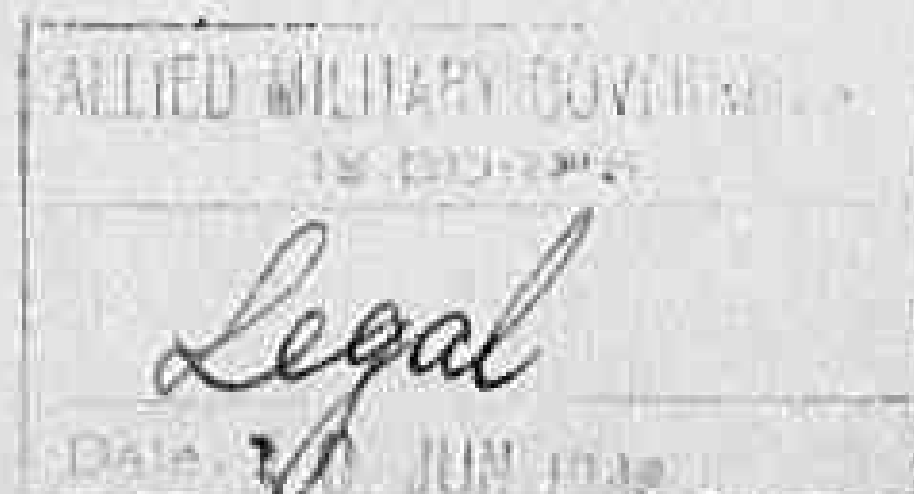

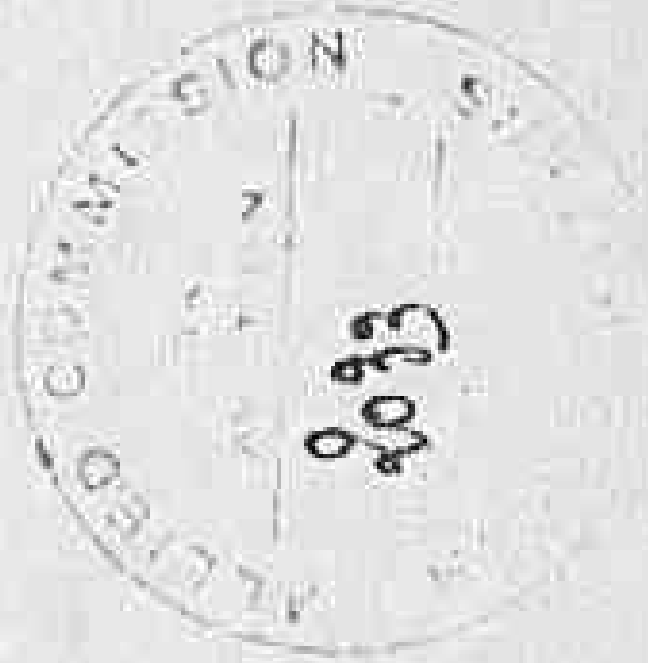

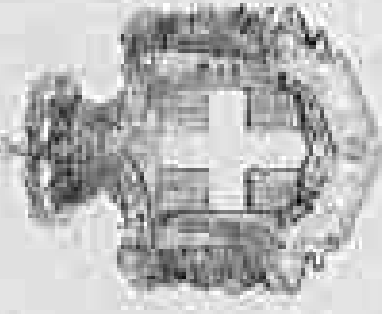

With note n.1807-1-1 dated April 4 1946, addressed to Allied Commission, we requested the extension to the territories under AMG control of the provisions contained in the two DIL n.59 and 60 dated February 8 1946. These Decrees altered the existing regulations of the insurance against the diseases respectively of industry labours and agricultural ones.

With note 15 April 1946 it was pointed out that all the provisions brought out after December 1 1945 come automatically into force in Province of Udine owing to the disposition January 19 1946 of the Admiral Ellery W. Stone. Therefore we think that the above mentioned Ellery W. Stone's decree settles the request of extension made by us.

In thanking for your kind acknowledge, this Ministry considers necessary to point out that the request of extension referred not only to the territory of Udine Province but to all the Provinces still under AMG control and particularly to Venezia Giulia. Therefore will you please specify exactly if the automatical extension, envisaged by Admiral Stone's order, regards only the territory of Udine Province or even the territory of Venezia Giulia.

