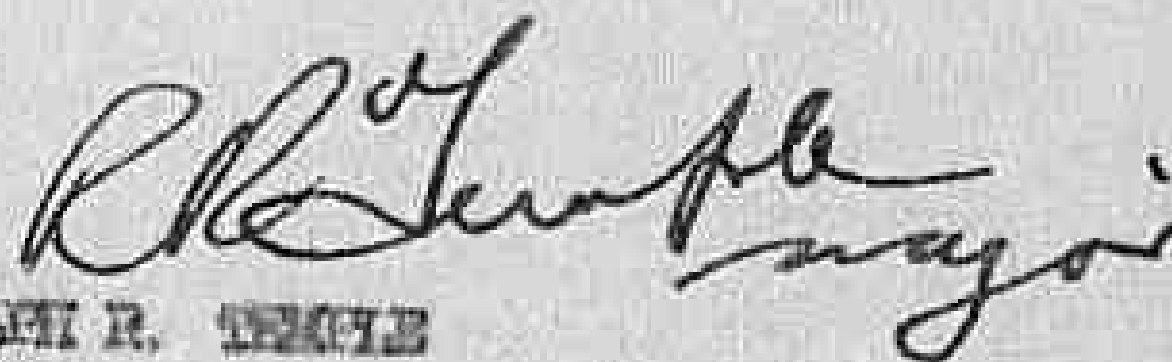

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission

1. Sig. Arrigo NICE commenced employment with the Allied Commission soon after the liberation of Rome in July 1944, when he became Senior Administrative Assistant in Region 4, AMG (Lazio-Umbria region). He later became a member of the office of the Secretary of the Regional Commissioner, Colonel Charles Polotti. He remained with Region 4 until 15 March 1945, when with the high recommendation of the Executive Officer of Region 4 (Colonel Benham-Carter) he was employed by the Local Government Sub Commission as technical interpreter. On 16 June 1945 Mr. Nice was reclassified to the status of Senior Administrative Assistant.

2. Under the general direction of the Director of the Local Government Sub Commission Sig. Nice performed liaison duties between the Sub Commission and the Italian Government, the principal ministries of which were the Ministry of Interior, Ministry of the Constituent Assembly, Ministry for the Consultative Assembly, and Presidency of the Council of Ministers. He has acted as interpreter at important interviews between the Director and officers of the Sub Commission and high officials of the Italian Government. He has interviewed a multitude of visitors to the Sub Commission and acted as a buffer between them and the Director and officers by disposing of many of the questions raised. He has at all times kept the Director and officers informed of matters of timely and pertinent interest to the Sub Commission. He has been of enormous assistance in enabling the Sub Commission to carry out its activities which concerned the organization and administration of local government throughout the whole of Italy, including over 90 provinces and 7,300 communes. His work has involved the handling of correspondence between the various ministries of the Italian Government and local officials as well as that between the Italian Government and this Sub Commission, the handling of reports dealing with the removal of Fascist functionaries and the handling of matters dealing with elections as well as other problems of local government.

3. In the performance of his duties Mr. Nice has displayed a very high sense of initiative, industry, conscientiousness, efficiency, integrity, and loyalty to the officers of the Local Government Sub Commission as well as to all others in the Allied Commission. He has enjoyed the confidence of all because of his ability and tact in the performance of his work. His personality and bilingual ability made it possible to introduce him into any conference. His work has been invaluable on behalf of the Allied cause, has been of an exceptionally meritorious nature, and much beyond that called for by normal duty. In fact, the employment of Sig. Nice has saved the services of an Allied officer.

4. In view of the foregoing exceptional services rendered in the Allied cause I strongly recommend that Sig. Arrigo Nice receive an award by the Italian Government. Sig. Nice's address is Viale Alfredo Rocco 26, Rome.

Major Gillette has served as a Patriots Officer in Emilia Region for 9 months, a branch of activity which comes under the control of this Sub-Commission.

