SUBJECT: Wage Policy for Industry in North Italy

TO : All Regional Commissioners

1. Reference is made to memorandum Labor Sub-Commission, LSC/116 of 4 May 1945 entitled "Wage Policy for the North". The machinery for wage adjustment provided in General Order No. 41 and set forth more particularly in paragraph 2 of the above mentioned memorandum still holds good.

2. On 8 July an agreement was reached between representatives of labor, industry and the Italian Government to extend to the entire North an agreement for wage increases previously negotiated in Milan. This has been approved effective from 25 June 45. By arrangement with the Italian Government, AC/ASO will approve wage increase agreements in industry which do not exceed the level established by the Milan agreement. Where proposals are submitted which go beyond this agreement in any material aspect, approval should be withheld temporarily. Such agreements should be submitted to this headquarters. They will then be considered in conjunction with the Italian Government and other interested parties.

3. The following is a summary of the increases provided for in the Milan Agreement:

1. Reference is made to memorandum Labor Sub-Commission, LSC/1116 of 11 May 1945 entitled "Wage Policy for the North". The machinery for wage adjustment provided in General Order No. 11 and set forth more particularly in paragraph 2 of the above mentioned memorandum still holds good.

2. On 3 July an agreement was reached between representatives of labor, industry and the Italian Government to extend to the entire North an agreement for wage increases previously negotiated in Milan. This has been approved effective from 25 June 45. By arrangement with the Italian Government, AC/ANC will approve wage increase agreements in industry which do not exceed the level established by the Milan agreement. Where proposals are submitted which go beyond this agreement in any material aspect, approval should be withheld temporarily. Such agreements should be submitted to this headquarters. They will then be considered in conjunction with the Italian Government and other interested parties.

3. The following is a summary of the increases provided for in the Milan Agreement:

The Milan agreement provided that for workers in certain communes outside of the commune of Milan there would be a 5 per cent deduction while

workers in other communes receive 15 per cent less. This geographical differentiation based upon population of communes and provinces should be applied to other localities. It is hoped that discretion will be exercised in applying these differences and where appropriate even greater differentials may be provided for.

The above increases absorb and therefore cancel the war indemnity (indennita' di guerra).

4. The Milan agreement further provides that 75 per cent of the indemnity will be paid to those who are not working or working at reduced hours. In the case of the latter, it will be paid at the hourly rate for the hours not worked up to 48 per week. Of this sum, one-third will be paid by the employer and two-thirds by the Cassa Integrazioni. These provisions will appear in a decree of the Italian Government which will be implemented by A/C order. It will be superfluous, therefore, for any agreement between employer and employee to alter this arrangement since public funds are involved. Approval should not be extended to any agreement which seeks to modify these provisions relating to the Cassa Integrazioni fund.

5. The contingency indemnity provided for in the Milan agreement should absorb any increases which may have been previously agreed upon or approved over the 3 April level.

6. The Milan agreement as extended to the North of Italy applies only to industry. It does not apply to agriculture or commerce.

1. With reference to paragraph 1 of circular letter 13065 /F of 27 June 1945, on the representations of the Italian Government it has been decided to implement the four decrees in question with effect from 1st May 1945, and not from 1st June 1945 as previously advised.

2. By implementing decrees RDL 6 December 1943 n. 18/B and DDL 18 November 1944, n. 528 with effect from 1st May 1945 the grant in anticipation authorised in paragraph 2 of instruction 13065/F of 14th June 1945, will be regarded as an anticipation of the increases provided by the above decrees, and not additional thereto.

3. For the purpose of account it will be sufficient to ascertain the difference between the sums due under circular instruction 13065/F of 27th June 1945 and the salaries or wages actually received. Until further orders are issued re-imbursment should not be requested in the respect of any over payments that may have resulted.

4. To offset the reduction in salaries and wages due to cessation of the so-called indennita' emergenza, it has been agreed with Italian Government to grant as a temporary measure a special indennita' di congiuntura payable to all State employees, at the rate of 32 lire gross per day, with effect from 1st July 1945, and limited to a period of 30 days. This special indemnity is not payable after 31st July 1945.

