1. In compliance with your request for a statement based on personal knowledge of the physical condition of Lt.Colonel Paul Revere, it is my distinct impression that sometime during the period of January-June 1944, while I was on duty with Region III, Naples Province, AMG, Lt. Colonel Paul Revere, then Major, while assigned to the same organization was on half time duty, because of physical disabilities of a nature with which I am not acquainted. It is my impression that such half time duty extended over a period of many weeks, though I may be in error on this premise. This officer was not under my command at that time.

2. Since recently joining the Legal Division, from the 11th until the 27th day of October, 1946, Lt.Col.Paul Revere was away from this Division for the purpose of a check on a sinus condition of which this officer complained.

3. I am not acquainted with the service of this officer other than in the period above mentioned.

I GENERAL

1. The word dependents as used herein will mean the dependents of all personnel mentioned in paragraph 3, Section III, Circular Number 73, this headquarters, 1946.

2. Dependents acquiring a dual status or who have previously acquired a dual status as a dependent and an employee of a government agency, will be governed by the provisions of this circular when traveling strictly as dependents. When traveling in their status as employees of a government agency, such travel will be performed under the provisions of Circular Number 38, this headquarters, 1946.

3. Authorization for travel of dependents will be granted by this headquarters or by subordinate headquarters to whom authority to issue travel orders has been delegated. Dependents are not required to have travel orders except as specified:

- a. When traveling at Government expense.
- b. When traveling to "restricted" areas.
- c. When traveling on Special Service organized tours.
- d. When traveling to areas outside of Italy.

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e. When traveling in connection with the permanent change of station of those upon they are dependent. Dependents will be included in the orders of those upon whom they are dependent in the case of a permanent change of station and such orders will be qualified to state that no additional expense to the Government, other than that specified by existing laws and regulations, will accrue as a result of the permanent change of station.

4. Travel authorization for other than a permanent change of station will be substantially in the form as prescribed in Appendix "A", or as required by Special Service Bulletins for individuals proceeding on organized tours.

Hq MTOUSA Circular No. 111 (Cont'd)

5. The War Department Identification Card (WD AGO Form 65) for dependents will suffice for the purpose of obtaining messing and billeting facilities whether or not the dependents are in possession of travel orders.

6. All usual modes or means of government transportation authorized for use by military personnel and other personnel mentioned in paragraph 1 supra, are authorized for use by their dependents, subject to the restrictions contained herein, viz: motor, rail, water and air.

7. Individual Government motor transportation is not authorized for dependents except for emergency medical or dental reasons. Dependents may accompany those upon whom they are dependent, on official trips in government motor vehicles when space is available without exclusion of military personnel, and on recreational trips in government vehicles authorized to military personnel upon whom dependent. Dependents may utilize established government bus facilities, or authorized group transportation facilities. All dependents will sign waiver of liability covering transportation in government vehicles. (Reference MTOUSA Circular "Transportation of Civilians in Motor Vehicles" to be published at later date.)

8. Government rail transportation may be utilized to such extent as may be available for non-military passenger service and as authorized for organized tours.

9. Government water transportation may be used to such extent as may be available for non-military passengers and as authorized for organized tours.

10. Dependents may travel by military aircraft at Government expense:

a. When on medical emergency as declared by the Commanding Officer of the major command concerned, or for other emergencies as declared by the Theater Commander.

b. When personnel upon whom they are dependent are authorized air travel for a permanent change of station (PCS).

c. When they must travel from port of debarkation to the station of the person upon whom they are dependent, in which case no deviations from the most direct route will be authorized.

d. When dependents now in the theater are authorized air travel in accordance with policy set forth in War Department Circular 83, 1946, from overseas place of residence to PE or Staging Area. War Department radio message WX 97574, dated 18 February 1946, which authorizes such dependents air transportation at government expense, will be cited.

