increases shall be applied to salaries and wages fixed by Collective Labor Contracts effective as of 1 September 1942. However, in the case of the cities of Palermo, Catania and Messina, the percentage increases shall be based upon the contract wage so fixed plus the indemnity of Provenza. These increases shall in no way affect or be affected by the Assegni Familiari.
- (1) Increases in salaries and wages received by employees since 1 September 1942 shall be deducted from any increase granted as a result of this proposal.
- (2) Increases in salaries and wages received by employees since 1 September 1942 which exceed the amount of increase granted by this proposal shall not be affected thereby.
- (b) Any disputes which arise between employer and employee or employees under Article I shall be adjusted in accordance with the machinery provided in AGO General Order No. 6 dated 24 September 1943.

## ARTICLE III

This Order does not apply to persons directly employed by branches of the Allied Armed Forces or by contractors rendering services to said forces.

ARTICLE IV

The foregoing provisions shall be applied in accordance with the following schedule:-

(b) There shall be one maximum increment of L. 1,900 per month for salaries of wages which exceed L. 5,000 per month.

This Order will become operative in each Province or part thereof within the Occupied Territory of Sicily on the date of its first publication therein.

3. Communications. Orders to personnel in the regions, including specialist personnel, will be issued only by the RCAG. Communications on technical matters from a Sub-Commission or Division Chief AMG HQ to the specialist personnel in the regions must be sent through the RCAG.

Officers from AMG HQ may and will make frequent inspection trips within the regions. On such occasions they will make their presence and the nature of their mission known to the RCAG, or where impracticable, to the nearest SCAG. No orders or directives will be communicated by such officers to the specialists in the field; technical observations may, however, be so communicated from HQ personnel to specialists in the Regions or vice versa. If these are in written form, copies will be furnished to the RCAG.

APPENDIX BSPECIFIC LIMITATIONS ON THE POWERS OF PCAASPublic Safety

1. No public official in this field having jurisdiction over more than one province will be appointed without the prior approval of AMG HQ. No Brigadier General or higher ranking officer of the CCRP may be appointed or removed without the prior approval of AMG HQ. Except as stated above, any public official in this field may be removed by the RGAO without prior approval.

2. No plant shall be rendered substantially less effective by cannibalization except upon prior approval of AMG HQ.

3. No goods in transit or in storage in warehouses or at other points pending their removal to their eventual destination shall be consumed unless prior authority is received from AMG HQ.

6. Internal Transportation. No action will be taken in any Region with reference to railroads under the control of the Allied Forces except in accordance with AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 76 of 9 Nov. 1943.

- (c) No telecommunication supplies, materials or equipment will be shipped from one region to another without AMG HQ approval.
- (d) Release of interurban telecommunication facilities for repair

- (c) No telecommunication supplies, materials or equipment will be shipped from one region to another without AMG HQ approval.
- (d) Release of inter-urban telecommunication facilities for restricted civilian use will be made only after AMG HQ has procured IIC approval.

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Property Control

- 9. The following will be treated as matters of policy, and no action by Regional chiefs will be taken except in accordance with instructions from AMG HQ.
  - (a) Classes of property to be taken into custody, (e.g. U.S., British, Greek, French, etc., Italian Government, Fascist Party, "Perastatal," etc.).
  - (b) Methods of disposal, recording and accounting for properties taken into custody, e.g. bank balances, Fascist funds, real estate, etc.

(APPENDIX 2, 2-0-2, HQ-AMG 23 Nov 43)

(c) Industrial concerns (whether allied or otherwise) whose activities extend beyond a single region (i.e., AMIB, IMIC, etc.)

