- I. I submit a report on the working of this Office for the period 31 July - 28 Aug. 1945. Ancona Commune including the Port was transferred to the Italian Government at midnight of the 4th of Aug. 1945.

2. ALLIED MILITARY COURTS

- (a) i. General Courts None
 ii. Superior Court One

involving 21 persons. This was a complicated case and took 2½ days.

Outstanding Fines

- i. DELLA FAZIA Domenico D2/JL/1006 (Pescara) sentenced to fines totalling L.18.000, in default imprisonment aggregating 5 months, also 3 months imprisonment. He has started to serve term in default.
 ii. GRAZIOSI Mazzareno D1/Anc/817 sentenced to 4 months and L.20.000 fine, in default a further 4 months. The same remarks apply.
 iii. MENCONI Emilio D1/Anc/802. Sentenced to 4 years imprisonment and a fine of L.1.340.000, in default a further 4 years. This fine represented the amount received by the accused for the sale price of a truck load of stolen WD sugar.
 iv. CIANCHELLI Egisto, D1/Anc/1141, sentenced to fine totalling L.200.000 in default an aggregate of 18 months imprisonment. His car was confiscated. His release is recommended on account of his age and state of his health. Our Anc/F/20 dated 14 of Aug. refers.

All payments have been duly entered and paid over to proper authorities. The counterfoil receipt books have been tied up and indexed.

3. Arrangements for trial of offences against Military property and personnel.

The Port of Ancona is still under Allied Control which will partially be retained after 31 of Aug. when it becomes a C class Port. The Military Authorities are perturbed at the prospect of the delay which may occur in deciding cases connected with Allied Property and which appear inseparable from Italian Court Procedure.

All such cases in AMG territory have been dealt with by AMG Court till date of handing over. Detailed instructions based on the Ministero's Circular of 9 May '44 together with copies of circular have been sent to all concerned and the necessity of using the summary procedure (procedura direttissima) wherever applicable has been stressed. Monthly reports concerning 20.8. have been called for and these will be sent to the ~~Liaison Officer~~ ^{for} Liaison Officer here temporarily to watch the work. There are still CMP working in Perugia, Jesi & elsewhere and arrests may be expected to continue for some time, apart from the cases reported by the C.C. R. Unfortunately it will not be possible to see the result of the action taken for some time so far as Ancona is concerned as I find the Questura has compromised the position by releasing nearly all arrested persons on bail, which means that the direct procedure cannot be used in such cases. His action was of course due to the difficulty of finding accommodation in the jails and probably the only course now open is to keep such persons in the Carabinieri lock-up (even though this may be contrary to the rules) so that they can be dealt with summarily. At all events, the Procuratore Generale has directed him not to grant bail in future, but to refer the question to the Procuratore del Regno.

4. JAILS.

See above. The problem of accommodation is acute. The jail at Ancona was badly damaged, and repairs are going on but very slowly. The present capacity is only 175 and the number of persons under detention at the time of writing is 234. There is no water and we have been responsible for a service of military water carts. There is no electric light. Since the writer has been in Ancona the vast majority of cases of stealing from the docks has had to be dealt with by fine, which has admittedly a limited deterrent effect. The attention of the Ministry may be drawn to the position.

5. COURT OF APPEALS

The question of accommodation for the personnel has not yet been finally settled, but the first sitting in Ancona is fixed for 23rd of Aug.

6. MILITARY TRIBUNAL

A letter has been received from Lt. Col. HANNAFORD stating that an effort will now be made to reestablish the Tribunale at Macerata.

7. EPURAZIONE

1. Administration

I called for a report from the Delegate from the Province of Ancona from which it appears that so far no cases have been decided by the Provincial Judicial Committee, although investigations have been completed in a number of cases. A scrutiny of the lists submitted shows the usual large proportion of petty Officials.

When I was in Siena, a representative of the High Commission ~~xx~~ visited the town in order to ascertain the progress of the work and I consider that this might well be done here.

