Name of accused: Kopal Antonio.
Date of trial : 20 July 1945.

Judge : Major G. ~~Stuart~~.
Charges : (1) Improper possession of 140 cigarettes;
(2) Theft of 2 tins each of 50 cigarettes.
Sentences : 2 months imprisonment on 1st charge, 1 month imprisonment on 2nd charge. Sentences to be concurrent.

2. It was admitted in evidence that all the above cigarettes had been extracted from Allied mail by the accused, who was employed in the A.P.O.

3. I have drawn the attention of the Judge to the ~~in~~ ⁱⁿ adequacy of the sentence imposed.

TO : H.E. The Minister of Pardon and Justice.

Further to my letter of 15 February 1944 - ref ACC/4083/L I have the honour to inform you that instructions have now been issued to all Allied Military Judicial Officers that in mail theft cases no provisional liberty will be granted at all, except in the light of most unusual circumstances. In any such extraordinary situation the amount of caution money will be so large as to make it most unlikely that the arrested person will fail to be present at the trial.

In order to ensure that the measures necessary to deal with this situation shall be uniformly applied in both occupied and unoccupied territories, I would ask Your Excellency to be so good as to give instructions that the above or equivalent steps be taken by your services concerned, and would further suggest that this Subcommittee be kept informed of the results so that a maximum degree of cooperation may be secured.

SUBJECT: Mail Theft Cases.

TO : SLOs (thru HQ) Regions I, II, III, IV and V.
SLOs, AMG, 5th and 8th Army.

1. You have been previously advised that the theft of Allied mail by Italian civilians has been considered as presenting a very serious problem calling for drastic action.
2. It has just been learned by this sub-commission that certain Italian civilians who were arrested for mail thefts were released on bail and have since disappeared causing the postponement of the trials and causing additional and unnecessary work on the part of the Military Police and Italian police in an endeavor to recapture them.
3. In mail theft cases NO bail will be granted at all except in the light of most unusual circumstances. In any such extraordinary situation the bail will be so large as to make it most unlikely that the arrested person will fail to be present at his trial.
4. In unoccupied territory where mail theft suspects are held subject to trial later either by Italian Courts or Allied Military Courts the Italian authorities should be requested to act in accordance with the foregoing.
5. All personnel having to do with court matters should be advised immediately of the foregoing.

1. With reference to your letter Ref/OS1/327 of 1 Feb '44, the action taken is appreciated.
2. Particulars of a previous case which occurred in Dec '43 are attached. It is understood that owing to congestion in the Italian Courts there is liable to be some three months delay before trial and that the accused have been released from arrest pending trial.
3. It is most desirable, from the military point of view, that the individuals concerned should be dealt with as promptly as possible, and that if convicted, a serious view should be taken of their cases. Such action will then act as a deterrent.

SUBJECT : Theft and Violation of Mail
TO : R.C.A.O., Region I, II, III, IV.

1. A.P.H.A., Adv. Adm. Echelon has reported that a number of thefts of Allied mail have occurred, apparently by Italian civilians. At Bari and Foggia railway sidings there were three notable cases reported during January. Certain Italian Civilians have been arrested in connection with these thefts.
2. In consideration of the effect on the morale of the troops caused by failures in the delivery of mails, and also of the security aspect, a serious view must be taken of such cases.
3. Accordingly, it is requested that special efforts be exerted to apprehend the perpetrators of such thefts, and also that, after their conviction, substantial sentences be meted out for this type of offense.
4. Reports of sentences imposed both by Allied and Italian Courts in this type of case will be submitted through the Legal Sub-Commission.

SUBJECT:- Theft and Violation of Mail.

1. The C in C is disturbed at the prevalence of thefts of mails, apparently by Italian civilians, especially at BARI and FOGGIA railway sidings, where three notable cases have occurred during Jan '44.
2. Certain Italian civilians have been arrested in connection with these thefts. In consideration of the effect on the morale of the Troops caused by failures in the delivery of mails, and also of the security aspect, I have to request that the serious view taken of these cases may be made known to those of your officers who are responsible for dealing with such matters, as a guide to them in regard to the action to be taken.
3. It would be appreciated if instructions could be issued so that this H.Q. is informed of the sentences passed on civilians who are convicted of thefts of this nature.