11. Dependents may be authorized to travel by military aircraft at no expense to the Government provided:

a. Personnel upon whom dependent are authorized air transportation in connection with temporary duty on official business, or leave, including rest and recuperation (except to the Zone of the Interior), and when:

Hq MTOUSA Circular No. 111 (Cont'd)

- (1) Dependents are in possession of competent air travel orders and accompany the person upon whom dependent while traveling. This does not preclude the dependent's departure from the aircraft at any point of the journey and continuing unaccompanied in or into authorized areas, and by other modes of authorized transportation.
- (2) Such travel orders will contain the statement that the cost of the travel performed by the dependents will be at no expense to the Government.
- (3) Air Travel Orders will indicate the route to be followed, including delays in route, if any, and no deviation therefrom will be permitted, except in cases of emergency. Circuitous routing for the convenience of the traveler is not authorized.

12. There are no restrictions on the usage of privately owned transportation except for restrictions proscribed for individuals desiring to travel into certain areas in accordance with Circular Number 104, this headquarters, 1946.

13. Commercial transportation, at no expense to the Government, may be used to such extent as available, subject to regulations proscribed herein.

II TRAVEL WITHIN THIS THEATER

14. Travel of dependents within Italy is unrestricted except to the "restricted zone" Venezia-Giulia Area and Udine Province and such other areas of Italy as may in the future be classified as "restricted". For travel into "restricted zones" approval must be obtained from this headquarters. Request for such approval will be submitted by the individual, upon whom the travelers are dependent, through military channels to this headquarters. Such approval will be granted only in exceptional cases. Travel to other countries within this theater is subject to the possession of passports and visas and/or procurement of necessary clearances as proscribed in paragraph 2b, Circular Number 38, this headquarters, 1946. The provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of Circular Number 38, this headquarters, 1946, apply insofar as procedure in obtaining clearances is concerned. 43

15. Dependents desiring to travel on Special Service organized tours, or on US Military Trains within this theater will be governed by the provisions of Special Service Bulletins 3, 4, 5, and 6, 1946, and such other Special Service Bulletins and Command Directives as may be published in the future pertaining to organized tours and US Military Train Travel.

III TRAVEL TO AREAS OUTSIDE THIS THEATER, EXCEPT THE UNITED STATES

16. Passports and visas will be required before travel orders are issued for dependents traveling to countries specified in paragraph 2b, Circular Number 38, this headquarters, 1946, except as indicated in paragraph 17 below. The provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of Circular Number 38, this headquarters, 1946, apply insofar as procedure in obtaining clearance is concerned.

Hq. AFMPCUSA Circular No. 111 (Cont'd)

17. Visas or clearances are not, nor is it contemplated that they will be, required for Special Service organized tours to points outside of Italy, such as Switzerland. Dependents desiring to travel on Special Service organized tours outside of Italy will be governed by the provisions of Special Service Bulletin Number 2, 1946, and as may be provided for in future Special Service Bulletins.

IV TRAVEL TO THE UNITED STATES

18. Travel to the United States of dependents acquired outside the continental limits of the United States will be in accord with the provisions of War Department Circular Number 83, 1946. Travel of other dependents to the United States at Government expense may be performed only when the personnel upon whom they are dependent make a permanent change of station to the United States. Travel to the United States for emergency reasons is authorized at no expense to the Government subject to approval by this headquarters.

19. Travel to the United States by commercial transportation at no expense to the Government is unrestricted, subject to limitations imposed by commercial transportation companies. Such travel, to be performed at Government expense, must be first approved by this headquarters.

GRC 480/46. EMPLOYMENT OF OFFICERS WITH URRRA.

1. War Office have ruled that the employment of officers with URRRA will now be regarded as military employment for all purposes except that officers will not be compulsorily posted to such employment. The following instructions will also apply to officers of the ARS.

2. REGULAR ARMY OFFICERS ON THE ACTIVE LIST.

(a) Regular Army Officers seconded to employment with URRRA will continue to draw the emoluments of their rank, will count the service for non-effective purposes and for time promotion, and for all demobilization benefits, including War Gratuity, so long as those benefits apply to Regular Army service.

(b) Such employment should not normally prejudice their Regular Army career and officers will continue to be considered for appointment or promotion as though they were employed with the Army.

