1. ALLIED MILITARY COURTS

The attached schedule sets forth the number and character of cases tried by Allied Military Courts in the Province during the period beginning from 1 March and ending 31 March 1947. The total number of cases tried was 7, two of which were Superior Court cases. The Summary Court cases resulted in convictions and the Superior Court cases were Not Guilty.

2. ITALIAN COURTS

The practice of remitting the majority of cases to the Italian Courts continues. The sentences are appreciably lighter than the average sentence of A.M.G. Courts in similar cases but are reasonably satisfactory. The Procuratore della Repubblica at the request of this Division has entered appeals in two cases where the Tribunale applied the Amnesty where the charges included improper retention of arms.

The magistracy, which had previously made representations regarding their economic difficulties, have intimated verbally that there is now abstention from non urgent work as a token of protest. This is not a protest against the conditions under A.M.G. but is in line with the protests in other parts of Italy. While the requests for economic improvement which were made to A.M.G. could not be met, the deputations appeared satisfied that at least a sympathetic reception had been given; and naturally, in view of the profession of those protesting, it appeared to be appropriate that A.M.G. were more than justified in not altering the Italian law. It is too early to assess the possible effect of the "abstention" on the administration of justice but it is not anticipated that the magistracy will allow any serious interference in that.

The attached schedules gives the number of cases disposed of during the month of March by the Special Section of the Court of Assize, and the number of cases pending at 25 March 1947.

The attached schedule sets forth the number and character of cases tried by Allied Military Courts in the Province during the period beginning from 1 March and ending 31 March 1947. The total number of cases tried was 7, two of which were Superior Court cases. The Summary Court cases resulted in convictions and the Superior Court cases were Not Guilty.

2. ITALIAN COURTS

It is too early to assess the possible effect of the "abstention" on the administration of justice but it is anticipated that the magistracy will allow any serious interference in that.

3. GENERAL

A number of cases of theft of Allied property and kindred offences will be tried immediately after Easter by A.M.C. Courts: it is thought that quick trial and deterrent sentences, even if reviewed and reduced very shortly afterwards, will be effective at this stage of Allied occupation in curtailing the activities of those who appear to regard the illegal acquisition of Allied property as a profitable sport or hobby and a means of life.

The Pasquinelli trial at Trieste appears to have aroused great interest, drawing the attention of people not normally involved or interested in Allied Court procedure.

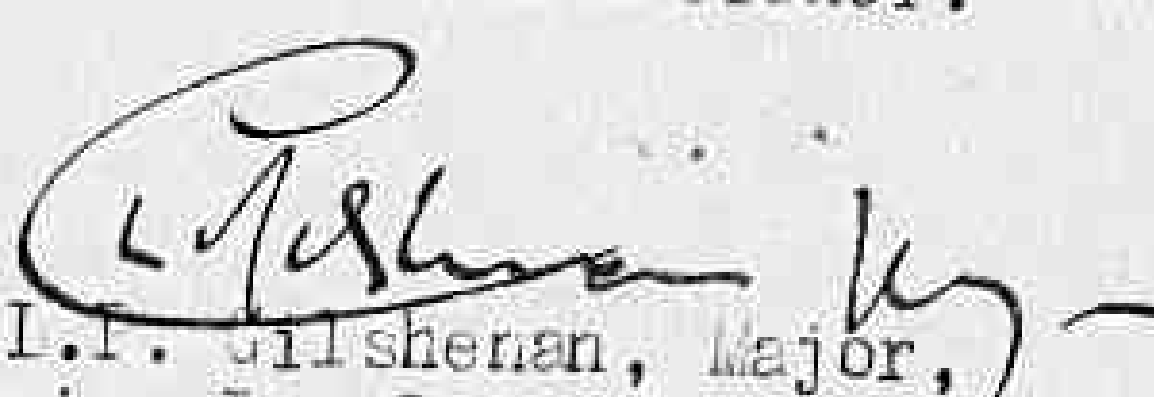

WHEREAS in consequence of the coming into force of

Udine there exists an exceptional shortage of housing accommo-

modification of the said decree hereinafter contained becomes
necessary.

NOW IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS

ARTICLE 1.

Provincial Order No 19 is hereby abrogated.

ARTICLE 2.

