1. Reference your endorsement No. RVIII/47/14 dtd 15 December to Livorno Province letter No. AMI/14/11/1099 dtd 16 December 1944.

2. Authorization has been granted for the opening of but one Consulate in Livorno, i.e. that of Brazil. Mr. Luis de Almeida Nogueira Porto, now Vice-Consul in Naples will resign and take charge of the Consulate. He will be assisted in his functions by Mr. Mario Agnoro, Consular Clerk. Both are Brazilian citizens.

3. But one other person, who has any connection with the Consulate, has been authorized to proceed to Livorno; the father of the Danish Consular Agent at Livorno. This person, however, is not authorized to exercise Consular functions.

4. Political Section will inform you of any Consulates to be opened at Livorno in the future.
