1. As Chief Legal Advisor I pass final judgment on the review of Allied Military Government cases. Due to the present shortage of legal officers resulting from redeployment however, it frequently becomes necessary for me to be away from headquarters for the purpose of trying important cases.

2. At such times there is no officer in headquarters qualified to pass on the review of these cases. Since the "Consolidated Instructions" specifically requires that such function be performed by a judicial officer not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.

3. Lieutenant Colonel HANFORD (B), who is in charge of the Italian Section, is fully employed with his work. Furthermore, he has had no experience in reviewing cases.

4. Major NOGENT, is familiar with the work and, except for his rank, is in all other respects fully qualified to review these cases.

5. It is therefore urged as a matter of necessity that the proposed table of organization now under consideration be amended so as to include one Lieutenant Colonel in the allotment of American Officers to this Sub-Commission.

SUBJECT : Maintenance of Legal Liaison Office, Naples Commune.
TO : HQ. A. C.
(Att. Chief Commissioner).

1. It has come to our knowledge that no plans have been made for the maintenance of Legal Liaison Office in Naples Commune upon the turn over of AMG functions to the Italian Government.
2. The Italian Courts, for the period beginning 1st April 1945 and ending 30th September 1945 tried or otherwise completed 7111 Allied interest cases. During that same period 5350 cases were referred to them for trial. On 30th September 1945, there were still pending trial before said courts 2181 Allied interest cases.
3. The redeployment of Allied Troops through Naples results in the commission of numerous crimes against Allied military personnel and Allied military supplies. It is most essential that these crimes be deterred to the greatest possible extent.
4. A legal officer can aid materially in expediting the trial of Allied interest cases, and can aid in insuring that exemplary and deterrent sentences, commensurate with the gravity of the offense are imposed.

JMS. ← The Italian Court Officials have requested that we continue our assistance to them by continuing to make available for consultation and advise, a legal officer familiar with the Italian Courts and their procedure.

6. Accordingly it is respectfully recommended that the Liaison Group intended to be maintained in Naples Commune include at least one legal officer.

1. Reference your letter of 4 August 45 circulating letter 13C/AMG/101 of 14 July 45 from AMG 13 Corps.

2. In my opinion the proposed W.E. for AMG 13 Corps Legal is excessive in numbers and exaggerated in rank.

3. At the present time the staff consists of 11 officers. Of these at least two have nothing to do, and the Regional Legal Officer told me that, if he could have one central prosecuting officer his requirements could be fully met.

4. I think therefore that an HQ staff of six officers plus two officers per area (total 12) is fully adequate.

5. I see no reason why the Chief Legal Officer should be higher in rank than Lt. Col, and certainly none only the area officer should be higher than Major. I think that Lt. Col. 1, Majors 3, Capt. (or Lieut.) 2 is an adequate HQ Establishment, while the areas should be Major 1, Capt. (or Lieut.) 1. Possibly the Area Officer in Trieste town might be a Lt. Col. . Certainly not in Gorizia and Pola.

1. Livorno presents an unusual problem. The first port of Entry in Italy for Allied supplies, and unquestionably to be the first Port of Debarkation, the inhabitable part of the town is under P.B.S, with little or no room permitted to the civilian population. As a consequence, only after extended effort was a bare room made available for Italian Courts, - a room of disgusting proportions. There is seemingly no space in which to house either for the permanent Italian Judiciary, or the visiting personnel of Assise, etc. Under the circumstances, use of the Italian Judicial personnel, even moderately, - has been out of the question at Livorno. I see no occasion for a change to occur in the near future.

2. In my opinion, no less than two legal officers, - and these must be willing to work, - should be left in Livorno. I have two officers at Livorno at the present. Since 8 May the office has been stream-lined, and has functioned very very satisfactory with two officers.

3. Lucca does not need a full-time Legal Officer. It will need attention, however. It would be my suggestion that the overseeing of Lucca could well be undertaken by the Livorno office. A similar arrangement for Pisa has worked.

4. Apuania should have a legal officer for the present. It is no different from any of the provinces liberated since 8 May. It must be remembered that Apuania was in enemy hands until the recent break-through. It has suffered much damaged due to the ebb and flow of combat during the fall and winter campaign. It is my opinion, however, that in another six weeks, Apuania will be ready for turn-back.

1. Attached is a roster showing the proposed allocation of Legal Officers on the liberation of all Italy.

2. The following officers are not shown on the roster:

Major A. W. B. Franklin
Major D. A. Rogers
Captain J. W. Levy

Major Franklin is going home on FIDON and it is understood the other two officers have already left to join the Austrian Commission.

3. Col. Campbell is on the Austrian list. It is the intention that he should be replaced at headquarters by Lt. Col. Telford from Liguria who in turn will be replaced by Lt. Banno. If this arrangement cannot be accepted it will be necessary to show Lt. Banno in Liguria at the present time. Lt. Col. Telford must then be shown as on headquarters strength and attached for temporary duty to one of the other regions.

4. The lists for Venezia and Venezia-Giulia have been changed considerably since the last plan, but this is caused entirely by the reintroduction of the Austrian names.

5. The deficiencies shown in the Lombardia and Piemonte regions must be accepted at the moment. They will be filled when more officers are available.