The date when any order for possession of a dwelling house or
other building intended for use as a dwelling house within the
meaning of Article 34 of D.L. No 290 of 18/10/46 becomes
effective shall be decided by the Prefect after hearing the
Commissario Rivernativo della Alloggi or the Sindaco in
communes where no such Commission is in being.

ARTICLE 3.

The Prefect of the Province in the exercise of the powers re-
ferred to in Article 2 hereof, shall not be bound by the time
limits set out in the said Legislative Decree No 290 of 18

Subject to the modifications thereof herein contained, the said

AND WHEREAS in all the communes of the Province of Udine there exists an exceptional shortage of housing accommodation in consequence of requisitioning and war damage in the sense of Article One of D.L. No. 280 of 18 October 1946 and the modification of the said decree. Hereinafter contained becomes necessary.

NOW IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS

ARTICLE 1.

Provincial Order No. 19 is hereby abrogated.

ARTICLE 2.

The date when any order for possession of a dwelling house or other building intended for use as a dwelling house within the meaning of Article 31 of L. No. 280 of 18/10/46 becomes effective shall be decided by the Prefect after hearing the Commissario Provinciale degli Affari or the Sindaco in communes where no such Commission is in being.

ARTICLE 3.

The Prefect of the Province, in the exercise of the powers referred to in Article 2 hereof, shall not be bound by the time limits set out in the said Legislative Decree No. 280 of 18 October 1946.

ARTICLE 4.

Subject to the modifications thereof herein contained, the said Decree Legislativo del Cayo Provisorio No. 290 shall remain in full force and effect in the Province of Udine.

ARTICLE 5.

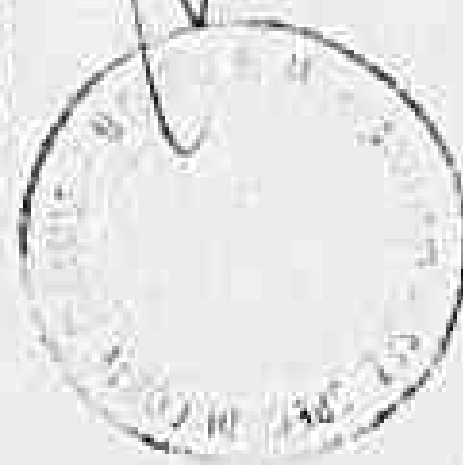

2. ITALIAN COURTS.

The work of the Italian Courts proceeds satisfactorily though there is a heavy list of cases for trial and there are considerable arrears due chiefly to gaps in judicial personnel.

The attached schedule gives the number of cases disposed of during the month by the Special Section of the Court of Assize and the number of cases pending at 25 October 1946. Three death sentences were pronounced by the Special Section of the Court of Assize during the past month as already reported.

3. PROCLAMATIONS AND ORDERS.

War damage, military requisitions and the presence of refugees have caused an acute shortage of living accommodation in Udine and where orders for possession or eviction were made by the Italian Courts many persons liable to be dispossessed thereby were faced with the immediate prospect of being rendered homeless, no alternative accommodation of any kind being available. The Italian Courts in certain cases have power to grant a short postponement and thereafter have no discretion

to prevent the order being put into execution. It is unnecessary to say that if a large number of families had been thrown into the street with no hope of shelter a very serious situation would have arisen. Accordingly after consultation with and at the request of the Italian Judicial Authorities a Provincial Order was published modifying the Italian law and conferring a fairly wide discretion on the Italian Courts.

1. ALLIED MILITARY COURTS

Attached hereto is a schedule setting forth the number and character of cases tried by Allied Military Courts in the Province during the period from 25 January to 25 February 1946. The total number of cases tried were 43. All of these were Summary Court cases. Of the cases tried 3 resulted in acquittal and 40 in convictions. The number of cases tried month by month since the liberation of the Province is as follows: May and June - 143; July - 76; August - 75; September - 34; October - 107; November - 25; December - 28; January - 27; and February - 43.

a. A certain number of cases of minor importance have been transferred to the Italian Courts for trial.

2. ITALIAN COURTS

a. The Italian Courts are working satisfactorily. A session of the Ordinary Court of Assize will sit in Udine Province from 1st to 15th of April to dispose of cases awaiting trial.

b. With regard to the Special Session of the Court of Assize: during the month 26 cases were tried and 40 were dismissed without trial after investigation. At the end of the month the number of cases ready for trial was 40. At the beginning of the period under report the number of prisoners to be dealt with was 184; 12 new arrests have been made during the month.

