My Dear

Upjohn

Reference attached file in connection with Lt. MODIANO and our talk yesterday. I have now looked into this case.

Firstly I must apologise for the abruptness of our G/7/1 dated 7 Aug. We should have told you why our G/7/1 of 6 Aug was suddenly reversed.

On 6 Aug I discussed with my Staff the whole matter of economy in the use of the Italian Army. We have had various indications that there is still a large number of officers and men who are attached all over the place, doing unauthorised jobs. So I gave instructions for a letter to be prepared for me saying that unauthorised attachments will be rescinded. As a result of this our letter of 6 Aug was reversed on the 7th.

Frankly the procedure in this case of Lt. MODIANO has been quite irregular. He is an officer in a Division in SARDINIA and there is no authority for him ever to have been attached to A.C.C. We certainly did not know he was. Apparently there has been correspondence on a private basis between your department and Major GREGSON, MMIA, who is one of my Ordnance officers and has nothing whatever to do with posting or transfer of Italian officers. This is borne out by your letter to Major GREGSON dated 3 Aug.

Apart from this it is most inadvisable that anyone except ⁰⁵¹ should ask for an Italian officer by name as this opens up possibilities of favouritism and other unsavoury things which we discussed yesterday.

I can quite understand SPICER saying that he needs an officer in uniform for various tasks but I can hardly agree that the spasmodic escorting of prefects to forward areas comes into the category of priority one. Moreover we all need Italian personnel. H.Q. AAI want 375,000 but they are only getting 309,000! Everyone has got to cut their coat according to their cloth and obviously military considerations must come first. With the formation of 6 new Combat Divisions, within the reduced ceiling mentioned above, we shall be frightfully short of Italian Army personnel. You can, of course, like everyone else, apply for the attachment of an Italian officer to your section but I feel pretty sure that AAI would not authorise this. Nor could I honestly recommend it in view of all the above.

Incidentally if Lt. MODIANO is on leave in ROME he is disobeying orders. Leave from SARDINIA is strictly forbidden.

So there it is. I am sorry for the abruptness of our letter of 7 Aug but I must let things stand as they are.