6. Lt. Scullion is shown in Venezia-Giulia. He is not at present assigned to the Legal S/O but he has been promised from the date when Berlino Region closes down.

7. The number of officers available now totals 88, leaving a deficiency of 6. Withdrawal of the 8 officers earmarked for Austria will leave a deficiency of 10.

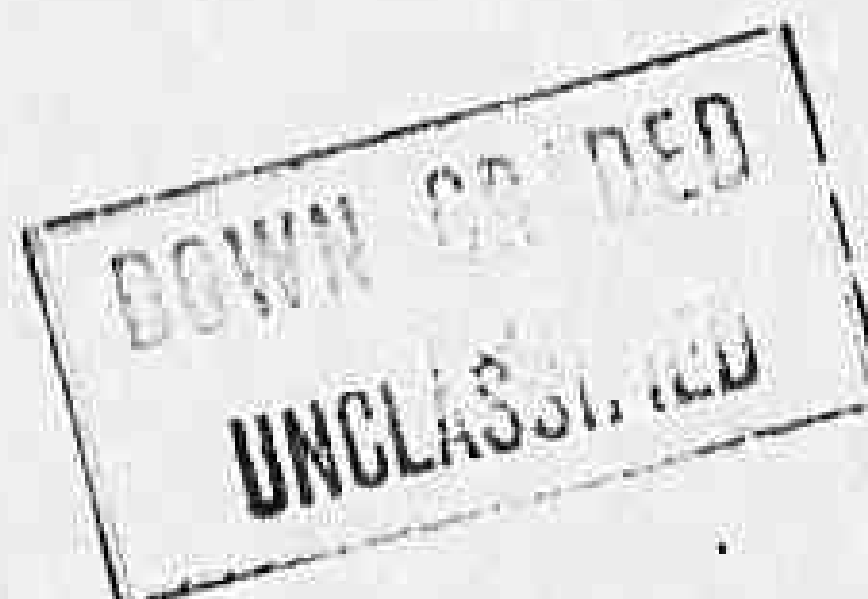

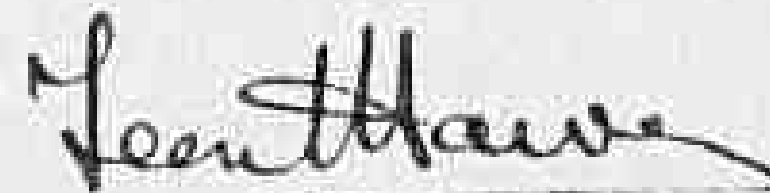

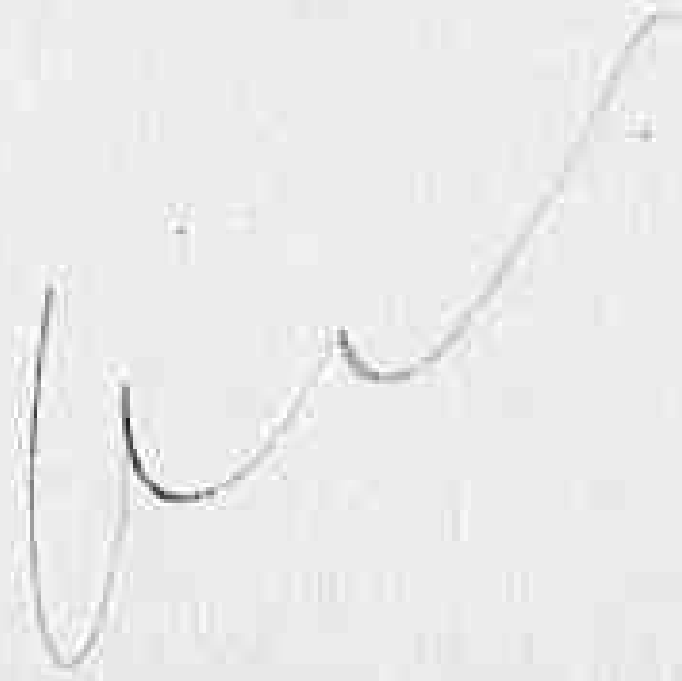

1. As I was not able to be present myself at the R.L.Os' Meeting held in Rome on 29 November 1944, I should like to make the following comments arising out of the Minutes of the Meeting which I have just received.

2. Paragraph 1(b).

I should like to recommend Major G. Stewart, R.A. (British) as a suitable candidate for the Legal Division of A.C. His present address is c/o D.A.A.G., 8th Army. I have already written to you personally with regard to this officer.

3. Paragraph 1(a).

I should like to place on record that I am not to be taken as agreeing that 20 legal officers will be sufficient for the requirements of Venezia Region. I am prepared to agree that with the available ceiling for the whole of Italy 20 is probably as many as any one Region can reasonably expect to get, if other Regions are not to go absurdly short. But I cannot possibly agree that it will be enough to do the work in the way it should be done. To do the work properly I consider that a minimum of 33 legal officers will be required for Venezia Region. I arrive at that figure as follows. You will remember that not very long ago the Regional Commissioner recommended that the Provinces of Trieste, Fiume and Pola would require a special team of 12 legal officers, in view of the special problems likely to arise there. Kindred problems are likely to arise in the Provinces of Trento, Bolzano and Belluno, which will probably have to be dealt with in a similar way. These Provinces are not of course so densely populated, but they cover a very large area in which communications are likely to be extremely difficult. On the same basis I do not think an allowance of 6 legal officers for these three Provinces would be unreasonable. For a Region of this size and complexity I consider that a minimum of three legal officers at Regional H.Q. will be essential. This adds up to 21, and there are still 8 other Provinces to be dealt with.

