1. The Italian National elections will be held throughout ITALY on 2 and 3 June. Personnel of all Military formations will be directed to avoid any kind of intervention or appearance of intervention in these elections.

2. In order to avoid embroilment of Allied Military personnel in any disorder attendant upon elections either preceeding, on or following the election dates, leaves and passes will be kept to a minimum during period 1 to 4 June.

TO : AFHQ: G-5 Section

1. Reference is made to this Headquarters signal 1607 of 6 March relating to the local elections held in March and April and to AFHQ signal to military commanders reference FX 62271 of 8 March.
2. Instructions have been given to Allied Commission Liaison Officers to observe the national elections on 2 and 3 June in the same way as was done for the communal elections. A copy of this Headquarters Directive AG/45/8/16 of 21 May is inclosed for your information. You will note that the voting continues until 1200 hours on Monday, 3 June.
3. It is recommended that directions be issued to all Allied military formations for troops to avoid any kind of intervention or appearance of intervention during the national elections as was done for the local elections by the above quoted signal.
4. In this connection attention is drawn to this Headquarters signal to you No. 1701 of 8 March and to your reply by signal No. F 62430 on 9 March and which relate to the conduct of Polish troops during the local elections.

SUBJECT: Macerata. Election campaign.

The Macerata Prefect has pointed out to our Ministry the fear expressed by the representatives of the various Parties, that the propaganda activity and the election campaign in that district might get disturbed by the intervention of Polish Troops.

In order to avoid that a such^{an} eventuality may take place, our Ministry begs to ask your Commission to examine the possibility that Allied Troops be displaced in that district during the election campaign with the purpose of carrying out a Police service control on the Polish Troops.

We furthermore point out that the said Polish Troops are displaced at the following localities of the Macerata district:

Macerata, Montecassino, Montefano, Urbisaglia, Corridonia, Cingoli, Treia, Monte S. Giusto, Mogliano, Porto Recanati, Civitanova Alta, Portocivitanova, Potenza, Pienza, Recanati, Morovalle, Montelapone, Montecorsaro, Camerino, Castelraimondo, Matelica, S. Severino Tolentino, S. Ginesio, Loro Piceno, Pollenza, Colmareno and Petriolo.

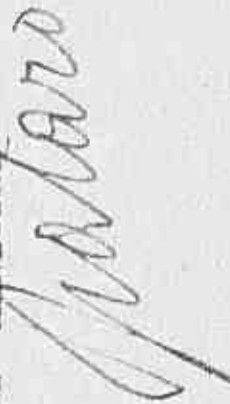

SUBJECT: Note of Interview - AC HQ

DATE : 31 January 1946 - 1045 hours

PRESENT: Dr. SCANDAGLIATO from Cabinet of the Ministry of Interior
 Maj R. R. TEMPLE, Director, Local Government Sub Commission
 Maj C. G. R. WILLIAMS, Executive Officer, Local Govt S/C
 Sig. Arrigo NICE, interpreting

1. Dr. SCANDAGLIATO showed the Director a telegram sent to the Ministry of Interior by the Prefect of ~~the~~ Macerata, Dr. CARTA. The telegram stated that the Prefect had held a meeting of the leaders of all political parties in the province, at which the Socialist and Communist representatives referred to the presence of Polish troops and said they feared these troops would disturb public order during the electoral campaign and the elections. The telegram suggested that the police service of the Polish troops should be entrusted also to Allied elements of other nationalities.

2. Dr. SCANDAGLIATO said that he had been entrusted to call to ascertain whether, if the suggestion made in the telegram was put to Allied Commission, it would be considered.

The Director said that

3. ~~the~~ if the Italian Government were of opinion that the fears of the Socialist and Communist political leaders in Macerata were founded and communicated accordingly with Allied Commission, such a communication would certainly be considered. If the Ministry were of that opinion, he suggested they should write to the Sub Commission accordingly, inclosing a copy of the telegram.

4. The Director also suggested, however, that before writing to Allied Commission, the Ministry should ascertain the facts from the Prefect, particularly what and how many Polish troops were referred to and where they were stationed and what exactly the Prefect meant by "Allied elements of other nations" and what these additional troops were supposed to do. If these points were clarified and stated in the Ministry's letter, it would assist him in obtaining a decision as the matter would have to be referred to the appropriate military command.
