Rome, 18 July 1945

Sir,

I thank you very much for your very kind letter of 30 June last. I did not hope to have the least chance of being re-employed in the Local Government Sub-Commission because I knew very well that Major Temple would never agree to have me again in his Office, although I always respected him, fulfilled my duty and complied with his orders. Indeed, I could never understand why the afore mentioned Officer was always so eager to dismiss me, although he was told many times by the Chief of Staff that I worked well and that I was useful.

The first of June (when I was dismissed) I asked Colonel Cripps (who knew nothing of the order of my dismissing and who, therefore, is not responsible of my misfortune) to help me in finding another job in whatsoever Office of the Allied Commission, and I felt, then, that he was willing to do so. If you, Sir, beside Colonel Cripps, would be so kind as to help me in finding work in whatsoever office ruled by the Allied in Rome, I assure you I should be very grateful to you for ever.

I have called many times on the Civilian Personnel Office and they have always told me they did not need new staff at all, although just on the 10th of July, when I was there fresh employees were being engaged. I have been told that only young people are now engaged but, excuse me very much Sir, I think that many years of continued work are not an handicap but, rather, a great help to work better, owing to the experience and training in correspondence, typing, languages, accounts, etc. the employee (as in my personal case) has acquired.

Please excuse me, Sir, if I have dared too much by addressing myself to you and giving you so much trouble, but I am compelled to work to avoid starvation, so I sincerely hope you will understand the extreme urgency of my personal case and forgive me.
