Copy is attached of signal despatched 18th March in connection with the above subject.

1. Elections were held in 229 Communes of Lombardy, 7 out of the 9 Provinces being concerned.
2. The greatest interest was shown by the population. Of the eligible voters, 30 to 35% went to the polls. The number of women voters was remarkable.
3. CC.RR., Questure Agents and Firemen were engaged in maintaining public order which was of the highest standard.
4. No disturbances occurred anywhere. Much good humour prevailed.
5. In all Communes visited, IOs were cheerfully welcomed and their presence and discretion favorably impressed authorities and population.
6. No evidence of intimidation was apparent, but in some Communes priests hovered near the polling stations.
7. From the political point of view it is interesting to report that in the important industrial centre of Saronno (22,000 voters), where a social-communist majority was expected, the Demo-Christians gained the day.

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In the Communes bordering Emilia Region (Pavia and Cremona Provinces), the social-communists prevailed everywhere.

SUBJECT: Observations on Local Elections
held on 17 March at Davagna and
Torrigliola (Province of Genova).

25 March 1946

TO : The Director of Local Government S/O.

Accompanied by the Prefect and Inspector-General RIZZA I visited the Prefettura of Genova on Saturday 16 March, where I spoke with the Prefect Antonicucci, the Vice-Prefect in charge of elections and the Chief of the Cabinet of the Prefect. They said that everything was in order for carrying out the elections the day after and that no trouble or disturbances were anticipated.

The Prefect said that pursuant to instructions from the Ministry of the Interior which reached him the same evening, orders had been given by telephone to the Sindaco to open the polling places at 6 a.m. and close them at 22.00 hrs. He mentioned also that a good number of carabinieri was sent to the communes in which elections were to be held on Sunday 17 March and that all the certificates and other voting material had been delivered to the communes.

On the 17 March accompanied by the Prefect and Inspector-General RIZZA I visited the Communes of Davagna.

At Davagna we met the Sindaco and the Secretary of the Commune.

There were 3 Electoral Sections, all of them in suitable buildings with a single entrance for men and women. Each section was presided by a judicial official. Two cabins had been placed in each section. The "scrutatori" at each polling station were equally divided among the parties. Two lists were presented: that of the Christian Democrats and Action Party with the symbol of the cross on a shield and a pre-Christian altar, and that of the Communists with the symbol of hammer and sickle and the star. The police was much in evidence inside and outside the polling stations and was patrolling the village. People outside the polling stations were waiting with enthusiasm their turn to vote.

No disturbances took place either before, during or after the elections. No threats were used to prevent people from voting and each party was able to hold its pre-election meetings. The President of one of the polling stations invited me to enter the station, but as I could see from outside what was happening inside the station I thanked him and declined his invitation.

I noticed that at the entrance of one of the polling stations was the "manifesto" of the Socialist party only. I drew the attention of the Sindaco to the fact, and he immediately gave orders in my presence that "manifesti" of other parties should equally be stuck on the wall. On my way back I noticed that the orders of the Sindaco had been carried out.

The counting of the ballots was to be done on Monday and consequently the result was not known at the time we left Genova.

Torriglia The Comune of Torriglia has a population of 4,191

All electoral certificates and other voting material had been delivered in time. There were 6 electoral sections, all six located in school buildings with one entrance for men and women. The Presidents of the polling stations were either magistrates or judicial officials.

Two lists were presented as follows: Socialists and Communists with the symbol of the hammer-sickle and book; Christian Democrat block with a few Independents and Liberals with the cross on the shield and the seal of Torriglia.

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We arrived at Torrignia at 11.30 on Sunday the 17 March and we met the captain and the Maresciallo of the Carabinieri together with the commissario of Public Safety. They said that the polling stations opened at 6.00 hrs. and that no disturbances were reported until our arrival. While we were talking to them a member of the Liberal party interrupted us and, rather excited, pointed out to the Maresciallo that a van was going around the village exhorting the population to vote for the Communist list. He said that that was not in accordance with the electoral law and a protest had been made in writing to the President of the 1st Electoral Section. I asked the captain of the Carabinieri whether the statement of the member of the Liberal party was correct. He said that the van was not within 200 metres from the polling stations, therefore he concluded there was no violation of article 36 of the D.L.L. 7th Jan. 1946 n.l. I pointed out however that the presence of the van in the Comune could create trouble and give way to disturbances. He then approached the van and asked the driver and the occupants to leave the Comune, which they did.

