SUBJECT: The Armed Forces Leave Act of 1946

TO : Commanders of all Major Commands, Separate Units and Installations,
WFOUSA

War Department radio, WOL 35237, dated 12 August 1946, is quoted for information and compliance:

"1. The Armed Forces Leave Act of 1946 provides that on and after 1 September 1946 the amount of accrued leave for officers and enlisted personnel will not exceed 60 days. The term "Leave" shall be applicable to both officers and enlisted personnel.

"2. Officers and enlisted personnel remaining in active service after 1 September 1946 will be entitled to compensation in 5 year Government bonds for amount of leave accrued as of 31 August 1946 in excess of 60 days. Total accrued leave as of this date can not exceed 120 days. Forms for filing claims available about 1 September 1946.

"3. On 1 September 1946 and thereafter all officers and enlisted personnel are entitled to accrued leave at the rate of 2 and 1/2 calendar days per month, credited as of last day of the month, not to exceed 60 days and must receive such leave prior to their separation or discharge.

"4. Enlisted personnel separated or retired from active duty prior to 1 September will be compensated in bonds for full amount of accrued leave, less leave taken. They will make claim for such compensation following their separation or release. Forms for settlement to be available at Post Offices.

"5. Officers being separated and beginning terminal leave prior to 1 September will receive terminal leave due in accordance with existing regulations and instructions.

"6. Leave under the provisions of this Act shall be computed as of 30 June 1946 in the manner prescribed in paragraph 3a (1) and 3b (1) of AR 605-115. Leave will accrue subsequent to 30 June 1946 only at rate of 2 and 1/2 days per month. This method shall be used for both officers and enlisted personnel. Enlisted personnel may consider all active service since 8 September 1939. Requests from individual officers for information regarding amount of accrued leave will not be acknowledged. See paragraph 23, AR 605-115. Service in the WAAC will not be considered for settlement under the provisions of this Act.

"7. Effective upon receipt of this message, reenlistment furlough heretofore granted as reenlistment bonus is no longer authorized. Reenlistment leave may be granted not to exceed 90 days and such leave shall be chargeable against unused leave accrued during prior continuous enlisted service, or against leave which will accrue during the first year of future service, or both.

"8. All regulations and instructions in conflict with those herein are hereby rescinded. Revised leave regulations will be published soon."

1. The following G.H.Q. ruling with regard to eligibility of personnel for Privilege Leave or LIAP is forwarded for information of all concerned.
2. In all cases eligibility will be determined by the actual geographical location of the individual at the time when the individual is to be granted Privilege Leave or LIAP.
3. It follows therefore that in cases where a Headquarters of any description is in South Italy and has units, sub-units or individuals attached to units in North Italy or BTA, or vice versa, the eligibility of all personnel on the strength of that Headquarters will be determined by the physical location of the individual and NOT by that of his Headquarters.

2. This practice has caused considerable embarrassment and numerous Parliamentary enquiries, and will cease forthwith.

3. The enquiries conducted in the UK by the War Office on the receipt of notification from GHQ CMF that application for repatriation of wife (and family) has been submitted, do occasion a certain amount of delay, and in consequence GHQ is unable to state FTD of the family until War Office sanction to the repatriation has been accorded.

4. To avoid unnecessary delay Unit Commanders should ensure that applications for the repatriation of families are submitted to this H.Q. well in advance of the husbands return to UK, and should also ensure that applications conform with the instructions contained in GRO 444 of 1946.

