SUBJECT: Jews and Foreign Nationals

TO : Director, Displaced Persons Sub-Commission

1. Reference your telephone inquiry: I have been into this matter with the Minister of the Interior, and he informs me as follows:

(a) His present estimate is for Rome that there are about 6,000 Jews. This, however, may be smaller owing to the presence of the Germans, and he states he is not in a position to give any other estimate than this.

2. As for foreign nationals, the Minister estimates that there were some 20,000 in Rome at the beginning of the war. This figure has, however, been considerably affected by:

- (a) The departure or internment of Allied nationals
- (b) Influx of German civilians
- (c) Probable recent efflux of Germans

3. The Minister states he regrets that he is not in a position to give us any more accurate information, and frankly I do not see how we can get it for you here. Intelligence would seem to me the best source.

SUBJECT: Record of interview with Signor Aldisio and staff on Friday, 2 June.

TO : Vice-President, for information.

1. Signor Aldisio wished to see the Prefect he had nominated for Littoria, who is now Presidente di Tribunale at Avellino, on his way through to Manfredonia. I told him I would arrange this and have since telephoned IG, Avellino and fixed this up.
2. I informed him that the proper channels for communications with Regional Commissioners was through this Sub-Commission and the Vice-President's Section. He informed me that Colonel Hancock had been to see him this morning and that it was a courtesy call.
3. I gave Signor Aldisio his passes for Manfredonia, which I had arranged for him.
4. He told me that he would arrange with the Minister of Agriculture not to send direct orders to a Prefect in regard to matters of agriculture except through him, particularly when it affected administrative matters.
5. He nominated a new Prefect for Avellino, lately a judge, and now President of the Delegazione Provinciale since he nominated Zanfrancesco, a Prefect to go forward in the new team for Frosinone.
6. He had instructed his staff to prepare a team for Rome Province immediately. He asked me if there was any chance of the Allied Control Commission changing their opinion in regard to Salvatore, the late Prefect of Campobasso. I told him I thought there was no chance whatever as the unfavourable reports in regard to this Prefect had been continuous.
7. I informed him that I was trying to get Dott. Stanislao Caboni released from internment in North Africa.

1. I saw Capt Cavalli + Dr Camera to-day. They spoke Dr Solimena, Dir.-Gen. Public Security at Ministry by phone
2. Jews : - The last official figures were published in 1938, for the year 1937. These state about 52,000 in all Italy. Present estimate for Rome - about 6,000. This may well be much smaller now, owing to (a) application of racial laws of 1938 + (b) presence of Germans.
3. Foreign Nationals : - The Ministry estimate that there

were in Rome at the beginning of the war - 20,000 foreign.

This figure will have been greatly affected by

(a) departure or internment of Allied nationals;

(b) influx of German civilians;

(c) probable recent influx of Germans.

* The Ministry can't form any estimate of the present number of foreign nationals.

4. The figures at to Jews in 2 above agree with those given by the Ministry on 4 May - see file ACC/15/2/INT at # 5.

This ministry hasn't sufficient means to be able to determine what the actual number of Jews there are resident in the territory of the Kingdom occupied by the Germans.

From the "Demographic Chronicle" of 1938 published by the Central Statistical Institute, is revealed that the total number of Jews resident in Italy in 1937 was about 52,000.

Not knowing the movement made by Jews upon the application of Racial Laws, the war, and the invasion by the Germans, it is not possible to determine the number of Jews resident north of the line of control by the Armed Forces.

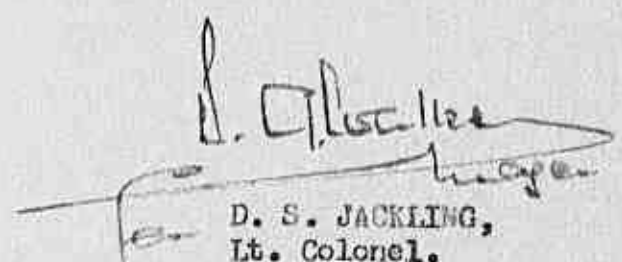
