SUBJECT : Translation - Testo Unico of 1915

TO : 2nd Lt B. Wadleigh, Interior

1. Your report of 29 January has been received. Thank you.
2. I am not immediately concerned, as you know, with the General Elections to the Chamber of Deputies, but am most interested with laws for the elections to the various local bodies, and so I am more than pleased that you are arranging to complete these relative sections.
3. The typing machine position is deplorable. I only have got one machine here, instead of the promised three, and I cannot, frankly, understand the position. Neither you have them, nor I have them. You might see Captain G-4 about this. I was definitely told I should get the same issue of typing machines here as I surrendered unwillingly at Naples. The result is exactly as I anticipated.
4. Your paragraph 2. I cannot understand why you were made to waste your now precious time in attending a conference which, so far as I can see, has no interest to the Sub-Commission. In the future, unless you can be assured there are matters of interest, you have my authority not to attend.

SUBJECT: Report of activities.

TO: Director, Interior Subcommittee. 29 January 1944

1. I received your instructions by telephone, relative to the completing the translation of the Testo Unico Law of 1915. I expect to finish all the sections except the provisions relative to the Communal and Provincial Administrative elections, by Jan 31. The section relative to the elections will take somewhat longer to complete than I had anticipated, since they are longer than I realized, and somewhat complex. However, I would bring to your attention that these provisions are not for General elections to the Chamber of Deputies, which are dealt with in the Giolitti laws of a later date, but laws for the election of the various local bodies, such as Consiglio Comunale and G.P.A. In any case, I do not anticipate getting that work finished much before Thursday Feb. 3rd.

The typing, I fear, leaves much to be desired, since we have only one good machine. I had to return two of the typewriters which we had before the move to Salerno. I have managed to borrow one extra one, but it is not very good. The two Civilian typists are, however, doing their best, and I am retaining them both until I complete the work.

2. This afternoon I attended a Conference on electrical matters, at the request of Col. Reiter, of Industrial Planning Staff, as a representative of Interior. I will send the minutes of the meeting when they are issued, but I can safely say that no matters of importance to this subcommission were discussed.

3. I enclose two communications which came to the office today. No action seemed indicated on my part.

1. Attached is a Memorandum on Italian Civil Servants forwarded to Interior Sub-Commission by Col. Spofford, and a "Scheda" which Security Intelligence Sub-Commission said had been requested by Interior.

2. I forwarded two Official letters by the regular courier earlier in the day.

3. I tried to contact the Colonel by phone today, but the Salerno operator told me there was as yet no phone installed in the Interior Offices. Capt. Farrar had called me earlier in the day to tell me that Col. Rathbone had directed that my transfer orders to Internal Communications Sub-Commission be postponed until I had finished the work assigned to me on the translation of the Testo Unico Law. I had understood that this would be the case, and the work is progressing well. However I find that the work of Sig. Margarita is so poor that I have had to retranslate all the text myself. Consequently I shall let him go on Saturday, giving him a certificate that he worked for Interior. I consulted with Col. Legg on the Signorina Costa's employment. He told me that he would not require her services for a few days yet, so I will employ her to copy my manuscript of the translation. This should be finished by Monday or Tuesday of next week.

4. I am not translating the sections of the law relative to financial matters, or to the electoral system, since they do not appear to concern Interior Sub-Commission. However, if you desire that these be translated too, this would be a