5. The contents of this letter will be brought to the notice of all locally married personnel as soon as possible.

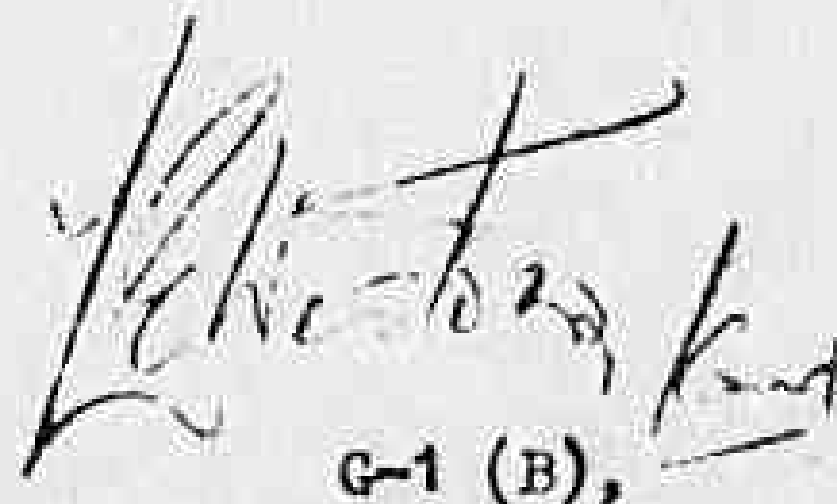

Under GHQ letter 4327/7/44 dated 8 Dec 45, authority has been given allowing officers in Age/Service Release Groups 25 and lower, who are at present ineligible for LIAP, to proceed on LIAP provided they sign a statement that they will agree to serve a minimum of four months from the time of rejoining their units or formations ex LIAP.

2. The same terms apply to Other Ranks.

3. It is emphasized by G.H.Q. that this is an arrangement whereby extra man power may be made available to the Army and it is not to be used as a means to send men on LIAP for compassionate or other reasons.

4. ~~Three~~ ^{Three} copies of all statements signed in accordance with para 1 and 2 above will be forwarded, before departure on LIAP, to G-1 (B) this H.Q. for onward transmission to GHQ 2nd Echelon.

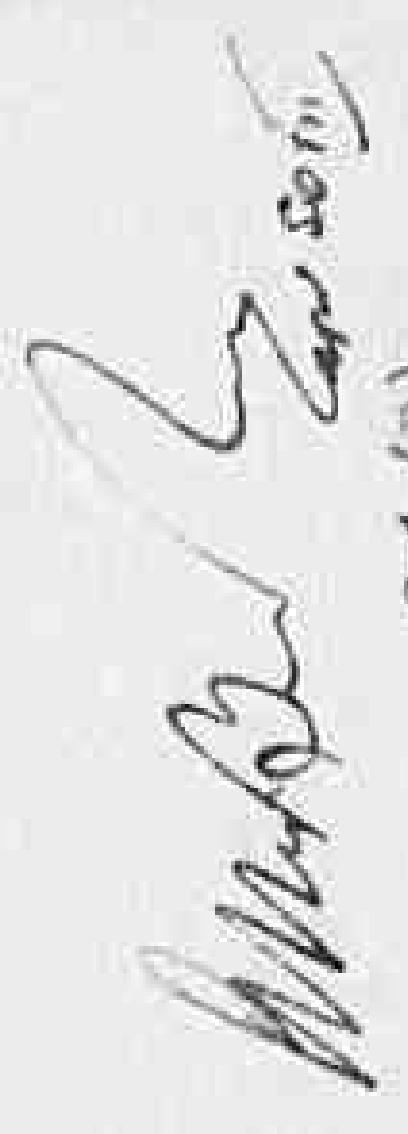

1. A limited leave scheme to Switzerland on compassionate grounds only has been approved by the War Office. Compassionate grounds on which leave may be authorized are similar to those which would secure reversion to UK under the terms of GRO 165/45 or the fact that the applicants family has been resident in Switzerland since June 1940 and owing to the war the applicant has been unable to see them since that date.

2. If an application is granted it will be subject to the following conditions:-

- (i) Valid British passport and Swiss visa must be in the applicants' possession.
- (ii) Plain clothes must be worn.
- (iii) Currency regulations must be obeyed.
- (iv) Travel from the Swiss border will be at private expense and the individual concerned must be maintained in Switzerland entirely at his own expense or the expense of the persons he is visiting.