In his capacity of Regional Patriots Officer he has had considerable responsibility in dealing with the dispersal of Patriots, their disarming and their return to civil life. His work involved not only the handling of considerable sums of money, but also the control of 10 Patriot Centres. These Centres have catered for some 10,000 Patriots who, while in the Centres, are accommodated, clothed and fed. Major Gillette has had under his control a large staff of Italian Officers and civilians.

In all of these matters I have found that he carried out his duties in a superior manner.

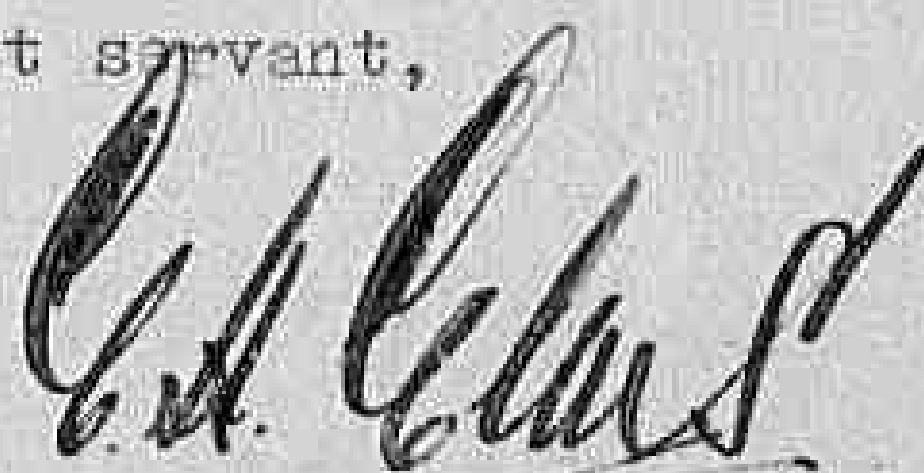
I regret to refer to the question again, but I would be glad to know of any further information regarding my promotion.

I regret that I can discover nothing definite about your promotion. I am no longer personally on the Promotions Board and am not therefore in a very good position to make an answer to you. I have endeavoured to make discreet enquiries for you but am sorry to say that I have not had much luck. I do not think that your release group being 20 would make any difference at this time.

With regard to your more official letter and the five or six points which you raise, I will answer you in full during the course of the next few days. Reakes is not in the office this morning and I do not know whether or not he has the answers to the more simple things such as the position regarding Sjt. Starkiss.

He will send forward to you the 2,000 identity cards that you require and I will see the Ministry of Post War Assistance on Tuesday morning, after which I hope to be in a position to give you complete answers.

As I am about to be released this will probably be the last personal contact I shall have with you in Italy. I hope you will be able to contact me when you come home. You will find my telephone number in the telephone directory under the title of A. Gripps and Son, Ltd. It used to be Bishops Gate 2531.

Very many thanks indeed for all the hard work and help that you have given to the Patriots Branch; you have certainly done an excellent job.

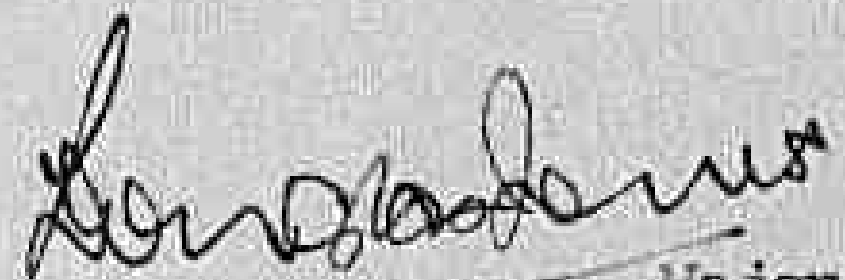

1. The War Department has advised that the following change has been made in AR 605-12, dated 17 August 1944, in order to permit promotion of deserving 2d Lieutenants who have been denied promotion due to lack of vacancies in the higher grade:

"Paragraph 4d (4). Any 2d Lieutenant (including Army Nurses, Dietitians, and Physical Therapists) who has completed 18 months of service in that grade, may be promoted to the grade of 1st Lieutenant without regard to Table of Organization or Allotment vacancies in the grade of 1st Lieutenant provided he is qualified for and worthy of promotion.