11. FASCIST CRIMES = COLLABORATION WITH THE ENEMY

A special Court of Assize has now been set up here, but has not yet held any sittings.

The number of persons detained locally is 88, of which 31 are charged with fascist Crimes committed before 8 Sept. 1943, and 57 with collaboration with the Germans after this date.

I have not yet received returns from other courts, but I believe that a considerable number of persons is awaiting trial.


Apart from this I understand from the Procuratore del Regno that nearly 1000 cases under ss.3 & 5 of D.L.L.159 are under istruzione.

This is admittedly no longer a responsibility of AMG, but any Legal Liaison Officer who may be posted here should make it his business to see that the trials are expedited and that prisoners are not left unduly long in jail awaiting trial.

8 III. GENERAL

From what I have seen during the limited time I have been here, I am not satisfied with the work of the Italian Courts in the Province.

It has now been arranged that the Tribunale of Ancona sets aside Monday in each week, and if necessary will sit again on Saturday, to deal with Allied Cases. The Procuratore del Regno has been told that summary procedure is to be the rule and not the exception. He has also been warned that all inferior Courts submit returns of decided cases weekly. I am now hopeful that the work will show some improvement. But the Procuratore del Regno is overworked and requires further assistance. As allied interests will be involved for so long as our troops remain in this area, I repeat my recommendation that a Legal Liaison Officer should be deputed here as soon as possible, to supervise the work.

2. ITALIAN COURTS

Troxell asked the Procura Generale to issue orders to Courts to close their lists and report on 20 of each month.





1. The reports from the Italian Courts covering the month of May were not received until after the monthly report had been forwarded.

a) UMBRIA

2. All of the reports for Umbria for the month of May were negative except the ~~last~~ Courts of Terni. They reported 5 cases concerning 9 accused all charged with possession of Allied military property. No order disposing of the W.D. property was indicated.
3. On 22nd of June I visited the Procuratore Generale Dott. Carlo Vallerani in Perugia. He has directed that all reports from Italian Courts in Umbria are to be closed on the 20th of each month, to be forwarded promptly to this office, so that they may be included in our report. No reports for June have been received.
4. The Procuratore Generale is making an inquiry as to the disposition of the W.D. property in the cases at Terni advising the Court that in such instances the property is to be delivered to the nearest Allied Military Agency.
5. The number of detained persons in Perugia on 10th May was 379 of which 69 have been released since that date.
6. The Procuratore Generale stated that the work of the Court Officials was greatly hampered due to the lack of motor vehicles. They were not able to even transport the necessary witnesses.
7. The Procuratore Generale also asked me to report the following matters as he thought we might be able to assist in remedying these matters by reporting them. A Procuratore del Regno is badly needed in Terni. They now have only a Substitute there and it is a troublesome area, he states.
8. Four Councilors are needed for the Court of Appeal, Perugia. They now have only five. He asks urgently for at least Two.

b) MARCHÉ

2. The number of people in prison in Ancona and Tolentino, reported by the Procuratore del Regno, are 103.

3. The First President of the Court of Appeal of Ancona visited the Ancona A.M.G. Legal Officer on 23 June. He stated that the offices of the Procura Generale and Court of Appeal were still located in Tolentino and asked for authority in writing to transport the records of the two offices to Palace of Justice in Ancona, their permanent location. It was learned that this building is now in good repair and is not in use by any other agency. The authority was granted.

5. The President advised that the Procuratore Generale was in Rome at the instance of the Ministry of Justice and he did not know when the Procuratore Generale would be authorized to return. The Substitute Procuratore Generale moved to Ancona on 27 June. A conference has been arranged with the Ancona Commune Commissioner to discuss the matter of quarters with the President of the Court of Appeal and the Head of the Housing Commission on Wednesday,

The President of Court of Appeal was so advised on 25th of June.







At least two should be sent immediately.