3. Compliance with the above conditions will be the applicants' responsibility. A British passport can be obtained from the British Consul Naples (or Athens for personnel in Greece) and a Swiss visa from the Swiss Legation Rome.

4. Applications for leave will be submitted in accordance with GRO 165/45 to this HQ. A firm address at which the applicant will spend his leave if granted must be given. Leave will be for a period not exceeding 28 days from the date of crossing the Swiss Border.

G.R.O. 825/45 - Return to UK of Long Service Personnel (PENSION).

1. As from the date of publication of this G.R.O. the qualifying date for eligibility for return to UK will be that on which four years' unbroken service overseas are completed, reckoned from the date of embarkation in UK for the journey which actually reaches an overseas destination.

2. (a) Periods of leave or duty, aggregating not more than six months, spent in the UK during the four years do not constitute a break for the purpose of eligibility and will be counted as overseas service and will contribute towards the qualifying period.

(b) Time spent in UK aggregating more than six months will constitute a break in an overseas tour, and a new tour of overseas service starts on the next date of embarkation.

(c) Time spent in UK in the following circumstances will be ignored in assessing the six months referred to above :-

- (i) As a patient in a Medical Unit or HES hospital after admission immediately on disembarkation.
- (ii) On leave in addition to PITHON (LAP).
- (iii) On leave granted to personnel from overseas before posting to the Far East.

3. (a) For the purpose of this ARO overseas service will include, in addition to all overseas commands, service in
 - (i) REF, NAF, Faroe Islands and Iceland.
 - (ii) Service afloat in the case of personnel serving on vessels based overseas.
 - (iii) Periods spent overseas as a Prisoner of War.
 - (b) Civilian service overseas cannot be computed when assessing eligibility for PYTHON or LILIP.
4. (a) Subject to the above para 3 a soldier is eligible to be considered for inclusion in the PYTHON Scheme provided that :-
 - (i) The overseas Commander does not consider his retention is necessary on operational grounds.
 - (ii) He was enlisted or commissioned in the United Kingdom into British Service.
 - (iii) He was enlisted or commissioned locally into British Service and either his normal residence is in the United Kingdom or he would normally be returning to the United Kingdom at intervals during his employment abroad.
 - (b) Personnel enlisted or commissioned into local forces are not eligible to return to the UK under the PYTHON Scheme, but an officer commissioned into local forces and contemporaneously or subsequently granted a King's Commission is thereby rendered eligible for inclusion in the PYTHON Scheme subject to residential qualifications as in para 4 (a) (iii) above. In such cases overseas service for PYTHON purposes will date with effect from the date of the King's Commission.
5. British Service personnel who are eligible for return to UK and who have been away from INDIA for a period of four years may be posted to INDIA in lieu of return to UK, subject to the conditions given in para 5 below. Periods of leave or duty, not exceeding in the aggregate six months, spent in INDIA during the four years do not constitute a break for the purpose of eligibility.
6. Posting to INDIA under para 5 above will be confined to those personnel who have definite roots in INDIA, as follows :-
 - (a) Those resident in INDIA on enlistment or commissioning, or before joining the British Army.
 - (b) Those married to Indians or Anglo-Indians.
7. Personnel posted to INDIA under para 5 above will be granted 28 days' repatriation leave. Before being posted to SIAO or elsewhere they will be granted a further 14 days embarkation leave.
8. Personnel eligible for PYTHON and in 429/Service Release Groups 27 or later,

returning to the United Kingdom at intervals during his employment abroad.

(b) Personnel enlisted or commissioned into local forces are not eligible to return to the UK under the PYTHON Scheme, but an officer commissioned into local forces and contemporaneously or subsequently granted a King's Commission is thereby rendered eligible for inclusion in the PYTHON Scheme subject to residential qualifications as in para 4. (a) (iii) above. In such cases overseas service for PYTHON purposes will date with effect from the date of the King's Commission.

5. British Service personnel who are eligible for return to UK and who have been away from INDIA for a period of four years may be posted to INDIA in lieu of return to UK, subject to the conditions given in para 6 below. Periods of leave or duty, not exceeding in the aggregate six months, spent in INDIA during the four years do not constitute a break for the purpose of eligibility.

