1. Establishment Memorandum Number 19 dated 1 Nov 45 is no longer effective and is hereby rescinded.
2. Effective immediately, any Division, Sub-Division or office incurring under existing rules, any expenditure with a civilian firm on behalf of the Allied Commission, will be responsible for seeing the matter through to final discharge.
3. All Divisions or Branches will immediately review all bills outstanding either against them or against former Sections or Sub-Commissions for whose work existing Divisions have become responsible. Settlement, where possible, will be made forthwith. In cases where prompt settlement, for any reason, is not possible, the Division or Branch concerned will refer the bill to the Claims and Assessments Board as set up by Executive Memorandum Number 11 dated 6 Jan 47.
4. The Claims and Assessments Board will take final action after due investigation, either to approve or disapprove all such bills.
5. If a bill is approved as a proper charge against the Italian Government, it will be forwarded, with necessary details, to the appropriate Ministry or Agency of the Italian Government.
6. If a bill is approved as a proper charge against AMG/AC funds, the Claims and Assessments Board will prepare a Payment Voucher (Form F/P3A) in duplicate, and will forward it, together with the original bill, to AF for payment.

In order that the duty roster may be administered properly it is essential that in the future all changes of status of personnel i.e. leave, furlough, absent sick, detached service, new arrivals, departures, etc. be reported in writing to the Adjutant at the time of occurrence. (Adj)

IV. DISCHARGE OF CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES:

In view of the necessity for definite reduction in number of civilian employees with the Allied Commission, the following points will be observed by all concerned:

- a. The policy of division heads recommending consideration for retention of discharged personnel to G-1 Civilian Personnel will be discontinued.
- b. No division will engage or transfer from one division to another any civilian employee without the written approval of the Executive Commissioner submitted through the Executive Officer American or British. (Ex Off (A))

SUBJECT: Identification of Welfare Agency Personnel and Vehicles.

TO : ALLIED FORCES HEADQUARTERS,
Air: Deputy Chief of Staff.

1. Reference is made to your unnumbered letter dated 3 December 1946.

2. As directed in your letter a meeting of all concerned in this matter was presided over by me on 10 December 1946. A copy of the minutes of this meeting is enclosed.

3. The following recommendations were agreed:

(i) Personnel

- (a) Any uniforms worn (except for serving service personnel) will be dyed a dark blue colour.
- (b) Uniforms will have an ISARA or AFIO shoulder patch on each shoulder.
- (c) All personnel will carry identity cards with photograph. Specimens of these cards to be furnished to Caserta.

(ii) Vehicles

- (a) A yellow diagonal stripe to be painted diagonally across the radiator and the rear of the vehicle.
- (b) Special number plates to be fitted at front and rear. These to be of yellow background with black letters and figure. Size required to be specified by Italian Government.
- (c) Front and rear bumpers to be painted yellow.
- (d) ISARA silver "Globe" sign to be painted on front doors of ISARA vehicles.
- (e) ISARA and AFIO to furnish Italian Government with list of all their vehicles and numbers to be assigned.

The above scheme was to be subject to the availability of paint.

4. As a result of the undertakings given by the Italian Government and UERRA representatives at this meeting, I have now received communications from both parties setting out the arrangements to be made in order to achieve the purpose desired and I enclose copies of these letters. As regards the letter from UERRA which makes no reference to painting of rear and bumpers, verbal agreement has since been reached on this point. The Italian Government are being informed of the details given by UERRA, and AJEC are being requested to conform as was agreed at the meeting. I am also forwarding to UERRA and AJEC the requirements of the Italian Government.

5. I feel that with the ready co-operation of the Italian Government and the Welfare Agencies concerned to carry out the suggested forms of identification, the likelihood of confusion regarding the proper identification of personnel and vehicles will be eliminated as far as is possible.

6. The arrangements made are considered most satisfactory by the American and British Embassies.

SUBJECT: Identification of vehicles belonging to welfare organizations.

For further clarification of the suspended question in yesterday's meeting, we suggest that the plates to be fixed at the rear of motor vehicles belonging to UNHRA and AJDC should be made of aluminium or other metal, rectangular in shape and 32 centimetres long by 22 wide.

The plates should be painted yellow with two lines of lettering in black. The first line should bear the sign of the organization to which the vehicle belongs (UNHRA - AJDC) and the second line show the registration number.

The lettering should be 8 cm high by 5 cm broad.

The registration numbers should be 9 cm high by 4 cm broad.