(c) If an officer serving with URRRA is required for an Army appointment, whether it carries promotion or not, the War Office will negotiate with URRRA for his return or replacement.

(d) If, during the course of his employment with URRRA, a Regular Army officer is passed over for promotion, or becomes otherwise due for retirement from the service, he will retire as though he were in Army employment and from the date of his retirement may become a civilian employee of URRRA without further call upon Army pay or benefits.

3. RE-EMPLOYED REGULAR ARMY OFFICERS AND NON-REGULAR ARMY OFFICERS.

40

(a) Re-employed Regular Army Officers and Non-Regular Army Officers will likewise be available for employment with URRRA and will continue to draw the emoluments of their rank until the date upon which they are for release under the Age/Service rules or until general demobilization is ordered.

(b) The time served with URRRA will count towards demobilization benefits.

(c) As from the date of their release from the Army such officers will pass to a civil contract with URRRA should they and URRRA so desire and they will have no further call upon Army pay or benefits.

4. PROCEDURE FOR OBTAINING EMPLOYMENT.

(c) If an officer serving with UNRRA is recommended for promotion or not, the War Office will negotiate with UNRRA for his return or replacement.

(d) If, during the course of his employment with UNRRA, a Regular Army officer is passed over for promotion, or becomes otherwise due for retirement from the service, he will retire as though he were in Army employment and from the date of his retirement pay becomes a civilian employee of UNRRA without further call upon Army pay or benefits.

3. RE-EMPLOYED REGULAR ARMY OFFICERS AND NON-REGULAR ARMY OFFICERS.

- (a) Re-employed Regular Army Officers and Non-Regular Army Officers will likewise be available for employment with UNRRA and will continue to draw the emoluments of their rank until the date upon which they due for release under the AGO/Service rules or until general demobilization is ordered.
- (b) The time served with UNRRA will count towards demobilization benefits.
- (c) As from the date of their release from the Army such officers will pass to a civil contract with UNRRA should they and UNRRA so desire and they will have no further call upon Army pay or benefits.

4. PROCEDURE FOR OBTAINING EMPLOYMENT.

- (a) Officers desirous of employment with UNRRA will apply in the first instance in writing to CHQ-Dep III Sec in the case of officers holding Staff Appointment, 1-9 in the case of Regimental Officers and 1-6 in the case of AS Officers.
- (b) Officers who, on Release with their Arc/Service Group, wish to apply for employment with UNRRA as a civilian will apply direct to UNRRA c/o CHQ CEF, as heretofore.
- (c) Employment with UNRRA is for an indefinite period but applications will not normally be accepted unless they are willing to serve for a minimum of six months to one year either as:-
 - (i) An officer
 - (ii) An officer and a civilian
 - (iii) A civilian.
 or
 - (d) Officers who are within six months of their normal release therefore be required to advise on their applications that they are prepared to accept the terms of employment outlined in sub-para (c) above.



5. Names of suitable applicants referred to in para 4 above whose release from their present employment has been agreed by all concerned will be submitted to War Office who will consider and issue the necessary instructions. No postings of officers will be made to URRM without first obtaining War Office authority for such postings.

6. RANK. Officers employed with URRM will retain temporary rank where applicable on posting.

7. PAY AND ALLOWANCES.

(a) Officers will continue to draw pay of rank and appropriate allowances from army funds.

(b) Officers employed with URRM will not be obliged to draw command or staff pay.

(c) Where an appointment with URRM carries pay in excess of army pay and allowances the responsibility for payment of the excess will fall on URRM.

8. OFFICERS PREVIOUSLY RELEASSED TO URRM UNDER CLASS 'B'.

(a) Officers who have previously been released to URRM under Class 'B' Release may now elect to be recalled for eventual release under Class 'A' provided that they agree to any benefits which they have already accepted being/taken into account when Class 'A' Release takes place.

(b) Names of officers so electing to be recalled will be sent to GHQ 2nd Echelon CEF, copy to GHQ CEF, not later than 8 Mar 46.

