Now, therefore, I, MAURICE STANLEY LUSH, C. B. E., M. C., Brigadier, Executive Commissioner, Allied Control Commission, hereby Order as follows:

1. Reference is made to Article III of General Order No.2 relating to access to safe deposit facilities.

2. For some time the Finance Sub-Commission HQ has been considering a change in the present system, under which access to safe deposit boxes was allowed in Military Government territory only in the presence of an AMG representative. The Combined Chiefs of Staff have now given their approval to the recommendation that only the opening of those boxes belonging to persons whose accounts or boxes have been blocked by AMG order need be supervised by an AMG representative. Access to all other boxes is to be free.

3. In view of the fact that the former policy in dealing with safe deposit boxes is embodied in General Order No.2 it will be necessary formally to amend such General Order. It is proposed to substitute for the present Article III the following :

Whereas by Proclamation No. 4 of the Commander in Chief Allied Armies in Italy and Military Governor, a general moratorium was declared, and the Chief Commissioner was given power by Order to suspend the said moratorium in respect of any obligations

Now, therefore, I, MARIO SPERI RUST, C.A.B., M.C., Brigadier, Executive Commissioner, Allied Control Commission, hereby Order as follows:

ARTICLE I

PAYMENT OF TAXES AND MONETS

All national, provincial and municipal taxes and incuse payable in the occupied territory shall continue to be paid promptly by the inhabitants as the same fall due, and all arrears of such taxes and revenue shall be paid forthwith.

ARTICLE II

COLLECTION AND ADMINISTRATION OF PUBLIC MONETS

Every person engaged in the collection or administration of public monets in the occupied territory, except such officials as are removed, will continue in the performance of his duties subject to the direction of the Allied Military Government.

ARTICLE III

ARTICLE III

- A. Until further notice, all payments of all imposts and taxes will hereafter be made only in cash and will not be paid in postal money orders, bank cheques, or coupons of government bonds of any kind.
- B. A person having funds on deposit in a bank in ITALY may authorize the bank to pay over in cash directly to all official tax collectors ~~monies~~ amounts for payment of taxes, and taxes are authorized to comply with such directions.
- C. Rentiers (tax collectors) having funds on deposit in a bank in ITALY may direct the bank to pay over in cash directly to ITALIAN PROVINCIAL accounts for payment of taxes, and banks are authorized to comply with such directions.

ARTICLE IV

STATE'S CONTRIBUTIONS

The payment of state contributions is abrogated.

ARTICLE V

OFFICES

No person shall:

- A. Wilfully refuse or neglect to pay any tax or other monies due or becoming due by him in respect of any taxes or revenue mentioned in Article I, when he shall have the means to pay the same;
- B. Wilfully refuse or neglect to perform any duties in regard to the collection or administration of public monies or fail or neglect to obey the directions of the Allied Military Government;
- C. Be in possession of or having under his control any book, ledger, receipt or other document relating to the collection or administration of public monies, destroy, make away with or lose by neglect, any such document so as to deprive the Allied Military Government of the use thereof; or
- D. Do any act or thing to deprive the Allied Military Government of the use or benefit of any public monies.

ARTICLE VI

PENALTIES

Any person committing any offense under this Order or otherwise violating any of the provisions hereof shall, upon conviction by an Allied Military Court, be liable to punishment by imprisonment or fine, or both, as the Court may determine.