The police was much in evidence in Torrignia and at the polling stations and included besides the Carabinieri, guards of the Finance Corps.

In the afternoon we were about to leave Torrignia when Major T. Kane of the Liaison Group, Genova, arrived there.

Late in the evening we paid another visit to the Prefect and he gave us a copy of a cable which he was sending to the Ministry of the Interior. He was stating in the cable that no disturbances were reported up to 19.00 hrs. and that the percentage of votes was 80% of the electors.

The result of the ballot was not yet known on Monday morning when we left for Rome.

 Subject : Italian Municipal Elections in Piemonte.
 To : CHIEF COMMISSIONER, Allied Commission, APO 394.

1. In compliance with above reference report on the Italian Municipal elections in Piemonte Region is hereby submitted.
2. Lt. Col. Green, Major Ronnie, Captains Sealife, Bolter, Perry, Barone and Ciliberti observed elections in different Provinces. Lt. Col. Gardner and Capt. Pankratz absent in some. Col. Ross observed in Torino and Asti Provinces with assigned Officers.
3. No instance of disorder or illegal electioneering was discovered. Comments from civilians and Carabinieri on streets was that elections were orderly, efficient and quiet.
4. In most cases voting occurred in the morning, and was marked by the large number of women voters and the very high percentage of all eligible voters turning out.
5. General indications in all towns of normal Sunday activities with bocce games causing only excitement observed.
6. Actually voters seemed more interested in the personalities of the candidates than in their political parties although all towns had posters of principal parties on display.
7. Some of the larger towns were holding political rallies but none were observed in towns where elections actually took place.
8. Carabinieri were in evidence in all towns visited - usually in the vicinity of polling places - but no incidents were observed. In Condove, in Torino Province, the Monday morning "IL COMMERCIO" (Ind) reports that a hand bomb was thrown at the Carabinieri at 2300 hrs. No damage reported.
9. No obvious misuse of transportation was observed in any Province.
10. Tabulated report of all observers is attached as Appendix I.

On Sunday the 17th I visited the following places in connection with the elections :

CAPURSO

Three party politics were in evidence :

- (a) Communist and Socialist
- (b) Liberale and Uomo Qualunque
- (c) Democristiani and Veterans

There was no question but the Democristiani were the most in evidence.

Newly written slogans on the walls and posters were extensively displayed :

"LONG LIVE TRUMAN - LONG LIVE AMERICA"

A large number of Italian Prisoners of War from America are located in this Area and are energetic in putting out pro America propaganda - and ~~one~~ achieving success in this respect - their wish being for Italy to become one of the States of America.

NOICATTARO

The population in the town were genuinely interested in the elections and the majority supported the Democristiani Party.

The slogans appearing on the street and building walls were thus:

"VOTE FOR THE DEMOCRISTIANI"
 "VIVA L'AMERICA"
 "WE ARE RECEIVING WHEAT FROM AMERICA NOT RUSSIA"
 "VIVA IL PRESIDENTE TRUMAN"
 "PANE E LAVORO"

The Uomo Qualunque did not appear to be in the picture at all in this town.

Here again returned Prisoners of War from America had been busy putting out strong propaganda in favour of America. The elections were going on in a very orderly and quiet manner.

RUTIGLIANO

Organisation good - Crowds orderly.

Majority supporting the Democristiani Party who had liberally adorned walls with their posters.

Not very keen interest was being shown in the elections by the population which crowded round the Sunday market stores and not the polling stations.

There was no question but the Democristiani were the most in evidence.

The Uomo Qualunque did not appear to be in the picture at all in this town.

This pro-America movement is very popular in Apulia.

The majority of the crowd were of the Democristiani Party.

Posters and placards supporting the Liberali, Democristiani, Uomo Qualunque - a few Communist posters. One poster caught my attention

"VIVA L'UNRRA"

The elections were well organized and conducted in an orderly fashion.