The Provinces of Rovigo, Verona, Vicenza, Treviso, Udine and Gorizia will require one Provincial Legal Officer each. The Province of Padova should, I consider, have two legal officers, in view of the population and importance of the City of Padova, especially as this city is likely to be a vital Army communications centre. The Province of Venezia should in my opinion have not less than four legal officers, in view of the size of the City of Venice and its probable importance as a port. I consider these figures for Padova and Venice are not unreasonable in view of view of experience now being obtained in Florence, a city of comparable size and importance. Allowing for the above, the total of officers required amounts to 33.

4. Paragraph 7.

As I was not present at the Meeting, there is presumably no note of the requirements of this Region in respect of Amendments to the Consolidated Instructions. I should like to have 160. This is based on the fact that 150 copies of the book were recently received from you, for distribution to new officers; and I should like the additional 10 copies to cover the cases of ~~200~~ officers like myself who had already previously obtained their copies of the book.

I see from your L-3072 of 16 November 1944 that you are treating Lieutenant VOGEL as one of your permanent officers in NAPLES. I want to explain the position to you.

I agreed to let you have ten additional officers for Southern Region. Of these eight were for the BARI zone courts and two were to replace CAHN and ROLFS.

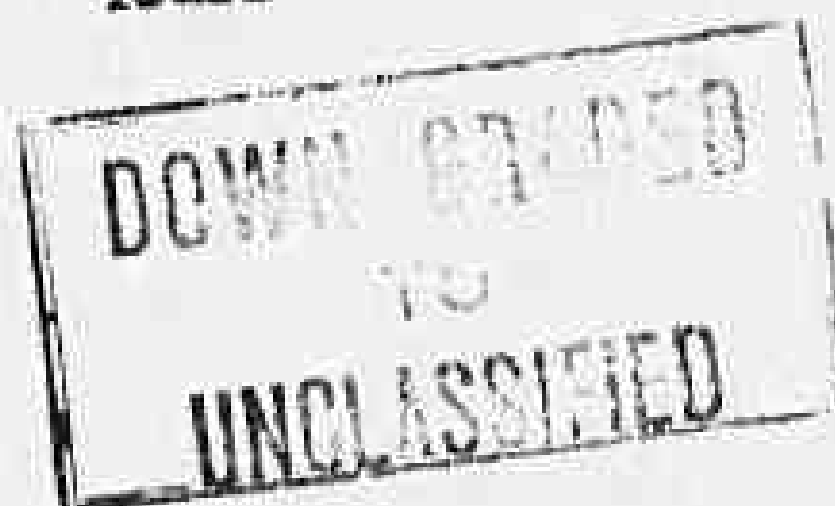
The ten officers to fill this role will now be as follows- YOUNG, GATES, LUPTON, AULISI, CHETIVIAN, ROGERS, GREENFIELD, BALBONI, ROBERTAZZI and VOGEL. Of these the first five are definitely attached to you for BARI purposes only. ROGERS is assigned to you as a permanent replacement. The other four officers are new to the Legal Sub-Commission of Allied Commission. In view of the situation in the north I did not find it convenient to assign any of them to a northern region and attached them to you because I was not sure exactly where I should ultimately want them. The position is, however, that only one of them will remain in Southern Region when the north is occupied.

I believe that VOGEL speaks excellent German and should be available in either Lombardia or Venezia. I would also think that ROBERTAZZI would be better in an AMG region. 87

I would like you to consider which of the four you desire to keep permanently, bearing in mind that my own suggestion is either GREENFIELD or BALBONI. The point is important because you will remember that the eight officers engaged in work on the AMG courts at BARI must be recognised as being liable to immediate recall when the operational situation demands it.

I duly received your letter of 14th inst..

The arrangements for shifting round legal personnel which included the temporary attachment of Major Cotes-Preedy to this Region were of course made before I took over.

In view of your decision to send Major Cotes-Preedy to Bari I shall be much obliged if you will let me have a replacement at Ancona. Capt. Boone is responsible for the Summary Courts at Ancona, Iesi, Macerata, Fabriano and Senigallia. He has been dealing personally with the first three and this together with his work in connection with the Italian Courts is as much as he can handle without being unduly burdened. Major Cotes-Preedy has been dealing with Fabriano and Senigallia. If therefore you have an experienced legal Officer to spare I would welcome him at Ancona. I do not feel however that an inexperienced officer would be of much value there as Capt. Boone would be too busy to instruct him.

If possible I would prefer that Major Backhouse should remain at Urbino. He is a very experienced officer and his services there are very necessary. He has besides a thorough knowledge of the set-up of the Italian Courts in Pesaro Urbino Province and a change in this respect is undesirable.

