SUBJECT: Enlistment and Re-enlistment of Officers, Warrant Officers and Flight Officers, AAF

TO : Commanders of all Major Commands, Separate Units and Installations, MTOUSA

WD Cable WCL 49401 4 February 1947, is quoted for the information and guidance of all concerned.

Pending distribution, AAF letter 35-29, dated 3 February 1947, is quoted for your information.

1. War Department Radio WCL 48582, dated 20 January 1947, authorized the Commanding General, AAF, to determine the grade in which former Officers, Warrant Officers and Flight Officers will be enlisted after 1 July 1947.

2. The following policy is announced and will govern the enlistment in the Air Corps of former Officers, Warrant Officers and Flight Officers after 1 July 1947, provided they are otherwise qualified for enlistment in the Regular Army, and provided further they enlist within 30 days of last date of terminal leave.

a. All officers who are serving on active duty with the AAF are authorized to enlist in the grade of Master Sergeant upon relief from active duty, providing that they have a total of 10 Years active Federal Army Service in commissioned status at the time of separation. Duty performed with the Civilian Conservation Corps as an Officer on extended active duty will be counted.

b. All Officers and Warrant Officers who possess the MOS of Weather Officer Pilot (8218) or Weather Officer (8219) who are currently serving on active duty with the Army Air Forces in the MOS of 8218 or 8219 as of 1 February 1947 are authorized to enlist in grade of Master Sergeant upon relief from such active duty.

c. Officers, Warrant Officers and Flight Officers who are on active duty with the AAF who served in an enlisted status in the Regular Army Air Corps prior to 10 December 1941 will be enlisted in the grade of Master Sergeant upon relief from active duty provided they:

(1) Held the permanent or temporary non-commissioned officer grade of Sergeant or higher in the Air Corps or AAF at time of entry on active duty as an Officer, Warrant Officer or Flight Officer, or,

(2) Held the permanent or temporary non-commissioned officer grade of Sergeant or higher in the Air Corps or AAF immediately prior to appointment as an aviation cadet providing the individual was commissioned as an Officer or Flight Officer directly from aviation cadet status, or,

(3) Held a technicians or specialists rating convertible to the noncommissioned officer grade of Sergeant or higher at time of entering on active duty as an Officer, Warrant Officer or Flight Officer, and were at that time serving with the AAF, or,

(4) Held the rating of air mechanic first or second class at the time of entering on active duty as an Officer, Warrant Officer or Flight Officer.

d. Technicians and specialists ratings are convertible to MCO grades as follows:

Technician Third Grade - Staff Sergeant;
 Technician Fourth Grade - Sergeant;
 Technician Fifth Grade ; Private, Specialist First Class - Sergeant;
 Private First Class, Specialist Second Class - Sergeant;
 Private, Specialist Second Class - Sergeant;
 Private First Class, Specialist Third Class - (?) Sergeant;
 (All others are convertible to lower grades)

e. Officers, Warrant Officers and Flight Officers who do NOT qualify for enlistment under a, b or c above will be authorized to enlist in grades commensurate with their training and experience.

(1) Applications for enlistment under the provisions of this paragraph may be submitted directly to the Commanding General Army Air Forces, WASHINGTON 25, D.C., attention AAF ME-3, at any time while on terminal leave or thereafter. A copy of WD AGO Form 100 (Army Separation Qualification Record) if available will be forwarded with the application. In the event Form 100 is NOT available, the application should include the applicant's full name, Army Serial Number, number of months service in main or related military occupational specialty, the time served in each rank held while on active duty. This Headquarters will review such applications and determine the grade in which applicant will be authorized to enlist. The application will be returned to the applicant showing the grade in which he is authorized to enlist and will be presented to the Recruiting Officer as

authority to enlist in that grade providing the applicant enlists within the time specified in letter of authorization.

'(2) Application for grade authorization will show time served in each commissioned or enlisted grade, primary MOS and all other MOS and time served in each.

'3. Date of noncommissioned warrant will be determined as provided in WD Circular 110, 1946, as amended.

'4. All references to AAF in this letter are equally applicable to Air Corps.

'5. The provisions of this letter do NOT preclude the enlistment of personnel in the grade authorized under the provisions of paragraph 10 d (1), AR 600-750, change 11, dated 9 March 1945.

'6. The contents of this letter are applicable to all AAF personnel worldwide.

'7. The provisions of this AAF letter and the fact that NO further change in this policy is contemplated will be brought immediately to the attention of all Officers, Warrant Officers and Flight Officers on active duty except Regular Army Officers.

'8. Due to the constantly changing conditions affecting personnel of the Army, Headquarters AAF can NOT commit itself to any specified period of time which this AAF letter will remain in effect. However, all Officers, Warrant Officers and Flight Officers in your command will be informed immediately when a change in this policy is contemplated. Sufficient notice will be given by this Headquarters to allow such personnel adequate time to effect relief from active duty, take advantage of any accrued leave and enlist in the Regular Army, in accordance with the provisions of this AAF letter. Such personnel will be released from active duty for the purpose of enlisting in the Regular Army upon application in accordance with the provisions of the War Department Circular 126, dated 1946, regardless of category statements which they may have executed. '8

Fire Plan for Headquarters Allied Commission

1. The individual discovering a fire will immediately phone the Chief Telephone Supervisor on 227, giving the nature of fire, exact location (Floor and Wing) and will then take such action as he can to control the fire with local fire appliances available at nearest fire point.

2. Upon receipt of the report of fire the switchboard will:

- a) Immediately call fire department on 66666.
- b) Set off fire siren.
- c) Warn offices nearest fire by a telephone ring of about 15 seconds duration.
- d) Notify remainder of occupants of floor and rest of building if the fire is serious.

3. Occupants of offices having received the fire ring on the telephone will immediately vacate the building using the stairs nearest their offices away from the fire. This will be accomplished in an orderly manner under the supervision of the senior officer of the section who will conduct his personnel well away from the building.

4. The senior officer of the section will then ascertain what steps have been taken to combat the fire and will insure the blaze is entirely out before allowing personnel to return to their offices.

2. After a year or more of research, a new efficiency reporting form, WD AGO Form 67-1, was tried out throughout the United States and in two overseas divisions last 30 June. This form included the best personnel practices in industry, some features from the old efficiency rating form, and some which had been especially developed for Army use by field trials. Every effort is being made to insure that each part of it is equally important with every other in making final evaluation of the officer. The form was necessarily tentative and will be further modified before the final approved form is adopted for future use. Extensive research is now being conducted in connection with this revision and comments are sought from all officers. These should be sent direct to The Adjutant General prior to 30 November 1946.

3. 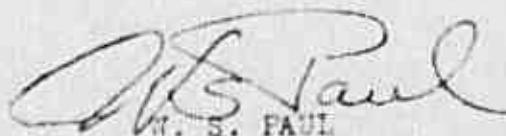