6. Posting to INDIA under para 5 above will be confined to those personnel who have definite roots in INDIA, as follows :-

(a) Those resident in INDIA on enlistment or commissioning, or before joining the British Army.

(b) Those married to Indians or Anglo-Indians.

7. Personnel posted to INDIA under para 5 above will be granted 28 days' repatriation leave. Before being posted to SEAC or elsewhere they will be granted a further 14 days' embarkation leave.

8. Personnel eligible for PYTHON and in Age/Service Release Groups 27 or later, or if in earlier Age/Service Release Groups whose release has been deferred, NOT domiciled in the U.K. or EIRE are not eligible for PYTHON, but may apply for 64 days' leave to their country of domicile (DOMCOL) on completion of 4 years' overseas service outside the country of domicile subject to the conditions laid down for DOMCOL.

9. Personnel of British Service in Age/Service Release Groups 27 or later, or if in an earlier Age/Service Release Groups whose release has been deferred, NOT domiciled in the U.K. or EIRE are not eligible for PYTHON, but may apply for 64 days' leave to their country of domicile (DOMCOL) on completion of 4 years' overseas service outside the country of domicile subject to the conditions laid down for DOMCOL.

10. Personnel will be eligible to be called forward by CHQ 2nd Echelon as soon as their overseas period is completed. In some cases personnel may necessarily be called forward shortly before or after the actual completion of the qualifying period. In the event of an officer or other rank who considers himself eligible not being called forward he will notify his commanding officer who will forward his name to CHQ 2nd Echelon stating the circumstances.

11. Where, due to the exigencies of the service, a man cannot be spared, a certificate to this effect, signed by an officer not below the rank of brigadier will be forwarded to C.H.Q. 2nd Echelon, who will delay his calling forward for a period of one month.

12. Personnel returning to the U.S. under this scheme will be served off strength of this theatre with effect from the date of embarkation. They will be granted 28 days' repatriation leave, and before being posted to another theatre will be granted a further 14 days' embarkation leave. Unless they volunteer for service in any other theatre, they will only be liable to be posted to North-West Europe.
13. Acting rank will be relinquished by officers and other ranks with effect from the date of leaving the unit or appointment. Temporary rank of officers will be retained for a period of 61 days with effect from the date of disembarkation in UK/INLA or until taken on the strength of a unit and filling a specific vacancy in the War Establishment of that unit, carrying a lower rank, whichever is the earlier.
14. This scheme is voluntary on the part of those qualified. In all cases where an officer or other rank does not wish to take advantage of this scheme, his name will be returned to GHQ 2nd Echelon accompanied by a signed certificate to that effect. Such certificates may not be revoked until six months from the date on which they were signed. Cases in which earlier revocation is required for exceptional reasons will be submitted to AHSQ through the usual channels. Full statement of the circumstances involved will accompany the application.
15. Nominal rolls of personnel applying for posting to INLA in lieu of return to the UK under para 5 above will be forwarded direct to GHQ 2nd Echelon, CEF. All rolls will be accompanied by a recommendation of the commanding officer stating that the individual concerned fulfils the conditions given.
16. Attention is drawn to GPO 319/44, as amended by GPOs 10/45 and 465/45 whereby married personnel may apply for the return to the UK of their wives and children. This application should be made six months before personnel become entitled to repatriation; in view of the large number of families involved it may not otherwise be possible to return families at the same time.
- As from 1 Jul 45, personnel listed at para 4 (c) (iii) above returning to the UK under PITHON or LILOP who are granted passages at WD expense for their families will NOT be entitled under the Release Regulations, Chapter 20 to further passages for the repatriation of their families, even if on release the individual himself is eligible for repatriation under the Regulations.
- Personnel who are affected by this rule who, because of it, do not wish to take PITHON or LILOP will be allowed to defer without the restriction contained in para 14 above.
17. The provisions of this GPO are applicable to officers and auxiliaries of the ATS for whom the qualifying period referred to in para 1 above will be two years.

