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


GENERAL ORDER No. 29 (REVISED)

DECLARATION OF ESSENTIAL SUPPLIES AND FIXING OF PRICES

I, ELLERY W. STONE, Rear Admiral, USNR, for and on behalf of the Supreme Allied Commander and Military Governor, hereby order as follows:

ARTICLE I.

General Order No. 29 of 26 August 1944 is hereby repealed.

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ARTICLE II. — **Declarations**

SECTION 1. — Any person, company or association owning or controlling any commodity specified in Article IV hereof in excess of the quantity shown therein shall, thirty days after the effective date of this Order, make a declaration in writing of their entire stocks as of the date of such declaration to the officer of the Allied Military Government having jurisdiction over the area within which owners or controllers possess such stocks or the agency designated by such officer.

SECTION 2. — Upon the first day of each succeeding month, such owners or controllers shall make a like declaration only if changes or alterations in their stocks have occurred subsequent to the initial declaration referred to in Section 1 of this Article.

SECTION 3. — All such declarations shall bear the name and present address of the legal owner of the commodities declared and shall bear the signature or thumbprint and address of the person making the declaration.

ARTICLE VI. — Further Orders and Notices

Notices or Orders will from time to time be issued by the Allied Military Government revising the list of commodities referred to in Article IV hereof, and the ration scales, maximum prices, charges and other provisions referred to in Article V hereof. Such further Orders or Notices shall be deemed to have the effect of amending this Order to the extent applicable and any violation of this Order so amended shall be punishable in the same manner as a violation of this Order.

ARTICLE VII. — Penalties

Any person violating the provisions of this Order shall upon conviction by an Allied Military Court be liable to imprisonment or fine, or both, as the Court may determine, and any property in respect of which such an offence has been committed may be ordered to be forfeited.

ARTICLE VIII. — Conflicting legislation

Any and all provisions of Italian Law or Orders of the Allied Military Government inconsistent or in conflict with the within Order are hereby repealed, provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to abrogate or nullify any of the provisions of General Order No. 26 ("Consignment of wheat and barley produced in 1944 to Pec Granaries") or of the corresponding Ministerial Decree of the Italian Government dated 2 May 1944.

ARTICLE IX. — Effective date

This Order shall become operative in each Province or part thereof within the occupied territory on the date of its first publication therein.

Any person violating the provisions of this Order shall upon conviction by an Allied Military Court be liable to imprisonment or fine, or both, as the Court may determine, and any property in respect of which such an offence has been committed may be ordered to be forfeited.

ARTICLE VII. — Conflicting legislation

Any and all provisions of Italian Law or Orders of the Allied Military Government inconsistent or in conflict with the within Order are hereby repealed, provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to abrogate or nullify any of the provisions of General Order No. 26 ("Complaint of Wheat and Barley produced in 1944 to People's Granaries") or of the corresponding Ministerial Decree of the Italian Government dated 2 May 1944.

ARTICLE VIII. — Effective date

This Order shall become operative in each Province or part thereof within the occupied territories on the date of its first publication therein.

1. In reply to your R5/511/26 of 12 April 45 it is thought that the working of General Order No. 29 (Revised) leaves no possible room for doubt as to correct interpretation.

2. Art. I of that order repeals in toto General Order No. 29 and therefore repeals any provisions included in Art. III of that order. Obviously, therefore, Section 3 of Art. IV of the revised order does not apply to the older order which has been repealed.

3. If you desire a full list of the "existing regulations" pertaining to commodities not listed in Section 2 of Art. IV of the revised order, you can no doubt obtain these from Commerce Sub-Commission. However, by way of illustration, I shall draw your attention to the Ministerial Decree of 21 October 1944 appearing in Gazzetta Ufficiale No. 78 which has been implemented in AMG Territory and which confers upon the Italian Government control of certain materials.

4. It is understood that this opinion was not that which was tentatively put forward by Lt. Col. Thackrah on his recent visit to your Hq. but there can be no doubt that this is the correct interpretation of the order.