Lieut. LEWIS visited the following towns:

VALENZANO

Communists in majority. Very much propaganda was made by same during past few days. Not many people at polling stations because of bad weather.

Temper of people not very good and they talked with little willingness, also were very suspicious.

ADELFIA

Democristiani in majority, rest all independent. No Communists or Socialists. Some electioneering was made by Democristiani Party the day before the elections.

Temper of crowd very good and many people were to be seen waiting in queues before the polling stations.

When asked, people gave information freely and without asking for the reason this information was required.

Voting was well organized and all was very orderly and calm.

MONOPOLI

The Democristiani, Liberal, Reduci (war veterans) and Uomo Qualunque all represented one party, so called

"Partito della Stella" (Party of the Star), with a star as symbol. Very much propaganda was made by this party and no Communist or Socialist posters were in sight either at the polling stations or elsewhere.

Order very good and people appeared to be very interested in the elections and good humored.

In none of these communes was there anything outstanding to report, the usual Sunday crowds collected in the streets and piazzas but there was no undue excitement or disorder.

No public meetings were held, and as far as could be seen no electioneering was taking place within 200 metres of the polling stations.

Obviously, many people on the roads were proceeding to and from voting places and it is expected that polling was heavy.

Some transport was being used, particularly by the



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Communist and Socialist parties, but having re- to the fact that most of the Communes are in country areas, with a scattered population, the use of transport is not regarded as excessive. The heaviest use of transport of all kinds, pleasure cars, lorries, carts etc, was observed at Taenaa.

At San Prospero during the morning, a crowd was waiting outside the polling station, but it was quite patient and orderly.

There have been no reports of intimidation or bribery.

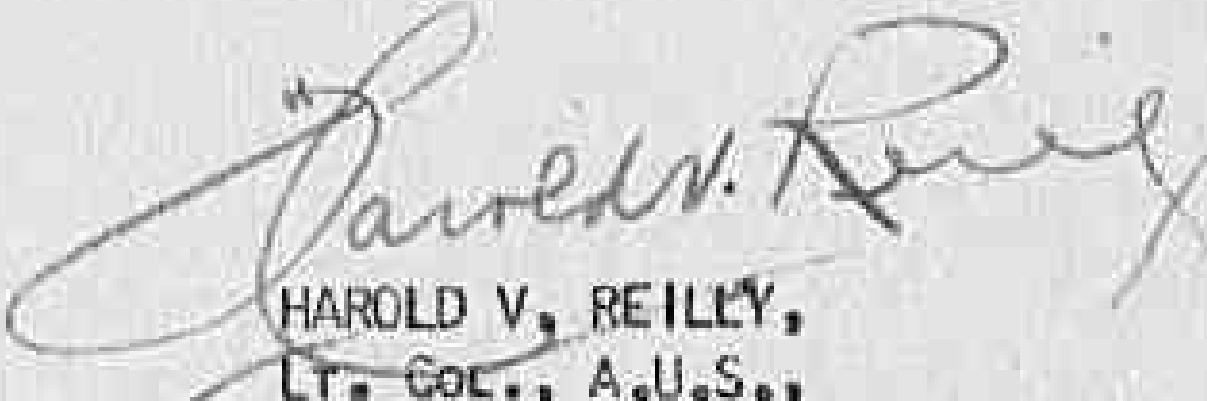

1. ALL THE COMMUNES OF TUSCANA, WHERE ELECTIONS WERE HELD ON SUNDAY, 17 MARCH 1946, WERE COVERED BY A REPRESENTATIVE OF THIS H.Q.
2. THE PERCENTAGE VOTING OF THOSE ELIGIBLE WAS EXTREMELY HIGH THROUGHOUT.
3. PUBLIC ORDER WAS AS IT MIGHT HAVE BEEN ON ANY SUNDAY OF THE MONTH, AND THERE WAS NO ELECTIONEERING OR PUBLIC MEETINGS.
4. ON THE ROADS APPROACHING THE COMMUNES THERE WERE MANY PEOPLE ON FOOT, WHO EITHER WERE GOING TO OR COMING FROM THE POLLS. NO OTHER MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION WAS SEEN TO GET THE VOTERS TO THE POLLING PLACES.
5. ALTHOUGH THERE WAS NO ELECTIONEERING NEAR THE POLLS, THERE WERE IN SEVERAL CASES PRINTED BALLOTS AND SLOGANS OF THE VARIOUS PARTIES TACKED ON THE WALLS OF THE POLLING PLACES. NONE OF THESE SEEMED TO DRAW ANY PARTICULAR ATTENTION, HOWEVER.

