1. Reference Your request for my views on fo. 4 There is little to say - chiefly because so much is left unaided by the PC as to what actually took place. We don't know what form the "plan of ratiocining the basis of families to advise him" took. The PC merely states "it was not an election properly so called". What was it then?

The HQ indicate that elections see not to be held but a PC may secure all the advice he wants for the appointment of officials.

## I capifamiglia di Belluno votano per i comunisti

BELLUNO, 19 - Un curioso esperimento elettorale ha avuto luogo in questi giorni nella provincia di Belluno. Per iniziativa della Democrazia Cristiana è venuto consenso ed incoraggiamento delle autorità militari allede in 20 comuni si è proceduto alle elezioni amministrative di carattere proporzionale a cui hanno preso parte i soli appartenenti. Questa prima saggio elettorale dimostra, secondo le speranze dei suoi promotori, a seguire una strada del partito democratici e la fine del potere locale del CLN, si è concluso con una grossa sorpresa per la reazione. Su 20 comuni in cui si sono votate le elezioni il Partito Comunista si è classificato primo conquistando il maggior numero di voti. I risultati possono essere riassunti in poche cifre.

Ma il risultato è già di per sé obbligatorio sintomatico, anche se non esprime in pieno la volontà ancor più netamente democratica degli elettori.

### HEADS OF FAMILIES OF BELLUNO VOTE COMMUNIST.

A curious electoral experiment took place lately in the province of Belluno. On initiative of the "Democrazia Cristiana" and with the warm consent and support of the Allied Military authorities, administrative elections of temporary character in which only head of families voted, took place in twenty Comunes. This first electoral test 'bound', according to the hopes of the people who sponsored it, to mark a defeat of the democratic parties and the end of the local power of the CLN, turned out to be a great surprise for the reactionaries. On 20 Comunes where elections took place the Communist Party came out the winner with the greatest number of votes.

Results can be summarized in the following few figures:

Quite a bit could be said on certain electoral manœuvres which characterized this local experiment. However the result in itself is much of a symptom, even though it does not express in full the still more clear democratic will of the electors.



1. Ref your AC/45/30/LG of 16 Nov. and further to my  
of 19 Nov 45.2. I have now had an opportunity of investigating  
carefully the matters alleged in the "Avanti" report.3. In the first place I have ascertained that the  
article which appeared in the Rome paper was a copy almost  
word for word of a small article which appeared in the C.L.N.  
paper published in Venice. So far as I have been able to  
ascertain there has not, at any time, been any further press  
comment.4. The matter was mentioned to me by the President  
of the Regional C.L.N. who subsequently confirmed his conversa-  
tion in letter form. He was however chiefly concerned with  
certain results in the border Communes of Livinallongo, Cortina  
and Colle S.Lucia where he felt that the Tiroler - he called  
it Nazi - influence was too strong.5. Colonel Farren, then Provincial Commissioner Belluno,  
explained the position as follows. In the first instance, he  
wished to emphasise that any action taken was done in complete  
agreement with the Prefect and Vice Prefect, both C.L.N. nominees.  
He found that in his widely scattered and thinly inhabited  
Province, with few Officers, it was very difficult to get an  
idea as to who should be good Sindacos. Some men had been put  
in, in the early days by the C.L.N.s, who got tired of the job  
and retired, or who were clearly not going to be the right type.  
Colonel Farren therefore devised the plan of asking the heads  
of families to advise him as to the likely person for Sindaco.  
It was not an election properly so called, for the Sindacos  
were all recommended by the Prefect and appointed by the Provincial  
Commissioner. When Colonel Farren was asked if he would allow

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women and young men to vote, he replied, I submit quite correctly, that he particularly wished to avoid any confusion with the proper administrative elections which would be carried out under regulations laid down by the Italian Government. He did not wish to prejudice in advance any regulations that the Italian Government might make.

The method adopted was merely intended as a guide to the Provincial Commissioner to make a choice which remained his responsibility.

6. I am advised that out of sixty nine Communes, Sindaci were changed in ten as a result of this method. It appears that on the whole the system worked well and secured general approval.
