I have just had a call from Mr. HOPKINSON, Polad (B), who told me that a communication had been received from the Foreign Office which made it quite clear that BOLZANO Province would not be handed back in the forthcoming hand-over of Northern territory.

Polad B thought that this would be a great shock to the Italian Government, especially as the matter of the retention of AMG in BOLZANO had not been raised publicly. WASHINGTON and LONDON are drawing up a statement giving reasons why BOLZANO is being retained under AMG and HOPKINSON wishes to give some ammunition for the statement although I gathered that the Embassy here may not have been specifically asked for it.

The three reasons which HOPKINSON suggested might be put forward were:-

- (a) Military Necessity. By this HOPKINSON meant the comparatively large number of Germans still in the area.
- (b) The confused nationality problem.
- (c) That although AMG was being retained it would not be allowed to in any way interfere with Italian Government efforts to set up local autonomy, or works to that effect.

I said that I agreed and would let him know if we had any further suggestions to make.

Regions I, II, III, IV, VI, VII,
VIII, IX and Rome Region.SCAO, AMG 3 Army.
SCAO, AMG 8 Army.

1. Reflecting as from 2001 hours, 20th July, 1944, the Provinces of NUZZES, BENTIVELLO and AVELLINO (Region III) and of CAMPOROSSO and POGGIA (Region V), will be handed over to the Italian Government.

2. Regional Commissioner, Region III will thereafter exercise supervision and control under ACS conditions throughout Region III with the exception of the Comune of NUZZES (which includes the City and Port of NUZZES) in which Allied Military Government will continue.

3. Regional Commissioner, Region V, will exercise similar supervision and control over the administration of CAMPOROSSO Province while administering the remaining Provinces of ARREDA and the MUSCHIE under Allied Military Government.

4. As from the date defined above, ROZZA Province (Provincial Commissioner, Colonel C. S. Tomphey) will be detached from Region V and temporarily, pass under direct command of AGC HQ. This Province, which lies in the compartment of Apulia, will eventually pass to the control of Region II.

5. All matters of staff, transport and supplies are now being prepared by the Regional Commissioner, Region V and Provincial Commissioner, POGGIA, and will be submitted to the Section concerned for approval.

1. Effective at 0001 hours, 20th July, 1944, the Provinces of NAPLES, BENEVENTO and AVELLINO (Region III) and ARCANDELLI and FROSINA (Region IV) will be handed over to the Italian Government.
2. Regional Commissioner, Region III will thereafter exercise supervision and control under APC conditions throughout Region III with the exception of the Comune of NAPLES (which includes the City and Port of NAPLES) in which Allied Military Government will continue.
3. Regional Commissioner, Region V, will exercise similar supervision and control over the administration of CAMPANIA while administering the remaining Province of ABRUZZI and the MAREMME under Allied Military Government.
4. As from the date defined above, PROV. PUGLIA (Provincial Commissioner, Colonel G.S. Temperley) will be detached from Region V and temporarily, pass under direct command of APC HQ. This Province, which lies in the compartment of Apulia, will eventually pass to the command of Region II.
5. Adjutant of staff, transport and supplies are now being prepared by the Regional Commissioner, Region V and Provincial Commissioner, FROSINA, and will be submitted to the Sections concerned for approval.
6. This will not be made public until further orders.

The correspondence of March 1944 between the Chief Commissioner and Marshal Badoglio has been formally brought to the notice of the Minister of the Interior and detailed arrangements for implementing the Marshal's undertaking (in relation to this Sub-Commission's functions) have been laid down.

No question as to this has arisen within this Sub-Commission.

Art. 12 (Free movement and immunity from taxation for any Representative of the United Nations) :-

Para. 3 (a) (1) :- Para 3 of Document C and the 2nd para of Art. 1. of Italian R.D.L. No. 31 relate to the functions of this Sub-Commission. The Italian Government have satisfactorily observed these provisions in the cases with which this Sub-Commission has dealt.

MEMORANDUM

TO : All Concerned

1. By Proclamation No. 18, that part of the Italian Peninsula which lies south of the northern boundaries of the provinces of Salerno, Potenza and Bari, together with the island of Sicily (not exclusive of the islands of Pantelleria, Lampedusa and Linosa) was restored to the jurisdiction of the Italian Government with effect from 0001 hrs. on 11 February 1944.

2. Without prejudice to the rights which the United Nations have under the Armistice and which are exercised in their behalf by the Commander-in-Chief of the Allied Forces and his representatives, including the Allied Control Commission, all powers of government in the above mentioned areas will henceforth belong to the Government of Italy.

3. According to the terms of the Armistice, the Allied Control Commission will continue to insure the effective use of Italian resources in the common war and to represent Allied interests to the Italian National and local governments.

In order to centralize control of the Regional Organizations (including 5th and 6th Armies and 5th and 6th Armies) and to ensure compliance by the Italian government with the advice tendered to them and the execution of the Chief Commissioner's orders, as advised by the Economic and Administrative Sections, a third section has been set up to be called the Regional Control and Military Government Section headed by an Executive Commissioner having the status of vice President under whose immediate command will come the R.C.A.Os and R.C.Cs and their staffs both administrative and specialist in all matters, and the S.C.A.Os, 5th and 6th Armies and military personnel of HQ, A.C.C. for administration and discipline.

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8. On all matters of policy the Chief Commissioner's orders and directives (as advised by the Subcommissions) will be passed to the A.C.A.Us and R.C.Cs by this Section. Heads of Subcommissions will correspond with their representatives in the Regions (but not with representatives of other Subcommissions) on routine technical matters only. A.C.A.Us will address themselves on all matters to the V.P. of the KC & MG Section, which will also carry out (in the Establishment Branch), the MS, A & Q, J-1 and J-4 duties for all personnel of the A.C.C. All postings and assignments to Regions and to HQ will be made by the Section and no transfers of personnel from Region will be carried out except by this Section.

9. This Section will also be responsible for Displaced Persons Subcommissions, Security and for proper liaisons between A.C.C. and Regions and All Allied military (all services) formations.

10. It is important to maintain the channel of communication to Regions and Army Areas through this Section in order that coordination of policy, continuity in administration and close liaison with military formations and units may be ensured, so far as is possible, both in the areas administered by Allied military government and in the territory in which the Allied officers act in an advisory capacity only.

11. It is therefore the Chief Commissioner's wish that Subcommissions should err on the side of passing too much through this Section, especially during the early stage, rather than of dealing direct with their representatives in the field.