I have handed Bryce a copy of a Report I made to the Regional Commissioner on my return from my recent tour. This gives the actual present location of all Legal Officers in the Region. I am proposing to send Major Clerum shortly to Chieti.

SUBJECT : Legal officers - Ceilings.

TO : C A Sec.

1. It is recommended that the ceiling for the Legal Sub-Commission should be 90 officers made up as follows.

2. The figures for Sicilia, Sardegna, Southern, Lazio-Umbria, Abruzzi-Marche and Toscana Regions are as previously given.

3. It is considered that in Emilia Region with the cities of Bologna, Modena and Forli at least 4 officers will be required, even when the territory is restored to the Italian Government.

4. Liguria has three large ports; Genova, La Spezia and Savona. I do not consider that this region can be operated particularly in Military Government conditions on less than 7 officers.

5. Piemonte is a highly industrial area including the city of Turin and 7 Provinces. Italian judges are likely to be scarce. I feel that 12 officers are necessary.

6. Lombardia has Milan, and Brescia and in view of the probable conditions there I recommended 16 officers.

7. In view of the policy contemplated for Venezia it is essential to have at least 8 officers in the 12 provinces. The remaining 10 provinces require 12 officers.

8. In present conditions we do not require 90 officers. Indeed until a further advance is made our present number of 84 is certainly adequate. We are, however, in course of opening Allied Military Courts in Bari which will require 8 officers, and we have lost and are about to lose the services of four officers. If officers are to be taken for Austria our present strength will be reduced to 75.

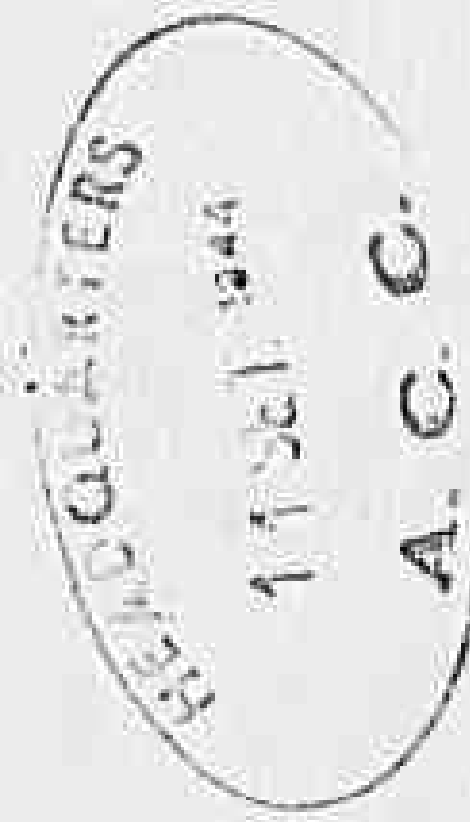

1. Reference latest edition to Appendix "C" - Tentative Ceilings and letter of 5 Sept 1944 4/1.1/AS .

2. The allocation of legal officers in this latest edition of Appendix "C" differs in some respects from previous editions. I will take them up in order where some change should be made.

(a) Southern Region.

New appendix "C" shows 10 legal officers. 8 legal officers are now carrying on the work in the Southern Region and I expect to cut that down by one or two officers within the next month.

(b) Region 4.

Eventually there will be 5 legal officers not 7 as appears in new appendix "C". Eventthis number may be further decreased if circumstances will permit.

(c) Region 5.

New appendix "C" shows 2 legal officers. In my opinion there should eventually be 3 because of the port facilities and airfields.

(d) Region 8.

New appendix "C" shows 6 officers. When all territory has been turned back to the Italian Government there will be 4 or 5 legal officers in Region 8, depending upon circumstances.

(e) Region 9.

New appendix "C" shows 3 legal officers. New appendix "C" must be based, as far as Region 9 is concerned, on a time sometime distant from the present moment for there are now 9 legal officers in Region 9 and will be for some time. When all Region 9 is restored 3 legal officers should suffice.

(f) Region 10 and 12.

These regions will both require at least 15 officers if AMG Courts are to function, and if the occupation of these regions will be conducted substantially in the manner of provinces previously occupied. It will be observed that both of these regions have ports of importance, always a source of difficulty, and both of these regions have a number of large cities, as well as actually moree

- 2 -

provinces in number than new appendix "C" purports to assign legal officers.

3. At Headquarters, A.C.C. new appendix "C" appears to allow 8 legal officers. This figure should be 9 as it includes Major Palmieri, who, although technically assigned to H., A.C.C., is generally on loan for specific reasons to one region or another. At present Major Palmieri is working with the Adm Sec on various phases of "Sanctions against Fascism".

4. New appendix "C" apparently assumes a combination of events at the same time and on that basis fixes the ceiling as of a particular moment. However, as the events assumed as being simultaneous are unlikely to be so new appendix "C" from the standpoint of the Legal Sub-Commission may be of little use. For instance it is quite possible that Regions 10, 11 and 12 will be occupied at a time when Regions 8 and 9 are also in an occupied status. Obviously Regions 8 and 9 could not get along on the small number of officers allocated to them if there was full occupancy.

SUBJECT : Legal Officers - Tentative Ceilings.

TO : Adm Sec.

