Provincial orders have been published in each Province EMILIA cancelling provisions of Proclamation 3, Article 1, Sections 1 and 2 requiring declaration of radio receiving sets etc, the whole of Article 2, Section 2, and so much of Article 4, Section 1 as forbids theatrical and moving picture performances. No further general order required. This HQ has never received authority to cancel restrictions of Proclamation 3, Article 2 relating to photography or Article 3 relating to printed matter. Advise whether latter restrictions have been cancelled. If cancelled recommend notification to civilian population by Provincial Order.

GENERAL ORDER NO. 45

MODIFICATION OF POLICE AND SECURITY REGULATIONS

I, ELLERY WHEELER STONE, Rear Admiral, United States Naval Reserve, Chief Civil Affairs Officer, for and on behalf of the Supreme Allied Commander and Military Governor, hereby order as follows:

ARTICLE I
RADIO RECEIVING SETS

Until further notice of the Allied Military Government, no person shall be required to declare the possession of any radio or wireless receiving set, or of any equipment, part, accessory or material used in connection with wireless reception, or of any private telephone wire or telegraph wire, or of any carrier pigeon. Possession of such items without declaration may lawfully be had until further notice of the Allied Military Government.

ARTICLE II
PHOTOGRAPHY

1) Permission is hereby granted for the taking of photographs and the developing and printing of photographic films and plates save and except that it is expressly forbidden to take any photograph whether by still or cine or other type of camera of:

- a) any Naval, Military or Air Force installation or any equipment of the Allied Forces; or
- b) any vessel of war or any vessel engaged in the transportation of supplies or personnel.

2) Until further notice of the Allied Military Government, no person shall be required to declare the ownership or possession of any camera, telescope, binoculars or photographic supplies.

ARTICLE III
PRINTED MATTER

Permission is hereby granted for the importation into and exportation out of Occupied Territory of newspapers, magazines, books and other printed matter.

ARTICLE IV
BLACKOUT

Until further notice of the Allied Military Government the existing laws and regulations relating to "Blackout" are hereby suspended.

ARTICLE V

This Order applies to all territory subject to Allied Military Government except the Provinces of POLA, FIUME, TRIESTE, GORIZIA and UDINE.

ARTICLE VI

This Order shall come into effect in any province or part thereof on the date of its first posting therein.

La denuncia del possesso di tali articoli non è preesclusiva fino a nuovo ordine da parte del Governo Militare Alleato, non c'è prescrizione.

ARTICOLO II
FOTOGRAFIA

1. Con la presente si concede l'autorizzazione a prendere fotografie, a sviluppare e a stampare pellicole e lastre fotografiche, fatte salve ed eccezionalmente il divieto di prendere qualsiasi fotografia sia con macchine fotografiche che cinematografiche o di qualsiasi altro tipo, di:

a) qualsiasi installazione o apparato Navale, Militare o Aeromutuo delle Forze Alleate; o

b) qualsiasi nave da guerra o altra nave adibita al trasporto di rifornimenti e di uomini.

REGULATIONS ON SECURITY INSTALLATIONS

I, General Headquarters, Rear Admiral, United States Naval Reserve,
Chief Civil Affairs Officer, for and on behalf of the Supreme Allied Com-
mander and Military Governor, hereby order as follows:

ARTICLE I

RADIO RECEIVING SITES

Until further notice of the Allied Military Government, no person
shall be required to declare the possession of any radio or wireless receiving
set, or any equipment, part, accessory or material used in connection with
wireless reception, or my private telephone wire or telegraph wire, or any
carrier pigeon and possession thereof without such declaration may lawfully
be had.

ARTICLE II

PHOTOGRAPHY

1) Permission is hereby granted for the taking of photographs and the
developing and printing of photographic films and plates and except
that it is expressly forbidden to take any photograph whether by still or
cine or other type of camera of:

- a) any naval, military or air force installation or any equipment
of the allied forces; or
 - b) any vessel or any vessel engaged in the transportation
of supplies or personnel.
- 2) Until further notice of the Allied Military Government, no person
shall be required to declare the ownership or possession of any camera,
telescope binoculars or photographic supplies.

ARTICLE III

PRINTED MATTER

permission is hereby granted for the importation into and exportation
of printed matter, magazines, books and other printed

PHOTOGRAPHY

1. Permission is hereby granted for the taking of photographs and the enveloping and printing of photographic film and plates used except that it is expressly forbidden to take any photograph whether by still or cine or other type of camera of:

- a) any Naval, Military or Air Force installation or any equipment of the Allied Forces; or
 - b) any vessel or aircraft engaged in the transportation of supplies or personnel.
- 2) Until further notice of the Allied Military Government, no person shall be required to declare the ownership or possession of any uncorrected telescope binoculars or photographic supplies.

ARTICLE III

SEARCHED MATERIALIZED

Permit is hereby granted for the importation into and exportation out of Occupied territory of newspapers, magazines, books and other printed matter.

ARTICLE IV

BAGGAGE

Until further notice of the Allied Military Government, the existing laws and regulations relating to baggage are hereby suspended.

ARTICLE V

This order applies to all territory subject to Allied Military Government except the provinces of FUL, SAK, TUR, GREE and UNE.

SUBJECT: Suspension of Certain Provisions of Proclamations
in Northern Italy.TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission,
(Attn: Chief Commissioner)
A.P.O. 394.1. The Supreme Allied Commander consents to the suspension by
Proclamation or General Order, as you may determine, of the follow-
ing provisions of Proclamation No. 3:Article I
Article III (Section 2)
Article VI2. So far as Article II of Proclamation 3 is concerned, the
Supreme Allied Commander consents to relaxation of the article so
far as to do away with the necessity for declaring possession of
cameras, etc., and so as to permit the taking of photographs except
photographs of the following objects:

- a. Any Naval, Military and Air Force installations and
equipment of the Allied Forces.
- b. Any vessel of war or any vessel engaged in the trans-
port of supplies or personnel.

3. The above will take effect upon publication of the Procla-
mation or General Order relating to the same and shall apply to all
Italian territory with the exception of the Provinces of Istria,
Carnaro, Trieste, Gorizia and Udine.