15. Nominal rolls of personnel applying for passage to the UK under para 5 above will be forwarded direct to CHQ 2nd Echelon, GMR. All rolls will be accompanied by a recommendation of the commanding officer stating that the individual concerned fulfils the conditions given.

16. Attention is drawn to GSO 345/44, as amended by GSOs 10/45 and 145/45 whereby married personnel may apply for the return to the UK of their wives and children. This application should be made six months before personnel become entitled to repatriation; in view of the large number of families involved it may not otherwise be possible to return families at the same time.

As from 1 Jul 45, personnel listed at para 4 (a) (iii) above returning to the UK under FTHON or LILOP who are granted passages at WD expense for their families will NOT be entitled under the Release Regulations, Chapter 20 to further passages for the repatriation of their families, even if on release the individual himself is eligible for repatriation under the Regulations.

Personnel who are affected by this rule who, because of it, do not wish to take FTHON or LILOP will be allowed to defer without the restriction contained in para 14, above.

17. The provisions of this GSO are applicable to officers and auxiliaries of the ATS for whom the qualifying period referred to in para 1 above will be two years.

18. Officers and auxiliaries of the ATS who so desire may be permitted, provided the ADATS, AFHQ, and the medical authorities are in agreement, to serve overseas continuously for a maximum period of three years. Postponement certificates and medical certificates will be rendered to AFHQ (G1(Dr)) for approval.

19. Officers and auxiliaries of the ATS who desire to take LILOP or DOMCOL (para 8 and 9 above refer) must be in Ayr/Service Release Group 33 or later, or if in earlier Ayr/Service Release Group must have deferred their release.

20. Attention is drawn to GSO 263/45 - "Cases of VD under Surveillance - Return to United Kingdom".

21. GSOs 661, 695, 991, 1071/44 and 262 and 332/45 are hereby cancelled.

G.R.O. 029/45 - Leave to UK - LIAP

1. Allotment of Vacancies within Units

LIAP vacancies will in future be allotted within units according to length of continuous service overseas, subject to the exceptions in para 6 below.

2. Allotment of Vacancies within Formations

In order to achieve uniformity within Formations, so that personnel with comparatively short service are not sent on leave in one unit, while in other units personnel with longer service are kept waiting for vacancies, Formations will allot vacancies in the following manner:-

(a) Vacancies will first be allotted in proportion to numbers of men with over 3 years and less than 3 1/2 years service overseas plus those with over 3 1/2 years service who have relinquished Python until all such individuals have been granted vacancies. These personnel will be known as Group 1.

(b) As soon as Group 1 have been allotted vacancies, the proportional allotment will be made in accordance with numbers of personnel with over 2 1/2 years service and under 3 years, and thereafter in succession to those with over 2 and under 2 1/2 and those with over 1 1/2 and under 2 years continuous overseas service. These groups of personnel will be known as Groups 2, 3 and 4 respectively.

3. Allotment of Vacancies by AHO

(a) A similar system will be followed by this HQ in allotting vacancies to Armies and Districts. To enable this to be done, each Army and District forward a monthly return to reach this HQ by the seventh day of each month showing numbers of eligible men under command on the first day of the month in each of the four groups specified in para 2 above. Monthly allotments will be made by this HQ on the basis of these returns about the tenth of the month.

(b) As trains will be arranged on the basis of the monthly allotments made three weeks in advance it will not be possible for vacancies to be carried from one Army or District to another by units moving from one to another; except where large numbers are involved and special arrangements can be made. Normally a unit so moving will surrender its vacancies and obtain a new allotment when reaching its destination. Owing to the number of vacancies available, this should not cause hardship. When large movements occur, the Army or District from whose command the movement takes place will send details as soon as possible to G1(Tr)HQ in order that allotments can be adjusted.

