It is policy of this Headquarters, as determined by AFHQ. Administrative Memorandum No. 47, dated 16th November 1944, that salaries of civilian employees will be increased gradually, in accordance with their performance, rather than immediately increased to the maximum on completion of the seven day probationary period.

Dear Admiral,

I must first of all specify ~~that~~ the nature of the measures  
so far adopted for the elections

To the present moment, nothing but a number of steps concerning  
the formation of the electoral lists and the places where the citizens  
will go and depose their vote, has been decreed.

Such steps are:

- 1) the law of the 24th October 1944 which inscribes in the electoral  
lists all the male citizens above the age of 21;
- 2) the law of the 1st April 1945 which includes also women in the  
electoral lists;
- 3) the laws of the month of april -in course of issue- which  
regulate some particulars concerning the lists and which prescribe  
that in the electoral sections both men and women go and vote  
together, providing -if possible- the electoral sections with  
two entrances, one common and one reserved for women.

The work for the formation of the lists will last five months.

Since in the 36 provinces under the Italian administration the work has started at the beginning of February, it is reckoned that the administrative elections can be announced only at the end of June. These may be attended to in different regions and on successive Sundays, for example: all the Communes of Calabria on one Sunday, one half of Sicily on another Sunday, another Sunday for the other half, and so on.

In the provinces of Tuscany, Umbria, and of Marche under the Allied administration, if this administration allows the beginning of the formation of the lists now, these cannot be ready but at the end of September.

Nothing can be said about Northern Italy. Supposing that the formation of the lists could be started in June the first elections cannot take place before November.

Nothing, so far, can be said about the electoral system to be adopted.

Different systems have been experimented in Italy both for political and administrative elections. For the political ones a law was issued which offered secrecy of vote and possibility of control. It certainly was one of the best electoral laws in Europe.

But to-day no measure can be adopted if the problem of the electoral system will not be solved first. You have certainly seen the polemics in the papers. Some parties want the proportional system for the administrative elections too, other parties the full age system.

I think this question shall have to be resolved by the aid of the Council. The question of the system being solved, the practical means for its application shall have to be devised. And then the electoral formalities and procedures will be determined by the experience Italy had during the period in which she



was ruled by the fullest and wisest democracy.

Consequently, the rumours and suppositions about the future electoral law  
are absolutely premature. The Government <sup>itself</sup> which is formed of parties not  
in agreement on this point cannot yet have a definite opinion and a precise  
design.