UNHRA and AJDC should send to this Ministry two copies of the list of motor vehicles used by them and bearing for each vehicle the following particulars: type of vehicle, engine No., chassis No., plate No.

Any variation of the above should be forwarded in due course.

1. With the ratification of the Peace Treaty, all rights, duties, privileges, and responsibilities of the Allied Forces will cease. Active steps are being taken to secure sufficient rights for the Allied Forces so that evacuation may be completed during the ninety days subsequent to the Peace Treaty ratification.
2. All functions now being performed by the Allied Commission including the Service Sub-Commissions; by ASAI, by AFH, and by ANG must either be terminated or transferred to permanent Civil Authorities prior to the completion of evacuation. It is probable that the full extent and complexity of terminating and transferring of these functions may not be fully known or appreciated at AFHQ. It is therefore desired that each addressee analyze the problems to be solved before his organization may be finally deactivated, and make prompt recommendations to hasten the procedures. It is regretted that no information as to the governmental set-up for Trieste Free State can be given. It will be assumed, however, that the French line will become the international boundaries. When further assumptions are made by addressees in submitting their plans, such assumptions will be clearly stated. When recommendations are made that either the British and United States Embassies, in Rome, assume duties previously performed by the Military Authorities, the views of the respective Embassies will be secured. When such views are not readily available, however, the recommendations will not be delayed.

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3. There is attached hereto an entirely incomplete list detailing a few of the more obvious problems.

4. Certain special instructions on the subject of planning for the rundown of MEIA are being issued separately.

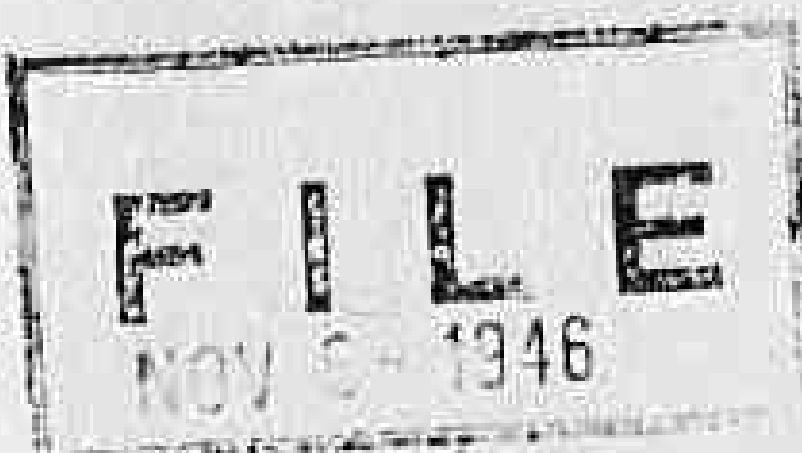

List of obvious problems connected with the liquidation of ACOM/AMG functions.

1. Disposal of funds, records, and effects held by Allied Financial Agency.
2. Maintenance of present AMG Territory. When should shipment of CCLC supplies cease? Who handles those arriving after "R" (Ratification) day, keeping in mind that territory now maintained will be Italian, Yugoslav, and Free Status.
3. Legal. What becomes of records of trials of those undersentenced, considering that those undersentenced will be in Italian, Yugoslav, and Free Territories? What undertaking, if any, will be taken by Italy, Jugoslavia, and Free State to carry out sentences imposed by present courts including AMG Courts?
4. Funds in Venice Giulia. What disposition made of funds now in AMG (so called State Treasury) custody? Presumably the right of AMG to collect or disburse funds, to hire and purchase, and to cover payrolls ceases on R Day, except from national funds provided by the Allies. Therefore, all employees, including public servants, paid from Allied (AMG) funds must be discharged or their pay otherwise obtained.
5. Service Sub-Commissions. You will work on the assumption that these will cease functioning on R day.
6. Liaison with Italian Government. Presumably this will no longer be an Allied function, and each military high command will have direct liaison with the Italian Government only in connection with the rights which may be granted in national agreements, somewhat on the order of the previous Military and Civil Affairs Agreements.
7. Displaced Persons. This subject is under active consideration at all levels and no recommendations need be made in this respect at this time.