1. Reference latest edition to Appendix "C" - Tentative Ceilings.
2. The allocation of legal officers in this latest edition of Appendix "C" differs in some respects from previous editions. I will take them up in order where some change should be made.
 - (a) Southern Region.
New appendix "C" shows 10 legal officers. 8 legal officers are now carrying on the work in the Southern Region and I expect to cut that down by one or two officers within the next month.
 - (b) Region 4.
Eventually there will be 5 legal officers not 7 as appears in new Appendix "C".
 - (c) Region 5.
New Appendix "C" shows 2 legal officers. In my opinion there should be 3 because of the port facilities and airfields. 69
 - (d) Region 8.
New Appendix "C" shows 6 officers. When all territory has been turned back to the Italian Government there will be 4 or 5 legal officers in Region 8.
 - (e) Region 9.
New Appendix "C" shows 3 legal officers. New Appendix "C" must be based, as far as Region 9 is concerned, on a time sometime distant from the present moment for there are now 9 legal officers in Region 9 and will be for some time.
 - (f) Region 10 and 12.
These Regions will both require at least 15 officers if AMG Courts are to function. In the occupation of these regions they will be conducted substantially in the manner of provinces previously occupied. It will be observed that both of these regions have ports of importance always a source of difficulty, and both of these regions have a number of large cities, as well as actually more provinces than new Appendix "C" purports to assign legal officers.

2.

3. At Headquarters, A.C.C. new Appendix "C" appears to allow 8 legal officers. This figure should be 9 as it includes Major Palmieri, who, although technically assigned to HQ., A.C.C., is generally on loan for specific reasons to one region or another. At present Major Palmieri is working with the Adm Sec on various phases of "Sanctions against Fascism".

4. New Appendix "C" apparently assumes a combination of events at the same time and on that basis fixes the ceiling as of a particular moment. However, as the events assumed as being simultaneous are unlikely to be so new Appendix "C" from the standpoint of the Legal Sub-Commission may be of little use. For instance it is quite possible that Regions 10, 11 and 12 will be occupied at a time when Regions 8 and 9 are also occupied. Obviously Regions 8 and 9 could not get along on the small number of officers allocated to them if there was full occupancy.

5. I would add one other point, namely that if Region XA is created one additional legal officer is needed as RLO.

1. In reply to your 4/1.1/AS of 26 Aug. 44 lists of officers for Regions X, XI and XII are attached hereto.

2. We feel that we should place on record the fact that we do not consider the number of legal officers detailed for any of these regions to be sufficient to enable the region to be administered in Military Government conditions.

3. It should be remembered that these areas are highly industrialized and the population is almost half that of the whole of Italy. It should further be noticed that many of these officers are now filling positions in Regions 4, 5 and 8 and others are to come from Region 9. There is no doubt that at the moment these officers are not available for the northern region, and it should be pointed out that in many cases they will not be available for some considerable time. We feel that, even though these officers are earmarked for the northern regions, no authority should be given to the Regional Commissioners to call forward these officers at their own discretion. As a matter of policy we think that the discretion to send forward any officer should be reserved to you or to ourselves.

4. We need not stress again that we are continuing to seek additional legal officers. If reinforcements are made available other officers will be added to the northern regions and in other respects it may be desirable or even necessary to amend the lists enclosed.

3. In addition Capt. Bader assists at Regional HQ. In effect the office of DRLO is abolished.

4. I am prepared to release Lt.Col. Troxell and Major Cohen immediately. I then propose to move Major Reynolds to Ancona.

5. As you know the Ancona Court of Appeal has moved and the Province has only recently been occupied. Pesaro will need the full time services of a LO for at least a month after it is full occupied. Ancona is still Army area and requires a whole time LO. 58

6. As you know Phase III reduces the Legal personnel of the Region to RLO and Capt. Boone. This may be satisfactory on an ACC basis, but in my opinion it gives no chance for Region to carry out its legal responsibilities on an ACC basis.

7. As soon as Provinces are handed over to ACC, the legal officers will be available for a further assignment. When this occurs, I will forward you their names.

8. Lt.Col. Troxell has asked me to forward for him an application for an early assignment for him and I requested that this may be done.

Dear, *Behrens*

1. Your foreboding on the number of Legal Officers remaining in the Region was not sufficiently gloomy. We are now to be cut down to a grand total of 2. These are to be Boone and myself.
2. Under ACC letter 16031/3/G-1 dated 22 June 44, the number was to have been 3 in the third phase. Since then Foggia has been taken out of the Region and with it went one sixth of the personnel left on Phase III. In fact we lost one third.
3. Troxell tells me that in fact we have lost Boyd-Carpenter and Levitt to Foggia.
4. You know this area better than I do. In my opinion even with the loss of Foggia and Campobasso Provinces to another Region, it is absolutely essential that there should be 3 legal officers in the Region. It might be possible to cope with the Region with 2 LOs if it were A.C.C.
5. If I can get a third, I propose to divide the duties as follows:-

RLO	Region HQ
LO	at HQ to cover Aquila, Chieti, Pescara, Teramo and Ascoli
LO	at Ancona to cover Pesaro, Ancona and Macerata.
6. I am writing to you at length in the hope that you may be able to get another LO for the Region. It takes a day to get to Ancona from here, and though I am probably biased, I do not think the provision of a third LO here is unreasonable. I would suggest that the amalgamation of Rome and Region 4, also a new large Region in the South, might enable an extra LO to be squeezed for here.
7. Can you do anything to help?

