The vehicles or component parts covered by the original agreement may be of German origin, or made under licence in Enemy occupied territory, or of Italian origin other than Italian Military vehicles.

Among the Italian vehicles or component parts may be items requisitioned

by the German. or seized by the German.
It would be appreciated if a ruling as to title could be given as soon as possible.