This Ministry will be grateful of a kind quick acknowledgement on the matter because it does not regard only the decrees n.59 and 60 but it is a general matter.

Dear Mr. Nugent,

I received the two numbers of Gazzetta Ufficiale (No. 25-1945 and No. 41 -1946) containing rules for the alienation of property belonging to Allied subjects.

With reference to my letter of last month, I have to clarify the following points:-

In 1941 I was residing at TERMINI IMERESE (Palermo) and there I was called twice by the local "Carabinieri" in order to declare the amount of my property which was to be confiscated.

On 12 June 1941 I sold my property of acres 38, 83, 16, 28, so I could save it from confiscation as the notary assured me.

But, it was not so. The purchasers after having stipulated the contract did not give me any money; the fixed amount for my property was deposited with a notary, certain CANDIOTO of TERMINI Imerese (Palermo). ~~After~~ Only after four months I had the money due to me exactly after having threatened them. The purchasers, as you see, ~~they~~ were acquainted with confiscation rules (everybody was talking about it and even lawyers).

Now I refer the matter to you in order to be advised if there is, and what it is, the way to proceed against the purchasers as I am not informed of the law in force. I would like to know, further, if there is any rule concerning the restitution of property belonging to Allied subjects.

Please note that I am an American citizen, so anything you can do for me will be very much appreciated.

I hope to get rid of this matter soon and then return in the States for good.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister:

I wish to bring to your attention an unsatisfactory state of affairs existing within the Italian Air Force. This condition is apparently caused by former established laws compelling the Italian Air Ministry to administer 11,328 inactive personnel besides the present ceiling of 31,000 personnel on the active list. According to the Italian Air Ministry, most of the 11,328 are receiving full pay except those who are being scrutinized to determine whether they belonged to any pro-German organization, Fascists, etc., and who get three-fourths pay. This, of course, in effect raises the ceiling of the Italian Air Force to a figure in excess of that laid down by the U.C.M.

In order to enable the Italian Air Ministry to eliminate this state of affairs, I would urge that legislative action be taken to abrogate the current laws and that new laws be enacted authorizing the separation of surplus and undesirable personnel from the Italian Air Force.

You will no doubt wish to instruct your Minister for Air to consult the Air Force Sub-Commission in the preparation of this decree.

Sir,

I have been informed by H.B.M. Consul at Firenze of the publication, at last, of the Decree (passed last Nov.) for the benefit of all N. subjects who made forced sales of their properties before the War to avoid confiscation or sequestration, and also of the interpretation of the various clauses of the Decree by your Sub. Commission.

If the Consul, however, is correct in his interpretation of your Commission's interpretation of the Decree, the latter appears to me to be incorrect, and ~~also~~ unjust, on two points.

- (1) Refund of transfer taxes paid on original forced sale. This is not very

important or serious: but my lawyer
Prof. Avv. Mario Bracci (then a Member

of the Consulta and now a Minister)
informed himself of the Claims, and he
told me specifically that this refund
of the original transfer fees was provided
for.

(2) Right to claim as a British subject
for war damages. The Decree is
indisputably a Decree of Annulment,
and recognises the fact that no sale
actually took place. The property
therefore never changing hands.

Any other interpretation would be
flagrantly unjust; my villa had two
tons of explosive blown up in front of it by
the retreating German troops, causing
damages, which, taken together with
other damages to my little property,
would be crippling.

I have no desire to "sock it" to
poor Italy in any greedy or unjust way,
but her actions have caused me serious
losses, and I don't see any reason

why my Government should not see justice done.

Anyhow I hope the Legal Sub-Commission will re-consider the case, and support my right to claim for War Damage as a British subject at the proper time. I suppose a claim could be put in in the name of my sister-in-law, the nominal purchaser; but her position would be difficult seeing that the Estate is officially recognised as not her property, and anyhow, the amount likely to be obtainable from the Italian Govt. by an Italian subject (i.e. a subject of the Nation that declared war) would be trifling and no great help.