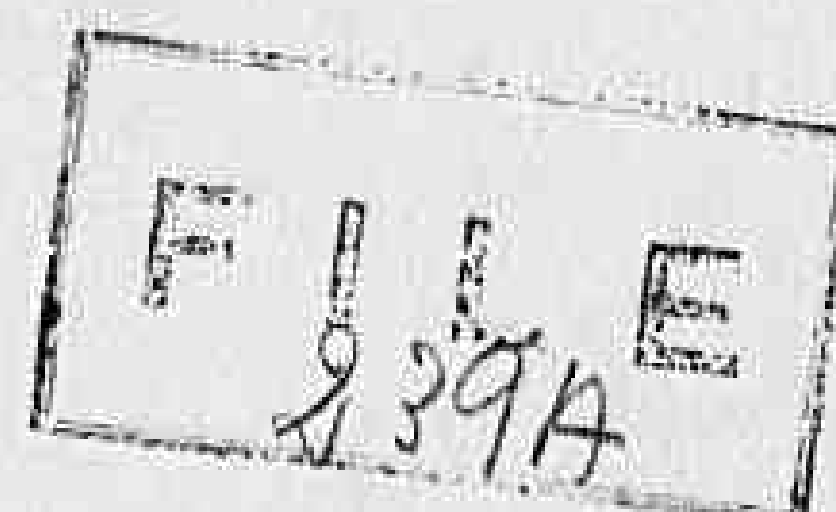

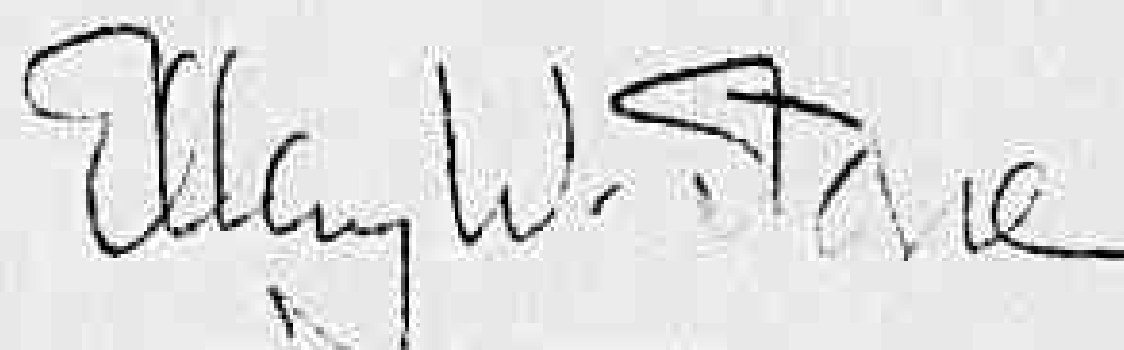

L. The following extract from MTOUSA cable C-51351, dated 29 June 1946, is for information and compliance of all concerned:

"a. Normal procedure in this theater for rations furnished officers is at 75¢ per day deduction for all officers. With the arrival of dependents there will be some officers who will wish to mess separately. An officer desiring to mess separately must submit request for such authorization in quadruplicate to the Major Commander. This request will contain a statement: "I hereby undertake to pay the mess Officer for all meals eaten at the Arms Mess at the rate of 25¢ per meal plus any service charge". If approved such approval will be indicated by indorsement addressed to the Disbursing Officer responsible for paying the officer submitting the request with carbon copies being furnished to Mess Officer and Officer submitting the request respectively. No deduction for rations taken will be made on an officer's pay voucher whose authorization to mess separately has been approved. Request must be effective on first day of month.

b. Mess Officers will not be required to furnish individuals statements of charges. Each officer will be responsible, without notification, for payment of meals furnished.

c. On and after 1 July 1946, enlisted Personnel when approved by competent authority to mess separately, will be paid allowance authorized by Section II, Cir 197, WD 1945. Competent authority is considered to be Major Commander. Occasional meals provided by Army Messes to EM who are authorized to mess separately will be collected in cash by mess Officer at one third the commuted allowance authorized by WD Circulars.

d. Money collected from EM for sale of meals will be handled as prescribed by Par 24, Sec VII, MTOUSA Cir 60, 1946.

e. Orders for leave Tours will state when an EM has been authorized to mess separately so that appropriate special service officer will make cash collection for meals.

f. Sec II, MTOUSA Cir 37, 1945, Sec II MTOUSA Cir 105, 1945, Par 17, Sec VI, MTOUSA Cir 60, 1946 are being rescinded and superceded by appropriate new instructions which will follow.