2. Upon receipt of a copy of your wire of 5 August, I immediately telegraphed to RHO, Region VIII and also wrote to him. In the meantime, one additional legal officer already has arrived in Region VIII, namely Major Holt who has been the officer in charge of Italian Courts, Region III. The RHO, Region VIII intended to use him for that purpose, but in view of this shortage, I suggested to him that at least temporarily, he use Major Holt as a RHO. 50

3. Also I have found one additional officer whom I think might be spared from Region V and I am making request at this time that this officer, Lt. Grant, be assigned from Region V to Region VIII. I trust this will solve the present difficulties.

4. You will appreciate the fact that, as of to-day, there are only 61 legal officers for all of Italy, this not including two who are sick in the hospital, and continued efforts are being made to secure additional legal officers.

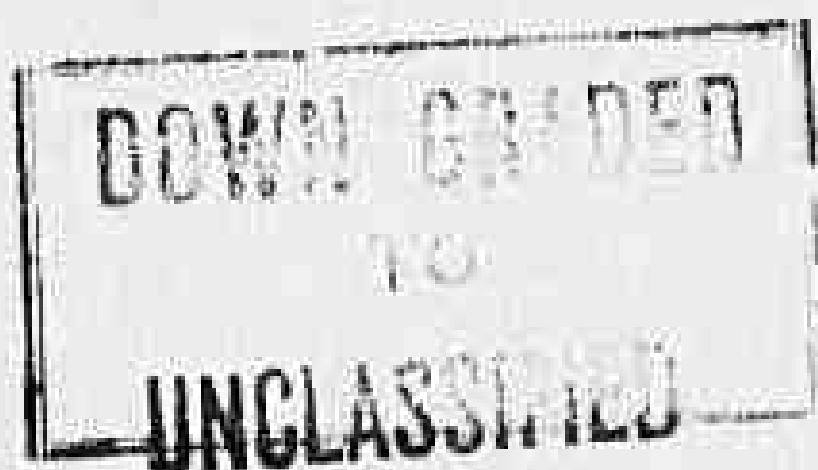

1. The following telegram has been received from AMG Fifth Army:

"Combination Pisa and Lucca Provinces under one Legal Officer most unsatisfactory, separate officer should be designated Lucca. Situation with doubling up of Finance Officers also unworkable as their urgent duties increase greatly when provincial capital liberated requiring continuous presence in province especially at this time when ammassi financing is added to usual heavy schedule".

2. I concur with the SCAO Fifth Army; but have no Finance Officer for Pistoia Province and no Legal Officer for Lucca Province.

3. In view of the fact that the actual progress of our Armies is such that no Province will have Italian officials properly organized and capable of functioning without immediate supervision for some time, it is requested that additional Legal Officers be furnished for Lucca and Apuania Provinces and additional Finance Officers be furnished for Pistoia and Apuania Provinces with the least practicable delay.

SUBJECT : Provincial Legal Officers for Lucca and Pistoia.

TO : R.C. Region VIII (for R.L.O.).

1. The decision to make one Legal Officer responsible for both the Provinces of Pisa and Lucca is likely to cause considerable delay in the reorganization of the Italian legal system in those Provinces, and it is urgently requested that a second officer be made available to go into Lucca and thus permit Lieutenant Nevans to carry on the work in Pisa Province, on which he has already made an excellent start.

2. The liberation of Pisa City and the various towns in the Arno Valley to which Court personnel and records have been evacuated will mean a great deal of work for the P.L.O. Pisa, as practically the whole legal organization of the Province is concentrated in that area. If he is to do that work properly, he will not be able to give any time to legal affairs in Lucca at any rate for the first few weeks, whereas from the military standpoint it is quite likely that the two cities may be occupied within a few days of one another and his services may be required in Lucca almost immediately. In view of the special problems of Livorno and Piombino, the P.L.O. Livorno is unlikely to be available to help in Pisa Province at present.

3. While the difficulties occasioned by the shortage of legal officers are appreciated, it is considered essential that every Provincial team should have its own legal officer at any rate in the initial stages of occupation, when the task of reestablishing the Italian Courts is heaviest. Once these Courts are functioning, their work and the conduct of any A.M.G. Courts in the area can probably be satisfactorily supervised by one P.L.O. covering two Provinces, and other legal officers be released in this way to go forward to new Provinces.

4. If no additional Legal Officers can be made available from any other source, will you please consider whether any internal reorganization could be effected in Grosseto and Siena Provinces which would release an officer to look after Lucca until such time as Lt. Nevans is ready to take that Province over as well as Pisa.

5. A similar problem will arise in Pistoia Province but this can probably be more easily overcome since the number of legal officers available in Florence should be sufficient to allow one officer to devote the greater part of his time to Pistoia.