In determining time in grade for this purpose, service outside the continental limits of the United States or in Alaska will be counted as time and a half.

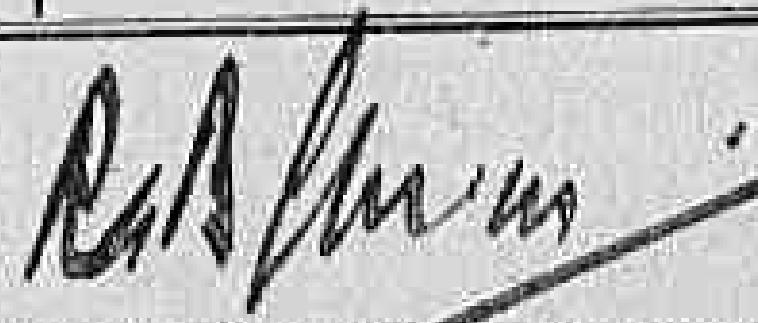

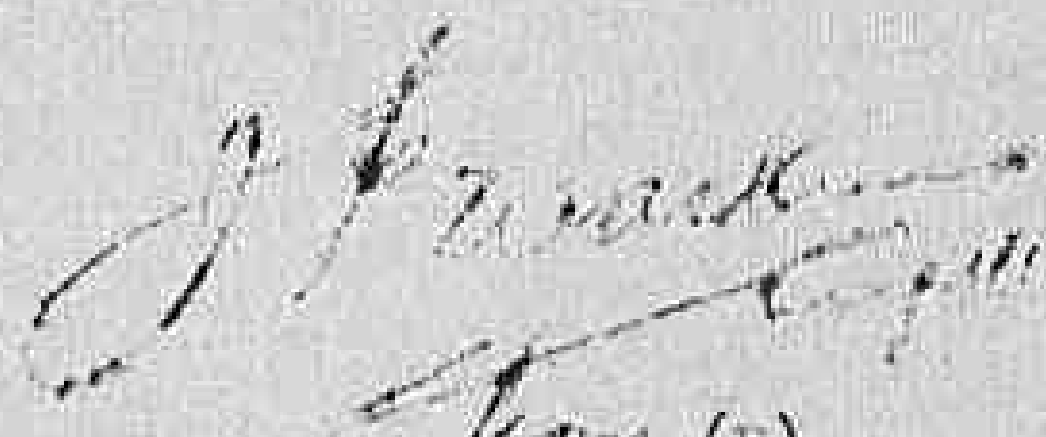

Sir,

I am commanded by the Army Council to refer to Army Council Instructions 1696 of 1942 (as amended by 153 of 1943) 2441 of 1942 and 1064 of 1943, regarding the scheme for the grant of permanent commissions in the Regular Army.

2. I am to say that General Officers Commanding-in-Chief all Commands at home were recently invited to comment upon the inadequate response to the scheme and to submit suggestions for its improvement. This invitation was not extended to General Officers Commanding-in-Chief abroad, on the grounds of expedience and that less information was available regarding the quality and number of candidates appearing before the Selection Boards abroad.

The consensus of opinion of General Officers Commanding-in-Chief all Commands at Home is that there is need for improvement in the professional and financial prospects of Regular Officers, but this is a basic consideration upon which no pronouncement can be made at the present time.

3. As to financial considerations, the reforms introduced in 1938 were designed to provide an assured career up to the age of 47 years with a reasonable pension at the close of an officer's service. Army Council Instruction 2441 of 1942 extends the effect of these provisions to officers granted permanent commissions in the Royal Army Ordnance Corps, up to the age of 55 years.

Owing to the outbreak of war the beneficial effects of these reforms have not yet been fully felt.