It is not clear whether the expression 'existing regulations' includes the provisions of Art III of old General Order No 29 so far as they affect commodities not listed in new art IV (2) or whether what is meant is any existing local regulations. If the former one would have expected there to have been some saving expression in the clause repealing the old Order. This matter, which is of considerable interest to the Army Authorities, was discussed with Lt Col Thackrah when he called yesterday and he suggested that it be officially put up to Headquarters for a ruling. May I be favoured with your views please ?

I, ELLERY W. STONE, Rear Admiral, USNR, for and on behalf of the Supreme Allied Commander and Military Governor, hereby order as follows:

SECTION 1--Any person, company or association owning or controlling any commodity specified in Article IV hereof in excess of the quantity shown therein shall, thirty days after the effective date of this Order, make a declaration in writing of their entire stocks as of the date of such declaration to the officer of the Allied Military Government having jurisdiction over the area within which owners or controllers possess such stocks or the agency designated by such officer.

SECTION 2--Upon the first day of each succeeding month, such owners or controllers shall make a like declaration only if purchases or alterations of their stocks have occurred subsequent to the initial declaration referred to in Section 1 of this Article.

SECTION 3--All such declarations shall bear the name and present address of the legal owner of the commodities declared and shall bear the signature or thumbprint and address of the person making the declaration.

ARTICLE III

DEFINITION OF TERMS

For the purpose of making declarations, the person, company or association in possession of any premises or land shall be deemed to be in control of all commodities thereon.

ARTICLE IV

PROHIBITION AGAINST REMOVAL AND TRANSFER OF CERTAIN COMMODITIES

SECTION 1--From and after the effective date of this Order, no person, company or association owning any of the commodities listed in Section 2 of this Article in excess of the quantity specified therein, or listed in any Order or Notice hereafter issued, shall remove, sell, exchange or transfer any such articles without the permission in writing of the officer of the Allied Military Government referred to in Article I hereof or his duly authorized agent.

ARTICLE VI

NOTICES, ORDERS AND NOTICES

Notices or orders will from time to time be issued by the Allied Military Government revising the list of commodities referred to in Article IV hereof, and the ration scales, maximum prices, charges and other provisions referred to in Article V hereof. Such further orders or notices shall be deemed to have the effect of amending this Order to the extent applicable and violation of this Order so amended shall be punishable in the same manner as a violation of this Order.

ARTICLE VII

Any person violating the provisions of this Order shall upon conviction by an Allied Military Court be liable to imprisonment on pain, at both, as the case may be, of death, and such an offence shall be deemed to be a felony.

ARTICLE VIII

PENALTIES

Any person violating the provisions of this Order shall upon conviction by an allied military court be liable to imprisonment or fine, or both, as the Court may determine, and may moreover in respect of which such an offence has been committed may be ordered to be fined.

ARTICLE IX

COMPLIANCE INHIBITION

Any and all provisions of Italian law or orders of the allied military Government inconsistent or in conflict with this Order are hereby repealed, provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to abrogate or nullify any of the provisions of General Order No. 26 ("Consignment of meat and barley produced in 1944 to recycle's Granaries") or of the corresponding Ministerial Decree of the Italian Government dated 2 May 1944.

(Attn. Lt.Col. Reiter.)

1. Reference your letter PIE/3/GEN/27 dated 5 Dec. 44.
2. The question of applicability of General Order N° 29 to Piemonte Region (or any other Region) when the Regional Officers take over, can relate only to the period when the Region is AMG territory because:

- (a) General Order N° 29 is not acceptable in Army territory where materials are blocked and released in accordance with operational requirements.
- (b) It is an AMG order and, therefore, not applicable to Italian Government territory.