Request that you have Directors of your Sub-Commissions review appendix "C" to 16031/3/C-1, dated 22 June 44, subject, "Future Planning Regional Strength", with reference to the number of officers required by each Sub-Commission in Regions I and VI under this appendix. It will be necessary sometime between August 15th and August 30th to drop Regional Strength of the above regions to the approximate strength shown in appendix "C". Conditions and commitments of Sub-Commissions may now be different from those existing on 22 June.

2. It is planned to have a meeting of the Regional Commissioners of Regions I and VI about August. It will be of great assistance to the Establishments Branch if I could have, by not later than 6 August, the numbers and names, if possible, of the officers of your Sub-Commissions who will be required in Regions I and VI on and after 15 August.

SUBJECT : Legal Personnel - Officers.

TO : Executive Commissioner (THRU: Admin Sec).

1. To bring you up to date on the legal personnel situation, I would like to point out that as of this date there are on paper 62 legal officers. Of these, two are acting entirely in other capacities (Col. U. John and Col. Chapman) and three are in hospitals for undefined periods, leaving, as far as I know, 57 active legal officers.

2. For Region IX, I have a SIO, Wing Commander Noble, but so far no other legal officers. I think it likely that three may be obtained shortly from Region III. That question, in view of the recent restoration and closing of Allied Military Courts outside of Naples Command, is being studied now. Also after Rome Region and Region IV are combined and the restoration of additional territory on 15 August I expect to make three or four officers available to Region IX. However, the latter plan may become altered if, as is now threatened, a substantial number of spy cases will have to be tried here. I may pick up one legal officer later from Region V or VI.

3. As to Region Z there are available now only the SIO of Region IV and his assistant and somewhat later, Lt Col Mercer, now SIO, 6th Army. In the absence of circumstances I know nothing of, there will not be available any other legal officers for regions above Region IX, unless:

- a. It is determined to remove all legal officers or some legal officers from Regions I, II, VI, VII (there are now only 7 altogether in those five regions);
- b. Additional officers in ACP of legal training now doing other work are reclassified as legal (2 are now promised);
- c. Secure, as the result of the arrival of British officers, the requisite number for legal duty;
- d. Secure from other sources outside ACP legally trained officers.

4. To the extent that at least thirty additional legal officers are not forthcoming from some of the above sources or combination of sources, for use in the three populous regions above Region IX, it must be understood clearly that there can be no trials by Allied Military Courts in those regions and that the Italian courts themselves can not be rehabilitated to function properly at the usual early date. Likewise, it will not be possible with present limited personnel to undertake the trial of any substantial number of spy cases in any region.

TO : Executive Commissioner.

1. Reference your 16031/3/G1 dated the 12th of June 1944.

2. Attached as Appendix "A" is the recommended strengths of Sub-commissions for Regions 1-12 and Army AGs. From this it will be seen that there are two main observations to be made.

(a) LEGAL. It is not considered that the Legal Sub-commission can function satisfactorily under its present obligations unless their ceiling is increased and it is recommended that this be done. It was always understood that the ceiling of 61 officers, Legal Sub-commission, was up to the Rimini-Lisze Line. The territory to be taken over is more densely populated and includes a number of very large cities.

(b) PUBLIC SAFETY. According to Appendix "C" of your 16031/3/G1 shows 120 police officers in the field as the total ceiling for Public Safety Sub-commission. This makes no provision for Headquarters staff of 9 officers. It is therefore recommended that an increase of 9 officers to the Public Safety Sub-commission should be made. If, however, this is considered impossible, the necessary numbers to provide for the Headquarters staff will have to be made by the reduction of officers from Regions 10, 11, 12.

3. Attached are copies of comments of the directors of Legal and Public Safety Sub-commissions for your information. In the absence of the Vice President on duty this date, this letter is forwarded unseen by him, in view of the fact that the matter is urgent. Nominal rolls of the officers transferred to the new Regions are in course of compilation and will be forwarded as soon as possible.

1. With further reference to your AGO/4023/L of 3 May 1944, the list of future legal officers for Region 4 contains the names of 6 officers who had never previously been assigned or attached to Region 4 and up to date have had no connection with this Region. These officers are:-

Lt. Col. Purcell
Captain Peyton
Captain Davis
Captain Cox
Lieut. Morris
Lieut. Nevans

The list as originally submitted contained also the name of Lieut. Grant, but it is understood that the name of Captain Falk (~~was~~ previously assigned to this Region) has been substituted for this officer. 25

2. I have had the opportunity of interviewing all the above officers and acquainting them with the work they will ultimately have to do. I enclose herewith for your information copy of proposed distribution of legal officers within Region 4 after the Region has been fully activated.

3. I now ask that the above 6 officers should be assigned straight away to Region 4. This is not because I desire to take them away from their present work. On the contrary, if my request is complied with, the first thing I should do, upon the assignment of these officers to this Region would be to lend them back to Region 3 to continue their present work. The reason for the request is that experience has shown that it takes anything up to a fortnight for an order to be produced assigning an officer, after the appropriate request is made through channels. It is impossible at present to foresee exactly when these officers will be required to take up their duties within Region 4, or how long notice it will be possible to give of their being required. I consider it likely that any of them may be, and the

17A

officer ^{for} ~~for~~ Littoria certainly will be, required at very short notice. If they have been previously assigned to Region 4, they can be called forward from their present work at short notice, as and when they are required. If they are not, it may not be possible to get them when they are required, and some provinces may have to take the field without a legal officer.