MEMO ON OBSERVATION OF ELECTIONS.

You have been asked to act as a Liaison Representative (L.O.) representing the Chief Liaison Officer of the Allied Commission in the observance of Italian elections. Please be guided by the following instructions:

The policy of A.C. HQ is that the conduct of elections is strictly a matter for the Italians to settle. Great care must therefore be taken to avoid any possible impression, which would be erroneous, that Allied representatives are interfering in or supervising the elections. The conduct of LOs in observing the elections will be as inconspicuous as possible. In particular an LO will on no account enter a polling station or any place where votes are being counted.

LOs should visit a typical Commune or Communes on election day and observe the behaviour of the population in the streets and Public places.

Reports are required after each election day from LOs on this subject and should be addressed to Chief L.O., A.C. Livorno. They should mention very briefly what they have observed and draw attention to any special or unusual feature. Among points which might be noted are the following;

1. State of Public order.
2. Any electioneering within 200 metres of polls.
3. Any election meetings on public places.
4. Any other type of political activity.
5. Any form of intimidation or bribery to influence voting.
6. Any unusual use of transport to bring people to the polls, etc.

All kinds of electioneering are forbidden within a radius of 200 metres of a polling station. No election meetings may be held in public places on the election day. The non-observance of this rule should be reported, but nothing will be done by members of Allied Forces to enforce rule.

Remember you are solely an observer and a reporter. Do not give advice nor permit yourself in anyway to become involved in the handling of the elections.