SUBJECT: Allied Commission Duty Officer

TO : All Concerned

1. The following procedure with regard to Duty Officers is effective 1 July 1946:

a. The functions of the various duty officers (Chief Commissioner's, (MMIA, etc), within the Allied Commission will all be performed by one individual, who will be known as the Staff Duty Officer, Allied Commission. Only one officer and one EM/OR will be on duty for each tour, which will be carried out according to a roster.

b. The Staff Duty Officer's tour and the Assistant Adjutant's duty hours will be coordinated so that an official representative, a commissioned officer or warrant officer is on duty within the headquarters building for 24 hours a day. Each officer will therefore remain at his post until relieved in person by his successor. Delays in reporting for duty will be reported immediately in writing to the Adjutant, Allied Commission.

2. All officers below the rank of Lt Col or equivalent and all EM/OR below the rank of Sgt or equivalent are eligible for duty as Staff Duty Officer and Duty Clerk except Motor Transportation Officer (i.) Major ARTHUR M MCPHAIL, Motor Transportation Officer (B) Major J. S. LYON, Headquarters Company, 2675th Regiment Commanding Officer Capt THOMAS R SWISHER, and Officer in Charge, British Detachment Capt R. V. DUDLEY-CLARKE. Other exemptions from duty will be sanctioned only by the Executive Commissioner, to whom applications should be made in writing through the Executive Officer (A) or (B).

3. Duty rosters will be kept by the Assistant Adjutant, Allied Commission, G-1 (B), G-1 (A), and the Personnel Officers of Navy, Land Forces and Air Forces Sub-Commissions will submit to the Assistant Adjutant each week nominal rolls of all officers and EM/OR assigned or attached to Allied Commission. This procedure is necessary in view of the great reduction in strength of commissioned personnel of the Allied Commission and in order to prevent undue hardship on the part of a few officers.

6. The signal officer will see that the duty operators direct calls to the phones indicated in paragraphs 4, 5 and 7.
7. The Assistant Adjutant, Allied Commission is located in Room 32, 6th Floor, phone Ext. 405 or 429.
8. Each individual concerned will arrange his personal and official affairs so that he reports for posting on time. Once on duty he will not leave his post unless so instructed by the Chief Commissioner or the Executive Commissioner. British officers will arrange with the Head Waiter at the Flora Hotel for a special meal to be provided so that they may report for duty punctually at the time stated. Suitable arrangements will be made by US officers at the Excelsior Hotel. Messing will be completed before going on duty. Bedding will be supplied by the individual going on night duty.
9. Detailed instructions will be kept up to date by the Assistant Adjutant and will be presented to the duty officer at the beginning of his tour.

1. The following is the text of a message received from GHQ, CIP:-

"It is obvious that numbers of reinforcement clerks sufficient to maintain even a reasonable standard of efficiency will not be made available ex UK in future. All are therefore warned that present holders of WO and HCO clerk appointments cannot be replaced from resources other than their own if allowed to proceed on release or P.T.I.O.N.

Although existing training facilities will continue to produce clerks of low grade, only in exceptional circumstances can it be expected to find material suitable to assume supervisory appointments. GHQ are reluctantly compelled to accept necessity for immediate D.O.V. action in respect of WO clerks and HCO clerks in key appointments. Nevertheless these WO's and HCO's will only be D.O.V. in cases where replacements are impossible to find and always on an individual basis".

2. Bearing in mind the fact that the provision of re-inforcements for senior clerks in Allied Commission is now almost impossible, you should consider whether or not it is necessary to initiate D.O.V. action in the case of the clerks serving at your H.Q. or in your Branch. Applications for D.O.V. action will be submitted to G-1(Br) this H.Q. on Appendix 'A' to GHQ Release Instructions 1945. 25

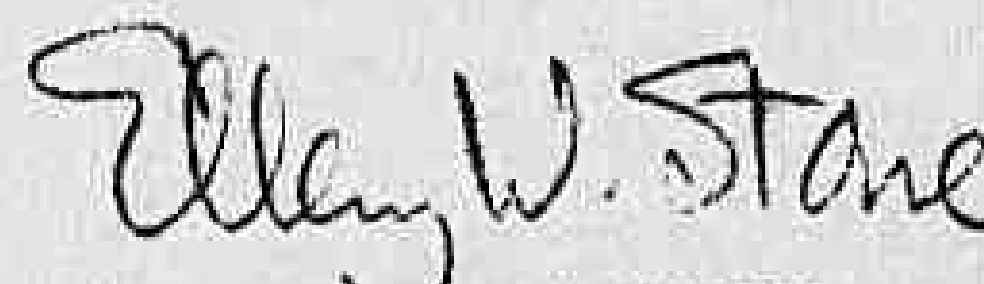

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DCLA Branch deals with all matters pertaining to international Law, Italian Law, interpretation of the Armistice terms and subsequent agreements. This branch advises the Chief Commissioner, Executive Commissioner, the Sub Commissions and Liaison Officers, (individually and in their relations with the opposite Italian Ministries, occasionally the Embassies and regions still under AMG (Udine and Venezia Giulia) in all matters where the activities of the Commissions and other Allied organizations may require a legal interpretation or justification.