4. If the above request is granted, I will give my undertaking that none of the officers would in fact be called forward from their present work until they really are required.

5. Lastly, I have to request that the position with regard to Major Woodward may be cleared up without delay. At present I am still without orders in respect of this officer. So far as I know he is still assigned to Region 4, and up to date had been earmarked as Littoria Province Legal Officer. If Littoria Province team takes the field while this officer is still assigned to Region 4, and before Capt. Cox is assigned, I shall be placed in a very embarrassing situation.

6. I have discussed the contents of this letter with the Regional Commissioner, and he asks me to say that he regards the question of the Legal Officer for Littoria Province as a matter of extreme urgency.

In the meantime, however, Major Hendrickson has been assigned to C.A.S., as S.L.O. It is presumed, therefore, that for the time being Major Hendrickson is responsible solely to the S.C.A.O. 5th Army, and not to the R.C., Region 4, and that consequently he is not under my orders with regard to Legal matters. May this be confirmed? 22

3. What should the procedure be with regard to filing and examination of records of cases arising within the boundaries of C.A.S., and what is the policy to be with regard to Petitions for Review? Will the latter be dealt with only at H.Q., A.C.C., on the basis that for the time being the C.A.S. will be within an Army Area? Or have I, as R.L.O. of the Region which will ultimately be responsible, any obligations in relation to review of cases arising within C.A.S.?

4. It is presumed that for the time being Legal officers either permanently designated, or temporarily loaned, for service in Rome will pass under the exclusive control of Major Hendrickson, notwithstanding that they are Region 4 officers. This affects principally the officers whom I am designating as future Provincial Legal Officers of the four northern Provinces of the Region. My intention is that these officers, pending the occupation of their own Provinces, shall be temporarily employed in Rome, to

Reference your 4/20/AS dated 6 May 1944 unless Region III becomes unoccupied this Sub-Commission cannot supply legal officers for Region VIII as all legal personnel will be fully engaged in Regions I - VII. Even after restoration to the Italian Government there will, in the light of experience gained in Regions I and II, be a substantial time lag of 1-2 months before personnel can be released from Region III.

2. 4. At the present time the Allied Military Court situation at Naples requires the continual use of 26 officers in the city itself. In the event that Region 4 including Rome is occupied, the situation at Naples would become impossible because of the removal of presently attached officers. The Military Authorities naturally require the continued function of Allied Military Courts at Naples because of the large number of thefts and because of the prostitution situation. Any breakdown of the Naples Courts would be regarded as critical by the Military Authorities. There are nearly 6,000 new cases per month, of which 3800 are dealt with in the AM Courts, not including prostitution cases. A program is now under way to turn over to Italian Courts all possible cases.

5. The suggested ceiling would seriously cripple the work of this Subcommittee.

6. It is urgently requested that the ceiling be 11 in headquarters to include 3 trouble shooters and 50 in the field. Even this suggested ceiling would only work if it is possible to throw about an extra 2000 - 3000 cases a month onto the Italian Courts in Naples (which must be considered very doubtful) when Rome is occupied. Also it does not take into consideration Region 8 inasmuch as it would seem likely that if territory in Region 8 is later occupied legal officers from other regions will be found. The revised ceiling would provide:

9. It should be borne in mind that not only does the Legal Subcommittee perform normal Subcommittee duties, but unlike other Subcommissions spends much of its time in advising HQ ACC and its various sections and Subcommissions on the legal aspects of their many problems.

SUBJECT: Ceilings - Officers - HQ. A.C.C.

Telecommunications Sub-Commission.

1. The ceiling for the total officer strength of the Allied Control Commission including all Regions, Sub-Commissions and American appointments to the Army Sub-Commission, has been laid down at 4222 - 611 American, 611 British. This ceiling is intended to cover the territory up to the RIMINI - PISA line but it is probable that if the rest of the territory falls with rapidity, we should be expected to cover the whole of Italy with this number.

2. It is not proposed to lay down War Establishments for Sections or Regions owing to the necessity for maintaining elasticity within the Commission. It is, however, necessary to lay down a basic distribution of these officers amongst Headquarters, Sections, Regions and Sub-Commissions.

3. I attach herewith as Appendix "A" a table which shows suggested ceilings for the various Divisions of this Commission. You will notice that I have divided the figures between Headquarters and the field, i.e., the Regions, and that I have shown a small reserve in each Section.

4. I should be grateful if Heads of Sections would give this matter their immediate attention and prepare their comments on the figures proposed. If it is possible the numbers should be reduced. If the numbers shown are not sufficient for any one Sub-Commission, I would ask Heads of Sections so to manipulate them that the total shown for their Section is not increased and I would ask that a case be prepared for any increase in any Sub-Commission. I suggest that the reserve be absorbed at the discretion of the Head of the Section.

5. I should be glad if Vice Presidents when preparing their comments would define the distribution of officers amongst Regions where this is

6. I am anxious to complete the picture for submission to the Chief Commissioner before the Regional Commissioners' meeting on 14th April and I suggest, if it is convenient to Vice Presidents, that we should meet on 7th April to discuss the picture presented in the attached list.