4. Certain amendments have been made to the percentages of their pre-war peace establishment at which the strength of various arms may be maintained by the grant of permanent commissions. They will now be as follows:-

Royal Armoured Corps.....	100%
Royal Artillery.....	75%
Royal Engineers.....	80%
Royal Corps of Signals.....	90%
Foot Guards.....	100%
Infantry.....	100%
Royal Army Ordnance Corps.....	80%

The peace establishment of the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers has not yet been settled, the number of permanent commissions which may be granted will, therefore, be based on 100% of those parts of the peace establishments of other corps absorbed into that corps.

5. It is desired that all officers, and especially those who are candidates or intending candidates for permanent commissions, should be aware of the present position with regard to the scheme, and of the principles upon which it is based. I am, therefore, to request that you will cause the contents of the Appendix to this letter to be brought to the attention of all military officers under your command.

REGULAR COMMISSIONS

1. With reference to A.C.Is. 1696 and 2441 of 1942, 153 and 1064 of 1943. It is desired that all officers may know the principles on which is based the grant in war of permanent commissions in the Regular Army and the present position with regard to the grant of such commissions. This Appendix will not be quoted as an authority. A further A.C.I. will be issued in due course.

2. The main factors affecting the grant of permanent commissions during the war are:-

(a) Although the future size of the Army is at present unknown, it is considered very desirable that a certain number of officers should receive permanent commissions in the Regular Army to ensure that their services are available on demobilization, and to avoid a gap in the peace establishment, the filling of which at the end of the war would inevitably create a block in promotion.

(b) By bringing in junior officers in accordance with the normal peacetime practice, a block in promotion in future years should be avoided.

(c) It is also desired that every officer receiving a permanent commission should have a fair chance of drawing a reasonable pension at the age of 47 or 55, whichever is the age for compulsory retirement from the arm in which he serves.

(d) The number of vacancies which may be filled by the grant of permanent commissions under this scheme is based on a certain percentage of the pre-war peace Establishment, less the number of Regular Officers still serving. Obviously, it would be grossly unfair to fill all those vacancies in the first instance by accepting too large a proportion of candidates whose applications have already reached the War Office, because they are serving in the United Kingdom of the more accessible Commands overseas. Room must be left for those who have not had an opportunity to appear before a Selection Board. These considerations have particular application to the Infantry, wherein the number of vacancies varies widely in each regiment. Thus, it is not always possible to accept an officer on the recommendation of his Commanding Officer and superior Commander, because standards vary in regiments and formations and because candidates must compete in the open field of the Army as a whole. For this reason, some form of centralized selection is required, and it was decided that the only practicable method of selecting and grading candidates was by a form of War Office Selection Board, which has proved so successful in selecting emergency commissioned officers. In view of the importance of the permanent commission, a Major-General was appointed to the Board as president. The only other change is that the psychiatrist has been withdrawn.

4. CONDITIONS OF SERVICE

It is emphasised that there are openings in the post-war Army for the keen young man who is prepared to tackle a hard job of work entailing the exercise of very varied talents.

As to financial considerations, it should be noted that the reforms introduced in 1938, were designed to give officers an assured career up to the age of 47 or 50 years, according to the arm of the Service, with a reasonable pension at the close of their service. A.C.I. 2441 of 1942 extends the effect of these reforms to officers granted permanent commissions in the R.A.C.C., up to the age of 55. Owing to the outbreak of war the beneficial effects of the 1938 reforms have not yet been apparent.

5. APPEALS

It is recognised that although the War Office Selection Board has a very small margin of error, no Board can be infallible. It has, therefore, always been intended that a rejected candidate, who feels he has been misjudged, with the concurrence of his Commanding Officer, be re-interviewed by an Appeal Board. Such a Board has been working in the United Kingdom and one is now visiting Commands overseas. The decision of an Appeal Board is final.

6. GRANT FORFEITURE OF PERMANENT COMMISSIONS

Candidates who have already been interviewed by a Selection Board have been graded A, B, C and Failed. Those graded "A" and "B" for arms other than Infantry are to receive permanent commissions forthwith, providing they are still desirous and that the satisfactory report required under the terms of paragraph 12 Appendix I to Army Council Instruction 1696 of 1942 and paragraph 10 Appendix I to Army Council Instruction 2441 of 1942, is forthcoming.