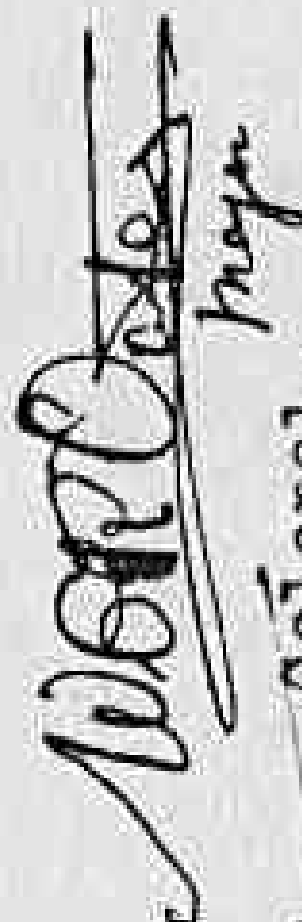

SUBJECT: Increase in Salaries, Wages and Pensions of Public Employees.

TO : All Regional Finance Officers and
Senior Finance Officers.

1. It has been decided to grant increases in the salaries, wages and pensions of public employees by the implementation of the following decrees, with effect from 1st June, 1945:-

RDL 6 Dec 1943 n. 18/B
DRL 18 Nov 1944, n. 328,
RDL 13 Mar 1944 n. 85,
DRL 30 Jan 1945 n. 41.

2. The principal provisions of these decrees are as follows:-

DRL 18 Nov 1944 n. 328 (This decree is put first to facilitate calculation).

- (a) New basic salary and wage scales are established, which incorporate the former supplement for active service and the temporary war bonus;
- (b) The temporary integration granted by RDL 6 Dec 1943 n. 18/B is increased by 500 lire monthly for grades I to V; by 800 lire monthly for grades VI to VIII, and by 1000 lire monthly for lower grades. These increases are subject to a reduction of 15% for employees in towns of less than 200,000 inhabitants, and of 30% in towns of less than 50,000;
- (c) The "aggiunta di famiglia" and indennita' temporanee mensili di caroviveri are increased by 100% - the application of the increases being limited to the first three dependent children;
- (d) The institution of an indennita' giornaliera di disabitazione per residenza for employees in Rome, Naples and Palermo, or other places to be named subsequently by ministerial decree, where the cost of living is unduly high. This new indemnity is equivalent in amount to the indennita' per offese belliche (bombardamento) established by RDL 16 Dec 1942 n. 1498. These two indemnities are not cumulative and only one can be paid at one time.

SUBJECT : Italian political Courts - Personnel - Court of Cassation, etc.
TO : Regional Commissioner (Attn: Regional Legal Officer),

A conference with the Minister of Justice took place this morning. A number of points were discussed and the following decisions reached in common agreement,

1. Will you please issue an administrative order appointing Consiglieri Umberto Guidi and Bruno Medici to the Cassation Section. They are being duly promoted by the Ministry.
2. Lepore will not, repeat not, return to Milan. Berardi will also remain in Rome. It is hoped to appoint in the near future other Consiglieri to the Milan Section in order to constitute a second section if and when this becomes necessary.
3. The Minister is writing an official letter to the P.C. (copy to you) forbidding him to accept any document or letter signed by or on behalf of the "Commissario per la Giustizia", whom he considers, rightly I think, as juridically and otherwise non-existent.
4. A number of grade V will be promoted or transferred to the Court of Appeal of Milan before the end of the month.
5. It is CIA's opinion and the Minister's that ~~some~~ members of the Republican Army now POWs should not be tried by the Court of Assize or the Tribunale Militari for the sole reason that they have been wearing a fascist uniform. Definite charges must be preferred against them and specific facts stated.
6. Personnel available from the south will proceed to Lombardy as soon as your "nulla osta" is received.
7. Zingale has left today for Milan and will report to you on his latest activities in Cremona.

SUBJECT : Salaries of Judges at Florence and Pistoia.

TO : Finance Sub-Commission.

1. The Minister of Justice has received complaints from the two undermentioned judges who were both retired on 1 Sept. 1944 in that they have been unable to obtain settlement of the claims as set out below because the Treasury refuses to pay the corresponding orders on instructions from the "Allied Command".

2. Counsellor of Appeal, Dott. De Murtas, Riccardo, domiciled at Florence in respect of his "indennità di buonuscita", liquidated up to 13 March 1945.

3. Procuratore del Regno, Dott. Mele, Ascanio, domiciled at Pistoia, in respect of both his provisional pension and the "indennità di buonuscita", liquidated several months ago.

4. If these matters can be adjusted direct by your Financial Officers on the spot, or further difficulty arises, please advise this Sub-Commission so that we may inform the Minister of the outcome.