All letters from C.C., Ex.C. and Sub Commissions to the Italian Government bearing on the above subjects or requiring legal interpretation of treaties, agreements or other documents are drafted by DCLA branch. Liaison with the Ministry of Justice is the responsibility of DCLA branch.

All Italian legislations which may affect the Armistice terms or Allied interests are also submitted to the DCLA branch by agreement with the Italian Ministry of Justice, for comments.

DCLA is Lt.Col. G.C. Hannaford (B) who is responsible for all the activities of this branch.

Judge Ausgrave Thomas is assistant to the DCLA and deals mostly with routine matters and advice to Sub Commissions on current activities where legal points may be involved.

Major Anthony Nugent (Chief Counsel) also advises Sub Commissions on contracts and other documents which are submitted to him for approval.

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The Legal Sub-Commission is the advisor to the Chief Commissioner and the Allied Commission on questions of International Law, the armistice terms, and Italian law. It administers the Allied Military Government Courts and reviews decisions of serious import. By liaison with the Italian Ministry, the functioning of Italian Courts is safe guarded. It is presently engaged in reconsidering all sentences previously imposed for a term longer than two years by Allied Military Courts.

For administrative purposes, the Deputy Chief Legal Advisor Branch deals with all matters pertaining to international law, Italian law, interpretation of the Armistice terms and subsequent agreements. This branch advises the Chief Commissioner, Executive Commissioner, the Sub-Commission and Liaison Officers, (individually and in their relations with the opposite Italian Ministries) occasionally the Embassies and regions still under AMG (Udine and Venezia Giulia) in all matters where the activities of the Commissions and other Allied organizations may require a legal interpretation or justification.

All letters from C.C., E.C. and Sub-Commission to the Italian Government bearing on the above subjects or requiring legal interpretation of treaties, agreements and other documents are drafted by Deputy Chief Legal Advisor Branch. Liaison with the Ministry of Justice is the responsibility of Deputy Chief Legal Advisor Branch. 21

All Italian legislations which may affect the Armistice terms or Allied interests are also submitted to the Deputy Chief Legal Advisor Branch by agreement with the Italian Ministry of Justice, for comments.

Deputy Chief Legal Advisor is Lt.Col. G.G. HAWKARD (B) who is responsible for all the activities of this Branch.

Judge Musgrave THOMAS is assistant to the Deputy Chief Legal Advisor and deals mostly with routine matters and advice to Sub-Commissions on current activities where legal points may be involved.

Major Anthony NEUMANN (Chief Counsel) also advises Sub-Commissions on contracts and other documents which are submitted to him for approval.

The review of sentences, and the functioning of Military Government and Italian Courts is under the Chief Judicial Officer. Cases from occupied territory wherein sentences by AMG Courts imposing fines of more than 50,000 lire and imprisonment more than two years, as well as all sentences imposed for violation of Italian law, are reviewed by the Chief Judicial Officer. All death penalties are reviewed for the personal consideration of the Chief Commissioner. Any case of novel import may be reviewed by the Chief Judicial Officer. By liaison with the Italian Ministry the functioning of Italian Courts on turned back territory involving cases of Allied interests are carefully watched for neglect or hostility.

Allied Military Courts for the trial of surrendered enemy troops, and for offences in unoccupied territory which concern Allied interests are set up by the Chief Judicial Officer.

At this time all sentences previously imposed for a longer term than two by Allied Military Courts are being carefully reconsidered by a board of officers under the Chief Judicial Officer, and revision made when warranted under all the facts and circumstances.

The Chief Legal Officer and the Chief Judicial Officer is Colonel John K. WEBER (U.S.). He is responsible for the functioning of the Legal Sub-Commission, and performs the duties of Chief Judicial Officer as well. He presides over the trial of cases of serious import when and as the occasion demands.

