SUBJECT : Personnel.

TO : A.F.H.Q., G-5.

1. The officers referred to below have presented themselves at this office in the last few days for interview by me stating that they had been ordered by you to report.

2. It appears that they are anxious to obtain employment in Civil Affairs in North West Europe. No information has been supplied to me either by them or by you as to the posts which it is suggested that they should fill.

3. Major G. T. Cunningham.

This officer is 37. In civil life he is a hosiery manufacturer and has had no legal training or experience before the war. He speaks French but does not speak German and has no experience of Germany. During the war his legal work has been limited to being president of two Courts Martial and doing 18 months legal work as an 'A' Staff Officer. He has been and is now filling the post of D.A.G.

In this theatre, and it is presumed in North West Europe, officers employed in the Legal Sub-Commission must be qualified lawyers. Major Cunningham is not a qualified lawyer and presumably therefore is not eligible for such a post. Even if legal qualifications are not necessary it is my opinion that Major Cunningham has neither the knowledge nor experience necessary for a post as a legal officer. In the course of a short interview Major Cunningham appeared to me to be a competent and intelligent officer for whom suitable employment in Civil Affairs could presumably be found.

4. Major I. H. Shearer.

This officer is 30 years of age and a member of the Scottish Bar to which he was called in 1936 and where he worked for 3 years before joining up in September 1939. His work was mainly concerned with Workmen's Compensation but he also conducted a small number of criminal prosecutions. During the war he has done no legal work except during 6 weeks period of convalescence when he acted as Staff Captain Legal at Command Headquarters. He does not speak French or German and has no knowledge of Germany.

Although this officer has had comparatively little practical experience of legal work in Civil life he had a distinguished career and was lecturer in International Law at Edinburgh University. He has for 6 months been an instructor at the Middle East Staff School for Civil Affairs, lecturing on International Law and other legal subjects. In my opinion he would be a useful legal officer for work in North West Europe.

5. It is understood from a signal received at this Sub-Commission that there may be other officers for interview. If there is any further information which you require in connection with these officers perhaps you would inform me.

St. David Goodman's letter of 1 September 1944 has just reached me. He gave me your name and address, and I am taking the liberty of writing you informally. I hope you don't mind.

At present, I am still a reserve officer assigned to the 543rd Replacement Co, 24th Replacement Depot, APO 781, having been assigned to this company since my arrival in Italy, from the U.S.A., on August 7 this year.

Civilian Background and Experience: Born May 14, 1915 in Illinois. High School graduate.

1. Was graduated from University of Illinois AB, '37
2. Was graduated from University of Chicago JD, '40
3. Admitted to Illinois Bar October 1940
4. Worked as clerk-cashier in Peoples Federal Savings and Loan Assn., Peoria, Ill., during summer while attending college.
5. Associated with the law firm of Todd, Acker, Pendergast and Hademan, Peoria, Illinois from September 1940 to September 1941 when I was inducted into the Army. This firm was engaged in the general practice of civil law, representing 3 banks, 2 loan associations and various insurance companies. I have had some experience in adjusting claims against insurance companies.

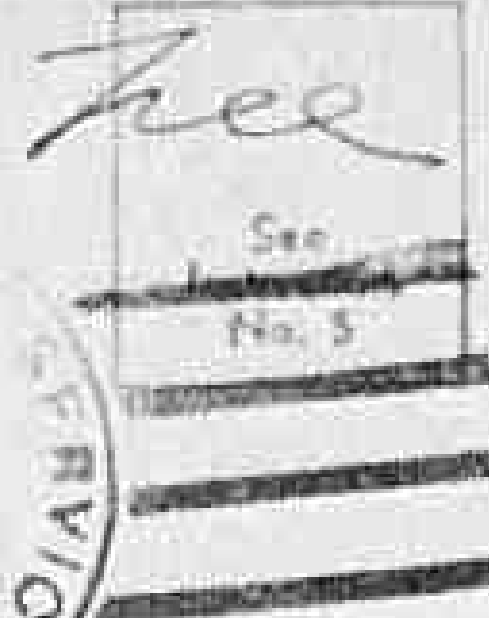