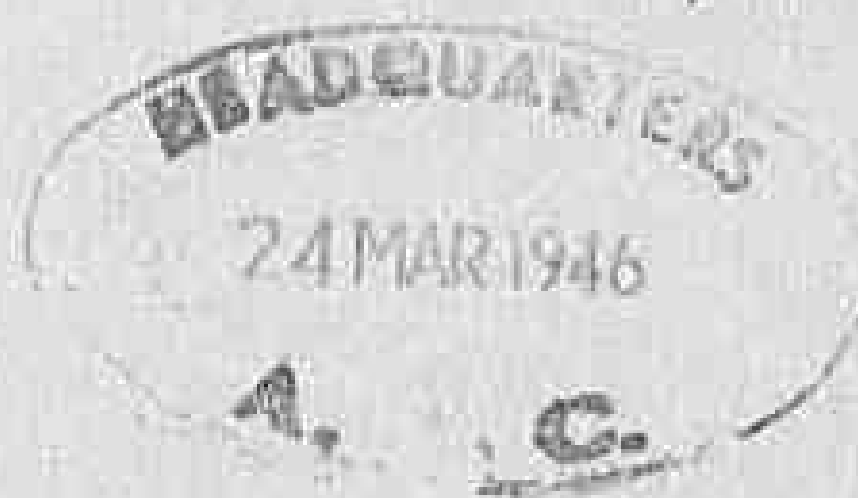

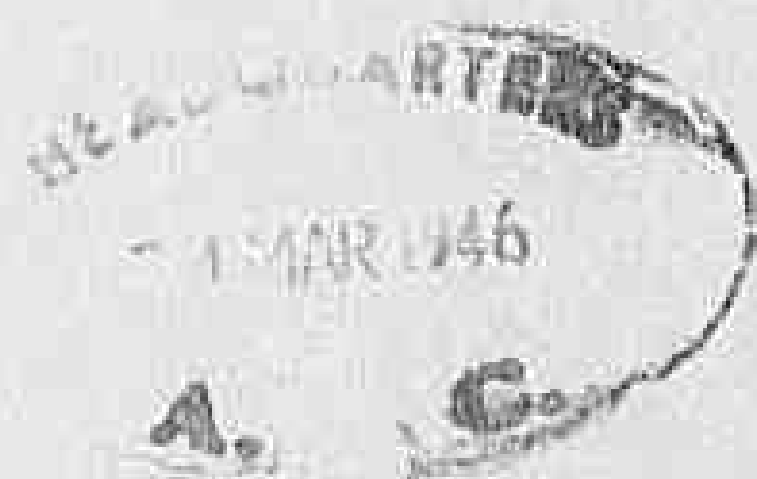

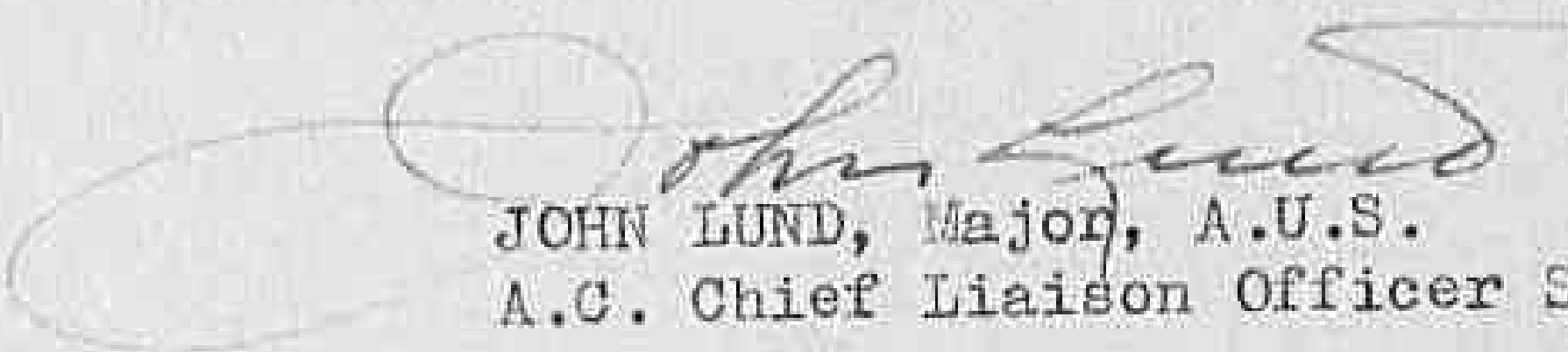

Accompanied by the Prefect and Inspector-General Mastrobuono I visited the Prefecture of Rome on Saturday 16 March, where I spoke with the Prefect TRINCHEIRO, the Vice-Prefect in charge of elections and other Italian officials. They reviewed the situation of the Province and said that they anticipated no trouble except possibly in Tivoli and Subiaco. Tivoli is a highly industrial town while Subiaco is best known for its famous sanctuary of St. Benedict. Large political meetings are held to-day at which the leaders of the right and left parties will speak.

The Prefect mentioned that pursuant to instructions from the Ministry of the Interior orders had been issued to open the polling places at 6 a.m. for the necessary preparation for voting and for the closing of them one hour later than usual, i.e. 9 p.m. depending on the size of the commune. A decree legalising this provision was being prepared. The Prefect reported that all the certificates of voting had been delivered to the to the Communes with the necessary paraphernalia like urns, notices and so forth.

On 17 March accompanied by the Prefect and Inspector-General Mastrobuono I first visited the town of Tivoli arriving there at 8 a.m. We visited the Municipio Comurale and other functionaries.

Tivoli has a population of 20,875. There were 14,515 registered on the electoral lists of which 7,987 were male and 7,328 female. Sixteen polling stations had been set up most of which were in public schools. Four voting cabins had been placed in each polling station.

The presidents of each polling station were duly qualified according to law, most of them being consiglieri of the Court of Appeal or chancellors. The scrutatori at each polling station were equally divided among the parties.

At 14.00 hrs. 2,518 certificates had not yet been claimed by voters; at 16.00 hrs. this number was reduced to 1,000. The reason for the failure of delivery of the voting certificates was that the voting list had been based upon an old census and former occupants were no longer dwelling in places which were destroyed and they had been removed from the town. The electoral office was open in the Municipio during the day of voting to permit those who had not received their certificate to procure one.