3. The terms of G.o. N° 29 are obsolete in so far as concerns NON-SUBSISTENCE materials for the following reasons:-

- (a) The list of AFLRS controlled materials has been shortened and, therefore, certain items detailed on the order are redundant.
- (b) Certain materials have become "Restricted" and these are not included in the order.
- (c) Certain materials are controlled by the Italian Government even in AMG territory, since the ^{MUNICIPAL} Decree of 20 Oct 44 giving them such control, was implemented in AMG territory in the Gazzetta Ufficiale N° 78. Such Italian controlled materials do not appear

- 2 -

on the list of materials detailed on G.O. N° 29.

4. The Decree referred to in sub-para 3 (c) above provides for the blocking and reporting of the various categories of controlled and restricted materials mentioned in sub-para 3 (a) (b) and (c). The Decree also details the channels through which the blocking and reporting shall be done, namely the Uffici Provinciali dell'Industria e Commercio (U.P.I.C.). These U.P.I.C. have been legalized by Decree N° 315, shortly to be implemented in AMG territory. All Regions have received copies of Decree N° 315 and have been urged to lose no time, once they are on the ground, in setting up these U.P.I.C.-

5. Consideration of the above will show that all the purposes for which G.O. N° 29 was drawn up in so far as relates to NON-SUBSISTENCE materials will be achieved by the Decrees mentioned in para 4 above, and further that machinery for handling the work entailed is provided for at the same time. For these reasons it is considered that G.O. N° 29 so far as NON-SUBSISTENCE materials are concerned is redundant and not applicable to Piemonte or other Regions yet to be taken over.

6. It is emphasized that the above comments refer to G.O. N° 29 only in so far as it concerns non-subsistence materials, as this Sub-Commission does not exercise control over the blocking and reporting of Food.





III, Sec 2. References to "wheat" were added in wording not easily understandable. The subject "wheat", because of various other orders and decrees on this subject is a controversial one and before any reference should be made to it in general orders, such as No. 29, it would necessitate a research to avoid conflict.

3. From the RC & MG Section I understand the change was made in the Economic Section. How much the RC & MG Section knew of the change before submitting the order with my certificate to Brigadier Lush, I cannot say.

4. In view of the foregoing, after the alteration was discovered, the General Order was sent back to the RC & MG Section with comment. I have heard nothing more about it and do not know whether the order is being printed or merely reconsidered.

5. You are familiar with the letter I wrote to the Executive Commissioner advising him of the alteration unauthorised by me after I had given my certificate. I have had no reply to that and none is required.

3. Your letter 28 June 1944 (ref ACC/5021/1c) failed to indicate that the required declaration applied only when stocks were held in excess of the amount specified. We have so provided in the new draft, and have further amended Article I as requested.

4. We have not been able to follow the suggestion contained in Para 4 of your letter (above) with respect to the use of the phrase "and permissible stocks". This follows because all stocks are "permissible". The only prohibition is against transfer, removal etc. thereof.

5. Attached to Order is certificate of the Acting Chief Legal Officer. If you find that the Order meets with your approval, the same may be presented by you to the Executive Commissioner for signature. The IC & MG Section will then direct the translation, printing and distribution thereof. 1. We refer to your ACC/4074/2/L, and, after consultation with the Food Subcommission and Agriculture Subcommission, now forward our comments thereon which carry the approval of the two subcommissions above referred to.

2. Article I, Section 1. We suggest that the period for making a declaration shall be extended from 15 to 30 days. We further would like the Section re-drafted so as to make it obligatory to declare on the first day of each month any alterations in the stocks originally declared, thus obviating the necessity for a monthly return in cases where there has been no change in the position.

3. Article IV, Section 1. After the words "owning any," we would like inserted, "amounts of the commodities listed in Section 2 of this article in excess of the quantities specified in the schedule hereto, or listed", etc.

4. Article IV, Section 2 we wish revised as follows:

RE: The Revised General Order (Declaration of Essential Supplies and Fixing of Prices).

Economic Section, HQ., ACC.

