PIEMONTE REGION.

31 May 45.

Political:

Mme CHANOUX as Honorary President of pro-annexation committee, Aosta Province, interrogated re proclamation poster. Denied all knowledge. Agreed to make a statement on her position. French reported promising early delivery of salt etc. to various communes. AMG supplies urgently needed.

CLN presented resignations. Party names submitted for Provincial Advisory Assembly.

Food:

Food Division was contacted on 31 May by Intendant Rono Deslandes, Quartermaster of the French 27th Division under General Molle, with regard to the purchase or requisition of locally produced hay and foodstuffs for use by the French troops of the 27th Division now at Susa, Torino. He was indefinite with regard to his authority to purchase or requisition local resources. He was told that instructions in the matter would be requested. A separate letter is being addressed to IV Corps HQ in this matter.

LOMBARDIA REGION.

31 May 45.

Regional Order No.1 setting forth precisely the relationship between the National Committees of Liberation and A.M.G., has been reproduced in all newspapers of MILAN. 23,000 copies have been distributed in the Region for posting throughout Lombardia. The Committees of Liberation now have only advisory powers.

A meeting was held yesterday by the Regional Patriots Officer with the chief Patriot heads of the Region. They have all agreed to cooperate in seeing to it that the provisions of the orders to consign arms and cease patriot activities as such be carried out throughout the Region. There was full agreement at the meeting.

The Patriot situation in Milan City is very satisfactory. The order is being obeyed and seven barracks have been established for those patriots who do not have a home in Milan. In the meantime they are vacating all posts, stations, and apartments. They will be processed as soon as possible.

LIGURIA/.....

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LIGURIA REGION.

1 June 1945.

Situation quiet. Flour situation taxes all transportation to the limit to maintain long supply line to Leghorn. Provinces report difficulty transporting food from Genoa to Savona and Imperia. Large industrial firms threatened with closure in near future unless financial aid forthcoming. HQ Alcom informed and Italian representatives are leaving to discuss situation with appropriate Italian ministries.

LOMBARDIA REGION.

1 June 1945.

The plan for collecting work horses for farmers deprived of them by the Germans is working out very well. Horses are also being provided for the city of Milan to help in the clean-up programme.

A vast programme for Public Works for the city of Milan has been approved. This will not only help in reconstructing the city and relieving the housing shortage, but will also be the first step against threatened unemployment.

1. The general situation west of the ISONZO continues to be satisfactory, although some incidents are still reported. The partisans are becoming somewhat unpopular with the population owing to their continued living off the country, and there has been some desertion and voluntary disarmament among both the OSOPO and GARIBOLDINI.

2. Plans are now being prepared for the general disarming of all partisans west of the TAGLIAMENTO River at an early date. The greatest obstacle is the provision of employment for the men when disbanded. PC UDINE has already taken on over 600 as Civil Police.

3. The Communist Minister SOCCIMENTI visited UDINE on 28 May. As he was in the area without permission he was asked to leave at once, and did so. There have been no visible repercussions from his visit.

4. 18 officers from MG Austria are at present on loan to UDINE Province as well as three others eventually assigned to TRIESTE Province. The provision of substitutes for them, which was discussed with the Executive Commissioner on his visit on 30 May, is now an urgent matter, as withdrawals of loaned officers for duty in JUSTIZIA has already had to begin.

5. Col MONFORT has now taken command of the VENEZIA GIULIA Sub-Region, and is himself living at HQ 13 Corps. The provision of additional officers, EM/OR and transport for this party is now an urgent matter, and has been taken up separately with HQ Allied Commission.

6. Supplies for TRIESTE continue to arrive as reported in my report for 29 May.

7. Various questions of policy in the administration of Allied Military Government in VENEZIA GIULIA were discussed with Field Marshal ALEXANDER on his recent visit here: detailed administrative instructions from AFHQ are still awaited, as are also the revised versions of Proclamations 2-4.

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Arrangements have been made with 13 Corps, and Army transport to distribute them at a moment's notice. It is considered important that as much display as possible should be made when the time comes to feed whatever proportion of VENEZIA GIULIA coming under M.G. control.

7. The emergency Proclamation which was sent down by signal to ROE (N.10 37 of 22 MAY refers), has been translated into Italian and Yugoslavian and has been printed by Army Field Printing Press, and has been distributed to II U.S. Corps and the TRIESTE Provincial HQ. The Proclamation No.1 flown up by air and agreed by ROE and AFHQ is now being printed and will take the place of the emergency one which has been issued.

The emergency Proclamation will only be used if the other one is not ready in time, but it is not anticipated that this will take place.

Pending the arrival of the Administrative Instruction as regards the method of handing VENEZIA GIULIA, which it is understood is coming from AFHQ, instructions have been got out to meet an emergency, but have not been distributed, and will not be, unless the Administrative Instruction referred to has not arrived.

In the meantime, various pertinent points have been signalled down to ROE which require an answer. I am well aware that the correct answer to most of these questions would be, that the whole of VENEZIA GIULIA, whether occupied by Allied troops or by the Yugoslavs is a country "held in trust", until the final settlement is arrived at round the Peace Table. I am, however, equally sure that the Yugoslavs will consider that portion in which they are, and in which they are to remain, as a de facto annexation whatever may be the de jure situation to be.

CLNAT yesterday passed resolution in which it is claimed that political parties represent not only their own members but all national public opinion and called for urgent constitution of a government with necessary powers and prestige and embodying genuine democratic elements in this country and in particular those who have been engaged in struggle in the North.