(1) It is considered necessary for practical and legal purposes that (a) an abstract of all decrees cancelling lost or destroyed cheques and other similar credit instruments published or to be published in the AMG 13 Corps Gazette, be also published in the Italian Official Gazette; and that (b) an abstract of all similar decrees published in the Italian Gazette since 12 June 1945 or to be published afterwards, be re-published in the A.M.G. Gazette.

(2) Three copies of the abstract of decrees mentioned under 1 (a), published up to date, are sent to you herewith in order to be forwarded, if you agree, to the Italian Ministry of Justice for publication in the Italian Gazette. Every month a similar abstract will be sent to you for the same purpose.

(3) This Legal Division will arrange directly, through the local Agency of the Banca d'Italia, to get the abstract mentioned under 1 (b) and to publish it in the AMG Gazette.

A question has arisen here over the implementation of certain decreti legge luogotenenziali. It appears that certain Gazzette Ufficiali published in December 1945 were never sent to the Prefect of this Province. These Gazzettas contain orders implementing decrees issued prior to 1st December 1945 which of course are not covered by the omnibus implementation contained in Gazzetta Ufficiale of 35 January 1946. The position today therefore is that as the Gazzette Ufficiali referred to were never handed to the Prefect by A.M.G. the decrees which could have been implemented by the handing over of these Gazzette Ufficiali to the Prefect have never in fact become law. Some of the decrees in question create financial rights and obligations and accordingly the date of their coming into force is a question of considerable importance. I think the simple plan would be for us to publish a Provincial Order making each of the decrees operative from the date of the Gazzette Ufficiali containing the relative implementation orders. Such a Provincial Order would override the terms of the Allied Commission's actual implementation Orders and this of course cannot be done without the authority of HQ AC.

May this authority be given?

There is something radically wrong with the *machines* *96* for distribution of Gazzette Ufficiali. My learned friend Crago who will hand you this letter has with him a further list of 1946 decrees, copies of which we have never received and he is going to see the C.A. Section about them.

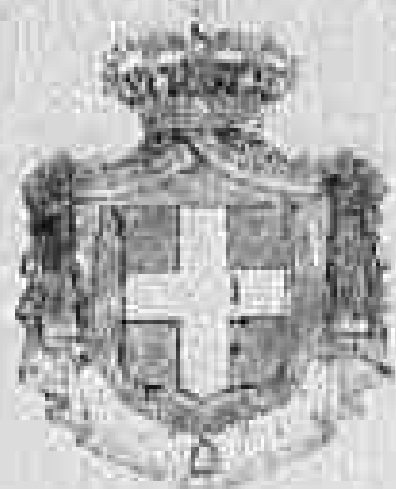

Our Chief Civil Affairs Officer is anxious that a review should be made in the occupied territories to determine to what extent it is desirable to make further repeals of Italian legislation of what might be considered Fascist character.

We have already specifically provided by Proclamations for the abolition of such laws as the anti-Jewish decrees and the bachelor tax decree. There are doubtless other decrees which might be denominated Fascist but which it is neither necessary nor desirable for us to abrogate comprehensively. On the other hand, it is thought that there may be legislation of Fascist character still nominally in force, which though perhaps for the present a dead letter, is known and resented by certain sections of the populations concerned.

Details of the letter type of legislation are now being collected from Middle East occupied territories, and Fascist legislation applicable to the Colonies will be examined with a view to any necessary or practicable abrogation. As it is known, Italian legislative regulations, in due course extended to the various provinces by the Allied Military Government, became in force on the day when the Prefects of the said provinces received from the Authorities in question a copy of the Gazzetta Ufficiale containing the relative regulations.

As every central Administration may need to know exactly the date of enforcement of the various regulations in the provinces which were formerly under A.M.G., we ask you to send as soon as possible to the Presidency and to all the Ministries a report containing the above mentioned data for the whole duration of Allied Administration.

The said report will also have to be forwarded to the communal Administrations and public offices of the province, allowing all citizens who wish to do so to take cognizance of it.