1. I enclose a copy of the revised General Order.

2. I have your attention on the following points:

(a) Art. IV of this order at the request of Col. Vass and Col. Long requires a complete publication in Italian, etc., of the conditions therein according to which participation in the economy, etc., of the communities through which the Italian population may be concentrated shall be left to each community on its own power as far as in that case to limit no liability on the part of a certain number of the units in that locality. Order No. 5, I consider the responsibility of this without the following being given power to inflict the regulations.

(b) The requirements as to publications contained in Art. 3 seem to define the nature of an economy large starting small in regular publications of some kind. But the reason mentioned in para (a) is not a limitation of some kind. Nor the reason mentioned in para (b) is not that there will always be every possibility because small units do not have the time available, however, that the reason of paper is used for printing the rules of discrimination.

(c) The question as to the limit of 15 days in Art. 3 is considerable in view of the fact that the large enterprises that will be affected by existing discriminations will be considerably less than 15 days for making adjustments. It is also possible that such units would regularly to comply with the order. It is also possible that the financial plan of concessions required to obtain permits from Art. 15 the exercise of their functions may be considerable.

(d) Art. IV contains reference to what are other agricultural authorities (in the request of Col. Long) but this would appear to cut across the policy not discerned by the Italian Government at the request of the Agricultural Economic section. Will you please advise with them.

(e) Art. IV also contains reference to a long number of materials and it is in front the current local Warboard Board list. You will recall that the local Warboard Board lists of such as legal form in my part of Italy (either Military Government or Italian Government territory) will be liable to receive strict out of the list remaining things in connection with the draft General Order only relating to Military Government territory, of course.

(f) As far as is known to you, from whom the Italian Government has no discriminatory laws to change the same law in Italian Government

(h) It is added for your information that so far as is known nothing on the lines of G.O. No. 5 itself was issued in Italy though it is possible that Region 3 may have issued some Regional Order thereon.

i. In the light of the foregoing your early consideration of the above draft is requested. If you approve of the draft in principle or have any comments to make in detail, please let me know as soon as possible.

SUBJECT: Revision of General Orders.

TO : Legal Sub-Commission.

1. This refers to discussion on 10 May concerning revision of general orders.

2. Attached is a note of items for inclusion in the proposed general order concerning amassing of wheat and barley. There are two suggested appendices, A concerning prices and B concerning retentions. Schedule B presents considerable difficulty. It would be much simpler to use Article III of the Decree of 2 May in its entity and that would be much more complete in definition of persons entitled to retentions. If you think Article III is not too lengthy perhaps it could be included as Schedule B.

3. When you have had an opportunity of studying these papers I should be glad to discuss with you any points arising.

4. In so far as a revised edition of General Order No. V is concerned we do not think that Agriculture Sub-Commission need be involved. We hope eventually to tie up control of all products up to the Ammasso by the Decree of 2 May and further control measures. We consider that thereafter it is a matter for Food and other Sub-Commissions.

The title of the order would be the "Granaries of the People."

The main purpose of the order will be to bring into effect immediately the principal clauses of the Ministerial Decree of the 2nd May 1944 which deals with regulations for the collection of wheat and barley. It will also deal with the price to be paid to the producer for wheat and barley.

The order should state that ALL wheat and barley should be delivered to the "Granaries of the People" with the exception of retentions permitted under Schedule B. It should state also that all products delivered should be paid for immediately at the prices indicated in Schedule A. The permitted retentions for family consumption and for seedings should be outlined in abbreviated form in Appendix B. The order should make clear that no one person shall be entitled to more than one retention.

No wheat or barley retentions are authorized for animal feed. Farmers should be told to go to the offices of the Sindaci to study the full details of the decree of 2nd May 1944.

It should be stated that further orders and decrees may be issued from time to time regulating or controlling other farm products.

One article of the decree should state that the Consorzio Agrario is empowered to continue its functions in connection with collecting and storing of wheat and barley and is the sole agency authorized for such collections.