Attached hereto is a schedule setting forth the number and character of cases tried by Allied Military Courts in the Province during the period from 15 January to 25 February 1946. 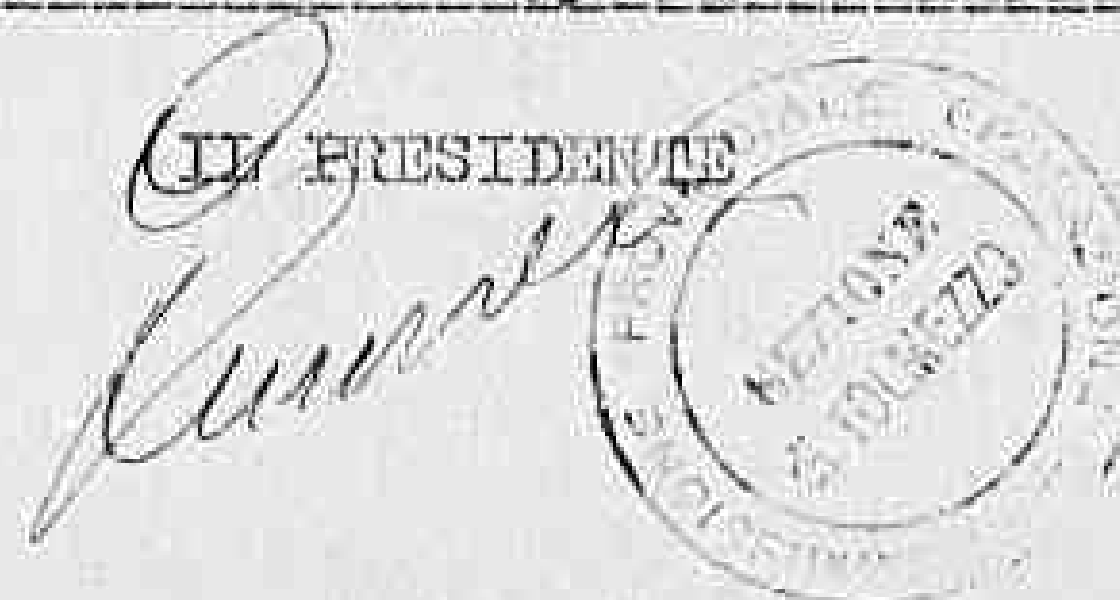

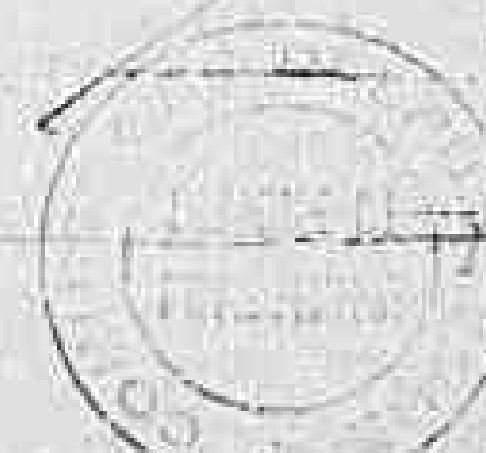

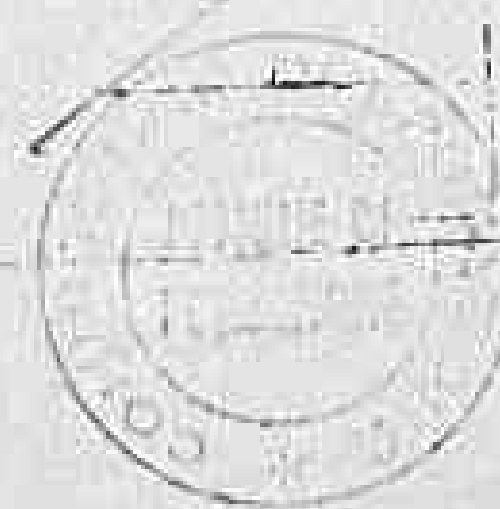

1. ALLIED MILITARY COURTS

Attached hereto is a schedule setting forth the number and character of cases tried by Allied Military Courts in the Province during the period from 25 December to 24 January 1946. The total number of cases tried was 87, of which 18 were Superior Court cases. Of the Superior Court cases tried 2 resulted in acquittal, and 16 in convictions; of the Summary cases, 4 resulted in acquittals and 65 in convictions. The number of cases tried month by month since the liberation of the Province is as follows: May and June - 143; July - 76; August - 75; September - 94; October - 107; November - 85; December 99; January - 87.