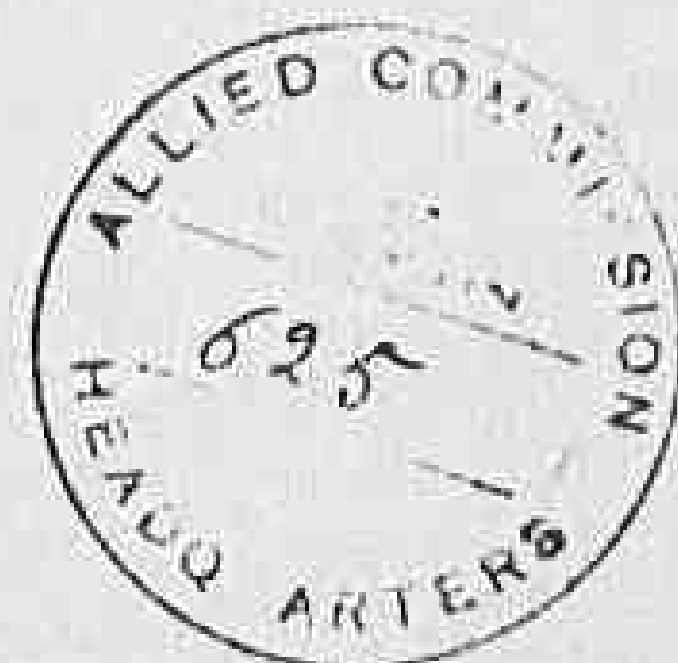

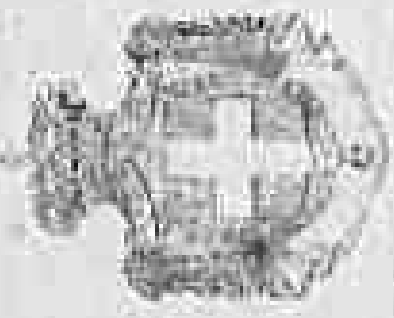

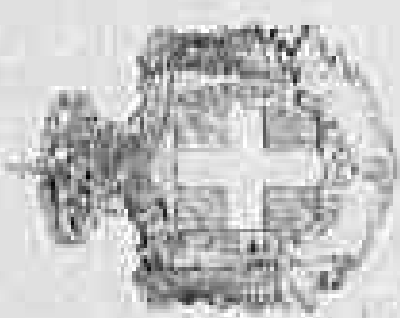

1. By Proclamation No. 1, all fiscal, economic, and social insurance legislation published since 8 September 1943 in that part of Venezia Giulia now under Allied Military Government was nullified. Thus this territory has lost two years legislation at a time when the country has passed through a major crisis and is suffering from serious inflation. Results include:

- (a) a serious loss of revenue to the State;
- (b) discontent among civil servants, old age and public service pensioners, people in receipt of social insurance benefits, commercial and industrial concerns, etc.
- (c) lack of effective control over industry and commerce;
- (d) a body of basic financial law completely out of line with today's economic conditions.

2. An effort has been made to fill this gap by the drafting and publication of General Orders, but personnel is not available in either Finance or Legal Divisions to prepare in three languages the tremendous amount of legislation required.

3. Pressure is constantly applied to this headquarters by private and public bodies covering the wide field of public finance, economics and social insurance, to make applicable in this territory the same benefits and restrictions as apply in Italian Government Territory.

4. We cannot satisfy these demands. Not all economic legislation published by the Italian Government should be adopted here, but by far the greater part must. Many Decrees are so long and so complicated that they require several weeks careful study by one Officer before the first draft in English is drawn. Only two Financial and two Legal Officers are available to do this work and

The Italian decree is then translated into English and a suitable Order is drafted and settled. Of necessity the order closely follows the Italian decree, but Sections and wording are re-arranged.

6. After being signed by me the Order is published, superimposed on existing Italian Legislation, and of course carried out by local Officials.

7. There are many disadvantages to this method amongst which it is only necessary to mention the length of time taken to transpose an Italian decree into an Order and the confusion caused by using English legal phraseology which has to be translated into Italian.

8. At the present time the Finance Division alone is desirous that 69 Italian Decrees should be duplicated in General Orders or Orders. In addition there are many Ministerial Instructions and Administrative Orders normally published in The Italian Gazette or in the "Bollettino Ufficiale" of the Ministry of Finance relating to and amplifying Finance Decrees which should also be followed by the issue of Allied Military Government Orders and Administrative Instructions.