Any person failing to obey the provisions of this order will, on conviction by an Allied Military Court, be liable to imprisonment or a fine or both and any goods forming the subject of such a conviction may be confiscated.

The order will become operative in each Province or part thereof as it is occupied by the Allies as the intention is that the Ministerial decree will be applicable to all territories of occupied Italy.

2. "Article 2, Section 1, Any person, company or association owning or controlling any commodity specified in Article 5, shall fifteen days after the date of this order and thereafter upon the first day each month, make a declaration in writing of their stocks to the Civil Affairs Officer Having Jurisdiction over the area within which owners or controllers possess such stocks or to the agency designated by such Officer.

Section 2. All such declarations shall bear the name and present address of the legal owner of the commodities declared and shall bear the signature or thumb-print and address of the person making the declaration."

3. General Order No. 5(revised) Article 5, to be amended as follows: "Article 5, Section 1. From and after the date of this order, no person, company or association owning any of the commodities listed in Section 2 of this Article shall remove, sell, exchange or transfer any such articles without the permission in writing of the Civil Affairs Officer referred to in Article 12 hereof or his duly authorised agent. 4

MEMORANDUM OF MEETING WITH ECONOMIC SECTION AND REPRESENTATIVES OF SUB-COMMISSION CONCERNED WITH REVISION AND CONSOLIDATION OF GENERAL ORDERS.

The conclusions reached:

1. The following General Orders or portions thereof will in no case be duplicated:
 - a. Title I of General Order 5 (Italy) having to do with wage adjustments;
 - b. Art. 3 of General Order 3 (Sicily) having to do with claims for refund;
 - c. All of General Order 14 (Sicily) having to do with temporary wage adjustments;
2. Agriculture seemed very much concerned as between the need of function of General Orders and the proposed new Italian decrees. They apparently have some idea that pending the publication of the latter, they can function through administrative orders. We are, however, promised prompt report as to their wishes in the premises.
3. Colonel Evans is to inform us not later than Monday as to the wishes of his sub-commission as to particular emphasis on declaration of commodities and the prohibition against removal or transfer of special commodities.
4. Labor Sub-Commission apparently desires incorporated in new General Orders only the substance of Title 2 of General Order 5 (Italy) having to do with the abolition of certain fascist institutions, creation of labor offices, etc.

5. We should get special consideration to the effect in the case of Agriculture in particular of Article 7 of General Order No. 5 (revised Sicily) reading as follows:

"The provisions of this General Order are in addition to the provisions of Italian law relative to the "amassing; holding or otherwise utilizing" assets and do not supersede or otherwise

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2. Agriculture seemed very much confused as between the need of function of General Orders and the proposed new Italian decree. They apparently have some idea that pending the publication of the latter, they can function through administrative orders. We are, however, promised prompt report as to their wishes in the premises.

5. We should get special consideration to the effect in the case of Agriculture in particular of Article 7 of General Order No. 5 (revised (sic) Italy) reading as follows:

"The provisions of this General Order are in addition to the provisions of Italian Law relative to the 'amassing,' holding or sale of' any such commodities and do not supersede or otherwise affect the same."

6. It was decided that because of the complicated nature of the subject the wages of merchant seamen and other shipping employees would not be covered by General Orders.

7. So far as price fixing and wages, rationing, schedule of charges for commercial services, rates for public utilities, rationing of electric power, rates of transportation and the like are concerned, the state of the thinking of the sub-commissions was so fluid, to put it kindly, that it would seem desirable if General Orders on the subject are to be published shortly or six months merely to provide therein in substance that any violation of ceilings or limitations placed upon the foregoing by subsequent orders of Allied Military Government, shall be punishable, etc. In that connection it will seem expedient to provide for the nature and character of the publication of such subsequent orders. It is doubtful how any designated place of posting could be specified since our prime interest in connection with the new General Orders, in the first instance, will be the forward areas and any building so designated might be destroyed.