9. DOCUMENTATION.

(a) When an officer's posting to URRM has been agreed by the War Office notification to this effect will be sent to his unit or formation by A-9 GHQ, on receipt of which the unit or formation will render the necessary casualty on the appropriate Army Form direct to GHQ 2nd Echelon CEF quoting the War Office authority in each case.

(b) GHQ 2nd Echelon CEF will then forward the duplicate copy of AF B 1991, in respect of such officers who are below the substantive rank of Colonel, direct to Director of Personnel, URRM HQ, 11 Portland Place, London, W.1.

(c) Once an Army officer (Military and A.S.) is posted to URRM, all subsequent casualties affecting him/her will be rendered on the appropriate Army Form by that organization direct to URRM HQ, London so that such casualties can be incorporated in Part II

- (a) Officers who have previously been released to URRR under Class 'A' Release may now elect to be recalled for eventual release under Class 'B' provided that they agree to any benefits which they have already accepted being taken into account when Class 'A' Release takes place.
- (b) Names of officers so electing to be recalled will be eabled to GHQ 2nd Echelon CEF, copy to GHQ CEF, not later than 6 Mar 45.
9. DOCUMENTATION.
- (a) When an officer's posting to URRR has been agreed by the War Office notification to this effect will be sent to his unit or formation by 4-9 GHQ, on receipt of which the unit or formation will render the necessary casualty on the appropriate Army Form direct to GHQ 2nd Echelon CEF quoting the War Office authority in each case.
- (b) GHQ 2nd Echelon CEF will then forward the duplicate copy of AS B 199A, in respect of such officers who are below the substantive rank of Colonel, direct to Director of Personnel, URRR HQ, 11 Portland Place, London, W.1.
- (c) Once an Army officer (Military and A.S) is posted to URRR, all subsequent casualties affecting him/her will be rendered on the appropriate Army Form by that organization direct to URRR HQ, London so that such casualties may be promulgated in Army II Orders (Officers) issued by HQ in UK in accordance with A.C.I. 789/43. All casualties which are recordable will be entered on AS B 199A. (Officer Record of Service) by URRR HQ, London in accordance with A.C.I. 924/43.
10. MOVEMENT OF OFFICERS TO AND FROM OVERSEAS COMMANDS.
- War Office have requested URRR HQ, London to notify all overseas Command Hqs and GHQs 2nd Echelon by letter the arrival and departure of officers whose duty involves a stay of 21 days or longer.
11. PROMISE WHILE IN EMPLOYMENT WITH URRR.
- Arrangements for carrying out release of Officers, other than Regular Army Officers, due for Release with their Army/Service Group will be notified in due course.

Paraphrase of cable from Establishment Section. G-1 (American)

Effective immediately under authority, Subject: Redeployment of Officers, Headquarters Command Allied Force, dated 25 October as clarified by letter same headquarters and subject dated 11 November 1945, all officers of Allied Commission with MOS 8104, or Civil Affairs Training will be retained for duty for six months beyond date of their separation eligibility or until adequate qualified replacements are made available whichever is earlier.

Commanders will take steps to ensure that all personnel with MOS 8104 are performing PRIMARY duty as Civil Affairs Officers. Personnel in this category who are surplus to regional and provincial Civil Affairs needs will be reported to this Headquarters attention G-1(A) before thirty November 1945 for reassignment. Negative reports will be submitted when applicable.

The following WFOUSA cable, FX 52457, dated 9 November 1945 is quoted for the information of all concerned.

"Clarification second sentence paragraph 2 Cured FX 50262 regarding Civil Affairs officers which reads 'date agreed on must be subsequent to date officer becomes eligible for relief from active duty' follows.

'Date officer becomes eligible for relief from active duty' is date critical score is equal to or below officers adjusted service rating score. One whose Mos is included on list of scarce categories officer specialists may be retained 6 months beyond date of his separation eligibility without his consent. Same officer may be continued on extended active duty beyond 6 months period referred to in preceding sentence with his consent by signing specified volunteer statement.

If an officer whose Mos is on list scarce categories of officer specialists consents to remain on active duty for a period which expires less than 6 months from date of his separation eligibility he may be retained without his consent for remaining portion of 6 months period but not longer."