9. With a view to overcoming these formidable difficulties, the Legal Division has with my approval drafted an Order which it is considered would greatly facilitate our work. A copy of the Order is enclosed for consideration. If approved, the Order would be used each time any Division required to enforce in Venezia Giulia Italian Legislation promulgated subsequent to 8 September 1943.

10. I fully appreciate the question of policy involved, and would, I assure you, much prefer to issue my own General Order in each case. I am, however, forced to recognize the practical impossibility of doing so. I have therefore, waived my own policy objections to following the procedure suggested. I should however, like guidance from higher Authority.

11. In view of the urgency of most of the Financial legislation I ask that this matter receive immediate attention.

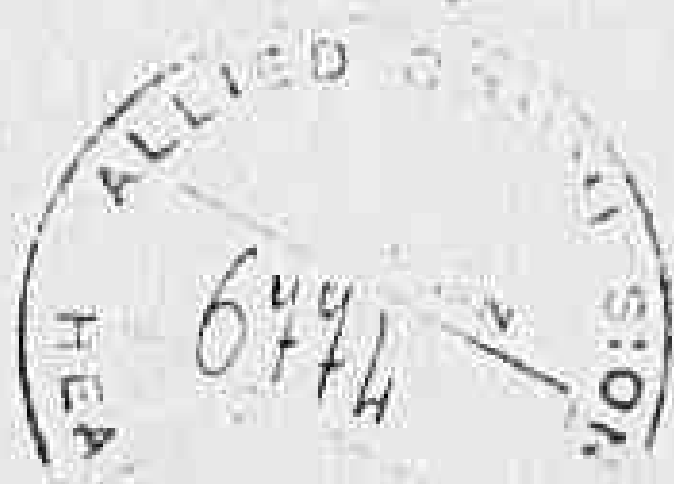
some time ago, the Allied Commission pointed out that it would be advisable for the Italian Government to issue a legislative regulation better to define the enforcement of Italian regulation in territories under A.M.G. The proposal aimed at eliminating the inconveniences which occurred on this ground, for, occasionally, the drafting of the regulations left the date when such regulations became effective rather uncertain.

As you are aware, last March already, the Presidency of the Council of Ministers issued definite instructions to the various Administrations to insert in all regulation, which might leave a doubt because of the matter they regulate, regarding the area where they are effective, the following direction: 'In such territories as haven't yet been handed back to the Italian Administration, the present decree will become in force on the date of the restitution, or on the date on which it will become executive by an ordinance of the Allied Military Government'.

However, the above mentioned inconveniences may still occur, should a regulation fix as date when it becomes effective a date which is different from the normal date of enforcement; this happens mainly in the case of regulations that have a retroactive effect. In such cases, there may be a doubt as to whether, in territories under Allied Military Government, the regulation becomes in force on the date it mentions, or on the day when the Government extended it. It may also happen that, when such territories are handed back to the Italian Administration such regulations must be considered as retroactively in force, from the date expressly fixed by them, because they hadn't been extended before by the Allied Authorities, or because the possible decisions of A.M.G. modifying the date of its enforcement are no longer valid; this might sometimes not correspond to the wish of the legislator and cause serious and unforeseen repercussions.

To prevent such inconveniences from occurring again (such inconveniences chiefly happened in the field of regulations bringing economic improvements to officials) we are now taking particular care so that, in the case of all decrees with a retroactive character, the various dates of enforcement may be carefully distinguished and disciplined in relation with the various territorial situations. In such a respect, I remind you of D.L.L. 18 November 1944, n. 329, D.L.L. 13 March, 1945, n. 116, D.L.L. 22 April 1945, n. 148, D.L.L. 21 November 1945, n. 722.

On the other hand, it doesn't seem possible to discipline by a regulation with a general character, the date when all decrees to come are to become effective. From the point of view of form, such a disposition would eliminate all doubts

for the future, for it would always be possible to suppose that a decree issued at a later date derogated from the principle fixed in the regulation itself. 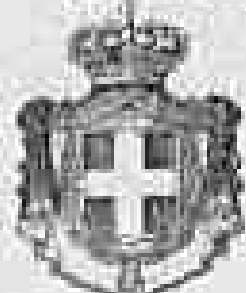

Some time ago, the Allied Commission pointed out that it would be advisable for the Italian Government to issue a legislative regulation better to define the enforcement of Italian regulation in territories under A.M.G. The proposal aimed at eliminating the inconveniences which occurred on this ground, for, occasionally, the drafting of the regulations left the date when such regulations became effective rather uncertain.