Also attached hereto is a statement setting forth the sentences of more than one year imposed by A.M.C. Courts. Five persons received such sentences, all of whom were involved in the armed robbery of an Allied vehicle.

2. ITALIAN COURTS

a. The regular Italian Courts are functioning normally. As previously reported, it is desirable that a session of the Ordinary Court of Assize be held in Udine as soon as possible. A request that such a session be convened was forwarded through A.M.C. channels during the month of December. It is believed that the delay in convening the requested session is due to the scarcity of qualified judicial personnel.

b. Attached hereto is a report for the month ended

1. ALLIED MILITARY COURTS

Attached hereto is a schedule setting forth the number and character of cases tried by Allied Military Courts in the Province during the period from 15 December to 24 January 1946. The total number of cases tried was 87, of which 18 were Superior Court cases. Of the Superior Court cases tried 2 resulted in acquittal, and 16 in convictions; of the Summary cases, 4 resulted in acquittals and 65 in convictions. The number of cases tried month by month since the liberation of the Province is as follows: May and June - 14; July - 7; August - 75; September - 34; October - 107; November - 85; December 99; January - 87.

Also attached hereto is a statement setting forth the sentences of more than one year imposed by A.M.C. Courts. Five persons received such sentences, all of whom were involved in the armed robbery of an Allied vehicle.

2. ITALIAN COURTS

a. The regular Italian Courts are functioning normally. As previously reported, it is desirable that a session of the Ordinary Court of Assize be held in Udine as soon as possible. A request that such a session be convened was forwarded through A.M.C. channels during the month of December. It is believed that the delay in convening the requested session is due to the scarcity of qualified judicial personnel.

b. Attached hereto is a report for the month ended 22 January 1946 of the Special Session of the Court of Assize. During the month, 22 cases were tried and 38 cases were dismissed without trial after investigation. At the end of the month the number of cases ready for

trial was 43. The progress being made by this Court is better than these figures indicate. (The Court is in receipt of a letter of commendation from the Primo Presidente of the Corte d'Appello di Venezia, a copy of which is attached.) A number of the cases tried have been complicated and time consuming. The instruction process has been completed in a sufficient number of cases to occupy the Court through the month of March. Dates of trial have been set for these cases. It now appears that it would be advisable to establish an additional section of the Court in Udine. This matter has been brought to the attention of the Court of Appeals in Venice. However, the scarcity of qualified judicial personnel makes the establishment of such a section difficult.

Repeated requests for more transportation for the Extraordinary Court of Assize have been made to the Prefettura but so far its transportation facilities have not been increased.

At the beginning of the period under report the number of prisoners to be dealt with was 266; 5 new arrests have been made during the month.

3. EPURATION

Attached hereto are two reports for each of the three sections of the Provincial Epuration Commission established under G. O. 35, one prepared upon a cumulative basis from the establishment of the Commission through 24 January, 1945, and the other prepared for the month of January.

On 3 January 1946, instructions were issued to the G. O. 35 Commission, intended to modify its procedure so as to make it consistent with the provisions of the new epuration decree, D.L.I. 702. A copy of these instructions is attached.

4. ELECTORAL LISTS

From the report of the Prefettura for the fortnightly period ended 15 January 1946 it appears that the general

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been completed in a sufficient number of cases to occupy the Court through the month of March. Dates of trial have been set for these cases. It now appears that it would be advisable to establish an additional section of the Court in Udine. This matter has been brought to the attention of the Court of Appeals in Venice. However, the scarcity of qualified judicial personnel makes the establishment of such a section difficult.

Repeated requests for more transportation for the Extraordinary Court of Assize have been made to the Prefettura but so far its transportation facilities have not been increased.

At the beginning of the period under report the number of prisoners to be dealt with was 266; 5 new arrests have been made during the month.

3. EPURATION

Attached hereto are two reports for each of the three sections of the Provincial Epuration Commission established under G. O. 35, one prepared upon a cumulative basis from the establishment of the Commission through 24 January, 1946, and the other prepared for the month of January.