10. The Regional C.P. shall have delegated to him all general powers of the D.P.C. with respect to properties in his Region, except that he shall not without the authority of the D.P.C.,

- (a) In the case of real property raise money on the security of any property for its maintenance beyond the limit of 40,000 lire;
- (b) in the case of commercial enterprises, etc., (i) contract any loans other than temporary advances obtained in the normal way of business, (ii) pledge any of the assets of the company or concern (iii) close down any business in his custody;
- (c) borrow or expend monies for the reparation of damage due to faits de guerre;
- (d) enter into any legal contract or execute a deed necessary for the exercise of any of the powers of the D.P.C., except for the purposes laid down in General Administrative Instructions No.10, para. 22 (a) to (c).

Labor.

11. Any announcement of labor policy affecting hours of work or collective bargaining or changing substantially conditions of work will be submitted to AMG HQ before it is published.

12. No change in the Italian law on the subject of wages, regulations and inspection measures and methods; supply, registration and distribution of manpower; industrial and labor relations; employee and employer organizations; hours of work; or absorption of demobilized soldiers in the economy will be made without the prior approval of AMG HQ.

Public Works & Utilities.

13. Materials which may be from time to time declared critical by this Sub-Commission will not be used for ordinary maintenance without prior authority from AMG HQ.

14. All contracts for public works or utility construction or services are subject to prior approval by AMG HQ, except where the contracts do not exceed 100,000 lire and only involve the use of local materials.

15. Engineering, structural or building material or contractors' plants shall not be moved out of the Region in which they are located without the approval of AMG HQ.

16. No person shall be appointed to or removed from any of the following offices without the prior approval of AMG HQ.

- (a) Compartmental Chiefs of A.A.S.S. (Public Highways).
- (b) Compartmental Chiefs of the Provveditorato alle opere pubbliche.

Education.

- (c) borrow or expend monies for the reparation of damage due to faits de guerre;
- (d) enter into any legal contract or execute a deed necessary for the exercise of any of the powers of the D.P.C., except for the purposes laid down in General Administrative Instructions No.10, para 22 (a) to (e).

Labor.

11. Any announcement of labor policy affecting hours of work or collective bargaining or changing substantially conditions of work will be submitted to AMG HQ before it is published.

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14. All contracts for public works or utility construction or services are subject to prior approval by AMG HQ, except where the contracts do not exceed 100,000 lire and only involve the use of local materials.

15. Engineering, structural or building material or contractors' plants shall not be moved out of the Region in which they are located without the approval of AMG HQ.

16. No person shall be appointed to or removed from any of the following offices without the prior approval of AMG HQ.

- (a) Compartmental Chiefs of A.A.S.S. (Public Highways).
- (b) Compartmental Chiefs of the Provveditorato alle opere pubbliche.

Education.

17. The following subjects are reserved from the scope of authority of the R.C.A.O. and action thereon will be directed from AMG HQ.

- (e) The procedure for the appointment or removal of all school personnel.
- (b) Conditions under which schools and universities will be opened or closed.
- (c) The establishment of school programs, text books and school organization.
- (d) Alterations in the existing type of schools.
- (c) Appointment or removal, in all universities and institutions of similar rank, of
  - (i) Rectors and heads,
  - (ii) Presidi of faculties
  - (iii) Titular professors, all members of the Lenatus Academicus, and personnel of equivalent rank.

(f) The establishment or abolition of chairs in universities or other institutions of similar rank (to be specified later).

18. All inter-Regional allocation of seeds, seed potatoes, artificial fertilizers, insecticides, fungicides, and farm machinery shall be made by AMG HQ.

19. Production goals for agriculture, forestry or fisheries will not be established without prior approval by AMG HQ.

20. No alteration in producer prices or in the quantities retainable by producers for consumption or seed will be made with respect to controlled commodities, except after prior approval by AMG HQ.

21. No Italian governmental agency or quasi-governmental agency in this field will be substantially altered or abolished without the prior approval of AMG HQ.

22. No appointment or removal of the Chiefs of the Ispettorato Agrario Compartimentale or Provinciale will be made without the prior approval of AMG HQ.

APPENDIX C