Resolution states that present situation gravely prejudices the solution of pressing problems of Italian labour and of the whole nation and makes the following specific review:

1. That new Government should be nominated by Central Committee of National Liberation substitute for Parliament by virtue of the pact between the anti-Fascist parties and as repository of constitutional rights. (Text corrupt).
2. That the resistance movement in the North should be adequately represented in the Government.
3. That CLNLI or Government legislation should be integrated, with suitable modifications, into measures passed by local with particular reference to rapid exurtion and social legislation (Text corrupt).
4. That patriots if they so desire should be accepted in Italian army and police.
5. That the new government, in agreement with the central CLNLI should immediately arrange for establishment of a provisional

opinion and called for urgent construction of a government whose necessary powers and prestige and embodying genuine democratic elements in this country and in particular those who have been engaged in struggle in the North.

Resolution states that present situation gravely prejudices the solution of pressing problems of Italian labour and of the whole nation and makes the following specific review;

6. That the President of the Council and other members of the government should give concrete affirmations and guarantees regarding the above principle.

Ref No. 4029. I understand that moderate character of resolution was largely due to pressure of Christian Democrats who are determined not to be stampeded into violent action. It should be noted that leading article of ITALIAN LIVANTI, today specifically states that article 1 means that government would be nominated by CLN and not by LUGOTTEMENTE. SCONCIALMO who arrived here unexpectedly last night with TOGLIATTI said in a press interview that the pre-Fascist Democracy still existing in the South would move to evolve in a progressive direction in which the North had already led the way. The North could not go backwards and the change of Government must involve not only a change of ??(text corrupt) but above all a structural transformation of Italian state.

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Left wing parties are complaining about ban on public meetings and sarcastic article in 'Unita' today asks whether this is the sort of liberty which the Allies have brought with them and whether it is merited in view of sacrifices of the North. I understand, however, that Christian Democrats are greatly relieved as they feared incidents if public meetings were allowed. Left wing parties will probably try to get ban removed and if they fail must be expected to improvise meetings during visits to factories, etc.

General Crittenberger intends to take no chances but is resting for formal written orders on the subject which he has thus far never received. My own impression is that no attempt will be made to secure final solution of Government issue while Ministers are in North but that every effort will be made to convince them of strength of progressive forces and futility of trying to resist these tendencies.

'Unita' at once labelled them Fascist criminals but it is much more probable that they were extremist partisan hot-heads annoyed by MURAZZI's firm attitude on CLN. Town remains quiet. Small number of murders per night still continue but further intensification of measures by allied military authorities should eliminate this except for isolated cases. General Crittenberger is also intensifying measures for collection of arms.

AVANTI : 1. Message of the Socialist Party to the population of the North. The Dizionisti of the Party met yesterday and passed resolutions, asking formally 1. that all powers be retained by the Northern C.I.N. and their appointments be confirmed, 2. that battaglia formations keep their organization, arms and banners and be allowed to continue to wage war against the Germans, 3. that a C.I.N. congress be summoned immediately in Rome to receive the message of the North and to designate the new Government, 4. that no "sanitary cordon" or line of demarcation be allowed to divide the provinces of Italy - exception made only for the necessities of war.

2. The above message is followed by a report of the joint meeting of Communist and Socialist Committees asking Bonomi to appeal to the Allies for permission for immediate meeting of the C.I.N. committee to meet with C.I.N. of the North. In the meanwhile the two parties have taken the initiative, summoning the Central C.I.N. committee and the secretaries of the six parties.

Large towns liberated by the patriots so far are: Milano, Pregola, Varese, Biella, Asti, Alessandria, Domodossola, Novara, Imperia, the frontier between Como and Domodossola entirely in the patriots' hands.

The C.I.N. through Radio Milano, invited all patriots to surrender immediately and hand over their arms; whoever resists will be treated as an enemy; all Fascists, counterrevolutionaries and police agents to hand over all their arms before midnight of the 28th,

2. The above message is followed by a report of the joint meeting of Communist and Social-Centrist Committees calling Honors, to appeal to the Allies for permission for immediate meeting of the C.I.N. Committee to meet with C.I.U. of the North. Meanwhile the two parties have taken the initiative, summing the Central C.I.N. committee and the secretaries of the six parties.

Two towns liberated by the patriots go for two: Milano, Pressana, Varese, Biella, Asti, Alessandria, Concordia, Genova, Savona, Imperia. The frontier between Com and Domodossola is entirely in the patriots' hands.

The Camere dei Lavoro of Milan has invited all workers to see that no harm is done to plants or works.

The new socialist Minister of Milan has ordered the immediate end of the strike and the immediate restarting of work.

The C.I.N. through radio Milan, invited all prisoners to submit immediately and hand over their arms; whoever resists will be treated as an enemy; all fascists, communists and police agents to hand over all their arms before midnight of the 26th; all police agents who remained on duty until the 25th, to present themselves to the local authorized commands; all those who fled to the flight of war and fascist criminals will be severely punished, whoever commits acts of sabotage in the liberated territory will be punished or even executed.

The patriots treat German prisoners according to international conventions, waiting to hand them over to the Allies.

Turin strikers and workers have occupied all the works, plants and industrial firms; patriots and demobilization are fighting against the last fascists.

The Province of Apulia has a curfew as present.

The Socialist leader of the Milan C.L.R. urges the economic Govt to resign; "We want a clearly revolutionary party - he said - formed by representatives of the truly democratic forces, by men who can prove that they have always fought against fascism and from the very depths of the working classes".

Radio Milano Libera sent a message to Togliatti asking him to resign to him.

Raniero Musolini and his wife were invited entrance into Socialist territory.