As you are aware, last March already, the Presidency of the Council of Ministers issued definite instructions to the various administrations to insert in all regulation, which might leave a doubt because of the matter they regulate, regarding the area where they are effective, the following direction: 'In such territories as haven't yet been handed back to the Italian Administration, the present decree will become in force on the date of the restitution, or on the date on which it will become executive by an ordinance of the Allied Military Government'.

However, the above mentioned inconveniences may still occur, should a regulation fix as date when it becomes effective a date which is different from the normal date of enforcement: this happens mainly in the case of regulations that have a retroactive effect. In such cases, there may be a doubt as to whether, in territories under Allied Military Government, the regulation becomes in force on the date it mentions, or on the day when the Government extended it. It may also happen that, when such territories are handed back to the Italian Administration, such regulations must be considered as retroactively in force, from the date expressly fixed by them, because they hadn't been extended before by the Allied Authorities, or because the possible decisions of A.M.G. modifying the date of its enforcement are no longer valid: this might sometimes not correspond to the wish of the legislator and cause serious and unforeseen repercussions.

NOW, therefore, I, ELLERY WHEELER STONE, Rear Admiral, United States Naval Reserve, Chief Civil Affairs Officer, for and on behalf of the Supreme Allied Commander and Military Governor hereby order as follows :

1. The decrees listed in the schedule below which have been previously excluded from Allied Military Government territory or certain parts thereof including the Province of Udine shall become operative and shall have full force and effect of law in the Province of Udine as from the 1st January 1946.

2. All decrees promulgated in the Gazzetta Ufficiale issue No. 144 of 1st December 1945 and in following issues shall until further order become effective in the Province of Udine on the same date as in the territory administered by the Italian Government without an express order of the AMG to that effect.

Provided, however, that the Provincial Commissioner of the said Province shall have power to suspend or modify in part or in full by Provincial Order the provisions of any decree contained in any of the aforementioned issues of Gazzetta Ufficiale in so far as they affect the said Province.

1. I refer to Col. Hannaford's memorandum AC/4010/4/L of 29 December 1945, regarding Italian legislation Udine Province.

2. This section agrees wholly with the idea behind the draft order attached to Col. Hannaford's memorandum. A recommendation to this effect went forward to the Executive Commissioner yesterday, in response to the comments made by Brig. Dunlop on the situation in Udine.

3. While it is outside the field of this section, it may be appropriate to suggest that Allied Commission no longer has the authority to issue a direct order in the form proposed by Col. Hannaford. The following language in FAN 634 seems to deprive the Allied Commission of any further command responsibilities over the Province of Udine.

"Para 2. Simultaneously, in respect of any territories which may be retained under AMG, all command functions of ALCOM and AMG will be performed by 13 Corps, reporting directly to AFHQ. Military personnel detached from duty with ALCOM will not be utilized as AFHQ Liaison to ALCOM."

4. It is, therefore, suggested that the order be issued either by AFHQ or by the Provincial Commissioner in the Province of Udine.

SUBJECT : Italian Legislation Udine Province.

TO : Chief Commissioner and Executive Commissioner,
All Sections and Sub-Commissions.

1. Your attention is invited to the enclosed draft order which it is proposed to publish in the Italian Official Gazette.

2. As you are aware, problems are bound to arise due to the fact that the Province of Udine will continue to be administered by AMG until further notice.

3. For the purpose of Italian Legislation the Province of Udine will be treated in the same manner as the rest of the territory which is now being restored.

4. Decrees previously implemented in the said Province by the usual AMG orders will continue to be regarded as having come into effect on the date provided for in the said orders and not on the date of the "handover".

5. A number of Decrees have, however, been modified by AMG implementation orders, especially in relation to the dates from which certain benefits granted under the provisions of a decree would accrue or various tariffs established by decree would enter into effect. All such modifications will remain in force unless expressly abrogated.

6. It is therefore suggested that Sections and Sub-Commissions discuss as soon as possible the problems arising out of the special position of the Province of Udine with the Italian Ministries concerned, taking into consideration the provisions of the enclosed draft order.
