

SUBJECT: Transportation for Italian Arresting and Judicial Authorities.
TO : Legal Sub-Commission, HQ, ACC.

1. Our recent visits to the Tribunali and Preture within the Naples Court of Appeal district, demonstrated to us, rather forcibly, the seriousness of the transportation problem.

2. Although this problem is not new, it deserves urgent attention, for the Italian Courts are now in full swing and the criminal calendars, particularly as to cases affecting Allied interests, may easily be considerably reduced if transportation facilities are made available.

19

3. The Tribunale of Santa Maria Capua Vetere may serve as a good example. It has almost its full complement of magistrates and other personnel. It has a full calendar at all times, but most cases have to be postponed because defendants, witnesses, CC.RR., and others do not appear. The jurisdiction of this Tribunale extends to a radius of about fifty kilometers on all sides. The CC.RR. or other arresting agents cannot transport prisoners to Court because they lack the means. The military either cannot or will not cooperate in this respect. Witnesses, even if conscientious and civic-conscious, cannot afford to travel many kilometers. When transportation is available, prices run into thousands of lire. The judges themselves cannot travel to different localities for the same reasons. If transportation were available, hundreds of cases could be disposed of in a very short time.

4. We should like to make the following suggestion. At Present there are several rail lines in operation, such as the Naples-Cassino line. These lines run often, but are restricted to the exclusive use of military personnel.

5. The prefects of the various provinces have proved helpless in the matter of transportation and so have other Italian authorities.

6. This matter, therefore, is submitted to you for your consideration and advice. 13

1. On 12 October 1944 Consigliere D'AMATO Nicola was sent forward to his seat at the Court of Appeal Perugia. He was sent by the courier to Foligno (25 minutes from Perugia) and was equipped with all the necessary permits and documents, together with a letter from this Sub-Commission requesting that he be furnished all assistance to reach Perugia.

2. Arrangements were in fact made by this Sub-Commission with PLO Perugia for D'AMATO to be collected at Foligno but these arrangements appear to have encountered a technical hitch, so that when D'AMATO reached Foligno he had no means of further progress.

3. Capt. Oates, who was there, approached a M.P. and asked him to assist the judge by obtaining for him a seat on a military vehicle. The M.P. replied that his orders were that no civilian in any circumstances was ever to be allowed on a military vehicle.

4. It is felt that this sort of situation may recur and it will assist the forward movement of Italian officials if this ruling could be changed. Could this please be investigated.



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

1. Under ACC Establishment Memorandum 21, Para 12, it is provided that civilian vehicles belonging to the Italian Government will not be requisitioned.
2. For the purpose of this Memo the term "the Italian Government" includes all Court Officials while acting in the course of their duty.
3. Please take steps therefore to ensure that no car is requisitioned which is being used by any court official^s or other officers of the Ministry of Justice in your Region. If there is any doubt whether a particular vehicle is being so used a certificate should be obtained from the Ministry.

TO : Regional Legal Officer (thru RC) Region V.

1. The contents of your R5/511/12/AQ of 29 Aug 44
are observed with considerable regret.

2. Action as indicated in para 5 of your letter is
entirely useless, except that the request is passed on to this
Sub-Commission and then returned to you for action. The Minister
of Justice has far too few cars to meet the requirements of his
immediate staff; he cannot hope to satisfy local needs.

3. I would suggest that the importance of this matter
be brought to the personal notice of the Regional Commissioner
and that he be requested to add his personal authority to the
efforts which are being made.

4. The impression which I had, and which I believe
still to be accurate, is that if a car could be provided the
Court work in the whole Italian area of the Abruzzi would for practical purposes
look after itself.

1. Letter of 26 Aug. 44 Ref. ACC/4039/6/I received.
2. The car previously requisitioned by Prefect for Procuratore del Regno which was to be at the disposal of Procuratore Generale del Regno, Tribunale and the Court of Appeal was found to be unfit for this purpose and was returned to its owner.
3. To date all transportation for the above-mentioned has been arranged either in military vehicles or cars borrowed from other Departments. This has been very unsatisfactory.
4. Inspection of all Tribunali has been completed by the First President and Procuratore Generale.
5. At the suggestion of the PLO, the First President and the Procuratore Generale have each written to the Minister of Justice advising him of the existing transportation problem and requesting that some permanent means of transportation be supplied.
6. The Procuratore del Regno has requested transportation from the Prefect and the First President, the Procuratore Generale and the PLO met with the Prefect in an effort to obtain the same.
7. To date no permanent means of transportation have been supplied but every effort is being made to obtain the same.



Capt. Hill is also searching for some clerks, and the question
of whether any members of the family of either Judge can travel,
depends upon whether the car will carry on the return journey
to Grosseto, any such new employees.

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- 1 Now that the Allied Troops have advanced further to the North, a larger number of civilian cars have become available for requisition but the real difficulty arises in respect of tyres and batteries.
- 2 If only tyres and batteries could be provided it would I think be possible for us to give to the Italian Governmental Agencies assistance which they urgently and seriously need.
I will give three examples only:
 - (a) Education Sub-Commission urgently require transportation for the "provveditori" to get out into the country to open schools. Without transport they cannot get out and the schools remain closed or if open go without much needed supervision.
 - (b) Interior Sub-Commission urgently require transport for the Vice Prefecto (Ispettore) to get out into the communes and maintain much needed contact, frequently prefects are out of touch with their communes for months at a time.
 - (c) Legal Sub-Commission urgently require transport for the procuratori generali and procuratori del re to supervise out-lying pretori. Transport is also badly needed to serve process, to bring witnesses to Court and so on.
- 3 I fully appreciate the difficulties over transport but I feel that at this juncture the matter should again be tackled. The lack of transport for Italian civilian agencies is seriously hampering the administration of Italian Government territory and if anything can be done to help their genuine needs I am sure you will agree with me that it should be done.
- 4 I shall be glad therefore if you will examine the possibility of providing tyres and batteries which will go far to alleviate the present position.

Subject : Transport for Procure in Sardinia.

One of the main difficulties confronting the Law Courts here is the lack of transport by means of which the Procuratore del Re can get about the Island to conduct their investigations. Public transport facilities are still almost non-existent. The High Commissioner has agreed to requisition 7 cars for use by Court Officials i.e. 1 for the Procura Generale and one for each of the six Procure.

At present there seems to be no financial authority for incurring the necessary expenses in connection with maintaining and running these cars. The Procuratore Generale has written to the Ministry of Justice explaining the situation and asking for such authority. Whilst such expenses probably do not form part of the normal budgetary allowances to the Ministry of Justice it is hoped that in the present exceptional circumstances a special allowance may be made. It is superfluous to point out the advantages which would accrue as regards the speeding up of judicial business.

May representations in support of the Procuratore Generale's request be made to the Ministry, please?