Those graded "C" are not being accepted at present and may appeal if they wish.

The Selection Boards have interviewed a number of candidates in whom some of the qualities of a Regular officer are present but latent or inadequately developed. These candidates are being advised to resubmit their application one year after their first interview with a Board. Re-interview on resubmission of application will not be regarded as an appeal. Candidates will thus have the opportunity of a third and final interview, with the Appeal Board, should their second application be unsuccessful.

7. LOWER AGE LIMIT

Candidates for permanent commissions in the Royal Armoured Corps, Royal Artillery, Royal Engineers, Royal Corps of Signals, Footguards, Infantry and Royal Army Service Corps may now be accepted for the register at the age of 20 years, instead of 21 years as hitherto, but the minimum age at which permanent commissions may be granted will continue to be 21 years. The lower age limit for acceptance for the register of candidates for the Royal Army Ordnance Corps and Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers is unchanged.

8. PERMANENT COMMISSIONS IN THE RANK OF CAPTAIN OR MAJOR

Recommendations have been made that selected officers, above the age limits of the present scheme and holding a temporary or war substantive rank of Captain or Major, should be granted permanent commissions in those ranks.

These recommendations are being examined, but it at present appears improbable that the scheme will be expanded in this way. The known requirements of the Army do not at present warrant such a measure; a block in promotion must be guarded against and officers so commissioned might not have sufficient time, before reaching the age of compulsory retirement, to qualify for retired pay or gratuity under the present code.

9. INDIAN ARMY

Emergency commissioned officers who have applied for and receive permanent commissions, with a view to transferring to the Indian Army after the war, will be released from their honourable undertaking to serve for not less than five years, if it is decided that they cannot be granted permanent commissions in the Indian Army.

10. THE ROYAL ARMOURD CORPS

After full consideration, it has been decided that candidates accepted for permanent commissions in the Royal Armoured Corps, will be gazetted to that corps and not to individual regiments of the corps.

11. ARMY OFFICERS LENT OR TRANSFERRED TO THE R.A.F.

Army officers attached or transferred to the R.A.F. or R.A.F. Regiment may apply, but Army O.Rs. transferred to the R.A.F. and, who have now received emergency commissions in the R.A.F. or R.A.F. Regiment, are ineligible.

Permanent commissions are not being offered in the R.A.F. at present, but if they should be re-introduced later, and an attached or transferred Army officer should be required for a permanent R.A.F. commission, and also selected for a permanent Regular Army commission, the former would take precedence over the latter.

12. DOMINION FORCES

Officers of certain Dominion Forces are also eligible to apply.

13. PRISONERS OF WAR

Prisoners of war have been given details of the scheme and those wishing to apply for permanent commissions have been invited to send in their names. For obvious reasons they are unable to complete the normal application form whilst still in enemy hands, but arrangements have been made for them to submit full applications after they have been repatriated and their medical categories etc. can be confirmed.

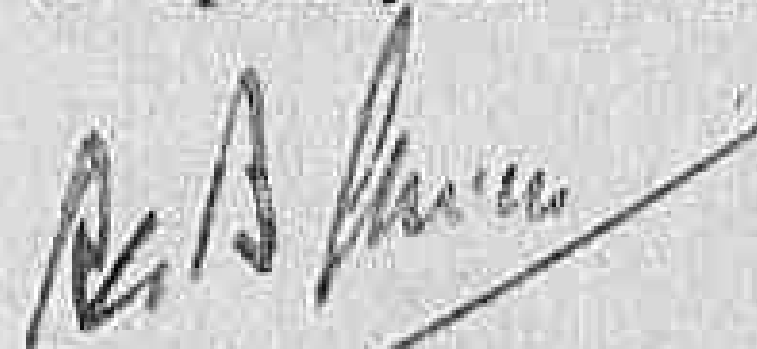
SUBJECT: Promotion
