To whom it may concern.

We have known Mr. Bruno Forti at Abeto since the beginning of February of this year, when we met him, during our crossing the Apennini Mountains, after our escape from the prisoners camp.

Mr. Forti is a lawyer, born in Trieste, he is an officer of the Italian reserve army, having enlisted for volunteering service during the last war against the German Empire.

Being a trustee for Italy of the British Firm Lassen & Co. R. Kevin Leeper (London, Sunlight Wharf) and chairman of the "Intercontinental" Ltd. in Trieste and of the "Transital" Ltd. in Milan, both international transport and forwarding companies, he was denounced to the "Gestapo" who searched his home and his office in Trieste and seized and confiscated all his estate.

Then he escaped with his family to Abeto.

From October 1943 till June 1944 he was given us a considerable amount of advice and help in work which we have been doing in by German occupied Italy. Among other he kept hidden in his home weapons, ammunitions explosive stuff, confidential documents etc. During and after several round-ups he personally took care for fetching and distributing food and money to the Allied ex P.O.W. scattered amongst the bushes. To this purpose he organized in touch with other agents a collection of money from Rome.

His son Sergio Forti, a naval architect, while on his way to sabotage an object during the German retreat, was shot on the 14th of June 1944. About his achievements and heroic death we wrote a report to Allied Commands.

During the former war Mr. Forti has been entrusted with special political missions in the liberated provinces of Italy, in France, in England and in Denmark.

He knows particularly the political and economical conditions of Trieste and his "Hinterland" and he speaks English, French, German and Spanish.

Therefore we recommend Mr. Forti for any position, which he may be able to fill with the Allied Armies and with Allied Control Commission.