(b) As soon as Group 1 have been allotted vacancies, the personnel with over 2½ years service and under 3 years, and thereafter in succession to those with over 2 and under 2½ and those with over 1½ and under 2 years continuous overseas service. These groups of personnel will be known as Groups 2, 3 and 4 respectively.

3. Allotment of Vacancies by AMHQ

(a) A similar system will be followed by this HQ in allotting vacancies to Armies and Districts. To enable this to be done, each Army and District and other formation receiving a direct allotment from this HQ will forward a monthly return to reach this HQ by the seventh day of each month showing numbers of eligible men under command on the first day of the month in each of the four groups specified in para 2 above. Monthly allotments will be made by this HQ on the basis of these returns about the tenth of the month.

(b) As trains will be arranged on the basis of the monthly allotments made three weeks in advance it will not be possible for vacancies to be carried from one Army or District to another by units moving from one to another; except where large numbers are involved and special arrangements can be made. Normally a unit so moving will surrender its vacancies and obtain a new allotment when reaching its destination. Owing to the number of vacancies available, this should not cause hardship. When large movements occur, the Army or District from whose command the movement takes place will send details as soon as possible to G1(Dr)Ad in order that allotments can be adjusted.

4. Eligibility

All officers and other ranks of the following categories are eligible for LIAF except those made ineligible by para 5 below:-

- (a) British personnel of the British service.
- (b) British personnel of Colonial Forces administered by the War Office
- (c) British personnel attached or permanently attached (i.e. those on British rates of pay) to the Indian Army.

5. Disqualifications

The following are ineligible for LIAF:-

- (a) Personnel within six months of FIVEON or Release, except as stated in

- 7 -

para 6 (b) below. The Age/Service Groups which for this purpose are to be considered likely to be released within six months will be notified from time to time. At present, the Groups are 1 - 24 for men and 1 - 38 for women, except for certain categories such as full Colonels and above and HQs, whose rate of release is likely to be slower than the normal.

(b) Personnel under suspended sentence unless authorised by Corps or District Commanders.

(c) Personnel with less than eighteen months continuous service overseas (twelve months in the case of members of the Women's Services) and those who have previously had LIAF or similar leave, except as stated in para 6 (b) below. Such personnel are likely to receive leave under different conditions when all entitled to LIAF have had leave.

6. Leave on Compassionate Grounds

(a) COs may give LIAF vacancies to a limited number of eligible men before their turn on the basis of length of service overseas, on reasonable compassionate grounds.

(b) Vacancies may be given by Formation, etc. Commanders on reasonable compassionate or other grounds to personnel ineligible under paras 5 (a) and (c) above.

(c) Leave on Compassionate grounds will not normally be granted unless the applicant does not wish to be posted or has been refused posting or is likely to be refused posting.

7. Officers Vacancies

No fixed proportion of vacancies will be allotted to officers. Vacancies will be allotted to all ranks on the basis of eligibility specified above.

8. Period of Leave.

The period of leave will in future be 28 days in U.K. starting on the day after leaving the U.K. Transit Camp. 19

9. Paras 2, 3, 4 and 5 of GPO 1013/44 are cancelled.

1. This H.Q. letter of even number dated 7 Jul 45 is cancelled in so far as it affects AG/AC personnel in the field.

2. The following LIAP procedure will be taken into effect forthwith.

(a) For Field Personnel.

H.Qs Regions and Communes, Livorno Zone and Liaison Officers will, in future, be allocated LIAP vacancies by the Districts and Areas in whose territory they are located. Movement and documentation instructions, will be carried out in accordance with existing policy issued by the District and Area Headquarters concerned. Any applications for Compassionate Leave which have been submitted to this H.Q. can no longer receive consideration and should be dealt with under local arrangements. It is of the utmost importance that this H.Q. be notified immediately an officer or O.R. is granted a LIAP vacancy, and also the date of proceeding on leave. This may be done on A.C. Form R.3 which will be forwarded by the fastest possible means.