On 3 January 1946, instructions were issued to the G. O. 35 Commission, intended to modify its procedure so as to make it consistent with the provisions of the new epuration decree, D.L.I. 702. A copy of these instructions is attached.

4. ELECTORAL LISTS

From the report of the Prefettura for the fortnightly period ended 15 January 1946 it appears that the general lists of male electors have been completed in 105 communes and the general lists of female electors in 107 communes. The male and female general lists have been approved in 9 communes. The sectional lists have been compiled in 44 communes and approved in five. Five communes are ready

for the election. According to the report of the Prefect the reason for the slowness in the preparation of general lists in all the communes is the failure of the Judicial Record Offices to return the penal certificates required of them. It has been reported in the press that certificates of the local P.S. authorities can be accepted in lieu of formal penal certificates. However, this has not yet been officially confirmed from Rome.

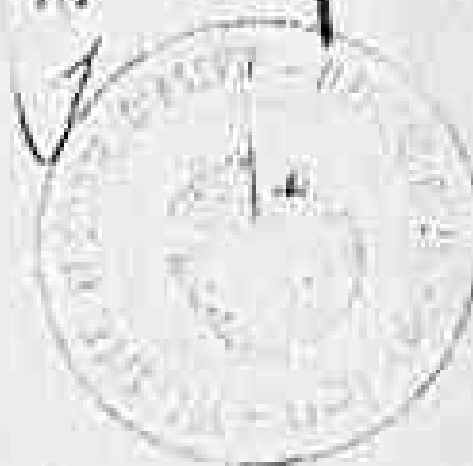

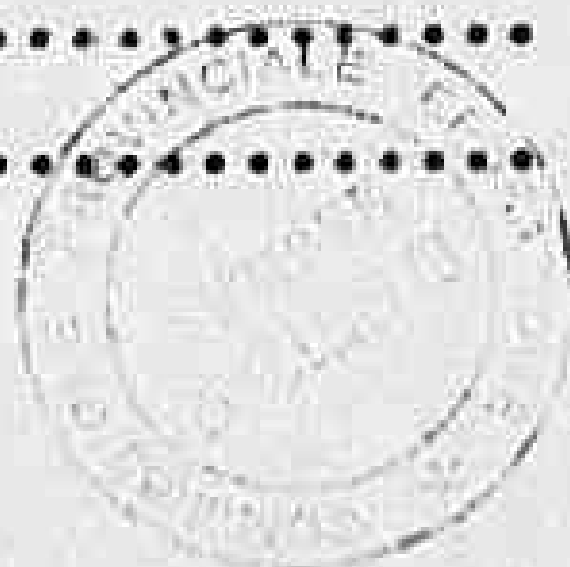

2. In the future, the Provincial Commission under G.O. No. 35 will suspend only persons whom they believe will eventually be dismissed under the provisions of D.I.I. 702.

3. The Commission will immediately re-examine the cases of all suspensions made by it, of officials of grades lower than 7 (except school teachers), and will re-instate all persons not epurable under the provisions of D.I.I. 702. The re-examination of these cases will be conducted in the following manner:

4. The cases of persons in grades 7 and above will be dealt with as in the past, the suspensions already made will stand and the examination of schede will continue.

5. The G.O. No. 35 Commission will immediately hand to the Provincial Delegate of the High Commissioner for sanctions against fascism the schede personali and all other documents relative to all officials of grades 1 through 7 (and all school teachers) who have been suspended; and will in due course hand to the Provincial Delegate the schede personali and other documents relative to all other officials whose suspensions have been re-examined by the G.O. No. 35 Commission and confirmed by it as being epurable under the provisions of D.I.I. 702.

6. In the future, statistical returns will include only officials in grades 1 through 7, school teachers, and those officials of lower grades who are subject to be epurable under D.I.I. 702.

7. It is realised that instructions contained in this letter with respect to school teachers are not consistent with the provisions contained in D.I.I. 702. However, this Headquarters has been specifically instructed by the Headquarters Allied Commission at Rome to transmit these instructions to the G.O. No. 35 Commission.

8. Wherever in this letter reference is made to "officials" of numbered grades, the term "official" is intended to include officials of comparable rank who do not have specific civil service grade.