1. When the Northern Regions are turned back to the Italian Government a sufficient number of legal officers should then be available to fill the requirements of the proposed AM and Liaison Teams. Until that takes place, however, there exists a serious shortage. Losses suffered through re-deployment and release have reduced the personnel of this Sub-Commission to such extent as to render it virtually impossible to continue essential functions.

2. Because the restoration was proposed for the very near future, no effort was made to have any of the officers declared operationally vital. Now, however, the date for the hand-over is most indefinite and the requirements of Legal continue as usual.

3. Venezia Giulia is understaffed, and all the other Regions are attempting to operate with far below the actually required strength.

4. It is therefore urgently requested that qualified legal officers who are presently assigned to other divisions or who have now been released from their duties, be made available to this Sub-Commission. A minimum of ten officers is immediately required if this Sub-Commission is to continue its function.

8. Emergency C4 Selection does not mean that all deficiencies and replacements of C4 officers required can be provided. The present over-all shortage of officers will not permit this. It is the intention that the majority of Emergency Selected officers will be drawn from those officers who have volunteered under ACI 173/45, but who have not yet been interviewed by CASD. Cases are occurring, with increasing frequency, of Officers who are not content with their present assignments, making application, generally unofficially, to Heads of other Sections or Sub-Commissions to give them a job.

Unfortunately in many cases these applications have been favourably received and eventually a request has been made for the officer in question to be assigned.

You will realize, upon consideration, that this is not the correct procedure, and in fact that any Head of a Section or Sub-Commission is in listening to such an application, being disloyal to his fellow Head.

If an officer is not satisfied with his present assignment he has the right of making application to the Head of his Section through his immediate Superior, for a change of assignment - he can also state any preference that he may have.

I therefore request that all Heads of Sections or Sub-Commissions will discourage these private assignments and insist that officers who desire a change of employment submit their request for this through the proper channels.

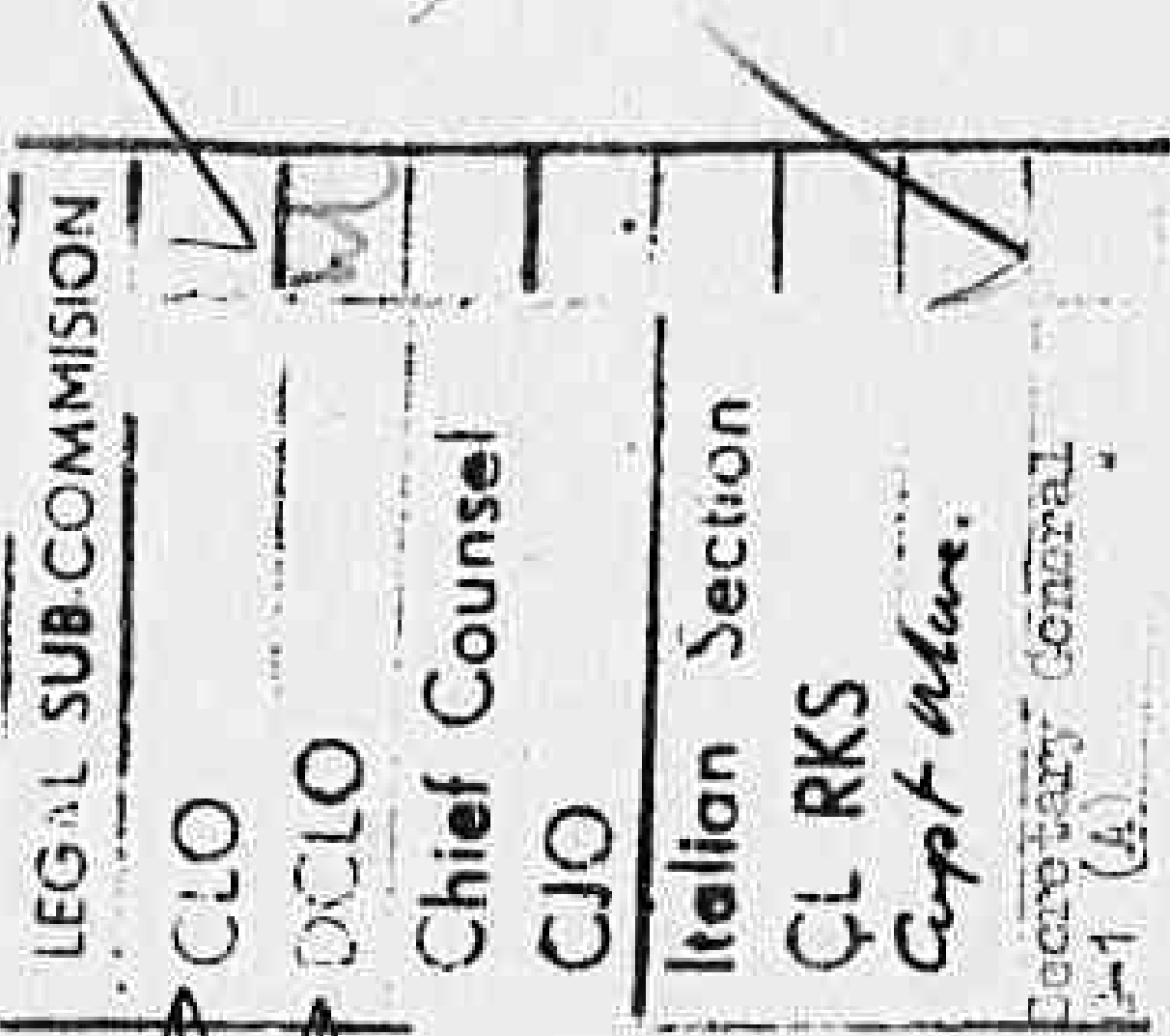
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I therefore request that all Heads of Sections or Sub-Commissions will discourage these private assignments and insist that officers who desire a change of employment submit their request for this through the proper channels.