(b) For H.Q. Personnel

Vacancies on future LIAP drafts will continue to be allotted to this H.Q. for personnel located within the territorial boundaries of R.A.A.C. Such vacancies will be reallocated on the principle outlined in this H.Q. letter of even number dated 7 Jul 45, but personnel will be placed into one of the following four groups.

- (i) Group 1. Personnel who have between 3 and 3½ years service overseas.
- (ii) Group 2. Personnel who have between 2½ and 3 years service overseas.
- (iii) Group 3. Personnel who have between 2 and 2½ years service overseas.
- (iv) Group 4. Personnel who have between 1½ and 2 years service overseas.

Into Group 4 also fall such personnel who are eligible for and have relinquished their rights to repatriation and have not taken

instructions, will be carried out in accordance with existing instructions issued by the District and Area Headquarters concerned. Any applications for Commissionate leave which have been submitted to this H.Q. can no longer receive consideration and should be dealt with under local arrangements. It is of the utmost importance that this H.Q. be notified immediately an officer or O.R. is granted a LIAP vacancy, and also the date of proceeding on leave. This may be done on A.C. Form B.3 which will be forwarded by the fastest possible means.

(b) For H.Q. Personnel

Vacancies on future LIAP drafts will continue to be allotted to this H.Q. for personnel located within the territorial boundaries of P.A.A.C. Such vacancies will be reallocated on the principle outlined in this H.Q. letter of even number dated 7 Jul 45, but personnel will be placed into one of the following four groups:

- (i) Group 1. Personnel who have between 3 and 3½ years service overseas.
- (ii) Group 2. Personnel who have between 2½ and 3 years service overseas.
- (iii) Group 3. Personnel who have between 2 and 2½ years service overseas.
- (iv) Group 4. Personnel who have between 1½ and 2 years service overseas.

Into Group 1 also fall such personnel who are eligible for PRISON, but have relinquished their rights to repatriation and have not taken ILIOP. The name of any officer and O.R. who falls into this category and who is desirous of LIAP will be forwarded without delay to G-1(Sr) this H.Q., through the correct channels.

It is the policy to despatch all Group 1 personnel on leave first and then to follow with the other 3 Groups. In this way it will be ensured that every individual will receive a vacancy in turn. Periodical returns will be requested by medium of the Daily Bulletin and it is of the utmost importance that these returns are accurately compiled. Should an individual, who considers himself eligible, not receive a vacancy in turn, application may be submitted through the appropriate channels to G-1(Sr). Conditions of eligibility have been notified in a previous directive and continue to apply. Documentation and movement will be dealt with (a) in the case of officers by G-1(Sr) and (b) for O.Rs by O.C. British Detachment, and will be done in accordance with "Instructions for Documentation - MEDLOC", copies of which have been forwarded to O.C. British Detachment under separate cover. All leave travel will, in future, be by overland route the code name of which is MEDLOC.

3. The only personnel of Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub Commission who will receive LIAP vacancies from this R.Q. are those located in the territorial boundaries of R.A.A.C. Others will be dealt with in accordance with para 2 (a) above.

4. The attention of all ranks is directed to C.R.O. 824/45 which outlines the LIAP Scheme in detail.

TO : Distribution below.

1. Compassionate leave on a limited scale is now open to JERSEY and GUERNSEY but not yet to ALDERNEY; leave can only be granted ex UK and this means that personnel in this theatre must first be reverted to Home Establishment except as provided below.
2. Compassionate posting to UK, where the object is to obtain a period of compassionate leave in JERSEY or GUERNSEY, will be authorised by AMHQ in cases where the grounds are such as would obtain a compassionate posting to UK under the terms of GRO 165 of 1945 had the application been one for compassionate posting to UK. Long absence from the CHANNEL ISLANDS by itself is not considered to be sufficient hardship.
3. Personnel returning to UK on LILOP or normal leave and who have grounds for a grant of compassionate leave in the CHANNEL ISLANDS may make application to the War Office for such leave but, to avoid accumulation of individuals awaiting passages, should not be despatched to UK on normal leave out of turn solely for the purpose of visiting the CHANNEL ISLANDS.
4. LILOP, normal leave and compassionate reversion cases should on arrival in UK make detailed application to the War Office, Whitehall, London S.W.4 submitting full particulars and an address in the Islands where enquiries can be made.
5. Application for compassionate reversion to UK in cases of this nature will be submitted in the form prescribed by GRO 165 of 1945 and should be accompanied by supporting evidence and in this connection attention is invited to GRO 707 of 1944.
6. A War Office ruling as to whether personnel domiciled in the CHANNEL ISLANDS are eligible for DEACOL under GRO 505 of 1945 has been requested.

