SUBJECT: Liaison Officer Region III

TO : Admin. Director

1. Arising out of Ex. Co. discussion yesterday I request that 15th Army Group may be asked to expedite the bringing forward of Lt. T. Harvey (J3) from MGC and HQ.
2. I propose to post this officer as liaison officer between Sub-Commission to Region III. Region III have welcomed the idea of his posting and have promised to arrange his messing and billetting with them.
3. A cable was despatched in this regard previously but has elicited no response.

REPORT OF CONFERENCE WITH REGION III.

January 4, 1944

1. Having met Lt. Col. The Lord Forrester (B) Chief of Staff, Region III, I met Major Knight (A) by arrangement this morning. He, Major Knight was later joined by Capt. Dillard (A).
2. In the first place I wish to place on record the courtesy and cooperative attitude afforded me at this interview.
3. I explained that I was well aware that AMG HQ had no authority in Region III but that I was interested in their activities in regard to Local Government and that this principally was the primary object of my visit.
4. Major Knight explained to me that they had little opportunity as yet to go into the intricacies of Local Government, but that they were concentrating on the individual concerns, and in, after screening, executing removals and appointments as the cases might on their merits demand.
5. I asked Major Knight if he would welcome the appointment of a Liaison officer from this HQ, who would be there to assist him when called upon in regard to Local Government matters. His immediate reply was "most certainly, yes, we would be delighted to have him."
6. I informed Major Knight that in the hope of receiving such a reply, I had already tentatively assigned Lieut. Harvey (USME) as Liaison officer for Region III and was expecting him any day now from Tizi Ouzou when after giving report to Major Knight for duty. Major Knight kindly consented to arrange within Region III for his billeting and messing.
7. I informed Major Knight that Lieut. Harvey would render weekly reports of which copies would be submitted to him, and that Lieut. Harvey would be definitely instructed to take no operative action within Region III but to assume duty in a consultive and advisory capacity only.
8. I promised Major Knight

III but that I was interested in their interests in my visit.

4. Major Knight explained to me that they had little opportunity as yet to go into the intricacies of Local Government, but that they were concentrating on the individuals concerned, and in, after screening, executing removals and appointments as the cases might on their merits demand.

5. I asked Major Knight if he would welcome the appointment of a Liaison officer from this HQ, who would be there to assist him when called upon in regard to Local Government matters. His immediate reply was "most certainly, yes, we would be delighted to have him."

6. I informed Major Knight that in the hope of receiving such a reply, I had already tentatively assigned Ltout. Harvey (USNR) as Liaison officer for Region III and was expecting him any day now from Tizi Ouzou when after giving him instructions I would allot him such assignment, and arrange for him to report to Major Knight for duty. Major Knight kindly consented to arrange within Region III for his billeting and messing.

7. I informed Major Knight that Ltout. Harvey would render weekly reports of which copies would be submitted to him, and that Ltout. Harvey would be definitely instructed to take no operative action within Region III but to assume duty in a consultive and advisory capacity only.

8. I promised Major Knight to send him a copy of our Administrative Instructions being issued to Region I and II for information.

9. The following points were clarified:

A. The G.P.A. has as yet no citizen members. This is still in ~~suspended~~
The position has remained in suspense, and is as it was on December 1 in that
regard. It may well be that Naples is not as yet ripe for such development, but
I think at this juncture the question of proceeding with the matter might receive
further consideration by the R.C.A.O.

B. A Gunta created, however, in that of "Economie" which equate a
Chamber of Commerce. The members are nominated by the Prefect, and after screening
approved by AMG Region III.

C. The Rettorato Provinciale although in suspense has not been abolished.
I think its specific abolition might receive further consideration by RCAO, Region
III provided there is no legal obstacle.
This should be read with my paragraph E.

D. The Consiglio di Prefettura to be left to the Prefect.

E. The Deputazione Provinciale has not been given consideration as yet. That is to say in its full entity as now constituted in Region I with its 10 citizen members nominated by the Prefect and approved by ANG RGAO.

I think further consideration might be given to this matter, since it does undoubtedly encourage the Italian citizens of high standing to feel that they have a real part to play in the rehabilitation of their country.

F. The Giunta Municipale is operating under the Commissioner Extraordinario, the acting Sindaco of Naples. Signor SOLLERA who has a high reputation; this body is composed of chiefs of Sections and general advisers nominated by the Acting Sindaco and approved by ANG RGAO Region III. It operates for Naples City only. I did not glean the numbers comprising the Giunta.

10. I further appreciate that Local Government may be regarded as a long term set up in Region III in view of the proximity of the area to the front line, and in view of the many pressing executive problems with which Region III are faced, but I feel that the position may change to a shorter term policy at any moment, so that it is well to have the retire along which Local Government can move, set up and ready for the train to make, when the signal is given.

AMG Launches New Purge Of Mussolini's Followers

A general purge of Fascist influence in the civil government of the provinces of Naples, Avellino and Benevento began today under an AMG order requiring removal of Mussolini's partisans from all walks of public life.

Officials of the three provinces have been instructed to oust all persons in public or semi-public offices who have had any connection with the Squadrini, Duce's strong arm group; active or honorary members of the 122 March on Rome society; those decorated for conspicuous service to the Fascist party, and the "big shots" of the former Italian conservative state. It has also been ordered that all other Fascists " guilty of attacks against personal libertes" be removed from office.

Civilian police officials have received additional instructions to

scrutinize the records and backgrounds of all public office holders who hold decorations from the German or Japanese governments as well as those who gained nomination or promotion because of services rendered the Fascist cause.

In discussing the order, AMG authorities stated earlier action had been retarded by inability to find capable and adequate replacements for the ousted officials as well as by constant wrangling between Italian anti-Fascist elements over the choice of successors.

A list of those removed from office in the cleanup campaign will be released shortly, AMG officials said. Criminal matters that are disclosed in the course of the investigations will be referred to police authorities for prosecution.

AMG Launches New Purge Of Mussolini's Followers

It has also been directed that all other Fascists " guilty of attacks against personal liberties" be removed from office.

scrutinize the records and backgrounds of all public office holders who held decorations from the German or Japanese governments as well as those who gained nomination or promotion because of assistance rendered the Fascist cause.

In discussing the ouster order, AMG authorities stated earlier action had been retarded by inability to find capable and reliable replacements for the ousted officials as well as by constant wrangling between Italian anti-Fascist elements over the choice of successors.

A list of those removed from office in the cleanup campaign will be released shortly. AMG officials disclosed in the course of the investigations will be referred to police authorities for prosecution.