Two lists were presented: a leftist and a rightist. The rightist list with the representative combination of the Christian Democrats, Liberals and Independents, the symbols adopted being the cross on a shield, the letters P.L.I. and the seal of the town for the Christian Democrats, Liberals and Independents respectively. The leftist ticket indicated by the symbol of the star and the spade represented the Socialists, Communists, Actionists, Republicans. 24 candidates were to be elected in the Commune of Tivoli. No lists were rejected by the Electoral Commission.

Polling stations were open at 6 a.m., the voting was calm and no incident took place. At 4 p.m. about 60% of the voters had voted.

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On 17 March accompanied by the Prefect and Inspector-General Mastrobuono I first visited the town of Tivoli arriving there at 8 a.m. We visited the Municipio where we spoke with the Sindaco (Mag. Coccarini), Captain of the Carabinieri, Segretario Comunale and other functionaries.

The rightist list with the representative combination of the Christian Democrats, Liberals and Independents, the symbols adopted being the cross on a shield, the letters P.L.I. and the seal of the town for the Christian Democrats, Liberals and Independents respectively. The leftist ticket indicated by the symbol of the star and the spade represented the Socialists, Communists, Actionists, Republicans. 24 candidates were to be elected in the Comune of Tivoli. No lists were rejected by the Electoral Commission.

Polling stations were open at 6 a.m., the voting was calm and no incident took place. At 4 p.m. about 60% of the voters had cast their ballot, at 5 p.m. 90% of the voters had cast their ballot. Trucks carried voters living out of town to the polling stations according to an agreement among the parties. One humorous incident was observed outside the Municipio where a huge Alfa Romeo had pulled up and one person tried to get out shouting "debbo votare" i.e. "I must vote". The driver of the car took a hurried look at me and then drove off. I found out that the man who was so anxious to vote was the ex-Podesta' of the town who is now living in Rome. His friends very wisely restrained him by telling him he would be risking his life if he tried to get out of the car.

The counting of the ballots was to be done on Monday and consequently the result will not be known until Friday. Exhibits are attached amplifying the information stated in this report.

Subiaco The town of Subiaco has a population of 9,500. There were 5,541 registered on the electoral lists of which 2,765 were male and 2,776 female. 20 Council men were to be elected. All electoral certificates had been delivered to potential voters. No lists were rejected by the Electoral Commission. At the order of the Commissario Prefetto all bars in the town were closed. 65 carabinieri had been distributed among the seven polling stations, two of which were in cinemas, two in private houses, two in schools and one in an empty garage along the main road. Pre-election meetings had been held the night before with noticeable order. The Presidents of the polling stations were all duly selected according to law and the scrutatori, representative of all the parties participating.

Three lists were presented as follows: Christian Democrats with the symbol of the cross on the shield; a leftist block with the symbol of a star and a spade representing a combination of the Socialists, Communists, Actionists, Republicans and Independents; Liberal Party list with the symbol of a flag.

The polling stations opened at 3 a.m. It was expected that about 80% would vote, although at 14.00 hrs. 50% - 60% already had cast their vote. Many women participated in the voting. The anticipated disorders did not take place, but preparations were kept in order in case they should arise in the counting which was scheduled to take place the next day.

Subject : Observation of Elections of Communal Councils.

Reference AG/45/38/LC dated 28/2/1946, and further to my report dated 13th March 1946.

On 17th March 1946 the following Communes of Rome Province were visited : Marino, Ariccia, Genzano, Artena and Palestrina.

Considerable, as on the past Sunday, the affluence to the polls with a large percentage of feminine voters.

State of public order very good. No incidents of any relevance.

Under the new dispositions issued by the Government electoral operations have started at 06,00 hrs. with the result that actual voting has begun everywhere not later than 08,30 - 09,00 hrs. and somewhere as early as 07,00 hrs. according to the skill and experience of the Committees presiding over the polling stations.

Reports received so far from the Prefects of Rome and Grosinone confirm that no incidents have occurred throughout these Provinces.