BY COMMAND OF REAR ADMIRAL STORE

2. Compassionate posting to UK, where the object is to obtain a period of compassionate leave in JERSEY or GUERNSEY, will be authorised by AMHQ in cases where the grounds are such as would obtain a compassionate posting to UK under the terms of GRO 165 of 1945 had the application been one for compassionate posting to UK. Long absence from the CHANNEL ISLANDS by itself is not considered to be sufficient hardship.

3. Personnel returning to UK on LILOP or normal leave and who have grounds for a grant of compassionate leave in the CHANNEL ISLANDS may make application to the War Office for such leave but, to avoid accumulation of individuals awaiting passages, should not be despatched to UK on normal leave out of turn solely for the purpose of visiting the CHANNEL ISLANDS.

4. LILOP, normal leave and compassionate reversal cases should on arrival in UK make detailed application to the War Office, Whitehall, London S.W.1 submitting full particulars and an address in the Islands where enquiries can be made.

5. Application for compassionate reversion to UK in cases of this nature will be submitted in the form prescribed by GRO 165 of 1945 and should be accompanied by supporting evidence and in this connection attention is invited to GRO 707 of 1944.

(b) British Personnel of the Colonial Forces administered by War Office.

(c) British Personnel attached or permanently attached (i.e. those on British rates of pay) to the Indian Army.

7. Personnel who come within the following categories, however, disqualify for consideration when allotments are made:-

(a) Personnel within 6 months of PYTHON, i.e. personnel with $3\frac{1}{2}$ years or more overseas service.

(b) Personnel within 6 months of Release. It is ruled at present that this will apply to those in Age/Service Groups 1 - 24 inclusive. Individuals within Groups 1 - 24 who have volunteered to serve on for a period of less than 12 months or who for any other reason will not be released with their Groups are however eligible.

(c) Soldiers under suspended sentence unless special authority has been obtained.

(d) Personnel who have less than 18 months continuous service overseas and those who have already had leave to U.K. In the case of Women's Services, the minimum is 12 months.

6. It is now possible to consider compassionate cases for LIAP, but applicants must have either been refused or are not desirous of a compassionate posting. It must be borne in mind that LIAP is primarily a reward for good service and careful consideration should be given to all applications for compassionate leave before submission to this HQ.

9. Conditions enumerated in paras 6, 7 and 8 above are also applicable to AIR LIAP and should be read in conjunction with this HQ. Letter of even number dated 2 July 1945.

10. It is again pointed out that the above is subject to alteration, particularly in relation to the introduction of ROAD LIAP for personnel of this formation, and advice will be given as soon as AHCQ policy is known.

1. Conversation Major Stearns - Col Behrens refers.
2. The attached file which consists of the previous application by Sgt Stein for permission to visit Prague is self-explanatory.
3. Since this application was made, Sgt Stein has had further news of his family, substantially to the effect that all members of his family except his mother were deported to Germany and that his mother is now alone in Prague. Naturally this news has increased his anxiety and his very natural desire to visit Prague.
4. He was given to understand unofficially that the reason why the original application was turned down was because the Russian Government was not admitting any visitors of this type. He believes however that the Russians have now vacated Prague and that visits there can be arranged.
5. I strongly endorse his application for permission to go but I agree with him that any normal application through channels at this time would probably only lead to an automatic refusal. I think that the only chance of obtaining permission is by some personal and direct appeal to higher authority.