1. Reference is made to your letter 4023/2/L, dated 26 May 1944, directed to Executive Officer, G-1, A.C.C., subject as above.

2. May I suggest that it is most inconvenient to me (aside from the irregularity of the practice from a military standpoint) to have legal officers assigned to specific posts, or transferred from present assignments within the Region to specific posts, within the Region, by Hq. A.C.C. orders.

3. It seems to me that all legal officers should be assigned, by Hq. ACC orders, for duty with the Regional Legal Division and then leave the R.L.O. a free hand in making assignments within the Region. Particularly is this true at the present moment when we are faced with the drastic reduction in the number of such officers.

4. In order to meet the conditions it is quite important that the legal officers in the Region (except the PLC's) be held as mobile officers who can be easily shifted. If officers are to be assigned to specified posts by ACC, this will be impossible.

5. May the attention of G-1 be invited to this situation.

MEMORANDUM TO : Vice President, Administrative Section.
Vice President, Economic Section

1. Request that you instruct Directors of Sub-Commissions to refrain from informing Regions that transfers of their specialist personnel "have been arranged." Several recent incidents have occurred in which the Directors of Sub-Commissions have so informed Regions and the transfers were impossible for reasons unknown to the Sub-Commission. Since demands for personnel are received from many sources both from inside and outside ACC, it is impossible to keep Directors informed of all contemplated plans for the use of all personnel. In many cases, these plans are changed for good reason within the day or hour. Further, the internal organization of forward Regions, such as IV and V are many times unknown to Directors and disruption of Provincial teams is quite likely to be caused without intending it. To give notice of changes which later can not be made or without consultation with any ac which may be involved, gives rise to confusion and irritation.

2. Consultation with AOs and AOCs reference their personnel problems is within the province of Directors and is to be encouraged. Possible transfers may be discussed but no promises should be made in reference thereto.

3. All requests for transfers, attachments or temporary duty of specialist officers should be processed through the Establishment Officer, or the Executive Officer (S) who is responsible for all personnel placements (not directly to G-1). In all cases of disagreement between AOs and Directors of Sub-commissions as to the assignment or relief of a specialist officer, the situation will be presented to the Establishment Officer for decision. Co-operation of Directors will be very much appreciated.