Major Anthony P. NUGENT is Chief Counsel and a member of the board reviewing sentences imprisonment for more than two years. 20

Major D.D. McCORM is a member of the board reviewing sentences of imprisonment for more than two years. He is presently in Bari presiding over a trial of surrendered enemy troop.

Captain Lester C. BURN is secretary of the Legal Sub-Commission. He is a member of the board reviewing sentences of imprisonment for more than two years.

Lt.Colonel H.J. ATKINSON I.C.D. is attached to Legal Sub-Commission for training. He is a member of the board reviewing sentences of imprisonment for more than two years. Lt.Colonel ATKINSON is a lawyer.

COPE AND CUSTODY OF ALLIED COMMISSION RECORDS.

FUNCTION.

1. The function of the Archives Branch of the Office of the Executive Commissioner is to collect, arrange, index, safeguard and store records of Allied Commission (both Headquarters and field) in a manner most suitable for reference.

REVIEW.

2. All Offices of Headquarters A.C. will constantly review their current files with a view to sending those not essential for current work to Archives. Such files will always be available to the office concerned.

3. All offices will keep papers relating to questions of policy on special files. Action or Routine documents will not be filed in Policy Files, but will be transferred to Archives when they have not been required for use for three months. If the subject of such a transferred file revives and reference to previous correspondence is unnecessary, a continuation cover under the original number may be opened.

DUPLICATES. 4. No correspondence or documents will be destroyed other than duplicates of printed matter, copies of which are in the appropriate file.

DIRECTIVES. 5. Reference files containing only directives, orders or similar circulars which originated in other offices will NOT be sent to Archives. Archives Branch will see that the record copy of such documents is on the appropriate file of the originator.

TRANSFER.

6. Where any offices are amalgamated or absorbed or any functions are transferred to another office, policy files may be retained as long as necessary. Action and routine files will be dealt with as follows:-

a. If it appears that the matter in action will be closed within two or three weeks, that particular action will be concluded on and under the reference number of the original file, altered only by the substitution of the identifying letters of the new office.

IT IS OF THE UTMOST IMPORTANCE that contact be made with Archives Branch before an Office or Branch closes or is absorbed, so that an Archives representative can call at that Office to discuss any questions relating to this procedure.

CLOSING
FILES.

8. In no circumstances will files or individual papers be transferred to any outside body. Any files which are temporarily essential to the efficient working of an outside body may be loaned to such a body for a period not exceeding three months. The Officer borrowing the files will receive a list of these and will forward this to the Archivist who will take steps to see these are returned on the stated date. (see Exhibit "A" attached)

9. Lists in quadruplicate (see Exhibit "B" attached) will be prepared by the sender showing by number and title all files transferred to Archives. 10. Files transmitted to Archives will be securely tied in bundles not exceeding 12" in height. Files from different offices or branches will not be included in the same bundle. Those to be transported to Headquarters will be securely crated; each crate containing a list of contents for checking.

PAYMENT FOR AIR TRAVEL WITH MATS AND ATC OF NATIONALS

1. Instructions have been received that in future (a) the transport by MATS or ATC of nationals of countries receiving lend-lease facilities will be charged against lend-lease account, and (b) the transport of nationals/countries not receiving lend-lease will be paid for in cash.
2. AC is not concerned with the accounting for the transport referred to in 1 (a) above, which will be handled by the U.S. transport agencies concerned.
3. With regard to 1 (b), the individuals to be transported fall under two categories, (a) individuals whose travel orders are not obtained by AC, and (b) individuals whose travel is sponsored and travel orders issued by AC, (e. g. Italians travelling on AC business, or nationals of countries not receiving lend-lease transported by Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission).
4. AC is not concerned with the procedure for the transport referred to in 3 (a), as payment of the transport charges will be made by the agency sponsoring the travel.
5. With regard to 3 (b), namely nationals of countries not receiving lend-lease whose travel is sponsored and whose travel orders are made out by AC, the payment of the transport charges will be made by AC. The procedure will be as follows:-

(a) Establishment Section, Regional Executive Officer or other Office or Officer responsible for issuing the travel order will give the individual for whom the ticket is required an outline copy of the

(b) The traveller will present this extra copy of the travel orders to the Headquarters Commandant or Regional Headquarters Sub-Accountant. The latter will pay over the price of the ticket as shown on the copy of the travel orders, which he will retain as a supporting document to his cash book.

(c) The Sub-Accountant issuing the funds will charge the payment to "Air transport paid for nationals of countries not receiving lend-lease".
